

His obsession with color and content has led The Global Arts Group down a path in which it produces products for many other well-known art publishers as well as some of the most respected museums in the world.

#### **Jeff Jaffe**

Hailing originally from Johannesburg, South Africa, Jeff Jaffe left that turbulent country at the end of 1979, choosing exile and uncertainty over a privileged life in an unjust and otherwise brutal society. He studied art and languages in Israel, Europe and the USA, finally earning his MFA in sculpture from the Cranbrook Academy of Art in Michigan in 1986. Upon his return to New York City he began pursuing his career as an art dealer. Working his way up through a few gallery organizations, which he likes to refer to as "the boot camp of the art world," along with his business partner of 13 years, Rick Rounick, Jeff started Pop International Galleries – aka The Pop Gallery, in SoHo, New York City in 1997. Pop International is a highly visible and successful art gallery specializing in pop art and art and photography influenced and inspired by popular culture. Jeff resides with his wife and two gorgeous children in New York City.

#### Joshua Kaufman
















### FREE ARTS DAY TO BENEFIT NYC YOUTH

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
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

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

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# #1 URBAN-INSPIRED

Now more than ever, the lines between streets and studios blur—as artists take art to the streets, and street scenes to the canvas. At this year's Artexpo, you'll find an innovative array of artful cityscapes, graffiti-inspired abstracts and everyday urban scenes.

#### Welcome to the Inside Alex White Mazzarella Booth #644



My recent paintings are voyages through everyday observations in New York City. Their creation has come through an abandonment of "decision making" and reliance upon transmission through instinct. I am using pastels, charcoal, acrylic, coffee, spray paint, enamel and collage to create through spontaneity. Brooklyn-based Alex White Mazzarella's work has been inspired largely by street art and by the likes of Kirchner, Appel, Miro, Clemente, Basquiat, Avery, Pollock, Tapies and William Blake.

Self-taught in principle, he has studied under Larry Poons, Frank O'Cain and Phillip Sherrod at the Art Students League and continues to work with Hugo Bastidas. He has been exhibiting his work in New York since early 2009, after being discovered by Richard Temperio of the Sideshow Gallery in Williamsburg Brooklyn.

### Numbers Sun Ou Published by Louie Art Space Booth #936



Artist Sun Ou joins us this year from Beijing, where he is an Associate Professor at the Beijing Central Fine Arts Academy in Environmental and City Design Department. With a background in architecture, Sun Ou has designed numerous buildings all across China. His intriguing paintings range from bold and robust to dark and pensive, and are often

Born in Lisbon, Portugal, Miguel immigrated to Toronto, where he studied the fine arts, explored photography and then ventured into the design industry. His success as a designer and illustrator eventually led him to positions working as Art Director for companies both in Canada and Europe. He has been painting full time since 2004. His unusual use of mixed media and subject matter are a perfect marriage, each painting telling a story, drawing you closer and inviting you to touch its textured surface.

Born in Chisinau, Moldova, Victor Nemo immigrated to Toronto, Canada, where he now lives and paints. A lover of travel, Nemo uses the discovery and excitement of new places as a springboard for his imaginative cityscapes. His international cityscape series displays an innovative style that combines photography, printing and painting. After printing and pasting his photographs, he then paints with acrylics and glazes to construct a fused,

### New Generation Ferjo Published by Katherina Perry, Inc. Booths #601 & #603



Whether Ferjo is representing automobiles or portraits, still life arrangements or sports events, imaginary or lifelike portraits, there is convincing evidence of his technical talent. There is also evidence of the artist's versatile and shifting imagination, as he moves with considerable agility from one motive to another—often—shifting styles in the process.

Brazilian-born artist Fernando de Jesus Oliveira (a.k.a. Ferjo) has become one of most versatile and commercially successful artists in recent history. He is known worldwide for his ability to paint realistically and then extend that realism into near-hallucinogenic surrealist visions filled with symbolic connotations. A master of dimension and perspective, Ferjo is published by Katherina Perry, Inc., an esteemed art publisher in Forest Hill, NY.

### *i-Pop*Craig Alan Published by Deljou Art Group Booths #501 & #507



California-born artist Craig Alan exhibits his artwork across the United States, where he has established himself as a singular voice in the visual arts industry. His collections run the gamut from abstract expressionism to haunting graphic realism, each one a reflection of his unique vision. Craig's creations offer a blending of disparate influences and media, demonstrating a broad knowledge and appreciation of the human form—as well as the colorful world these beings occupy. His prolific career is a culmination of both textbook artistic knowledge and a keen aesthetic sense. ### Art Deco J. Scott Nicol Published by Discovery Galleries Booth #820



With a nod to Pop Art, realism and Art Deco, Virginia-based artist J. Scott Nicol transforms the common still life into vivid, photo-realistic homages to the performing arts. At once iconic and contemporary, each of J. Scott's paintings is executed with intricate detail and composed of the highest-quality materials.

J. Scott has been a successful artist for more than 28 years. His greatest inspiration is his grandfather, who was a commercial artist and plein air painter. "Each year we would vacation at my grandparent's house," J. Scott remembers, "I would sneak up to the attic and look at the stacks of paintings. Although I never met my grandfather, I would sit at his easel and pretend to paint... I still have some of my grandfather's oil paints and use a little in each of my paintings. It is my way of thanking him for inspiring me to become the artist I am today." J. Scott is published by Discovery Galleries, the premier art gallery in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area.

Russian artist Vadim Hlopetsky paints with a clarity and precision that renders his work so real it borders on hyperrealism. Born in Rubtsovsk, he studied at both the Stroganov Industrial Art University in Moscow and the State Institute of Cinematography. While he opted not to pursue a career in film, Vadim's love of film and cinema nonetheless reveal themselves on his dramatic, theatrical canvases. Preferring creative solitude, he seldom participates in exhibitions-nonetheless, many of his works are in private collections in Russia and abroad. Vadim is published by Scottsdale, AZ-based Arcana Gallery, which specializes in the work of talented Russian and American artists.

### Soldier Shen Jingdong Published by Louie Art Space Booth #936



With their bright colors and softened features, the subjects in Shen Jingdong's "Hero" series hold a simplicity that belies their deeper narrative. Charming and cartoonish at first glance, these paintings and porcelain figures speak both to the conformity required by war, and the human fragility that lies beneath every uniform. Born in China in 1965, Shen Jingdong spent 17 years in the Nanjing Military, which laid the foundation for his work today. Shen is published by Louie Art Space, a Beijing gallery that specializes in paintings, water colors, and sculptures by Chinese Avante-Garde artists.

Scaffolding, concrete landscapes and factories in the distance dominate the surreal yet sublime landscape where the human figure becomes an object, an acrobat trying to hold on to the last essence of life. Dash's paintings and videos are an examination of the destruction wrought by urbanization and globalization on both the natural landscape and the human psyche. He has exhibited widely around the world and is represented by NYC-based Tamarind Gallery, a major advocate of contemporary Indian art.

### **Bug's Funeral Boris Zoubkous Booth #S218**





He lives and paints in New York City and has won numerous awards for his work.

### #4 COLORFUL ABSTRACTIONS

### Before Genesis II Aleah Koury Published by Slaymaker Fine Art Booths #609 & #613



An impressionist with a contemporary flair, Aleah Koury paints lush gardens, abstracted landscapes and compelling, geometric abstractions. A widely successful artist, he stumbled upon his passion in the arts while studying biology at the University of Missouri. Needing a fine arts class to fulfill his degree requirements, Aleah chose a painting class. Upon completion of the course, he asked his professor if she believed he had enough talent to change his major and pursue a career in the arts. In spite of her negative response, he went on to obtain a BA in ceramics and an MFA in Printmaking from the University of Southern Illinois. Since 1978, he has been showing in galleries and exhibitions nationwide. Aleah is published by Slaymaker Fine Art, a well-known gallery in Chicago, Illinois.

### Ocean 1 Damon La Scala Studio La Scala Booth #620



My philosophy is letting the art control my mind. Giving my hand the brush and letting my mind create what is to become. A philosophy from the subconscious mind creating a vision that is mesmerizing when you walk into an interior.

Denver-based artist Damon La Scala has been providing original art to Interior Designers since 1997. Working with Todd Sheehan and Accessory Warehouse, LLC, La Scala has created an endless amount of art created exclusively for custom interiors. Damon creates works on canvas, metal, bamboo, paper collage and a variety of other materials, but his most popular work involves reverse painting on plexiglass. This technique creates a three-dimensional effect under a glass-like finish, often mistaken for resin. He explains: "When I paint on plexiglass, it is a reverse painting. The foreground gets painted before the background, which keeps me exploring and creating new perspectives."

### Grunge II Candamil Published by Charles Harold Company Booth #1122



In the graffiti-esque appearance of his organically textured surfaces, Candamil reveals the influence of his urban youth. Born in Colombia, he was unable to afford a formal arts education, and shortly after high school moved to New York City, where he did odd jobs during the week and sold his art on Greenwich sidewalks over the weekend. Today, Candamil is a successful artist published by Charles Harold Company, a Tampa-based gallery that offers innovative original art from around the world.

Candamil's compositions have a definitively geometric structure that simultaneously incorporates an asymmetry which creates the impression of movement. As an artist, Candamil's proclaimed goal is to innovate upon established formulae until he creates something, "truly new and original."



As always, cutting-edge sculptures abound at Artexpo; and this year, metal works seem to be a particularly predominant theme. Whether working with bronze, copper, silver or aluminum, the following artists each artfully reinvent their medium – and the genre of sculpture itself.

### *Aporia*Nicholas Yust Booth #S244



I typically begin developing a new

sculpture by mentally generating a shape, curve or object. From this, I evolve a unique creation of energetic flowing lines accompanied with vibrant colors or reflection. Ultimately, the sculpture comes to life when the grinder meets the metal.

High-end modern metal artist Nicholas Yust creates widely acclaimed large-scale abstract metal wall hangings, free-standing sculptures and signs. With a background in both the arts and engineering, the Cincinnati-based artist brings a unique aesthetic to the world of sculpture.

Nicholas first began exploring metal art while working for the United States Air Force. After designing an experimental electro-polishing fixture, he started experimenting with bending, cutting and grinding decorative aluminum panels. He went on to invent an atomized acrylic painting process for metal and remains the only metal artist today to use this technique. Nicholas has exhibited widely and has commissioned monumental designs for multiple corporations and restaurants.

### Rhythm of Silence Daryl G. Colburn Booth #S127



Daryl G. Colburn, nationally acclaimed non-ferrous metal sculptor, has been working with copper, bronze and silver throughout an impressive three-decade career. A self-taught artist, Daryl has proved to be a pioneer in the art of metal sculpture, mastering techniques such as fusion, patinas, overlays, brazing, reticulation and soldering. He is constantly exploring new techniques; including fusing metals previously thought to be impossible to combine. With an oxygen acetylene torch, hands,

heart and hammer, he yields one-of-a-kind sculptures and two-dimensional copper wall hangings, which embody his passion for life and his quest for God. Daryl's extraordinary talent and artistic vision have earned national recognition and a client base spanning the globe.

### **Defense**Peter Decamp Haines Booth #644



I am a maker of objects, and the object itself is the main idea in my sculpture.

Peter Decamp Haines is a contemporary American sculptor best known for his "Artifacts" sculptures – pure forms favoring geometry, the compound curve, negative space and clean silhouettes. He also creates more constructivist works – complex compositions that use the pure elements of his previous work as building blocks. Peter's striking bronze sculptures range from tools to architecture to stylized animals and humans, in total, comprising a "personal archaeology." His work is a continuing exploration of the formal attributes of sculpture: form, scale, negative space, composition.

Peter is a graduate of the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, a founding member of the Boston Sculptors Gallery and a co-founder of the Vermont Gentlemen's Foundry. His studio is in Cambridge, MA.

### Longing Bill Mack Published by Erin Taylor Editions Booth #602



Bill Mack's dramatic portrayals of the human form are executed in a wide variety of materials—from bonded bronze and sand to metal from the original Hollywood sign. Combining low and high relief elements, incised lines and elements of full-round sculpture, Bill directly involves the viewer in a 3-dimensional experience that is at once textural, tactile and often startlingly real.


"Mack's art elicits an immediate emotional response," notes one critic. "A moment in time is stopped, a familiar face revealed, the grace of a body in motion captured."

For more than 35 years, Bill has been creating exquisite sculptures in relief and in the round for corporate, private and government collections. His art hangs in galleries in four continents and he has exhibited throughout the world. His work is in the collections of President Clinton and former presidents Ford and Reagan, actors Sylvester Stallone, Elizabeth Taylor and Tony Curtis—to name a few. ### Trio Hamilton Aguiar Published by Nan Miller Gallery Booth #1123



The composition of Hamilton Aguiar's paintings is inspired by the changing seasons of natural landscapes, which he interprets in a powerfully monochromatic style. In his current work, Aguiar applies silver leaf over the entire background of his linen canvases and then creates washes and shadows with oil paint. The images radiate a dramatic light caused by the interaction between the richness of the oils and the mercurial nature of the silver.

Born in Belo Horizonte, Brazil, Hamilton moved to the United States in 1987 to pursue his passion for art. During his many years of studying art and working in art restoration, Aguiar began to explore various painting techniques and develop his own signature style.

Hamilton Aguiar's art is acquired by numerous private collectors and represented by many prestigious galleries across the United States. He is published by Nan Miller Gallery, a Rochester-based gallery that has been offering high-quality artwork by international, national and emerging artists for more than 37 years.

### Gentle Flow Ares Published by Slaymaker Fine Art Booths #609 & #613



Ares was born on the ancient isle of Crete. With the encouragement of his teachers, Ares attended the National Academy of the Arts in Athens, where he became acquainted and enamored with the larger movements in contemporary art, especially in the United States. This experience allowed him to explore tensions between the present and the past through his often heavily textured and abstracted paintings. Ares' work can be found in private collections in Europe, Canada and the United States. Based in Chicago, Slaymaker Fine Art is pleased to exclusively present the work of Ares.

### Dream Fields Eduard Gurevich Booth #S241



Borrowing from different traditions, my paintings are experimental as I strive to best represent a thought or a feeling that I am living through. Using mixed media, acrylic and oil paints in particular, I constantly try new techniques rather than remain stagnant in one place.

Eduard Gurevich's innovative use of light and color lends his vibrant landscapes a feel that is at once contemporary yet timeless. **11-YEAR-OLD JOHN WOOLLEY** was just 9 years old when he first began his "Backyard Journals" book series—sketchbooks filled with artful urban scenes and engaging detail drawings. John's work has appeared twice in *Moonlight Chronicles*, and this is his first major exhibition.

**EIGHT-YEAR-OLD CHILD PRODIGY ZOE YIN** is a rising star in the international art scene. At the tender age of 6, Zoe joined a professional artists' guild and had her first solo show at an Art Fair in New England, whereupon she sold her first piece of art. Since then, many of this talented young artist's works have been purchased by art lovers and collectors. 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#### MAJOR EVENTS IN NIGERIA'S VISUAL ARTS CALENDAR



The African Regional Summit and Exhibition on Visual Arts (ARESUVA) which is endorsed by the African Union (AU) is a product of the National Gallery of Art designed to promote the Visual Arts as a strategy for achieving rapid economic development in the African region. The first epoch marking summit hosted 16 African countries with a traffic flow of over 10,000 visitors. 201 pieces of artworks - painting, sculpture, metal works, ceramics, textiles, etc were displaced for public viewing and appreciation. ARESUVA 2009 edition took place from 15 -21 November, at the International Conference Centre, Abuja. The next edition is billed for 2011, to make it biennial.

#### Nigeria Visual Art World Tour (NIVATOUR)

The Nigerian Visual Art World Tour is geared towards improving the status of modern Nigerian Artists by exposing the sector through multilateral relationships, partnerships and training with the rest of the world. The theme of NIVATOUR is "GENERATIONAL FOOTPRINTS" which is aimed at showcasing the past, present and evolving future of Nigerian Visual Art sub-sector to the rest of the world. It will also bring to



the forefront the strategic importance of Visual Art as a major catalyst for achieving rapid economic development. NIVATOUR is expected to draw the best of Nigeria's creative ingenuity in the Visual Art from the generation of the Aina Onabolu and Kenneth Murray through the "Zaria Revolutionaries" era to the present period of Nigerian contemporary Visual Arts. The tour will take Nigerian Visual Arts to the United States of America, United Kingdom, France, Australia, and the African countries, beginning with the Egyptian cities of Cairo and Alexandria, in September 2010.



#### 3RD National Visual Arts Competition

One of the major responsibilities of the National Gallery of Art is to identify and nurture budding talents in Nigerian youths through the organization of the National Visual Art. The aim of the competition is to discover the artistic genius of Nigerian pupils, students in various art forms and also to assist them develop their skills and creative abilities. It is also targeted at achieving rapid economic development in the country through Visual Art subsector as envisioned in the New Partnership for African Development (NEPAD) and the

Millennium Development Goals (MDG's). The competition is divided into four (4) categories: Primary Schools; Secondary Schools; Tertiary Institutions and the Professional category. The competition is an annual event. 2010 edition is slated for October, in Abuja, Nigeria's capital city.



#### National Symposium on Nigerian Visual Arts

This is an annual intellectual discourse where resource persons engage on issues that have to do with the contribution of Visual Arts to national development. This event attracts doyens in the art and cultural sector such as art historians/critics, art teachers, art journalists, studio artists, etc.




