Vice President of the Autonomous Province of Trento Minister for Public Works, Environment and Transport



Born in Trento on Aug 27th 1956, Alberto grew up in the San Giuseppe area of Trento. He is married to Paola, and they have two children, Massimo and Andrea.

A graduate of Sociology, he then went on to specialise in Psycotherapy in Milan and for 15 years he worked for the Drug Addition Service (SERT) and worked as a freelance psychologist.

In 1990, he began his political career, serving from 1990-1993 as a Councillor and in 1993 he was nominated Minister for Social Policy.

In 1995 he also took on the role of Vice mayor, and on October 2nd 1998, following the resignation of Lorenzo Dellai, he became Mayor.

Alberto's career as Mayor thus began in May 1999, leading a centre-left coalition. In the elections the citizens of Trentino voted in favour with a 69.33% majority.

In the Council elections of May 8th 2005, he was re-elected with a majority of 64.33%.

Following his centre-left ('Ulivista') convictions, this political path led him to be elected on June 8th 2008 as Secretary of the Democratic Party in Trentino and today to be a front runner in the project to open a new political way in the government of the Province.
