Dr. Herb Cooper:

1959 graduate of D W Daniel. 2 year letterman in baseball, 3 year letterman in varsity basketball, 3 year letterman in track2 year varsity letterman in football. Captain and MVP of football team senior year. Senior year ,team finished with 9-1-1 record. Selected Captain of Varsity basketball. Played in SC north/south all-star basketball game as senior. Captain of basketball team senior year that lost state semi-final game. State Champion in long jump. Member of state champion mile relay team, Best Athlete, senior year.

Long-time serving member of Pickens School Board and proponent and sponsor form many Daniel educational and sports facilities.

"Pistol" Pete Maravich

Attended D W Daniel though 1963.Started 8^{th.}9th and 10th grade years.. Went to LSU and became all-time scoring leader. Holds the following NCAA records, scoring leader in ppg at 44.2, most field goals made (1,387) and attempted(3166), most free throws made (893) and attempted(1152), most games scoring at least 50 points (28), single season scoring record for most points (1381) and highest ppg ((44.5) in 1970.pluis many others. 1970 College player of the year. AP and UPI first team all-American 1968, 1969 and 1970. Played professional basketball with Atlanta Hawks and New Orleans Jazz. LSU basketball coliseum in named in his honor.

Holds several NBA honors/awards. Died 1988.

Dr. James Sutherland

1963 Graduate of D W Daniel. Allstate basketball player at Daniel who averaged 27 ppg and 10+ rebounds/game. 2-time MVP. North-South All star Game leading scorer and rebounder.

3 year starter at Clemson University. All-ACC 2 years, Academic All-American, 3-time Academic All ACC. ACC student Athlete of the year for all sports (1966-67). Clemson Hall of Fame inductee. Clemson Career record holder for free throw percentage, 4th all-time points/game (17.3).

Drafted by Seattle Supersonics.

1965 graduate of D W Daniel. 3 year letterman in football, 3 year letterman in basketball, 4 year letterman in track. State Champion sophomore year in 100 and 220 yard dash. Fastest in USA in 100 yard dash at 9.3 seconds.
