Intercollegiate Athletics

1. The first intercollegiate contest was a baseball game against Redfield College in 1893, which ended up in a tie.
2. The first intercollegiate football game was played in 1897 against Yankton College, which ended up in a 40-12 defeat for DWU. This started the long rivalry between the two schools.
3. The next year, 1898, Dakota Wesleyan played two football games, beating Sioux Falls High School and Yankton College.
4. In 1899, the university had its first football coach and ended up with a 4-1 season.
5. In 1917, intercollegiate basketball made its debut at Dakota Wesleyan. Basketball was played before that time beginning in 1910; however, due to the lack of a facility, games were mostly intramural and against some high schools.
6. Dakota Wesleyan initiated their first track season in 1894. Track was quite different then as tennis and bicycle races were part of each meet.
7. Although baseball was the first intercollegiate game, only football, basketball and track have remained as annual athletic sports each year.
8. Baseball has been played off and on through the years at DWU. A popular sport in the early days of athletics, it dropped out of existence during the mid-20s. It returned for one year in 1956 and again in 1969. It was tried again in 1971, but only lasted a few years until resurfacing again in 1981 to the present.
9. Wrestling was started as an intercollegiate sport in 1963 and was continued until 1971. After a 23-year absence, wrestling returned to the campus in 1994.
10. In 1974, volleyball became the university's first women's intercollegiate conference sport.
11. The following year, 1975, women's intercollegiate basketball was started.
12. Women's softball began in 1976 and remained until 1984, then returned in 1995.
13. Women's intercollegiate track and cross country began in 1977.
14. All women's athletics at the university became members of the NAIA in 1980.
15. Golf and tennis have been intercollegiate sports for many years dating back to the early 1900s; however, they have appeared and disappeared many times since that time.
16. Women's intercollegiate soccer was attempted in the fall of 1995, but was cancelled due to lack of participants. Dakota Wesleyan began the men's and women's soccer programs when Si Tanka University closed. Si Tanka's soccer programs, along with some of its players, transferred to DWU in 2005.
17. The university has had other intercollegiate athletic teams such as tumbling, swimming and field hockey through the years, although they have never been recognized as a conference sport.

Athletic Conferences

1. In 1893, the first regulatory athletic body, the Intercollegiate Amateur Athletic Association of South Dakota, was formed in South Dakota by representatives from Vermillion, Yankton, Sioux Falls and Mitchell.
2. In the late 1800s and early 1900s, there was no conference. Teams in the state were declared South Dakota state champions depending on their win-loss record against each other.
3. Shortly after the turn of the century, area colleges from South Dakota, North Dakota and Minnesota formed the Minnesota-Dakota Conference. It was short-lived because of the travel distance and lack of gate receipts.
4. In 1917, representatives from area colleges met in Mitchell and on Sept. 24 formed the South Dakota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The charter members were Dakota Wesleyan University, Huron College, Sioux Falls College, Yankton College, South Dakota School of Mines and Northern Normal. The number was brought to 10 with the addition of Augustana, Eastern Normal (Madison), Southern Normal and Spearfish Normal. Columbus College and Redfield College were members for a brief time.
5. The South Dakota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference remained a 10-team conference until 1940. At that time the church-related colleges dropped out to form a new conference called the South Dakota College Conference. The reason for withdrawal was economic.
6. In the mid-40s, DWU joined the Dakota-Iowa Conference.
7. Beginning with the 1948-49 season, DWU was admitted back into the SDIC, playing in both that conference and the Dakota-Iowa Conference.
8. With the start of the 1949-50 season, DWU remained a member only of the SDIC.
9. Augustana dropped out of the SDIC in 1949, making it a nine-team conference until 1960 when Yankton and Sioux Falls dropped out to join the newly formed Tri-State Conference.
10. The SDIC was then composed of seven schools until Northern dropped out in 1974.
11. The conference had six members until 1977 when Sioux Falls rejoined. Yankton rejoined in 1981 bringing the total to eight.
12. After the closures of Yankton College and USD-Springfield in 1984, the conference dropped to the six teams that remained until 1995.
13. In the fall of 1995, the SDIC became the South Dakota-Iowa Conference with the addition of Mount Marty, Westmar College and Dordt College. These additions made the SDIC a nine-team conference once again, until Westmar closed at the end of the 1997 football season.
14. In the fall of 2000, DWU, along with the University of Sioux Falls, Dordt and Mount Marty, left the SDIC and joined the Great Plains Athletic Conference.
15. Beginning with the 2007 season, wrestling became an official GPAC sport. The GPAC is the first NAIA conference to offer wrestling as a sanctioned sport.
16. In July 2010, Dana College closed its doors, bringing the total count of GPAC schools to 12.

Blue & White Days

The first Blue & White Days event was held Oct. 18, 1913, and was actually called Wesleyan College Day. Its first purpose was to settle questions of class supremacy. The activities were football and basketball between the four classes.

The second Blue & White Days event was held Oct. 15, 1914. This event inaugurated Blue & White Days as the official name, which has lasted throughout DWU history. A tug of war was initiated as an activity during this year's event.

The first intercollegiate football game to become part of the Blue & White Days weekend was Oct. 16, 1916, against Nebraska Wesleyan who defeated the Tigers 21-0. Football has been a part of Blue & White Days ever since that day.
