

Senior School Drama teacher Natasha Souris had taken a group of Year 9 Drama boys to see the *The Adventures of Alvin Sputnik, Deep Sea Explorer* at the State Theatre Centre in 2012 - and was completely captivated by the idea of '*Alvin*' and *Tim Watts'* (1996-01) approach to puppetry, multimedia and character work. When the team at Perth Theatre Company arranged for an encore schools' performance season of '*Alvin*' before the show went on tour again, Natasha jumped at the opportunity to have the show come to the John Inverarity Music and Drama Centre.

Year 10, 11 and 12 Drama students as well as the whole Year 9 cohort were able to see just what a career in the performing arts could be and Tim was excited at the prospect of bringing 'Alvin' to his old stomping ground. The encore tour performance season was meant as an opportunity for a new cast and crew to produce 'Alvin'. On hearing of the Hale School booking however, Tim donned the costume and the 'Alvin' puppet one more time, in tribute to his school and the place his passion for the performing arts began. Both Grey and Akram also spoke superbly about how fortunate we are and encouraged the boys to make the most of opportunities - but also challenged them to think about what giving projects they themselves could initiate.

The guest speaker is the Reverend Father Ted Doncaster (1938-49), an expert in the history of the Diocese of Perth and its schools. This event is held annually at the Cathedral in June since the birthday of Mathew Hale (18 June 1811 – 3 April 1895) falls this month.

Dane played three seasons for the Emirates Western Force between 2008 and 2010, making his Super Rugby debut against the Chiefs five seasons ago. He was a member of the Australian Sevens side during the 2008/2009 IRB Sevens World Series and featured prominently for the Australian Under 20 side in their IRB Junior World Championship in 2008 and 2009, including starting at fullback in their 2009 semi-final loss to South Africa.

Dane returned to Force colours starting on the right wing in the Western Australian's clash against the British & Irish Lions at Patersons Stadium.

"I'm really excited to be coming back to the Force," Dane said. "It was always the plan to come back to Australia and play Super Rugby, and my preference was to come back to the Force because it's home to me."

"It was a great experience going overseas and I feel like I learnt a lot. You play 36 games a season against some of the best players and teams in Europe week in, week out which gave me some valuable experience, but I'm ready to come back and give Super Rugby a crack."
