

## **General Information about Election**

Jaipur district is divided in 19 Assembly Constituencies. Collector and District Magistrate, Jaipur is the District Election Officer of the district. The District Election Officer is overall responsible for maintaining Electoral Roll (Voter List) of the district. At the district level below the DEO, there is a Deputy District Election Officer and is a nodal officer for the election related activities in the District.

In the hierarchy below the District Election Officer, there are Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) for each Assembly Constituency and ERO's are assisted by Assistant Electoral Registration Officer. The ERO is responsible for maintaining and updating Electoral Roll for that Assembly Constituency. At booth level there is Booth Level Officer (BLO) and BLO's are updating the Electoral Roll in their booth area. 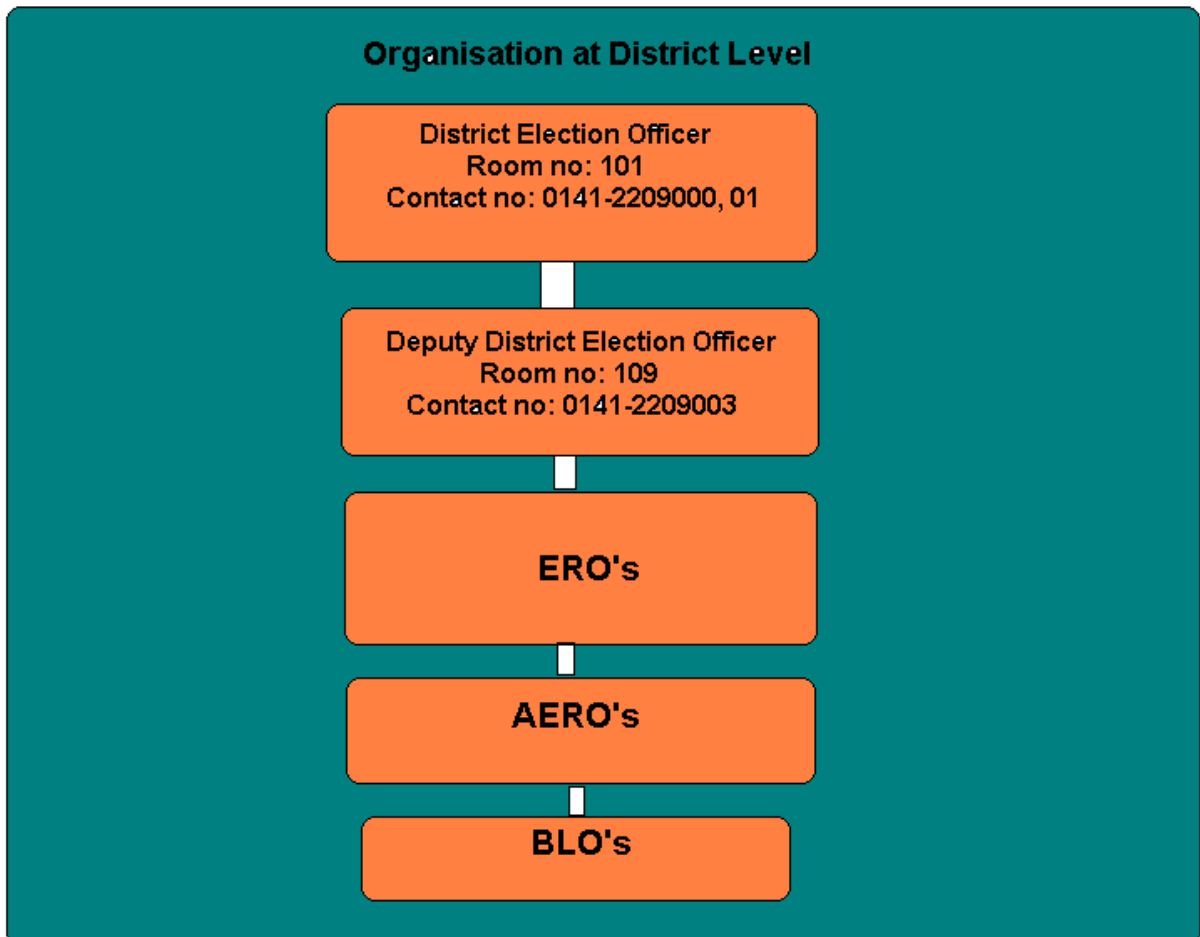

## Election FAQs:

**Q1.** For every constituency, there is a list of voters which is called electoral roll. What is the minimum age for enrollment in an electoral roll?

**Ans.**Eighteen

For every constituency, there is a voters list Article 326 of the Constitution, and Sec. 19 of R. P. Act, 1950 stipulate that the minimum age for registration of a voter is 18 years.

**Q2.** Which is the relevant date for determining the age qualification of 18 years? Suppose, you have completed 18 years of age today. Can you get yourself registered as voter ?

**Ans.** According to Section 14 (b) of the R. P. Act, 1950, the qualifying date means the first day of January of the year in which the electoral roll is prepared or revised.

**Q3.** Can a non-citizen of India become a voter?

**Ans.**No

A person who is not a citizen of India cannot be registered as a voter. Article 326 of the Constitution read with Sec. 16 of R. P. Act, 1950 clarify the point.

**Q4.** Can a non-resident Indian citizen become a voter?

**Ans.** According to Section 19 of the R. P. Act, 1950, only a person who is ordinarily resident in a constituency is entitled to be registered in the electoral roll of that constituency. However, such of the non-resident Indian Citizens who are employed under Govt. of India in a post outside India are eligible to be registered as voters in terms of Sec 20 (8) (d) read with Sec 20 (3) of the R. P. Act, 1950.

**Q5.** If I am working and living in Jaipur, can I be a voter in my native village?

**Ans.**No

If you are working in Jaipur and residing there, you are an ordinary resident of Jaipur in terms of Sec 19 (b). Therefore you can be enrolled at Jaipur only and not in your native village.

**Q6. Can one be enrolled at more than one place?**

**Ans.** No

A person cannot be enrolled as a voter in more than one place in the same constituency or in more than one constituency in view of the provisions contained under Sec. 17 and 18 of R. P. Act, 1950.

**Q7. How can I get registered/enrolled in the Electoral Roll?**

**Ans.** You have to submit a filled in Form - 6 to the ERO of the Assembly Constituency.

**Q8. I have lost my old EPIC Card. How can I get a new EPIC Card?**

**Ans.** You can deposit a copy of the FIR lodged at the Police Station. You will get a new EPIC Card after deposit of Rs. 25. The dates for issuing EPIC Cards are published in leading Newspapers.

**Q9. My old EPIC Card is defective. I would like to have a new EPIC Card with correct particulars. What is the procedure?**

**Ans.** You can get your EPIC Card rectified by depositing it in the office of the ERO concerned. You may also get EPIC at the designated Voter Facilitation Centre in your Assembly Constituency.

**Q10. How can I lodge any complaint regarding, Voterlist and Voter card?**

**Ans.** You can either registered your complaint online on CEO Portal (Ceorajasthan.nic.in) or you can also give your manual complaint in District election office( Room No.112 In Collectorate Building Jaipur)

**Q11. How can I get my Voter Id card?**

**Ans.** You can get your voter card by 2 ways:

1. You can register by Online process by filling form No.6 Online on - Go to link CEO Portal (Ceorajasthan.nic.in)
2. You can submit your form no. 6 Manually In ERO Office as per your constituency

**Q12. How can I get my voter Id card corrected?**

**Ans.** You can correct your by 2 ways:

1. By Submitting online form no.8 Go to link - On CEO Portal (Ceorajasthan.nic.in)
2. You can also submit form No.8 Manually in ERO office as per your constituency

**Q13. What is an Electronic Voting machine? In what way its functioning is different from the conventional system of voting?**

**Ans.** An Electronic Voting Machine consists of two units - a Control Unit and a Balloting Unit - joined by a five-meter cable. The Control Unit is with the Presiding Officer or a Polling Officer and the Balloting Unit is placed inside the voting compartment. Instead of issuing a ballot paper, the Polling Officer in-charge of the Control Unit will press the Ballot Button. This will enable the voter to cast his vote by pressing the blue button on the Balloting Unit against the candidate and symbol of his choice.



**Q14. How can I find out details of my Booth .**

**Ans.** You can find out entire details about your nearby polling Booth. Go to Link - on CEO Portal (Ceorajasthan.nic.in)- Select District (Jaipur)- Select Assembly Constituency

**Q15. How can I find out my name in Voterlist.**

**Ans.** You can find out your entire details in Voterlist by 2 ways:

1. By entering your voter Id card no. on CEO Portal (Ceorajastha.nic.in)
2. By entering your name, Gender and house no. Go to link- on CEO Portal (Ceorajastha.nic.in) - Search your name Voter list
