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br Charles George Everard was born on 29th Ausgust 1794 in Gloucestershire, the son of William and Elizabeth Everard. Charles Everard arrived in South Australia aboard the *Africaine* with his wife Catherine and four children. He was the surgeon to the *Africaine* and also acted as ship's Chaplain. Before leaving for South Australia he bought, in London, five sections of South Australian land costing him over £400. The family first settled at Glenelg before moving to a town house in Morphett Street. The Everards next settled at Black Forest at the end of July 1838; a portion of this estate they named 'Ashford'.

Dr Charles Everard does not appear to have regularly practised his profession in Australia, preferring to run a farm 'of the mixed type'. He became a JP and was also elected a member of the Legislative Council on which he served his full term of twelve years. He lived at 'Ashford' for 38 years and died, aged 82, on 30th March 1876.
