Dear Parents, Guardians, Teachers and Children,

After a year of discussion and thought by many people, the College Board has agreed to names for our four Houses. The Houses will be the same colours, but they will each have a name that honours and remembers some of the people who were the founders of St Joseph's in 1917.

The names of the Houses will be: CARTHAGE, named after Sister Mary CARTHAGE olsh, the first Head of St. Joseph's when it was started as a school for the children of expatriate public servants in Musgrave Street in Port Moresby town. (Green House).

MARCELLA, named after Sister Mary MARCELLA olsh, who worked with Sister Carthage and taught at St. Joseph's for many years in the 1920's. (Gold House).

CHEVALIER, named after Fr Jules CHEVALIER msc who started the olsh Sisters and sent Sisters to work in Papua New Guinea in the 1880's (Red House).


HARTZER, named after Sister Marie Louise HARTZER, who together with Fr Chevalier founded the Daughters of our Lady of the Sacred Heart (olsh) and with him sent these Sisters to work in Papua New Guinea. (Blue House).

At the beginning of 2013 we will also re-organise and rename all Classes. What are now called Prep A and Prep B....up to Grade 10 A and 10 B will be renamed using an acronym of the founders. Chevalier House and Hartzer House (red and blue) students will be in one class while Carthage House and Marcella House (Green and Gold) will be in the other class.

This re-organisation of Classes will mean some students move from their present Class to the other one; and some few students will need to change their House. We have had unbalanced numbers of boys and girls in some Houses for many years and this makes it very difficult for children to compete fairly at different House sports etc.

Hopefully the new Class lists will be available by Recognition Day; giving those few parents time to purchase new coloured Sports shirts if their child is changing houses.

The new Houses will be named and celebrated at the opening Mass of the school year in 2013.

These phones continue to be misused and demonstrate to us the lack of support from parents who continue to allow their children to bring phones to school without informing the administration. We would like to think that all our parents are supportive of the rules and guidelines we have so that we all can work together for the good of the students. Continuous breach and disregard of our college rules such as mobile phone ban may result in your child's cancellation of re-enrolment in 2013.

The College will also reconsider re-enrolment of these children in 2013 if the acceptance of enrolment terms and conditions continue to be breached in such circumstances.

The counseling support has assisted us very much with student behaviour and management. This service was concluded last week and will resume again in 2013. These devices are not encouraged to be brought to the College unless properly organized by subject and homeroom teachers if and when there is a need. Punctuality
