

Prof. Albert Chan is the Vice President (Research Development) of the PolyU, is also a Member of the Chinese Academy of Sciences and a recipient of numerous prestigious awards including the National Natural Science Award, Japan Society of Synthetic Chemistry Lectureship Award, and the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science Invitation Fellowship of 2006/07.

Prof. Albert Chan received his Bachelor of Liberal Arts degree from the International Christian University in Japan in 1975 and his PhD. degree in Chemistry from the University of Chicago in 1979. Upon graduation from Chicago, he started an industrial career at the Monsanto Corporate Research Laboratories where he had worked for 13 years. In 1992 he went to National Taiwan University as a Visiting Expert. From 1994 to 2004 he served as Chair Professor and Head of the Department of Applied Biology and Chemical Technology of PolyU. From 2004 to 2007 he was Dean of the Faculty of Applied Science and Textiles.

Professor Chan has been granted more than 20 United States patents, some of which have been licensed to major corporations in the U.K. and Europe. He has published 5 books and more than 400 SCI papers.

Message from Elizabeth Wong Chien Chi Lien CBE





The President's Report for 2006/2007 -

from Bosco Lau, President of the HKPolyUAA (2003/2007)

I'm extremely pleased to present our members and supporters the 2006/07 Annual Report of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (Australia) Association (HKPolyUAA).

2006 AGM

Our 2006 Annual General Meeting and Dinner function was held in October 2006 at the Golden Jade Seafood Restaurant in Eastwood, Sydney with great success. Over 200 members and their friends, and guests attended the function. We were glad to have Prof. Poon Chung-Kwong, the President of the PolyU came over from Hong Kong to attend the function. We also had Prof. Ko Jan-Ming - Vice President (Research & Development) of the PolyU, Mrs. Jenny Wallis – Director of the HKETO Sydney at the time, Mrs. Libby Wong and Prof. Chan Yiu-Nam amongst the many VIPs invited for the evening.

2006/2007 Activities

2006/2007 has been the busiest year for our Association in its 5 years history. We have organised Chinese New Year dinner, health seminars, professional and leisure seminars (through monthly meetings of the Synergy Group), dinners to meet old friends (e.g. Mr. George Ko as visitor from Hong Kong), gatherings with some PolyU Exchange students as well as Study Tour visitors. Our Victoria representatives had also held a no. of yum-cha and dinner functions for Melbourne-based members

As we have organised plentiful activities during the year, we have issued seven Association Newsletters – one in November 2006 and six newsletters in January, April, July, August, September and October 2007 respectively. We also published our 5th Anniversary Special Edition Booklet in October 2007, with the cover designed by our member Kelly Poon.

Linkage with the PolyU

Our Association has continued to maintain a close link with the PolyU. Several Executive Committee Members and active members including myself, Tony Tong, Chan Kit-Man, Stella Lau and David Ha visited the PolyU during the past 12 months.

In Sydney we have had several gatherings with the PolyU exchange students. I met a group of PolyU students coming to Australia for work experience in June 2007 at a reception organised by the HK Economic & Trade Office Sydney, 11 of the students in this group went to Melbourne for 6 weeks after their short stay in Sydney, and were welcomed by our Melbourne members at a dinner gathering organised by our Victoria representatives.

In August 2007, a group of 63 PolyU Applied Social Science students, staff and alumni led the Mrs. Teresa Tsein - Director of Alumni Affairs, Department of Applied Social Science visited Brisbane and Sydney on their 2007 Study Tour. I had the honour to first meet them at a tea reception organised by the HKETO Sydney, and then gathered a group of alumni to meet them on their farewell dinner in Australia. In September 2007, a group of 16 staff from Hong Kong Po Leung Kuk visited Sydney on their Elderly Services Study Tour, 6 of the staff including the tour coordinator Ms. Dorothy Chan were HK Polytechnic/PolyU Social Work graduates. The Association organised gatherings whereby alumni members having local social work expertise meet up with these tour groups and shared their experience in this field.

Linkage with the Community

Our Association had played a key role in joining up with the alumni associations of the University of Hong Kong and Chinese University of HK to organise a dinner function on August

13, 2007 to farewell Mrs. Jenny Wallis, the retiring Director of the HKETO Sydney. The successfully held function was the first in Australia where associations of three major HK-based Universities get together for a good course. All three associations have now agreed to work together for more joint functions in the future.

Membership

Up to October 2007, we have a membership close to 200 members including 70 Life Members.

2007 AGM

The 2007 AGM and Dinner is held on October 27, 2007 at the Fook Yuen Seafood Restaurant in Chatswood, Sydney. The theme of this year's event is "Celebrating the PolyU's 70th Anniversary". This year we welcome Professor Albert Chan, the new Vice President (Research Development) of the PolyU for his coming to join our function for the first time.

This is our 6th major annual event (first one being the Inauguration Ceremony in 2002) and the event marks our 5th Anniversary since inauguration in 2002. This year we have lined up a good number of prize sponsors for the event, I should particularly like to thank Virgin Atlantic Airways, Oriental Merchant, Lap Jewellery Manufacturer, Shiseido Australia, Global Sources Technology, AB Office Solutions and Maxcom Technology for their long term support. Lastly I should like to mention a few people whom we had sadly missed this year. These include Dr. Ching Yuen-Kai who was Deputy Principal of the HK Polytechnic when it was formed in 1973, Prof. Leung Tin-Pui who was a long-time staff and Vice President of the PolyU, and Mr. Michael Cheung, our life member and who had contributed support in forming the Association here in Sydney.

What's Next?

Shortly after this 2007 AGM and Dinner, a group of alumni from Australia including myself and Daniel will pay a special trip to Hong Kong to joining the PolyU 70th Anniversary gala dinner. The group will also take this opportunity to meet up some PolyU's staff and students, as well as members from other overseas associations.

Looking ahead, our Association will continue to be a major overseas Association of the PolyU to supporting its members and the PolyU in the years to come.

在二零零零年的十一月,一群畢業了四十年的機械和生產工程系的同學,自美、加、澳返港,回香港理工大學母校共同慶祝畢業四十週年,被邀請出席十二月八日舉行的校友離校銀禧紀念晚宴。席間校長潘宗光教授鑑於旅居澳洲員生數目不斷增長,建議籌備成立理大澳洲員生會,目的是讓居於澳洲的校友和前教職員,能與母校繼續保持聯繫和加強兩地溝通。

在二零零一年的三月,五位校友在前理工會計系教職員周秀霞女士引導下,初次在雪梨一酒樓會面,組成了一個六人籌備工作小組。小組成員包括有前教職員周秀霞、(61 年)生產工程系陳潔民、(73 年)紡織系張國華、(81 年)電腦資訊系蔡慧薇和電子工程系周伯漢,及(97 年)土木工程系施培坤等人。在同年八月,通過成立[香港理工大學澳洲員生會籌備委員會],邀得其他前理大師生加盟。參與工作小組成員,亦增添至十五人,包括有前理工應用物理系主任 Dr. Charles Martens 及理大中文及雙語學系講師張繼沛,並推選了周秀霞和吳步雲爲籌委會正副主席。

整整的一年裡,籌備工作小組不斷努力,聯絡己分散澳洲各地之員生,起草會章,收集和整理員生的資料,建立互聯網頁等事務。在二零零二年一月卅三日,終於成功在澳洲新南威爾斯省註冊爲一非牟利社團組織。繼加拿大(東西)兩岸之後,成爲理大海外之第三個員生會。適逢今年是香港理工大學建校六十五週年的大日子,澳洲員生會的誕生,剛好是這群旅居澳洲之員生,對母校一個特別的賀禮。

五月五日第一次週年大會當天,籌備委員會工作小組,很早便到會場佈置,更有籌委會員攜眷出席,幫助佈置場地、煲茶燒水、分配座椅、招待嘉賓、及爲大會拍攝記錄等。值得陳述的是當日出席大會之員 生與家屬,非常踴躍,比預先估計人數還多,員生皆來自悉尼各區,而且全數即時申請成爲會員,其中 五份之一員生,更申請爲永久會員。目前會員有來自其他省份,包括有西澳、維多利亞及昆士蘭省。

當天,推選了第一屆會長周秀霞、副會長吳步雲、秘書盧紀維、財務陳潔民、會籍幹事周伯漢、資訊事務幹事蔡慧薇、特別事務幹事李曉民、顧問 Dr. Charles Martens 及康樂幹事邱玉蓮等人。

會長簡報了理大澳洲員生會成立之經過,亦致詞歡迎出席之嘉賓及當選之幹事。同時宣佈已恭請了理大校長和校友事務及拓展處處長,於二零零二年十月十二日,到悉尼主持理大澳洲員生會成立典禮。典禮之安排及詳細情形,將會另行通知,歡迎各地員生,踴躍參加,出席這次盛會。





Those Were The Days

Those Were The Days was originated from a Russian song but put into English lyrics by Gene Raskin. **Mary Hopkin** did the best known recording of this song, produced by Sir Paul McCartney. It was released on August 30, 1968 and became a #1 hit in the UK singles chart, and reached #2 in the US.

Milestones on the Road of PolyU - 10 Year Snapshots since 1937

Year	Milestones	Comments
1937	The Government Trade School at Wood Road, Wanchai, was opened in February 1937. It was the first publicly funded post-secondary technical institution in Hong Kong. In its first year of operations 70 students studied wireless telegraphy, building and engineering courses	Mr. Ng Wing-Hong (伍永康) was one of the first students studying building courses at the Trade School. He was one of the very first graduates of the School (graduated in 1939).
1947	After World War II, the School reopened in phases and was renamed the Hong Kong Technical College (HKTC). Enrolment increased to about several hundreds a year and many apprentices attended evening classes offered by the HKTC.	Japan invaded and ruled over Hong Kong during 1942 to 1945, the darkest 3 years and 8 months for Hong Kong in all its history. The HKTC grew quickly as the Hong Kong economy began to pick up after the War.
1957	His Excellency the Governor, Sir Alexander Grantham, opened the new premises of the Hong Kong Technical College in Hung Hom , Kowloon.	Hung Hom was an important and convenient spot close to the centre of Hong Kong. This constitutes an important factor why the PolyU has the largest no. of enrolling students amongst all universities in Hong Kong.
1967	The Hong Kong 1967 riots began in May 1967 and lasted for almost 18 months. It was caused by pro-communist leftists in Hong Kong. Terrorist attacks and bombs in the city caused violence and dozens of deaths. It was the worst period for Hong Kong after the Japan invasion. After the riots, HKTC grew again and talks began in 1969 about the establishment of a polytechnic in Hong Kong.	Little known Mr. Li Ka-Shing (李嘉誠) invested in properties from the riot days and established Cheung Kong, the beginning of his real estate empire, in 1971. Li Ka-Shing eventually became one of the richest men in Hong Kong and has made many donations to the PolyU. The 18 storey building at the PolyU was named Li Ka-Shing Tower in recognition of a HK\$100 million donation from Mr. Li's Li Ka-Shing Foundation (June 2000).

1977	The new Polytechnic Library was officially opened by Princess Alexandra on February 7, 1977. The Library Building is a six-storey purpose-designed building with an area of 16,662 square metres, providing approximately 3,624 reader places. The Library also houses a 24-Hour Study Center, group discussion rooms, a seminar room for library instruction classes, AV facilities and private study rooms.	The Polytechnic Library later became the University Library, and was officially named as the Pao Yue-Kong Library on December 20, 1995 in recognition of a generous donation from the family of the late Sir Pao Yue-Kong (包玉剛). The Library today holds more than 2 million books. For more information about the Library please visit the Library website at: http://www.lib.polyu.edu.hk/.
1987	In January 1987 the Hon. Allen Lee Peng-Fei (李鵬飛) succeeded Sir Chung Sze-Yuen (鍾士元) as the Chairman of the Polytechnic Council upon Sir Chung's retirement.	Dr. the Hon. S. Y. Chung had been the Chairman of the Polytechnic Council from 1972 to 1986. Sir Chung had made great contributions to the development of the Polytechnic
1997	On April 1, 1997 Dr. Gordon Y.S. Wu (胡應湘) took office as Chairman of the University Council after Dr. Peter K.C. Woo (吳光正) completed his term of office in March. On July 1, 1997, the People's Republic of China resumes sovereignty over the city of Hong Kong, ending 156 years of British colonial rule.	Both Dr. Woo and Dr. Wu had served as Chairman of the Council for many years (5 years and 8 years respectively). Dr. Peter Woo oversaw the establishment of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (officially named on November 25, 1994).
2007	Hong Kong celebrates its 10 th anniversary establishment of the HK Special Administrative Region; the PolyU also celebrates its 70 th anniversary (1937 to 2007). The HK PolyU (Australia) Association celebrates its 5 th anniversary of establishment of its alumni and ex-staff network in Australia. A group of its members will attend the PolyU 70 th Anniversary Gala Dinner held in Hong Kong on November 9, 2007.	The PolyU celebrates its 70 th years of unique heritage with a massive celebratory "Flags of Harmony and Unity" in September followed by a Gala Dinner and a PolyU Alumni Convention in November. The slogan specially designed for PolyU's 70 th anniversary celebration is "Nurturing talents and innovating since 1937" In Chinese it is 「勵學育才七十年,利民科研創新天」

梁振英 (Leung Chung-Ying) 1954 年在香港出生,於英皇書院中五畢業,1974 年獲理工學院建築測量系高級文憑,及後赴英國 Bristol理工學院進修,獲估價及地產管理學位。1993 年創辦梁振英測量師行,2000 年透過互換股份,與英國 DTZ 及新加坡的戴玉祥產業諮詢公司合併,易名爲戴德梁行。2006 年再次透過互換股份,使梁持有控股公司的股份增至 4.61%,成爲控股公司第四大股東及最大的個人股東,除首度晉身集團董事局外,2007 年 2 月起他由北亞區主席升任爲亞太區主席。

梁振英的官職包括在 1997 年任香港特區政府行政會議成員。1999 年7月1日任香港特別行政區行政會議召集人。梁並於 1999 年獲香港特區政府頒發金紫荆星章 (GBS)。梁振英在 1997 年獲選爲理工大學首屆傑出校友之一。

The Golden Songs – 10 Year Snapshots since 1937

Year	Songs – Background and Their Influences
1937	何日君再來, a popular classic mandarin song first sung by 周璇 for the movie 三星 件月. The song had subsequently been sung by many artists including 潘廸華、奚秀蘭、李香蔅、翁倩玉 and 鄧麗君. A movie of the same name produced by 邵氏 also became a classic.
	The song has very touching lyrics: "好花不常開,好景不常在。 愁堆解笑眉,淚灑相思帶。今宵離別後,何日君再來?". The version sung by 鄧麗君 had once been banned by Mainland China as the lyrics causd cultural concerns.
1947	White Christmas, an Irving Berlin song written in the early 40s and sung by Bing Crosby. In 1942 alone, the single spent eleven weeks on top of the charts. It returned to the #1 spot again during the holiday seasons of 1945 and 1946 (on the chart dated January 4, 1947), thus becoming the only single in history with three separate runs at the top of the U.S. charts.
	More than fifty million <i>White Christmas</i> singles had been sold and it remains the world's most popular and best selling song of all times. When hearing this Crosby's song at Christmas time, one can always feel a sense of peace and family harmony.
1957	<i>Jailhouse Rock</i> by Elvis Presley first released in September 1947. It remains one of the greatest songs of all time. Elvis also did a movie of the same name.
	The song by Elvis opened up the whole era of Elvis - the King of Rock and Roll, which had influenced the US culture and fashion for the next 20 years until the death of Elvis in August 1977.
1967	<i>Scarborough Fair</i> sung by Simon and Garfunkel. The song was a traditional English ballad.
	Simon and Garfunkel's pop and folk songs had great influence to music lovers especially the younger and anti-war audience. Simon and Garfunkel had become friends as early as 1953 when they studied at the same elementary school. Throughout their singing career since the song - Sound of Silence released in 1965, the duo had been off and reunited several times, denoting a life-long friendship. They hosted their 25 "Old Friends Tour" shows in 2003/04. There has been rumour that the duo is considering to launch a concert tour to Australia, after more than 50 years in their music career.
1977	How Deep Is Your Love recorded by the Bee Gees in 1977, and later became a soundtrack of the very successful film Saturday Night Fever. The song topped the US Billboard Chart in December 24, 1977 and stayed in Top-10 for a then record 17 weeks.
	The Bee Gees is regarded the most successful song-writing and singing brothers group – consisting of brothers Barry, Robin and Maurice Gibb. The Bee Gees' Saturday Night Fever album has sold for more than 40 million copies and the music had great influence to the disco era and beyond.
1987	The Golden Song Award (金曲金獎) in the 1987's 十大勁歌金曲頒獎典禮 went to Leslie 張國榮's <i>無心睡眠</i> .
	張國榮 was a talented artist, but ended his life with a suicide on April Fool's Day 2003. Although many other talented artists like 羅文、梅豔芳 died later, Leslie's suicidal death remains the biggest shock to music fans.

1997 My Heart Will Go On by Canadian singer Céline Dion is the theme song of the 1977 blockbuster film *Titanic*.

My Heart Will Go On is regarded one of the best love songs as most people can remember the romantic scenes in the film Titanic. My Heart Will Go On is Céline Dion's biggest hit and the song single is one of the best-selling singles in history. The song reached number one all over the world, the single has been sold for more than 10 million copies worldwide.

2007 Though an older song, the song **獅子山下** sung by the late 羅文 (譚百先/Roman Tam), composed by 顧家輝 with lyrics written by 黄霑 truly represents the spirit of Hong Kong people.

The song 獅子山下 was first released in 1979 for the TV series of the same name. The TV programme 獅子山下 by Radio Hong Kong have been on air from 1974 up to now, and talked about the lives of Hong Kong people like a documentary. During the bad times in Hong Kong, Hong Kong people especially appealed to the lyrics of this song for encouragement. The song is almost regarded a 區歌 for the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region. The song reminds Hong Kong people about "、自強不息", it also influence migrants living overseas who still have a heart about Hong Kong.

在歌詞中,一句「人生中有歡喜,難免亦常有淚」描述香港人對生活前景患得患失的心情;「同處海角天邊,攜手踏平崎嶇,我地大家用艱辛努力寫下那不朽香江名句」則提醒香港人,香港成就是大家共同創造。

Do you know?

- 1) Sir Edward Youde (尤德) was the Governor of Hong Kong from May 1982to December 1986. Sir Edward Youde suffered a fatal heart attack in the Beijing British Embassy and died on December 5, 1986. He was the only Governor of Hong Kong to have died in office.
- 2) Sir Mark Aitchison Young served as the Governor of Hong Kong for only 4 months from September to December 1941 because of the invasion of Japanese and occupation of Hong Kong during 1942 to 1945. Sir Mark Young resumed as the Governor of Hong Kong from May 1946 to May 1947. His serving period as Governor is probably the shortest.
- 3) Five Governors of Hong Kong have been named Lords, the first being Sir Hercules Robinson (named Lord Rosmead) and the last being Rt. Hon Chris Pattern (named Lord Patten of Barnes).

Kenneth has been awarded a Centenary Medal by the Australian Government in 2001 for his community service work. Although retired Kenneth is still active in community services. He is a trustee of the Australian Chinese Charity Foundation and honorary chairpersons and advisers of many community and sports organizations. He has been leading Chinese soccer teams to play competition matches against Chinese teams in other countries. He is also an honorary adviser of our Association since 2003.

Alex studied Graphic Design at the Hong Kong Polytechnic and graduated with high marks, he then studied commercial design and related courses in various institutions and ended with a Master Degree in Multimedia Design at the University of Sydney. Nancy had also studied business courses at the Polytechnic. The couple had worked in various design and marketing positions in Hong Kong then started their own 1A Communication company venture in 1979. 攝影與生活

每個人都希望把值得紀念的人與物;情和境捕捉下來,作爲日後自我陶醉或與人分享。在沒有攝 影機的年代,人們在沙上、土上、樹上、石上、獸皮和紙上刻畫下來。攝影是文字和繪畫外的一 種工具。

隨著攝影機的發明、膠片和照相紙技術的不斷改良,從黑白照片到彩色的年代。科技溶入了我們的生活和藝術領域,電腦的廣範應用和數碼科技的不斷突破,數碼攝影機和數碼優化技術猛進使攝影變得更平民化。

數碼優化技術是攝影後期工序。在「雪梨攝影之友」成立一年晚宴上,我們邀請攝影大師卓金榮博士,爲我們主講「攝影藝術之誇越照相機」。卓博士指出我們按下快門捕捉當前美景,只是享受攝影快樂的一半,餘下的一半的快樂是數碼優化照片(又稱爲「白房」技術)。在優化過程中容許你灌進自我的情懷和感受、使你的作品注入生命,化爲你個人風格的照片並擴闊攝影藝術空間領域。

科技的快促發展,使每一個人有機會拍到好的照片。 數碼攝影機的普及化,展示平台的多元化,使到視像 媒體沖積在我們生活中。你可以把一堆照片輯成影 集,或燒在 CD 上,或放在網頁上以愉人樂已。攝影 是我們生活的一部分,你不知不覺已陷入這股潮流。

適逢理大成立七十週年及理大澳洲員生會成立五週年,謹藉此祝賀校務及會務同樣蒸蒸日上, 為育及文化交流事務不斷發展,開創更美好的明天。自一九三七年至今,理大經歷及見証香港社會的轉變,也為香港社會以致世界各地培育不少出類拔萃的人才,縱觀我們澳洲各地,均 擁有來自香港的移民,澳洲社會跟香港社會的結構固然不同但對文化,教育事務同樣著重基礎的發展。此外,現時澳洲社會是多元文化種族移民的組合,因此,政府也投放大量資源於社區文化的教育事務,為社區文化認同及了解方面作出努力,目的是希望把不同文化背景的人仕,投入社區並共同維繫社區和諧。

澳洲警察對文化教育也不遺餘力,對於社區文化和公民教育作出實際的貢獻,因此,警察除了 執行日常打擊罪案的職務外,更建立社區防罪綱絡,設立民族社區聯絡單位,爲不同文化背景 的族裔提供溝通的渠道,水乳交融,透過雙方的共同合作,合力打擊罪案及防止罪行。由於移 民需要面對新環境多方面的考驗和挑戰,往往接觸生活上的種種困難,包括語言,文化和習俗 等,假若不能夠於短時間內適應或對文化差異感到困窘,生活就會產生問題,澳洲警察於各州 及領地均擁有聯絡警官。以新州警隊爲例,包括家庭暴力案聯絡警官、青年聯絡警官、防止罪 案警官、同性戀者聯絡警官及民族社區聯絡警官等,所有這些職位均隸屬於罪案管理科部門, 並共同合作,除了負責聯繫角色外,更提供教育,對象包括學校、社團或商業機構等,不論移 民來自什麼地方,總會包含成人或小孩。因此,社團會集合社區新移民,要求警方提供治安講 座,學校會安排新生公民教育課堂,要求警方派員出席,所有這類講座均屬於警隊社區教育項 目的一部份,在執行警隊教育社區的過程,不單著重知識的灌輸,更著重文化上的理解,例如 我們曾經集合一群新移民的難民小孩,他們均來自阿富汗及伊拉克的戰區地帶,從小生活於極 端暴力的社會環境並感受戰爭的蹂躪,明顯地這些小孩的險上充滿憂慮,爲了糾正他們偏激的 想法及協助他們投入正常生活的軌道,我們警方必須理解他們過去的處境,更盡最大的能力教 育正常思考的模式,以理性的態度去解決生活的問題。固此,教育的領域是廣泛的,無論學術 教育或生活學習,總不會偏離「教育」偉大的概念。

理大明星 #4 - 名探險家 Dr. Rebecca 李樂詩



Explorer Dr. Rebecca Lee

李樂詩博士 (Dr. Rebecca LEE Lok-Sze) 是香港知名旅行家和探險家,中國極地博物館基金創辦人(China Polar Museum Foundation),喜好極地科學研究工作,曾經到過南極、北極及青藏高原多次探險。並且在中國香港兩地主持講座超過數百場次。

李樂詩曾任專業廣告設計師、畫家、攝影師及作家。

李樂詩在 1964 年於香港工業專門學院畢業並取得商業設計證書, 是世界上首位女性成功探索過兩極及征服珠穆朗瑪峰。Dr. Lee 在 2003 年獲理大選出爲當年度傑出校友之一。

How it began -

I was still working in Hong Kong as the Head of IT of a major corporation when the PolyU Australia Association was being formed. I returned to Sydney and reunited with my family in late 2001, living comfortably for a while after 6 years of hard working in Hong Kong. Some time in 2002 I came across an article on a local Chinese newspaper and became aware of a proposed PolyU alumni association to unite alumni residing in Australia. I read about Sarah Chow as the contact person in the article and rang her up to introduce myself, being a first year graduate of the Polytechnic. I was then invited to attend organizing committee meetings of the PolyU Association in preparation, and very soon I had found out that several members of the organizing committee were actually associated with either myself or my wife. Members like Hugh Lee, Stella Lau and Elaine Yau were old friends of my family so I got on with the committee very well from the start. [By the way my wife Cecilia was a cooking teacher and had her radio programme on gourmet cooking at the time so she was well known in the local Chinese community].

The organizing committee worked well and in October 2002 everything was all set for an Inauguration Ceremony of the PolyU Australia Association to be held in Sydney with the presence of Prof. Poon Chung-Kwong joining to address the ceremony. Sarah Chow became the founding President of the Association and I was a member of the first Executive Committee and acted as a Master of Ceremony for the Inauguration Ceremony event.

Mission Impossible?

In the second half of 2003, I started to do voluntary work with the Australian Chinese Community Association of NSW and soon became an Executive Committee member of ACCA. I was then asked by Sarah Chow and other Committee members if I would like to take up the President position for the Association for in year 2003/2004. I initially declined the request thinking that I would be quite busy already with community work. In the end I accepted the challenge and took up presidency of the Association in October 2003, exactly 30 years after my graduation at the Polytechnic.

Doing two jobs at the time was not easy, besides Cecilia and I were running an interactive distribution business, and worst still in early 2004 I was offered a contract job by one of the major banks in Australia on IT work, and started to resume full-time working after a 3 years+ break. To other people it was almost like mission impossible trying to tackle all these assignments simultaneously and to equally high standard. Nevertheless I had to exercise my time management skills and work with capable people to get things done in the most appropriate way. I had also found synergies amongst various work – for example, through my community services I got to know some companies and individuals who are willing to sponsor events for a good course, so when the Association decided to do fund-raising for the PolyU, I could line up sponsors and supporters and attain win-win situations for all related parties; I could also establish media contacts and have the media reporting our major events thus promoting our presence in the community. At one time I also lined up Oriental Merchant to offer Lee Kum Kee sauces to help out a charity event organised for the Bank where I worked. I did drop my ACCA work in late 2004 to free up more time.

"Impossible" becomes "I'm Possible"

Since 2003 I have now acted as the President of the Association for 4 full years. I am quite happy and satisfied that the Association has achieved significant growth in these years. I have to emphasize that the success does not come easy and does not come by my personal efforts alone, it is the cooperation amongst its members and many supporters (for example, Virgin Atlantic Airways, Oriental Merchant and Lee Kum Kee, and Lap Jewellery Manufacturer, and many of our own members have supported us every year in offering us souvenirs and lucky draw prizes in our major events), the dedication of the Executive Committee members and many supportive members, and as importantly the caring and support we have received from the PolyU (including the President and other senior staff members, and staff of the Alumni Affairs and Development Office, who closely work with us and are highly supportive in what we do or request).


I have also attained invaluable personal development through working for the Association. I have become "Mr. Possible" in the sense that I can now accept bigger challenges which I could not possibly take on before. In past years I have helped organising several successful functions in Australia (PolyU or non-PolyU related), such as major dinner events and sightseeing tours involving hundreds of participants.

Members Participation Highly Recommended

I constantly recommend our members to get actively involved in alumni activities. Many of our active members had the chance to meet up PolyU's AADO staff and/or participate in PolyU events on their visits to Hong Kong. Several of our members met representatives and members of other overseas PolyU associations on their overseas trips. Many of our members have also been making good use of our Association network to form social and/or business alliances. Personally I should also like to recommend members taking a more proactive role in our activities. For instance this year I was very pleased to receive calls from several members who volunteer to offer prizes or line up prize sponsors for our AGM Dinner event. I am sure members can learn a lot also through helping out our activities like I did. Members may even develop their potentials or find new fields of interest through such practices.

What's Next?

Although I am retiring from the President position, I am confident that my successor and the rest of the Executive Committee will still carry the PolyU flag here in Australia and move our Association forward in a big way. I shall still be present in the Executive Committee for some time to offer my support. My next priority is well-being — "Better Health" for my own self, my family and anyone who cares for his/her health. To me "Good Health" is worth more than "Good Fortune". Cecilia and I have had the chance this year to get involved in *kuolin qigong* ¹ (郭林氣功), a type of qigong exercises that can help people improve their fitness and fight against diseases. Regular qigong classes are being organised for beginners and the more experienced, hopefully we can introduce these to our members soon. Our aims have always been to help people around us. You are welcomed to talk to us if you have the same concerns about better health. I am sure that we can exchange ideas for the better life!



We Are Family was a 1979 dance hit song by Sister Sledge, composed by Bernard Edwards and Nile Rodgers. Rodgers and Edwards offered the song to Atlantic Records; the track was later released as a single from the album of the same name and quickly began to gain club and radio play and eventually went gold, becoming the number one R&B and number two pop song on the charts. It was also the theme song for the 1979 Pittsburgh Pirates. Other artists who have covered this song include the Spice Girls, The Corrs, Babes in Toyland and Chic.


