STS-121 crew gets close look at hardware, orbiter at KSC

▲ Return to Flight Update: The astronauts of the second Return to Flight mission, STS-121, were at KSC last week to participate in the Crew Equipment Interface Test. Crew members are Commander Steven W. Lindsey, Pilot Mark E. Kelly, and Mission Specialists Piers J. Sellers, Michael E. Fossum, Lisa Nowak and Stephanie Wilson. During the test, the crew has an opportunity to get a hands-on look at the orbiter and equipment they will be working with on their mission. The crew is scheduled to launch aboard Atlantis on mission STS-121 in July.
