

GOULD LAKE

Gould Lake is one of many lakes in Loughborough Township, Frontenac County, Ontario. It is a clear-water lake, largely spring-fed and drains south into Eel Bay, a branch of Sydenham Lake.

The lake covers 492 acres and is 460 feet above sea level. It has a very irregular perimeter of 10.5 miles; a maximum depth of 202 feet and a mean depth of 71.5 feet. This information is from the Ontario Ministry of Resources.

Fish species in the lake include lake trout, smallmouth and largemouth bass, brown bullhead, rock bass, pumpkinseed, blue gill and yellow perch. In recent years rainbow trout have been added to the lake.

The Gould Lake Conservation area covering the south half of the lake, is about 4 miles north of Snyderham. The north half, where most of the cottages are located is about 7 miles from Sydenham. The road past Gould Lake, once called Bedford Road, is now designated County route 5. A.
