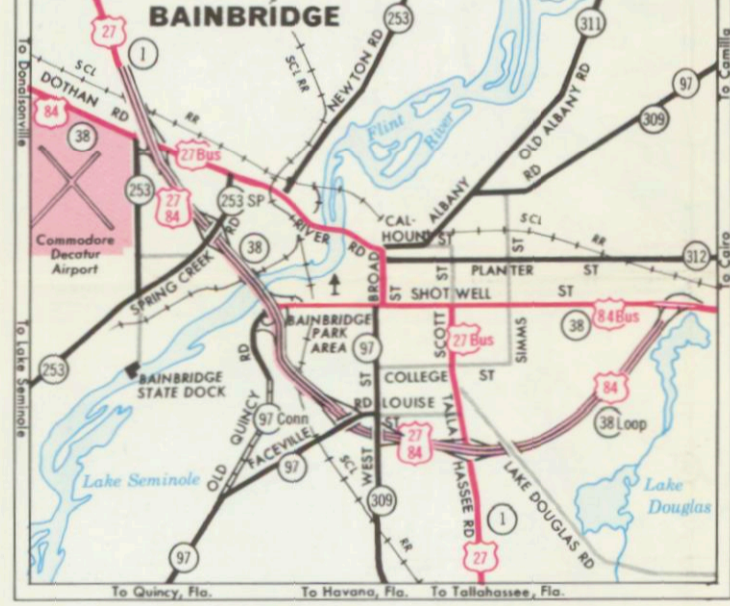
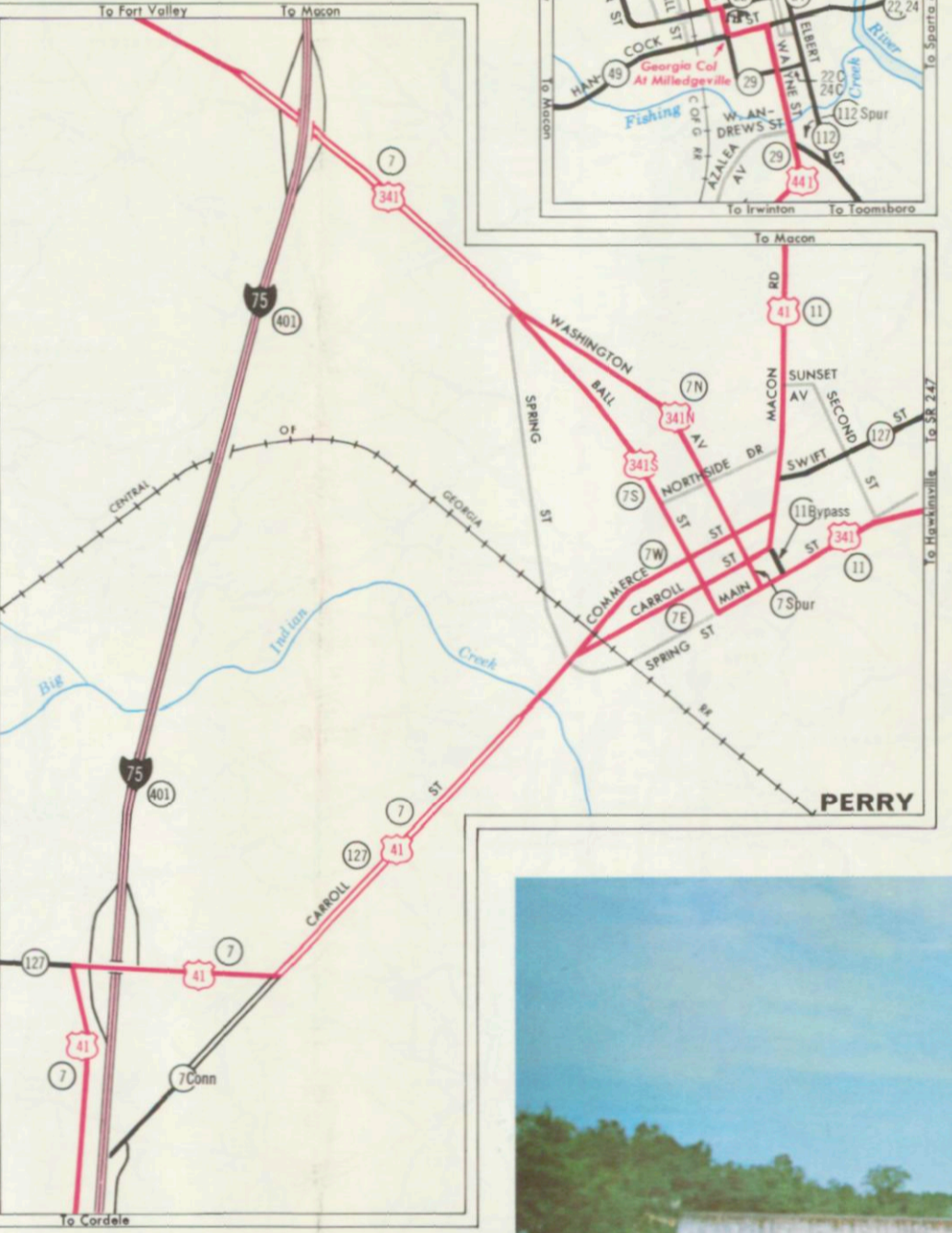
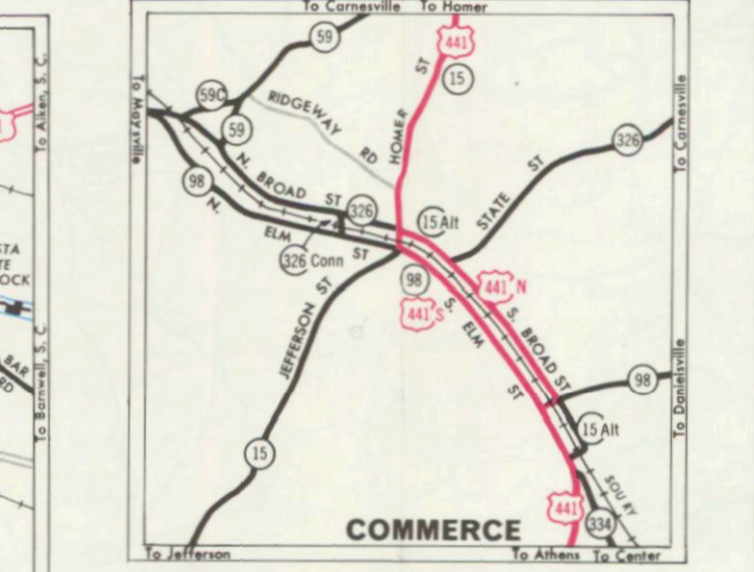
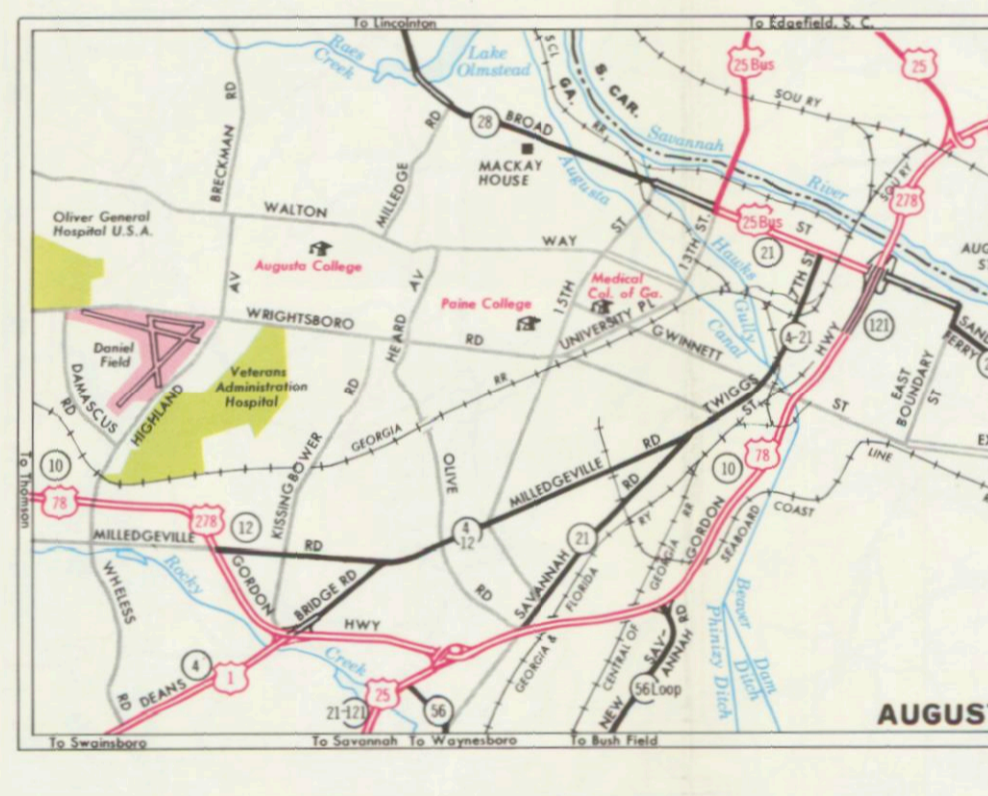
Ducks and geese stop along the Atlantic flyway over Georgia's coastal marshlands.



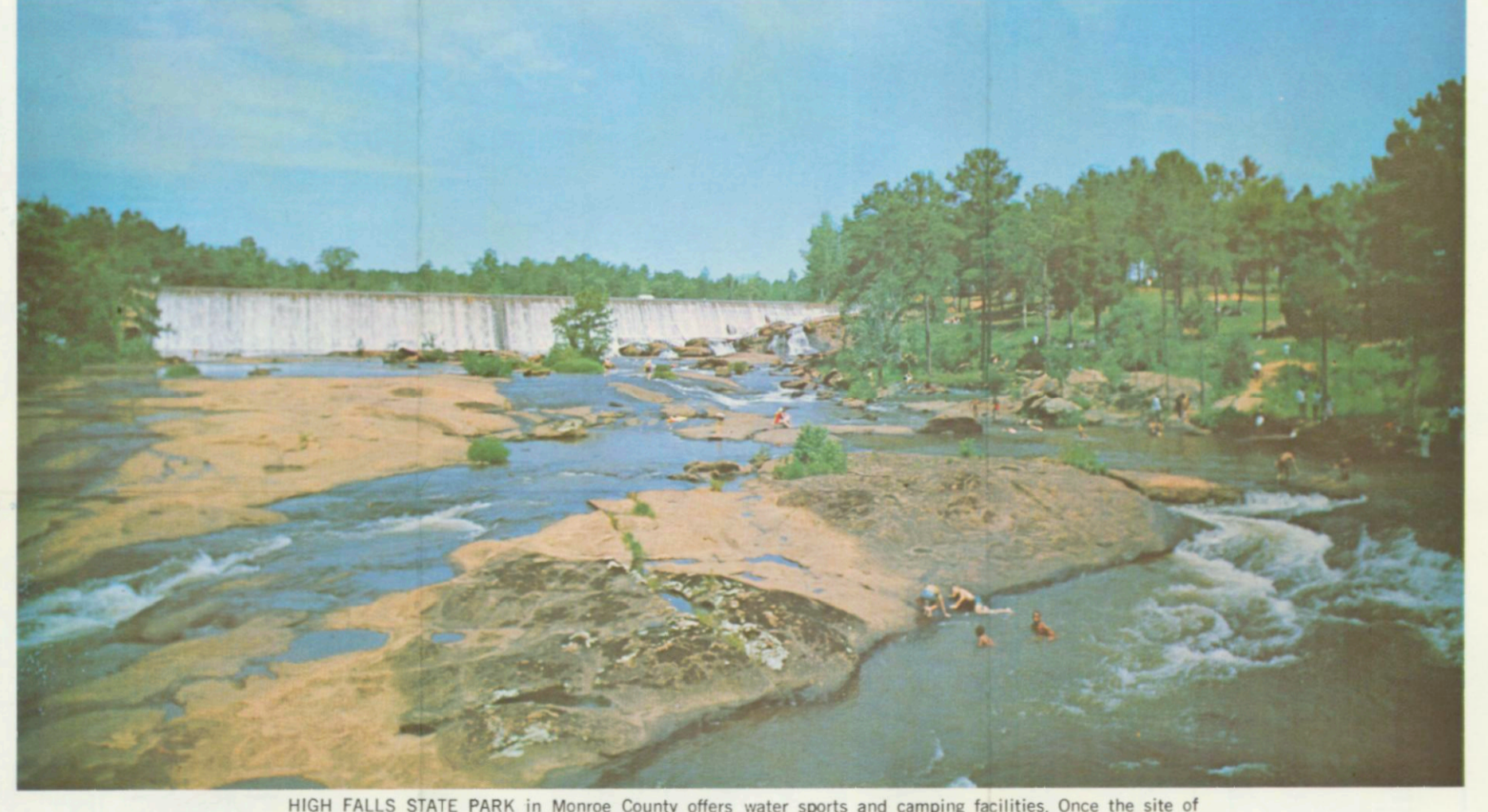
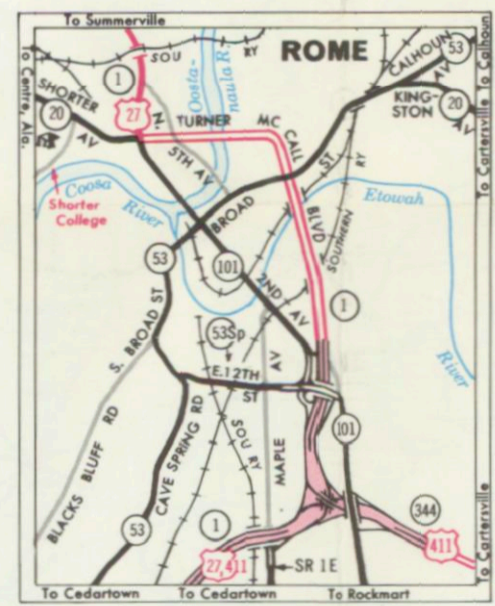
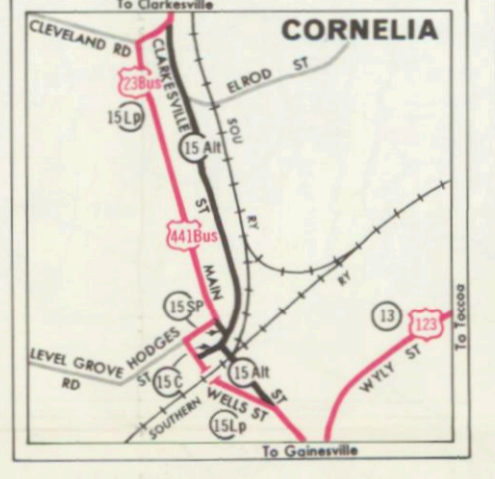

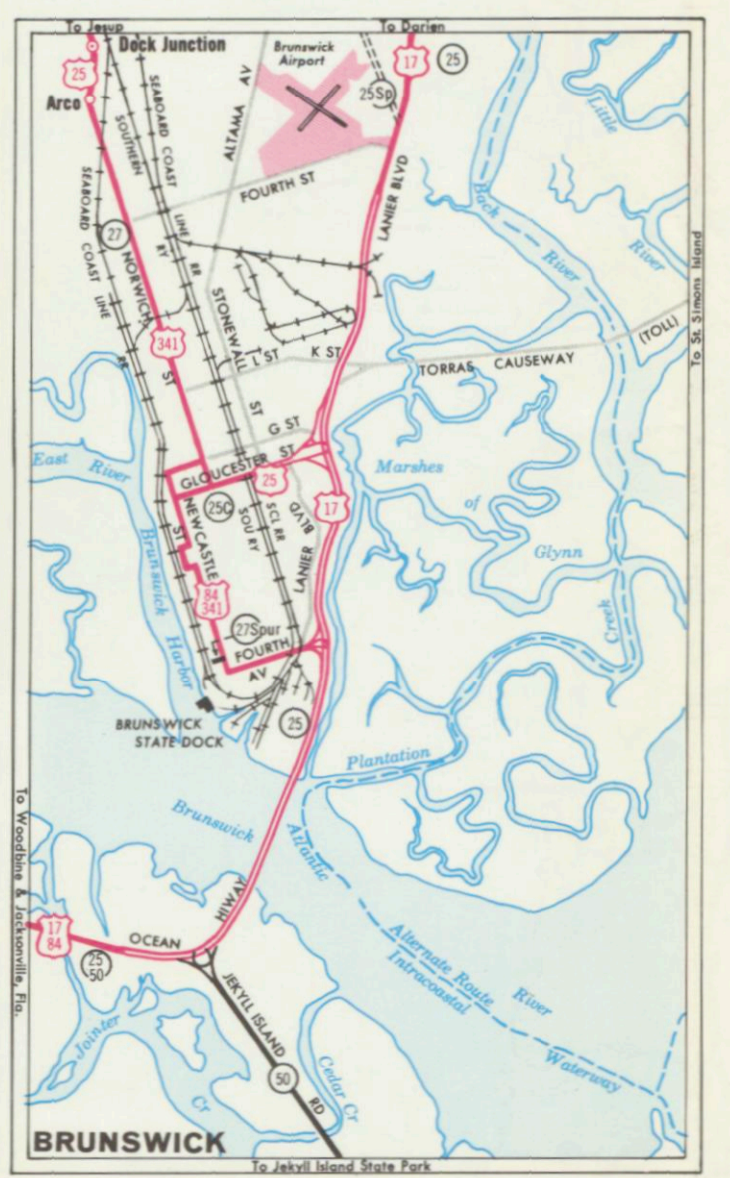
