GOLDEN GRIZZLIES FAST BREAK

• Oakland accepted an invitation to join the Horizon League on May 7, 2013, with official membership starting July 1, 2013.

• The Golden Grizzlies made their fifth consecutive postseason appearance in 2012-13, falling to Youngstown State in the opening round of the *CollegeInsider.com* Postseason tournament.

• Oakland finished fourth in The Summit League standings at 10-6. The Golden Grizzlies have won 10 or more league games in seven straight seasons.

• For the seventh straight season, the Grizzlies won at least 10 home games, finishing 10-2 last season. OU is 59-9 (.868) over its last 68 games inside the O'rena.

BADER SHOOTS FOR NCAA RECORD

• Senior **Travis Bader** is just 101 3-pointers made from breaking former Duke standout J.J. Redick's all-time NCAA record of 457. He needs just 307 attempts to break the NCAA all-time record of 1,192 held by Saint Peter's Keydren Clark.

MEDIA INFORMATION**INTERVIEW GUIDELINES**

Oakland's practices are closed to the public and the media, but players and coaches are available on a daily basis after practice, either on the main floor or in the athletic department offices. All media wishing to attend practice, conduct interviews and shoot B-roll must contact **Scott MacDonald** in the Athletic Communications office prior to scheduled practices.

Media are asked not to contact players directly either by phone, facebook, twitter and e-mail. Every effort will be made to make players available when necessary. Players are off-limits on gamedays until after the contest.

CREDENTIALS

Press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Working space is limited, children, spouses and other non-workers will not be granted credentials or access to media areas. Requests for credentials should be made through e-mail at least 24 hours in advance of each game to Scott MacDonald (macdona2@oakland.edu). Passes will be left at WILL CALL, located just inside the loading dock doors of the Athletics Center, adjacent to the Lot 17 parking lot just outside the O'rena.

PARKING

A limited number of spaces in Lot 17 are made available to media on gameday. You must be granted permission by the athletic communications office prior to arriving to the game. All other lots on campus are open to the public on a first come, first serve basis.

PRESS ROW

Oakland has press seating available on the east side of the court in the O'rena. These seats are limited for use by the media and working staff only. Media overflow will be hosted on the west concourse level. Wireless internet is available and box scores will be passed out at each media timeout.

RELEASES/PHOTOS

All Oakland University basketball releases, game notes, and media advisories are distributed via e-mail to a list maintained by the athletic communications office. Media wishing to be added to this list should send a request to Scott MacDonald. Photographs are available upon request.

POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Greg Kampe and Oakland players will be made available after each home game in the media work room. If there is a request for visiting team coach and/or players, please let the athletic communications staff know at the under 8-minute media timeout of the 2nd half.

A NEW ERA BEGINS

▪ After 14 seasons of competition inside The Summit League, Oakland accepted an invitation to compete in the Horizon League, effective July 1, 2013. The Golden Grizzlies will be the ninth member in the top mid-major league, joining in-state foe Detroit, Cleveland State, Green Bay, Milwaukee, UIC, Valpo, Wright State and Youngstown State.

▪ OU is 22-47 all-time versus Horizon League opponents. The Golden Grizzlies defeated last year's regular season and tournament champion Valparaiso, 70-68, in the O'rena. Four straight games in the OU-Valpo series have come down to the final possession, and 17 of 22 have decided by single digits.

OAKLAND RANKS AMONG NATION'S BEST IN SCORING

▪ Only BYU has scored more points than the Golden Grizzlies over the last five years. The Golden Grizzlies have accumulated 13,686 points, averaging over 80 points per game.

FEBRUARY DOMINANCE

▪ Oakland is a remarkable **31-4** over the last five years in the month of February. The .886 winning percentage ranks second-best in the country, behind Weber State's .889 (32-4). Here is a list of the top records in the country in February since 2009:

DARTH BADER

▪ **Travis Bader** led the country with a Summit League and school record 139 3-pointers in 2012-13. Bader, a native of Okemos, Mich., has an all-time school record 357 triples, just 101 shy of breaking the NCAA all-time record held by Duke's J.J. Redick (2002-06). Bader was a finalist for the Lou Henson Award, given to the nation's top mid-major player and earned Mid-Major All-America honors, as well as All-Summit League and All-District first team accolades.

▪ Bader made a single-game school record 11 triples vs. IUPUI (1/24) to break his own record of 10 last year set vs. South Dakota State. He earned Capital One Performance of the Week for his 47-point effort vs. the

KAMPE REACHES MILESTONE

▪ **Greg Kampe** became the 21st active Division I coach to reach 500 wins in a 67-60 win over Western Illinois (1/26/13) on Homecoming inside the O'rena. Kampe, a native of Defiance, Ohio, is just the fifth active coach to win 500 games at one school (Mike Krzyzewski, Duke, Jim Boeheim, Syracuse, Rick Byrd, Belmont, Dave Bike, Sacred Heart).

THE DUKE OF D

▪ **Duke Mondy** led the country with 3.03 steals per game, tallying a school record 100 last season. Mondy, a transfer from Providence College, led the Big East in steals his sophomore season with 59 and led The Summit League last season after sitting out the 2010-11 year due to NCAA transfer rule. Mondy was named The Summit League Newcomer of the Year.

3-POINT STREAK

▪ Oakland has made at least one 3-pointer in 769 consecutive games. UNLV, Princeton and Vanderbilt are the only three schools to make at least one 3-pointer in every game since the inclusion of a three-point line in 1986-87. Western Carolina is the first intercollegiate school to make a 3-point field goal.

Rising seniors Travis Bader and Duke Mondy both battled their way up the statistical leaderboards, with Bader finishing fifth nationally in scoring (22.1 points per game) and Mondy leading the country at 3.0 steals a night.

In all, Oakland returns four starters, a group that also includes 6'10", 245-pound rebounding leader Corey Petros.

If its vaunted three-point shooting gets a little sharper this year—Mondy hit just .315 from deep, Ryan Bass .349—Oakland could be a giant-killer in March.

OAKLAND #141, 3RD IN HORIZON LEAGUE

Coach **Greg Kampe** is leading his Oakland program from The Summit League to the Horizon League this season. It is a great move for the school and the basketball team. It is easy to write off the Grizzlies as they move into what should be a tougher conference. They have a bunch of new teams to prepare for while the rest of the league just has one. But it is not Oakland who should be worried about the Horizon League...it is the Horizon League that should be worried about Oakland. And they should be worried about Coach Kampe doing the same thing he has always done, which is putting a solid team on the floor every season and getting more out of those players than just about anybody else could. Sooner or later Oakland will find their new home consistently atop the Horizon League standings and do not be surprised if sooner or later means March.

Who to Watch:

The hope is Hill will be in the mix with **Ryan Bass**, **Duke Mondy**, **Travis Bader**, **Corey Petros** and **Dante Williams** forming the likely starting five. Bass is an underappreciated scorer and ballhandler who averaged 9.3 points and 2.7 assists as a junior. Bass is understandably overlooked. Mondy, a transfer from Providence, averaged 12.0 points, 5.1 assists and 3.0 steals for the Grizzlies last season. His defensive effort gives opposing guards nightmares and he can make this high scoring offense look easy. Bader is the pure scorer of the bunch. One of the best three-point shooters in the collegiate ranks, Bader averaged 22.1 points per contest and connected on 4.2 three-pointers per contest. That is a lot of three-pointers. However, Bader has also been more aggressive attacking the basket and he will use his 6-5 frame to get to the basket and the charity stripe. Petros is the big body on the team. The 6-10 junior averaged 12.5 points and a team high 8.2 rebounds in 2012-2013 and is only getting better and stronger with time. However, Petros is not a shot blocking threat and that has been a huge problem for Oakland. The Grizzlies will go for steals and give up easy buckets that way, but the opposition still shot 49.3 percent against them last year. Somebody has to make it a little less easy for opponents to walk right up to the basket. Dante Williams was a part-time starter last season, filling in for Mondy or Bass when Coach Kampe needed a bigger starting five on the floor. He may play the role again if Hill is healthy enough to start.

Final Projection:

The lack of frontcourt depth means that players like Petros cannot afford to make opposing scorers earn their buckets. But there is some possible depth out there. **Raphael Carter**, a 6-9 senior, and **Lloyd Neely**, a 6-5 sophomore, have some experience. Neither will likely be ready to play 20 minutes per game, but they can at least play some tough defense every once in a while and eat up some fouls so Petros does not have to. If that depth comes around, the backcourt will be well rested down the stretch and the frontcourt can toughen up. Then the Grizzlies will be more than just a contender for a Horizon League title.

HEAD COACH GREG KAMPE

After 29 seasons at the helm, **Greg Kampe** has led the Golden Grizzlies to five consecutive postseason appearances and three NCAA tournaments (2005, '10, '11). Kampe became the fifth Division I active coach to win 500 games at one school and is No. 21 among active D-I coaches for victories. He has led OU to six Summit League titles in 14 seasons of competition and ranks third all-time in league victories with 147.

In January 2012, Kampe became part of the 25th Hall of Honor Class as he was inducted into the Hollie L. Lepley Hall of Honor. He was selected as one of the top 20 Mid-Major coaches in the country by Athlon Sports in the summer 2012.

After leading the basketball program to the top of Division II in the 90s, OU has become an elite program amongst Division I Mid-Majors, finishing inside the Mid-Major Top 10 in two of the last four seasons.

"We have a quality program that turns out talented student-athletes," Kampe said. "We try to do things the right way with good people who receive a good education and then go out into the world and have success after basketball. That's what our mission is."

THE COACH

"Consistency is the hallmark of success," says Coach Kampe. Something that he strongly believes and a motto that his programs have been following for years. He has led the Golden Grizzlies to 10 or more league wins in seven straight seasons and 10 of 14. The Grizzlies have won a Summit League-best 68 league games over the last five seasons, 13 more than the next closest conference school.

A five-time Summit League Coach of the Year (2000, '03, '06, '10, '11) and National Coach of the Year (2000) by CollegeInsider.com, Kampe's tenure ranks fourth amongst active D-I coaches, trailing only Syracuse's Jim Boeheim's 37 seasons for the Orange.

During a stretch from 2009-11, Oakland boasted the nation's best conference record at 34-2. The Golden Grizzlies are 70-18 over their last 88 games versus Summit League opponents.

MICHIGAN SUPREMACY

The Golden Grizzlies are 89-31 in league action over the last seven seasons for a .742 winning percentage, better than any other D-I school in the state of Michigan. Michigan State ranks second with a record of 82-40 (.672), followed by No. 3 Western Michigan (62-48/.564), No. 4 Michigan (62-60/.508), No. 5 Eastern Michigan (49-61/.445), No. 6 Detroit (52-70/.426) and No. 7 Central Michigan (46-64/.418).

DIVISION I SUCCESS

Four straight 20-win seasons (2008-12) and five straight postseason berths (2009-13), three NCAA tournaments (2005, '10, '11) and six Summit League championships in 14 seasons is not too bad for a coach that was hesitant when Oakland made the decision to move to Division I. Not too surprising from a coach who was coming off his best season and looked to be a national title contender in D-II that next season.

Instead, the Pioneers changed to the Golden Grizzlies and OU spent the 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons in transition. Then the unexpected happened, Coach Kampe led the newly Golden Grizzlies to the Mid-Continent Conference regular-season title in their first year of competition at 11-5. OU was not eligible for the Mid-Con Tournament that season.

In 2004-05, the Golden Grizzlies finished a sub-par season at 9-19 and 7-9 in league to finish in seventh place. As the No. 7 seed, Oakland upset No. 2 seed UMKC (67-63) and defeated Chicago State (56-53) before matching up with top-seeded Oral Roberts (25-7) in the championship game. Then Pierre Dukes made the shot heard round the world as time expired and sent Oakland to its first-ever Division I NCAA tournament with a 61-60 victory over the Golden Eagles. OU went on to defeat Alabama A&M (79-69) in the play-in game of the NCAA tournament in Dayton, Ohio, and then fell to eventual national champion North Carolina (96-68) in Charlotte, N.C.

The conference may have changed its name in 2007 to The Summit League, but that did not derail Coach Kampe and OU's success. The Grizzlies have appeared in Summit League title games in 4 of 6 seasons, capturing their most recent titles in 2010 and '11 in dominating fashion with six double-digit wins at the tournament and posted a 34-2 regular-season league record.

His teams have posted back-to-back league record 17-1 marks to set records in wins and winning percentage (.944) from 2009-11. Oakland won a program-best 26 games in 2009-10 and followed that up with a 25-10 mark in 2010-11. The Golden Grizzlies picked up their first-ever top 10 win at No. 7 Tennessee (89-82) on Dec. 14, 2010, catching headlines across the country.

OU suffered heartbreak in two games in 2008-09. After player of the year Ben Woodside lifted the Bison over Oakland (66-64) on a last-second 20-foot jumper with three seconds left in The Summit League championship game, the Golden Grizzlies were invited to the inaugural CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. OU defeated Kent State (80-74) at home in the opening round, but tasted defeat at the hands of another buzzer beater, this time from 75 feet as Bradley escaped with a 76-75

win in Peoria, Ill. OU finished the year 23-13.

The Grizzlies posted a 19-14 record in 2006-07 and once again suffered heartbreak in the league tournament title game. ORU exacted some revenge as the top two seeds battled in the championship game, this time with OU's Erik Kangas missing an attempt at winning the game with seconds remaining from three, eventually falling 71-67.

After a disappointing 17-14 regular season where the Grizzlies finished third in the standings, OU surrendered an 11-point lead with just over 1 minute remaining in the quarterfinals of the league tournament and fell to Southern Utah. The Golden Grizzlies accepted a bid to compete in the CIT tournament and made a nice run to the semifinals. Oakland broke The Summit League record with three postseason wins and eventually fell to Utah State on the road. Reggie Hamilton became the first scoring champion in The Summit League, finishing at 26.2 points per game.

PRODUCING TOP PLAYERS

Under Kampe's direction, 27 players have went on to play professionally overseas, including two in the NBA; Rawle Marshall played with the Dallas Mavericks (2005-06) and Indiana Pacers (2006-07), while Keith Benson became the first-ever OU player to be drafted as he was selected 48th overall by the Atlanta Hawks in the 2011. He finished as a two-time Summit League Player of the Year and two-time Associated Press All-American and played with the Golden State Warriors (2012).

Brian Gregory (1987-90) continues to hold the all-time school record in assists for a career, season and single-game, and has now moved on to be a very successful coach at the collegiate ranks. Gregory worked under Tom Izzo at Michigan State, took over the University of Dayton program where he led the Flyers to an NIT title and three NCAA tournaments, has most recently been named as head coach at Georgia Tech in March 2011.

A TRADITION IS BORN

Kampe joined the Oakland University campus in 1984 after spending six seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Toledo. OU had only six winning seasons in 16 years of competition before his arrival.

After two disappointing seasons where Coach Kampe was trying to build a winner, the Pioneers busted on to the national scene in 1986-87 where Oakland went 20-8. Winning seasons continued to ensue for the final 11 of D-II and OU appeared in four consecutive NCAA Regionals, advancing to the Sweet Sixteen in 1996-97, ending with a then school record 24-7 season. OU captured Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) titles in the final two seasons (1995-96, '96-97) and Kampe led the Pioneers to six 20-win seasons during the D-II campaign.

Darren Sorenson enters his seventh season as men's basketball assistant coach. He primarily works with the back and frontcourts, along with handling scout team responsibilities.

OU has reached new heights since Sorenson's arrival in 2007. The Golden Grizzlies won back-to-back Summit League regular season and tournament championships (2009-11), along with consecutive trips to the NCAA tournament (2010, '11). Oakland has reached the postseason in five straight seasons and won 127 games, its greatest six-year stretch.

He owns a wide variety of experience in the coaching ranks, having worked under Stan Heath (Arkansas), Steve Lavin (UCLA), Lefty Driesell (Georgia State) and Mike LaPlante (Jacksonville State). Including OU coach Greg Kampe, the last five head coaches Sorenson has worked for have accumulated an amazing 1,723 wins, an average of 345.

During his time as an assistant coach, Sorenson has coached two conference players of the year, 16 1,000-point scorers and 22 all-conference players. He has guided three All-Americans, one Mid-Major Player of the Year and an NCAA assists champion and NCAA steals champion. Sorenson has seen four players drafted in to the NBA during his coaching days in the last six NBA drafts. In the last seven seasons on the sidelines, Sorenson's teams have made four championship game appearances and been to the postseason in 6-of-7 years.

Over that span of six years, his teams have won an average of 21 games per season. Keith Benson and Derick Nelson were each named Summit League Tournament MVP during his tenure at Oakland and both are currently playing professional basketball. A total of eight players have gone on to play professional basketball that worked under Sorenson's tutelage.

Among his many accomplishments, two players have been named Sixth Man of the Year in The Summit League and SEC. OU reached 20 or more wins in four consecutive seasons from 2008-12, the first time the Golden Grizzlies have accomplished that feat. Recent recruit Duke Mondy was named The Summit League Newcomer of the Year in 2013 and led the country in steals.

Sorenson comes to OU after spending the previous five seasons at the University of Arkansas as the Director of Basketball Operations and served as assistant coach. With the Razorbacks, his responsibilities included scouting, budgeting and equipment, video coordination, direction of the program's summer camp schedule, along with individual instruction and recruiting.

Prior to Oakland and Arkansas, Sorenson spent one season (2001-02) at Jacksonville State as the Director of Basketball Operations while also completing his master's work in general studies.

In 2001 he was presented with the opportunity to work as the head coach of the Qatar Junior National Team while also serving as an assistant on the national squad. The national team went undefeated and won the country's fist championship in the Gulf Coast Countries Tournament. The squad also won the under-21 Asian Championship and was one of 12 countries to qualify for the world championships in Japan.

Before Jacksonville State, Sorenson spent one season at Georgia State (1999-00) and UCLA (1998-99). He began his collegiate coaching career at his alma mater Mount Senario College (1996-97 - 1997-98).

While serving as the top assistant coach, Sorenson earned his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration in 1995 at Mount Senario.

Saddi Washington enters his eighth season with the program, and first as Associate Head Coach with men's basketball staff at Oakland. Washington primarily works with the guards for the Golden Grizzlies.

Washington is responsible for brining some of the best recruits in the backcourt to Oakland. Under his tenure, OU's Johnathon Jones led the country with 8.1 assists per game in 2008-09 and became the first NCAA statistical champion in Golden Grizzlies history. Travis Bader was next in line by leading the country with a Summit League record 139 3-pointers in 2012-13. Finally, Duke Mondy earned NCAA champion recognition when he finished the 2012-13 season with a school record 100 steals. Oakland was the first team in league history to have a pair of NCAA statistical champions in the same season.

Jones developed in to one of the finest point guards in Summit League history, setting a new all-time league record with 819 assists. Jones finished as a two-time Mid-Major All-American and All-Summit League first team selection. Bader, a Mid-Major Player of the Year finalist, was a first team all-league selection and Mondy garnered all-league second team accolades in 2013.

Another sharpshooter under Washington was Erik Kangas who ranked fourth in the country with 3.9 treys per game, earning all-league honors for the second time during his senior campaign in 2008-09. He set the single-season Summit League record with 135 triples made in 2008-09, a record that is now held by current standout Bader.

Reggie Hamilton was the latest sensational guard for OU, becoming the first Summit League player to lead the country in scoring at 26.2 points per game. Hamilton was a two-time All-Summit League selection and a Mid-Major All-American. He is the third straight guard to reach the professional ranks during Washington's tenure.

Washington brings plenty of playing experience to the Golden Grizzlies staff, with seven years of professional competition under his belt. He was the No. 1 overall draft pick in the Continental Basketball Association in 1998 by the Grand Rapids Hoops and has played overseas in Italy, France, Greece and Israel. In 2001 he was a member of the Detroit Dogs of the ABA that won the leagues inaugural title. He has also been at NBA preseason camps with a number of teams, including the Utah Jazz, Denver Nuggets and Atlanta Hawks.

A 1998 graduate of Western Michigan University with a degree in business/marketing, Washington was inducted into his alma mater's Hall of Fame in the fall 2010. In 1994 he was named to the Mid-American Conference all-freshman team after averaging 14.0 points per game. A two-time All-MAC selection, he was a first team pick after his senior season in 1998 after scoring 626 points, averaging 21.6 per game. He helped lead the Broncos to the NCAA tournament that season where they upset Clemson in the first round.

A native of Lansing, Mich., Washington attended Sexton High School where he was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and track, receiving all-state recognition in both sports in 1993. He and his wife Channon reside in Waterford with their daughter Sidney and son Caleb.

Tom Ford joined the athletic department in 1987. Ford serves as associate athletic trainer and assists with the day-to-day operations of the sports medicine program.

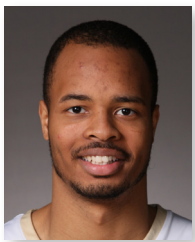

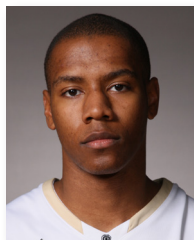
