Greetings from St Bede's,

FIDE ET OPERE

A few more previously scheduled activities and events are now happening as the term gets into full swing. Winter sport is well underway with nearly 600 boys fully involved in weekend sport. Other cultural activities like the Shakespeare Festival (last week) have already occurred. Preparations for our Feast Day, the Variety Concert, Big Sing, Poly Fest and other events are all underway.

It was pleasing also to see the good numbers of parents who came to listen to a presentation by Fr Allan Jones on the programme "Theology of the Body" which we in turn teach in Year 10 and in Year 12. This is a programme based on the teachings of Pope John Paul II and our interest in the programme was a proactive response to addressing some concerns we have had for a period of time about the social habits of some of our boys.

Last year the diocese funded a number of presentations by an American called Jason Evert who has adapted the teachings of John Paul II and developed a programme for young people. His 75 minute presentation to the boys last year was inspiring and dealt with, in an informal manner, the relationship and sexual issues of our age. He informed the boys of the consequences of promiscuity and STDs and promoted the values and principles that underpin lasting relationships between men and women, promoting the notion that self-giving love is sacrificial, respectful and other centred, rather than self-serving love which uses and manipulates because it relates to the other as an object in overt or subtle ways.

As someone said about the programme: "John Paul's 'Theology of the Body' provides an antidote to the abuse and trivialisation of human sexuality in our society."

On the night of June 7, we invite all parents to hear Jonathan Doyle, who is the main presenter at our Year 13 retreats the next day. Last year he captivated our Year 13 students and we recommend him highly to any parent who can come along.



Two boys from Portugal, Vasco Fragoso-Mendes and Francisco Viera-de-Almeida came at the beginning of the year, and even though they could have been forgiven for returning home, have stayed with us and are making strong contributions to our 1st XV. Yoshikazu Fujita had his first game for our top team against St Andrew's last Saturday after being in the College for only a few days. He continues the line of top-class players coming to St Bede's from the current Japan High Schools rugby champions, and sister-school, Higashi Fukuoka .

Along with the good support we have had from Japan this year, (which is greatly appreciated considering the disasters which have beset our city and Japan), we have a player from Krasnodar in southern Russia and one from Nairobi, Kenya. Simon is the third Muniafu boy to come to St Bede's College from Kenya and some may remember his older brothers Steven and Sidney.

In total, there are 15 boys in the programme. As usual, they are of varying abilities and will play for teams from the 1st XV to the U16 Bs. If you are on the sideling supporting your sons, any words of welcome and encouragement would be greatly appreciated by them.
