Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Description

The Edgar County Courthouse is a two story, Romanesque Revival structure, constructed of brick, and reinforced concrete. The "wedding cake" tower, painted gray, is of galvinized iron. The tower clock was added shortly after construction ended for a cost of \$1000. A statue of Justice, facing west, tops the tower.

The building is, in essence, octagonal in shape, consisting of four sides (facing north, south, east and west) and four main entryways (facing northeast, southeast, north, west and southwest). Each of the four sides consists of three parts - two terminal towers and a central flat facade topped by a steeply pitched gable. The dormers located in the hipped roof of each terminal tower are medieval in character. Relief carving and storbrackets are in the gable points and below the cornice. The two storys are marked by tall windows, topped with relieving arches on the second floor and by squares on the first floor. The tower is three tiered, the two lower tiers are square while the upper one is octagonal. Each side of the upper tier is topped with a steeply pitched gable. The hipped roof of red slate and tinwork is original.

The cornerstone was laid on November 5, 1891. Construction was completed in 1893 for a total cost of \$122,890.90. According to the architect's specifications the main building was of blue-amherst stone while the porch floors and steps were of Kasota limestone. The arches were of brick and interior floors marble. Carvings ordered for the exterior of the building include lion heads, medallions, entablatures, and datestones. The dome was of galvinized iron on a frame. Obtuse spouts and cement catch basins were ordered for the dome. The "sloping roofs" were covered with red slate and all gutters were painted red. The statue of Justice held scales gilded with gold leaf.

The exterior has not changed to any great degree since constructed. Aluminum windows were added in 1969. In 1970 an entryway of aluminum and glass doors was added at the lower level of the north facade to provide access for the handicapped. Sometime before 1940, Justice lost her scales in a windstorm and they were never retrieved.

Inside the building vaults and offices are located on the lower level. A courtroom and offices are on the main floor and additional courtrooms and jury rooms occupy the second floor. Interior ceilings were originally vaulted and covered with tin. These are still visable on the lower level and the original tin ceiling remains in the Treasurer's office. Four large, original murals on the second floor were recently restored through the efforts of the Edgar County Historical Society. Most of the offices and courtrooms have been remodled and suspended ceilings added. An elevator was installed in the center of the building in 1970.

The courthouse is located in the public square on land donated by Samuel Vance in 1823. At a June, 1823, meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the boundaries of the public square were laid out with each side being 310 feet 9 inches and the total area being two acres. Four streets surrounding the square were also laid out. The present courthouse is the third such building to be located on this site.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Edgar County Courthouse is a fine example of the Romanesque Revival style of architecture popular in public building design during the last quarter of the nineteenth century. The overall massiveness of the building, the heavy rough hewn stone, the terminal towers, medieval elements, subdued carving are indicative of the style. The unusual wedding cake tower distinguishes the building from other Romanesques Revival structures of the period. Since a courthouse is deemed representative of a county by the people of that county, it was necessary that the structure conform to the "right" style or form. Courthouses had to have a tower and the architect for the Edgar County Courthouse complied, albeit by combining two different architectural styles in one building. The Edgar County Ccurthouse may be seen, then, as indicative of the ways in which the people of Edgar County viewed both themselves and their public buildings. The present structure occupies the only site ever used as a seat of justice in this county. Thus it has always been the scene of political activity, the focal point of the community, and the center of the downtown business area.
