Typhoon "YOLANDA" has accelerated and intensified slightly as it continues to threaten Eastern Visayas.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from 10.0-30.0 mm per hour (Heavy - Intense) within the 600 km diameter of the Typhoon.
- Sea travel is risky over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and over the eastern seaboard of Central Luzon
- Residents in low lying and mountainous areas under signal \#4, \#3, \#2 \& \#1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides. Likewise, those living in coastal areas under signal \#4, \#3 and \#2 are alerted against storm surges which may reach up to 7 -meter wave height.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions - evacuation rather than rescue.

Let us untiringly aim for zero casualties.
