#### Size and Range of Collections

The National Museum holds a wide range of artifacts from Kingdom drums, house items, traditional arts, dance and music instruments, ancient Burundian clothes, jewels, kitchen material, welding fans, weapons, baskets and calabashes. The drum sanctuary contains ancient drum making tools.

#### **Facilities**

The museum has two facilities: the more traditional museum building in Gitega and a drummers' sanctuary nearby. The Central Museum displays artifacts and stores many traditional items for their safety. The sanctuary is a compound where drums' makers and dancers show construct the drums, learn the songs and perform drum exhibitions for the public.

### **Public Programs and Other Public Activities**

The National Museum of Gitega has many public programs. It is open to tourists and researchers. Secondary and primary schools have opportunities to visit and learn about their country's history and rich culture. Sometimes the museum organizes traditional dance's exhibitions when they have special visits or when they organize culture festivals.

#### **Mission Statement**

The National Museum of Gitega is dedicated to preserving the rich cultural heritage of the people of Burundi and to make that history available and accessible to the people of Burundi. Through our Drum Sanctuary to preserve and promote the cultural history of the drum in Burundian culture.

#### **Project Ideas**

- Burundian drummers have a historic role in the community harmony and the kingdom organization. The King had two personal drums (one is stored in the museum) that they used to beat when the country celebrated the "Seeds' Ceremony". This drum was the symbol of the kingdom and the dancers performed in certain way that none else could repeat the dance. Only the king had the right to see this dance. One dancer is still alive and he is at Gishora drummers' sanctuary. The first project would be to rehabilitate this sanctuary which is at an hour time away from the central town of Gitega.
- The second project would be a shared exhibition between with its partner museum in the capital of Bujumbura. The Burundian drummers, who have already performed around the world, could perform in US and American artists could perform in Burundi and would watch the drum making for example. They could even participate in the activity.
- American and Burundian artist/drummers could jointly organize an exhibition in their both countries.

#### **Community Involvement**

Drums express harmony and tranquility in the ancient Burundi. They were also the symbol of the king's power that guarantied the country's peace and sovereignty. We also seek assistance in ensuring that Burundi can preserve and pass on its drum making and performing.
