## The Women's Ashes Trophy Made in Kyneton



The England Cricket Board and the Australian Cricket jointly commissioned Flynn Silver, the Flynn Brothers Dan and John, to create a trophy that will celebrate the past and future of the women's Ashes between Australia and England.

The series was first played in 1934 and was the first Women's test series.

It only became officially known as the Ashes in 1998 when an autographed bat was burnt before the first test at Lords.

Those ashes are within a fragile timber cricket ball, which is now housed within the safety of nine golden stumps crowned with the crests of English and Australian Cricket.

Each disc, on the base, holds the outcome of the past 17 series played so far with space till 2030.

Local Kyneton expertise used in the creation of this Trophy included: Con Tsoukas from Sharp Pixel graphics, Grahame Brown from Turner Brothers, Dan Vereker from Vereker Brothers and Kyneton Engineering & Hydraulics'.

#### **CEO Statement on Volunteers**

The Macedon Ranges Shire Council CEO has provided the statement below:

#### **Our Valued Volunteers**

Macedon Ranges Shire Council highly values its 500+ community minded volunteers and, prior to the issue appearing in the media, had decided to increase the travel reimbursement rate for volunteers from \$0.50c per km to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) rate of \$0.75c per km.

The decision to increase the rate was made as part of a broader review of how we recognise and support our volunteers. As part of this audit, the travel rate was reviewed in October 2012 and an increase factored into the 2013/14 budget process. The rate will continue to increase in line with the ATO rate.

Council recognises that volunteers generously donate their time and use their own vehicle. This is why we offer an optional allowance for travel which, unlike staff reimbursements, organisations that engage volunteers are not legally obligated to provide.

Mr Neil Hirt has been a valued Council volunteer over many years and did not agree with Council's travel reimbursement amount. We respect Mr Hirt's opinion, and have sought to meet with him to discuss the possibility of his continued volunteering support.

It is unfortunate that recent media coverage relating to one volunteer may cloud anyone's thinking of the fantastic partnership that exists between Council, its volunteers and our community. We are very grateful for the contribution made by our volunteers in providing services to residents. Please be assured of our continued, extremely high regard for our volunteers.

The community is more than halfway to the \$20,000 target set by the Council as its target towards restoration of the Bluestone Theatre. The \$20,000 target for community fundraising is only a small percentage of the total needed for the refurbishment of the Theatre. With the Macedon Ranges Shire Council budgeting \$90,000 and nearly \$200,000 being applied for from the Victorian Government Putting Locals First program.

#### Editorial

The statement published on this page from Macedon Ranges Shire CEO Peter Johnston which acknowledges that recently dismissed volunteer Neil Hirt has been a valued Council volunteer, that his opinion is respected and that a meeting has been sought with him to discuss the possibility of his continued volunteering support, is welcome.

The dismissal of Mr Hirt for publicly criticising the Council had drawn an unprecedented volume of protests from residents across the Shire.

Whilst the service given to ratepayers by Council staff is well regarded, many citizens who seek to have input into Council decision making have a perception of lack of respect for their views, experience and expertise.

The CEO's statement is a first step towards a more constructive and inclusive approach to the input of the residents of the Shire.

#### 8 Mollison Place to be Sold

Cobaw Community Health has decided to sell its 8 Mollison Place Kyneton property.

The sale will affect the Men's Shed and the services to people with a disability and older members of the community provided by the Social Support and Respite (SSR) program from the building at 8 Mollison Place.

The SSR service recently went through an extensive review process that helped identify ways to improve programs and the experiences of people who use them and ensure Cobaw meets changing government policy requirements.

One of the key outcomes included better supporting people to build stronger connections with their communities, and to have a greater focus on independence and skill development. Cobaw thinks that the best next step is to move away from having a separate facility used exclusively by Cobaw's programs, and towards using the usual community spaces that everyone uses. This transition to the use of community venues will commence over the coming months.

Another challenge faced by Cobaw was the extensive capital works required Mollison Place for it to meet current food safety and disability standards. Whilst currently licensed, at least \$85,000 would be required in the next 12 months to improve the facility. The property will be put up for sale by tender in the next month.

The Board of Cobaw is committed to seeing the Men's Shed continue in a new location.

"Cobaw values the important service the Men's Shed offers to the local community and recognises the significance of the Men's Shed to those who currently participate" CEO Anne McLennan said.

The sale of Mollison Place also means establishing a new office base for the SSR team, which includes 10 people (approximately 6 employed full time). Options are currently being explored. Cobaw Community Health was established in 1986 with 3 staff offering one program and now offers more than 20 programs run by 90 workers.



#### Indian Myna - Major Problem

Indian Myna's, introduced in the late 1800's to control insect pests in sugar cane and horticultural crops have become Australia's most invasive bird species.

Indian Mynas move into native habitat in small groups and fiercely defend their 'new' territory, displacing possums, sugar gliders, parrots, rosellas, lorikeets from their nests and hollows.

A recent eradication program in Canberra saw 18,000 birds trapped in a single year. Melbourne is similarly affected and Kyneton is not exempt with increasing numbers along Black Hill Road, Three Chain Road, Pipers Creek Road and open land on the fringes of residential areas where preferred food supply is plentiful. Pipers Creek Landcare is keen to involve local residents in an awareness/ trapping program and can hire out traps for a nominal fee to members. Peter Sporle



#### **New Local Law on Exhibition**



A new local law for the Macedon Ranges, now on public exhibition, proposes new or revised controls around open air burning, the keeping of animals, septic tank maintenance, and shipping containers on residential land.

After the formal exhibition period and hearing of public submissions, it is anticipated the law will come into operation on I October 2013.

Among the proposed changes are the requirement for a permit to burn on land less than 4,000 square metres, and more stringent requirements around the maintenance of septic tanks in an effort to minimise odour, discharge and damage to the environment.

New limits have been introduced for keeping roosters (prohibited on land less than 4,000 square metres), pigs (prohibited on land less than 10,000 square metres) and farm animals (prohibited on land less than 2,000 square metres).

There will be a new permit requirement for the placement of a shipping container on any land in a township for longer than 6 months, and tighter controls around unsightly buildings which are not adequately maintained.

All residents are encouraged to view a copy of the draft documents at www.mrsc.vic.gov.au or any of Council's service centres. Submissions will be accepted until 12noon on Wednesday 4 September.
