Domiciled on the campus of Montclair State
University (MSU), the MMC Global Video
Library of Medicine (GVLM) is an electronic
storage facility for digitally captured video files.
The files' subject matter is a mix of medical
symposia, lectures, demonstrations,
discussions and clinical presentations.

The GVLM is a program of Medical Missions for Children - a four-star-rated 501(c)(3)

charity. Other programs of Medical Missions for Children include the Telemedicine Outreach Program (TOP), Medical Broadcasting Channel (MBC), Giggles Children's Theater and *Plain Talk About Health* television show.

Montclair State University is New Jersey's second largest university, with 16,000 undergraduate and graduate students. Although established in 1908, the University has a modern, state-of-the art campus located 3 miles from St. Joseph's Children's Hospital, the home of Medical Missions for Children.


The GVLM is used much like a bank; MMC "deposits" content after it has been harvested or produced. Prior to entering GVLM, all video content is encoded into Mpeg 2 format, color and audio adjusted, edited for HIPAA compliance, electronically tagged and then cataloged for scheduling. The content is then "withdrawn" and used for scheduled or on-demand programming.



THE GVLM PROVIDES CONTENT FOR:

- ► MBC (*Medical Broadcasting Channel*) Both satellite broadcast and Internet2 (*Free*)
- ► Internet Light Standard Internet with programming aimed at a non-medical audience (*Free*)
- ▶ On-Demand access to GVLM content (*Membership*)
- ▶ "Heads Up Network" On-demand GVLM service aimed at U.S. (960,000) and International physicians. Capable of delivering tutorials about new drug and drug delivery technologies being offered by the pharmaceutical industry. (*Membership*)
- ▶ Commercial and PBS television programming (*Free*)

MMC HIGH-DEFINITION TELEVISION STUDIO

The Medical Missions for Children (MMC) HDTV production studio is located on the campus of St. Joseph's Children's Hospital. This modern state-of-the-art facility is a multi-set studio capable of producing medical interviews, discussions, demonstrations and news announcements. The studio uses the latest in lighting technology, electronic presentation aids and HDTV or HD-light TV formats. Adjacent to the studio is a fully digital control room, a six-station editing suite featuring Apple Final Cut Pro technology, a green room and a make-up salon. Programs and content recorded at this modern facility will be edited and stored to the Global Video Library of Medicine (GVLM).
