

Mode of Games Round Robin

The 16 nominated teams are divided into 4 groups of 4 teams. All games are played 8 ends with additional end if necessary to decide a winner.

All teams play a full round robin within the group (3 games). The group arrangement and the draws have been made by the organisation committee.

Before first round all teams have 10 minutes practice time and must play a Last Stone Draw (LSD) immediately after practice. The first named team starts practice with the blue stones.

Mode of Games Round Robin

After each round LSD has to be played too. The LSD is used to decide the right of the last stone for the following game. The measuring will be made by deputies of the organisation committee, according to WCF rules. The results of the LSD will be published.

In the event of a tie in a game an extra end will be played. In the event of the score remaining tied after the extra end the following LSD decides the winner.

Ranking after Round Robin

The team ranking procedure will be done according to the WCF rules of play. If the ranking is not possible based on points and direct games the LSD results (DSC) call in. There will be NO Tie-Breaks. Rank 1 and 2 of each group qualify for the final round, all other teams drop out.

Mode of Games Final Round

The finalists play quarter-final on Saturday evening, semi-final and final on Sunday. In the final round extra end(s) will be played to determine the winner. The quarter-final draw will be A1 vs. B2, C1 vs. D2, B1 vs. C2, D1 vs. A2. The right of the last stone in the quarter-final goes to the team which won the group. In the semi-final and final the right of the last stone goes to the team with the better DSC.

The final ranking determines the prize giving. The purse breakdown is:

1st rank CHF 6'000

4th rank CHF 1'000

2nd rank CHF 3'000

5th rank CHF 500 (4x)

3rd rank CHF 2'000

Other Rules

All teams must start with four players delivering stones in the first game.

The first named team in the draw will throw the blue stones.

A minimum of 5 ends must be played in all games.

During the games all measurements will be completed by the persons in charge of the house. In case of inconsistency a games' official can be called.

Basically there is no time limit for the games. Anyway the teams are required to observe the game time of 2 hours. In the event of a game being behind time the games' supervisor has the right to intervene and request an improvement in the game time.

All decisions of the games' supervisor are final.

On all other matters WCF rules apply.
