DID YOU KNOW?

- WR **Jeremy Gallon** is 47 yards shy of setting the school's single-season mark for receiving yards.
- U-M will conduct bowl practices at Chaparral High School in Scottsdale, Ariz., where LT **Taylor Lewan** attended his senior year of high school.
- TE **Devin Funchess'** 727 receiving yards in 2013 are the most all-time by a U-M tight end in a single season.
- KR **Dennis Norfleet** needs 152 return yards in the bowl game to set a new program record for kick return yards in a season.
- WR **Jeremy Gallon** is the 10th U-M player to surpass 1,000 receiving yards in a season. The feat has only been accomplished 13 times in program history.
- During conference play, U-M ranked second in the Big Ten in turnover margin (+10).
- QB **Devin Gardner** threw 14 TD passes and only three interceptions during Big Ten play.
- CB **Blake Countess** is tied for the lead in the Big Ten with six interceptions.
- Michigan has posted 17 interceptions this season after posting only seven interceptions throughout the 2012 campaign.
- WR **Jeremy Gallon's** 369 receiving yards against Indiana (Oct. 19) set new Big Ten and school records for most receiving yards in a single game.
- QB **Devin Gardner** is just the sixth signal caller in Big Ten history to have a 500+ and 400+ yard passing game in the same season.
- A U-M player has been named the Big Ten's top offensive lineman three years in a row (**Taylor Lewan** 2012-13; David Molk 2011).
- LT **Taylor Lewan** is only the ninth Michigan offensive lineman to be a starter for four seasons for the Maize and Blue.

First-Time Matchups

• Kansas State becomes the 146th different opponent to face the Wolverines in 134 years of gridiron action. The Michigan football team has compiled a 116-25-4 all-time record in first-time games with a school. A first-time meeting has taken place in bowl games on 15 previous occasions, with the Wolverines holding an 8-7 record.

GOING BOWLING

- The Wolverines are making their 43rd all-time bowl appearance (20-22 record).
- This will be the first-ever meeting between Michigan (7-5) and Kansas State (7-5) and the fourth time that U-M has faced a Big 12 foe in a bowl game.
- This is the first time that Michigan will play in the Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl (formerly the Copper Bowl) but the second time that the football program plays a bowl game in the state of Arizona. The only previous visit to the Grand Canyon State was the 1986 Fiesta Bowl held at Sun Devil Stadium.

STREAKS TO WATCH

- WR **Jeremy Gallon** has posted a reception in a program-record tying 38 straight games.
- Gallon has notched multiple receptions in 18 straight games. He has posted 5+ catches in seven consecutive outings.
- TE **Devin Funchess** has a catch in 13 straight games.
- K **Brendan Gibbons** has converted a program-record 141-straight PATs.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS ...

- After starting the season 2-4, Kansas State (7-5 overall, 5-3 Big 12) won five of its final six games to qualify for its 17th bowl game in program history and the 15th under the guidance of head coach Bill Snyder. The Wildcats became just the fourth Big 12 team ever to become bowl eligible after starting the season 2-4.
- A competitive team throughout the season, all five of Kansas State's losses were by 10 points or less, and the Wildcats held fourth-quarter leads in three of those contests.
- On offense, K-State is paced by All-Big 12 first-team wide receiver Tyler Lockett, who led the Big 12 in all-purpose yards (151.4 per game) during the regular season. Lockett's 104.2 receiving yards per game in 2013 rank second in the Big 12 and 11th in the nation. The Wildcats have consistently used two quarterbacks throughout the season. Junior Jake Waters, a transfer from Iowa Western Community College, is the team's

primary passer, completing 138-of-233 passes for 2,198 yards this season. Redshirt freshman quarterback Daniel Sams has seen action in all 12 games for K-State and has been a difference-maker on the ground, using 148 carries to rush for 784 -- the most rushing yards by a freshman quarterback in program history. Big 12 Defensive Lineman of the Year Ryan Mueller leads a stout Kansas State defense that ranks fourth in the Big 12 in total defense, surrendering 367.0 yards a game. The Wildcats also rank third in the Big 12 in passing yards allowed (221.8 avg.) and fifth in rush defense (145.3 avg.).

MICHIGAN VS. BIG 12 CONFERENCE

- Michigan is 7-2-1 against teams currently in the Big 12 Conference.
- The Wolverines last meeting with a Big 12 school came in 2005, when the Maize and Blue dropped a 32-28 decision to then-Big 12 member Nebraska at the Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, Texas.
- U-M's last encounter with a current member of the conference game following the 2004 season, when the Wolverines fell to Texas, 38-37, in the Rose Bowl.

COMING HOME

- Fifth-year senior offensive tackle **Taylor Lewan** will play his final collegiate game in his home state of Arizona.
- The bowl location carries extra meaning to Lewan as U-M will practice at Chaparral High School in Scottsdale, Ariz., where the Big Ten Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year attended his senior year of high school.

LAST GAME ...

- U-M scored six offensive touchdowns and had a chance to take the lead with 32 seconds remaining in the game, but the Maize and Blue's two-point conversion failed, and Ohio State (No. 3 AP, No. 3 USA Today) escaped with a 42-41 win on Saturday, Nov. 30, 2013, in front of 113,511 fans in Michigan Stadium.
- Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner went 32-of-45 for 451 yards, the second-highest mark in program history, and four touchdowns. He also ran for a touchdown and helped the Maize and Blue rack up 603 total yards of offense. Fifth-year senior wide receiver Jeremy Gallon tallied 175 receiving yards on nine catches, while freshman Jake Butt caught five passes for 85 yards and a touchdown.
- After 14 straight points from the Wolverines, Ohio State went ahead, 42-35, with 2:20 left on a one-yard touchdown run from Carlos Hyde. Michigan followed with an 11-play, 84-yard drive to cut the Buckeye lead to one.
- Completions to sophomore Devin Funchess and senior Drew Dileo put Michigan at its own 43. An 11-yard completion to Dileo followed by a 13-yard catch from fifth-year senior Joe Reynolds gave Michigan the ball on Ohio State's 33. The Wolverines called timeout with 50 sec-

onds left after a Gardner sack. On 3rd-and-8, Gardner completed a pass to fifth-year senior Fitzgerald Toussaint for 29 yards to the OSU two. Gardner connected again with Funchess for a two-yard touchdown on the very next play as the Maize and Blue trailed 42-41 with 32 seconds left. On the two-point conversion attempt, Gardner's pass to Dileo was intercepted. Michigan tried an onside kick, which was recovered by the Buckeyes, who kneeled down to ice it.

• Gallon finished the regular season second in the Big Ten in receiving yards (1,284), receiving yards per game (107.0) and catches (80).

• The Apopka, Fla. native led Michigan in receiving yards in eight of its 12 regular-season games.

• In total, Gallon has posted seven career 100-yard receiving efforts (four in 2013 and three in 2012).

• Gallon also led Michigan in receptions (49), receiving yards (829) and receiving yards per game (63.8) in 2012.

ELITE COMPANY

• Fifth-year senior wide receiver **Jeremy Gallon** joined elite company at Northwestern on Nov. 16, becoming only the 10th player in program history to post 1,000 receiving yards or more in a single season. In total, the feat has only been accomplished 13 times in U-M history.

• He is the Wolverines' first 1,000-yard receiver since Mario Manningham (1,174) accomplished the feat in 2007.

• Through 12 games, Gallon has 1,284 receiving yards. He needs 47 yards in the bowl game to surpass Braylon Edwards (1,330 yards in 2004) for the program single-season record.

• Fifth-year senior **Jeremy Gallon's** nine receiving touchdowns this season are the most by a U-M player since 2007, when Mario Manningham posted 12 touchdown receptions. His nine TDs also rank tied for fourth in the Big Ten and tied for 28th in the country in 2013.

• In U-M's 41-30 victory over Notre Dame on Sept. 7, wide receiver **Jeremy Gallon** became the first Wolverine to record three touchdown catches since Mario Manningham vs. Notre Dame on Sept. 16, 2006.

• Dating back to last season's Outback Bowl, the fifth-year wideout has posted 11 touchdown catches over his last 13 games.

- Michigan is in its 107th season of competition in the Big Ten Conference.
- The Wolverines have compiled an impressive 482-193-18 record in conference play and have claimed a league-leading 42 championships.
- U-M also leads the conference with 407 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

U-M In 134th Season of Gridiron Action

- U-M is in its 134th season of gridiron action.
- The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine, 1-0, at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto, 0-0, in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1.
- U-M enters its 131st year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games.
- The Wolverines are the sixth oldest football program in NCAA history.

- Funchess is one of just two tight ends in U-M history with three 100-yard receiving efforts, joining Jim Mandich (1967-69).
- Funchess, who earned Freshman All-American honors from the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) in 2012, is averaging 15.5 yards per catch.
- Funchess has been a big-play threat all season for the Maize and Blue, posting 12 20+-yard receptions through 12 games. He posted four of those 20+-yard catches vs. Minnesota (Oct. 5), three of which came on third down.
- With six touchdowns during his sophomore campaign, Funchess ranks tied for second all time among receiving touchdown leaders by tight ends. Eric Kattus boasts the record in the category with eight in 1985.

LEADING THE WAY

- In his first full season at the helm, senior/junior quarterback **Devin Gardner** has showcased his dual-threat ability, completing 208-of-345 passes for 2,960 yards and 21 touchdowns and rushing for 483 yards and 11 touchdowns on 165 carries.
- Gardner's 3,443 yards of total offense through 12 regular-season games rank second on U-M's single-season list, behind only Denard Robinson (4,272, 2010). During the regular season, Gardner averaged 286.9 yards of total offense, which ranked second in the Big Ten and 24th in the nation.
- Gardner became just the sixth signal caller in Big Ten history to have a 500+ and 400+ yard passing game in the same season. The Inkster High School product set a program record with 503 passing yards against Indiana (Oct. 19), and finished the regular season by passing for 451 yards against Ohio State (Nov. 30). Both outputs rank as the top two single-game passing records in program history.
- The junior signal caller owns 12 200-yard passing games in his collegiate career, tying him for fifth-place on U-M's all-time list in that category with Jim Harbaugh (1983-86) and Denard Robinson (2009-12).
- Gardner threw 14 touchdown passes to only three interceptions during Big Ten play, and passed for 200+ yards in six of eight conference games.
- After throwing four touchdown passes against Ohio State, Gardner now has 34 for his career, which ranks ninth on U-M's all-time list in that category. He needs one touchdown to tie Tom Brady (35, 1996-99) for eighth on Michigan's all-

time list.

- Gardner finished the regular season second in the Big Ten and 20th in the country in points responsible for per game (16.2 avg.). He has accounted for at least two touch downs in 14 of his last 17 games.
- Gardner is on pace to finish his Michigan career with one of the highest efficiency ratings in program history. Gardner, who has appeared in 17 consecutive games for the Maize and Blue behind center, currently ranks first on Michigan's career efficiency rating list (149.2).

PASSING HIS COMPETITION

- After passing for 451 yards vs. Ohio State on Nov. 30, senior/junior quarterback **Devin Gardner's** upped his season passing yards to 2,960 to move to second among Michigan's all-time leaders in the category. He trails only record holder John Navarre, who passed for 3,331 yards in 2003.

- Gardner's 4,440 career passing yards already rank ninth all-time in U-M history. He is one of only 11 players in U-M history to post 4,000 career passing yards.

RESETTING THE RECORD BOOKS

- Fifth-year senior wide receiver **Jeremy Gallon** and senior/junior quarterback **Devin Gardner** each put forth record-setting performances in Michigan's 63-47 win over Indiana on Oct. 19.
- Gallon finished the game with 14 receptions for 369 yards and two touchdowns, establishing new Big Ten and school records for most receiving yards in a single game. His 369 yards are the second-highest ever by an FBS receiver, while his 14 receptions are the second-highest total in program history.
- Meanwhile, Gardner set program records with 584 yards of total offense and 503 passing yards against the Hoosiers.
- The senior/junior signal caller fell one yard short of the Big Ten record for total offense (585 by Dave Wilson of Illinois on Nov. 8, 1980) on his way to surpassing Denard Robinson's previous school record total of 502 yards at Notre Dame on Sept. 11, 2010.
- Gardner's 503 passing yards against the Hoosiers shattered the previous Michigan single-game passing record of 389 yards by John Navarre at Iowa on Oct. 4, 2003.
- Michigan set a school record with 751 yards of total offense, beating the previous mark of 727 yards against Delaware State in 2009. U-M's 751 yards is the second-highest total in Big Ten history. The two teams combined for 1,323 yards of total offense, which is also a Michigan record.

BRINGING THE PRESSURE

- Junior defensive end **Frank Clark** is in the midst of a career year for the Maize and Blue. Through 12 games, Clark has established new career highs in sacks (4.5), tackles-for-loss (12.0), total tackles (42) and fumble recoveries (two).
- For his efforts, Clark was recognized as an All-Big Ten second-team selection by the coaches and received the Richard Katcher Award as U-M's top defensive lineman in 2013.
- Clark's team-high 4.5 sacks have all come over U-M's last nine outings, while seven of his team-best 12.0 TFLs have occurred over Michigan's last eight games.
- Clark registered the first scoring play of his career at Penn State on Oct. 12, returning a fumble 24 yards for a touchdown on the first offensive play of the third quarter for Nittany Lions. Clark finished U-M's conference road opener with two sacks and two fumble recoveries.

BACK IN THE FOLD

- Senior/junior linebacker **Jake Ryan** returned to the lineup against Penn State (Oct. 12), 207 days after suffering a torn ACL in his right knee during spring practice (March 19).
- A defensive team captain, Ryan received the Roger Zatkoff Award as the team's top linebacker for the second straight year after posting 26 tackles, four stops for losses and a pass breakup in seven games.
- Dating back to 2011, Ryan has posted a tackle-for-loss in 25 of his last 31 games. He led the Wolverines in 88 total tackles (88), solo stops (56), tackles for loss (16), sacks (4.5) and forced fumbles (4) in 2012 on his way to earning All-Big Ten second-team honors by the media.

COUNT THE PICKS

- Junior/sophomore cornerback **Blake Countess** ranks tied for first in the Big Ten -- and tied for fourth in the country -- with six interceptions this season, while defensive back **Raymon Taylor** is tied for second in the conference with four picks in 2013.
- An All-Big Ten first-team selection by the media, Countess is the first Wolverine since Todd Howard (6) in 2000 to record at least six interceptions in a season. With one more pick, Countess can become the first U-M player since Charles Woodson (8 INTs) in 1997 to have at least seven interceptions in a season.
- The first two interceptions of Countess' collegiate career came against Notre Dame on Sept. 7. Prior to Countess, the last Wolverine player to record two interceptions in a game was James Rogers at Purdue on Nov. 13, 2010.
- Countess' 72-yard INT return for a touchdown against Minnesota (Oct. 5) marked the sixth-longest interception returned for a touchdown by a Wolverine since 1948. His 162 return yards this season rank third all-time on U-M's single-season list.
- Earlier this season at Iowa (Nov. 23), the Maize and Blue posted three interceptions in a game for the first time since notching three picks in a 28-24 victory at Notre Dame on Sept. 11, 2010.
- U-M has tallied 17 interceptions this season after posting only seven interceptions throughout the 2012 campaign.

RETURNING FOR MORE

- Despite being considered by many analysts as a high first-round selection in the 2013 NFL Draft, fifth-year senior offensive tackle **Taylor Lewan** elected to return to Ann Arbor for his senior season with Team 134.
- Lewan, who has opened 47 career games at left tackle -- including 40 consecutive -- is only the ninth Michigan offensive lineman to be a starter for four seasons for the Maize and Blue.
- A semifinalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award, the Wolverines' offensive captain did not allow a sack during the 2013 regular season on his way to being named the recipient of the Big Ten's Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year award for the second consecutive season.
- Lewan's 47 starts rank fifth all-time among offensive linemen at Michigan. The school record is 50 career starts by Jon Jansen (1995-98).
- The Cave Creek, Ariz., native was tabbed a first-team Preseason All-American by ESPN.com, CBSSports.com, SI.com and Sporting News, and named to the 2013 national watch lists for the Outland Trophy and the Maxwell, Rotary Lombardi and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards.
- Lewan was a 2012 All-America first team choice by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, Associated Press, ESPN.com and SI.com. He also was an All-Big Ten first team choice by the league's coaches and media during his junior campaign.

TURNING THE TIDE

- After struggling to win the turnover battle during the non-conference slate, Michigan fared much better during its eight-game Big Ten schedule.
- U-M ranked second in the conference with a +10 turnover margin during Big Ten contests. The Wolverines forced 18 turnovers during that stretch, while only turning the ball over on eight occasions.
- Senior/junior quarterback **Devin Gardner** threw 14 touchdown passes and only three interceptions during U-M's eight-game conference slate.
- The Maize and Blue played even or won the turnover battle in each of their eight Big Ten games.

SOUND D

The Michigan defense continues to make strides as the 2013 season moves forward.

- U-M ranks 28th in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 139.4 yards per game on the ground. The Wolverines have allowed only three 100-yard rushers through 12 games (Michigan State's Jeremy Langford, Nebraska's Ameer Abdullah and Ohio State's Carlos Hyde).
- The Maize and Blue are sixth in the Big Ten and 38th in the country in total defense, allowing only 367.4 yards per game.
- The Wolverines have surrendered only 32 touchdowns this season and have allowed only 13 rushing scores through 12 games.
- Michigan has allowed opponents to only score touchdowns on 51% of their red zone opportunities this season (21 TDs in 41 opportunities).

DEFENSIVE PRESENCE

- Under the guidance of defensive coordinator **Greg Mattison**, Michigan finished the 2011-12 seasons ranked in the top-20 in total defense for the first time since 1997-98.

Norfleet has posted 850 kick return yards in 2013, good for second on U-M's single-season list in that category. He needs 152 return yards in the bowl game to break Darryl Stonum's program record (1,001 yards, 2009) for return yards in a season.

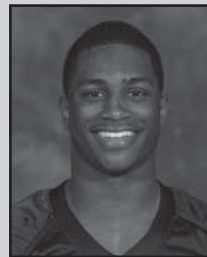

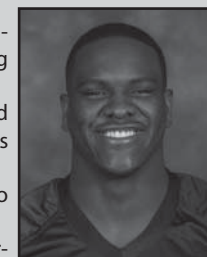

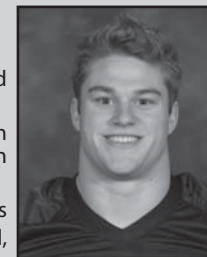

Brady Hoke was named the 19th head coach in University of Michigan football history on Jan. 11, 2011. A former assistant coach at U-M (1995-2002), Hoke has guided the Wolverines to a 26-12 record (15-9 Big Ten) in his first three seasons as head coach. Hoke led the Wolverines to an 11-2 record (6-2 Big Ten) and Allstate Sugar Bowl victory in his first season at the helm, while U-M finished the 2012 season with an 8-5 (6-2 Big Ten) mark following a bid to the Outback Bowl. The Wolverines are 7-5 in 2013 heading into the Dec. 28 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl.

Hoke had previous head coaching stints at San Diego State from 2009-10, where he earned a 13-12 record, and his alma mater, Ball State, where he went 34-38 from 2003-08. Collectively, Hoke is 66-57 in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Hoke's first-season success in Ann Arbor was acknowledged across the country. He was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual. The Big Ten Conference's coaches voted Hoke as the inaugural recipient of the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award, while the Big Ten media named him the Dave McClain Coach of the Year.

With four wins more than the 2010 squad (7-6), Hoke and the Wolverines tied Fielding Yost's 1901 team as the only two teams with a four-win improvement from the previous season. Yost's 1901 team went 11-0 following a 7-2-1 1900 season.

Only the legendary Yost precedes Hoke as a Michigan head coach to win 10 games in his first season. Hoke also became the fifth Big Ten coach to win at least 10 games in his first season as head coach, and became the third U-M coach to win his first six games (Fielding Yost-1901, Bennie Oosterbaan-1948). Nationally, Hoke became one of eight coaches to direct a team to a BCS bowl in his first season, while he became the third coach to direct a team to a BCS bowl victory in his first season.

In 2012, Hoke became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02. The Wolverines were a perfect 8-0 at Michigan Stadium in 2011 and 6-0 at the Big House in 2012.

Since Hoke's arrival, the defense has improved from a unit that in 2010 ranked 108th in the Football Bowl Subdivision in scoring defense and 110th in yards allowed to one that ranked among the top 20 in the country in

scoring and total defense in 2011 and 2012. Meanwhile, the offense has averaged over 30 points per game during Hoke's tenure, including averaging 34 points per game through 12 games in 2013.

Fifteen Wolverines have earned All-Big Ten distinction in three seasons under Hoke, including back-to-back-to-back Big Ten Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year winners in center David Molk (2011) and left tackle Taylor Lewan (2012-13). Devin Funchess also earned Big Ten Kwalick-Clark Tight End of the Year honors in 2013.

The 2010 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year, Hoke guided the Aztecs to a 9-4 record, marking the most victories since 1996 (8) while earning the program's first trip to a bowl game in 12 years, a 35-14 victory over Navy. Six of his players earned All-MWC first team honors in 2010, including running back Ronnie Hillman, the league's Freshman of the Year. Seven additional players earned second-team (4) honors and honorable mention (3). In 2009, Hoke's first season at San Diego State, five players were named to All-MWC teams, while 11 were MWC All-Academic selections.

As head coach at Ball State, he mentored players to 35 All-MAC selections in six years en route to a pair of bowl game appearances in 2007 and '08. The 2008 season marked the best season in program history, recording a school-record 12 wins and completing an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular-season campaign.

Collectively, Hoke has 30 years of collegiate coaching experience beginning with assistant positions at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94) and Michigan (1995-2002). A defensive line coach at U-M, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, '98, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl winning squad. During his tenure, U-M posted a 76-23 overall record, claiming at least 10 victories on four occasions.

A 1982 graduate of Ball State University, Hoke earned four letters (1977-80) with the Cardinals. He was part of the only two teams in Ball State football history to post undefeated conference seasons: as a player in 1978, and as the head coach in 2008. Hoke led Ball State to the 1978 MAC championship, and as a team captain in 1980 earned All-MAC second-team honors. He graduated from Fairmont East High School in Kettering, Ohio, in 1977.

He and his wife, the former Laura Homberger, have one daughter, Kelly.

The football program is in its 87th season in the "Big House" in 2013, with a 403-122-15 all-time record at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0, on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has increased nine times to its present 109,901. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 38 times in the past 39 years, and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 115,109 fans against Notre Dame in the second night game ever in Michigan Stadium in 2013. The previous mark was 114,804 fans against Notre Dame during the first-ever night game at Michigan Stadium in 2011.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 251 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan.

The Wolverines drew 659,406 fans for their six-game home schedule in 2012. The six-game average of 112,252 broke Michigan's NCAA record of 112,179 fans per contest set during the 2011 season.

Michigan Stadium was the first college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones. It was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

CAPACITY: 109,901 -- the largest college-owned structures of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.

COMPLETION: 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

FIRST GAME: October 1, 1927 -- Michigan led by Captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

DEDICATION GAME: October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State, 21-0.

REDEDICATION GAME: September 4, 2010 -- Michigan defeated Connecticut, 30-10.

ATTENDANCE: Since 1927 -- 45,957,028 fans have watched the Wolverines play 540 games. Since expansion of the "Big House" in 1998, and the rededication in 2010, the single-game attendance record is 115,109 set against Notre Dame on Sept. 7, 2013. The NCAA season record of 897,431 was set in 2011.

FIELD: 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

100,000-Plus Crowds at Michigan Stadium

The football program has played 251 consecutive home games in front of crowds in excess of 100,000. The last time Michigan did not have 100,000 in attendance in Michigan Stadium was on Oct. 25, 1975 vs. Indiana. A crowd of 93,857 was on hand for the 55-7 Michigan victory.

Since then, Michigan has set numerous NCAA attendance marks and the Wolverines have led the nation for 38 of the past 39 seasons in attendance.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner accounted for 214 total yards (162 passing, 52 rushing) and three touchdowns in leading the University of Michigan football team (No. 17 AP/No. 17/USA Today) to a resounding 59-9 victory over Central Michigan on Saturday (Aug. 31) at Michigan Stadium. The Wolverines amassed 242 yards rushing and outgained the Chippewas, 463-210, in the season-opening rout.

Three Wolverine players had at least 50 yards rushing and four players had at least 40 yards receiving. Gardner and fifth-year senior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint each had two rushing touchdowns, while junior Thomas Rawls and freshman Derrick Green had one apiece. Fifth-year senior wide receiver Jeremy Gallon was the team's leading receiver, hauling in four passes for 47 yards and one touchdown.

Junior linebacker Desmond Morgan led the defense with seven tackles. Fifth-year senior linebacker Cameron Gordon collected two sacks. The Michigan defense allowed only 12 first downs and forced three turnovers (two fumbles, one interception).

Michigan got on the board first by way of special teams. As the Chippewas punted away their first possession of the game, freshman defensive back Dymonte Thomas burst through the line to block it. The ball was scooped up by fifth-year senior wide receiver Joe Reynolds and returned 29 yards for a touchdown to give U-M an early 7-0 lead.

The Wolverines forced Central Michigan to punt on their second possession but started deep in their own territory. On the second play from scrimmage, Gardner attempted to hit senior wide receiver Drew Dileo on a short out-route but was instead intercepted. In the shadow of their own goal line, the Wolverines held on the first three plays, forcing Central Michigan into a fourth-and-goal from the one-yard line. A delay of game penalty pushed the Chippewas back five yards, forcing them to settle for a 23-yard field goal that cut the score to 7-3 with 9:39 to play in the first quarter.

Gardner made plays with his legs on Michigan's next drive that led to a touchdown. On third-and-four near midfield, he was chased out of the pocket right but found Dileo open over the middle of the field for a 36-yard completion. On the next play, Gardner ran again, using down-field blocks to score on a 22-yard run to put U-M up 14-3 with 7:26 to play in the first quarter.

After another Central Michigan punt, the Wolverines scored again, set up by a 38-yard reverse from sophomore wide receiver Dennis Norfleet. Gardner was 4-for-5 for 40 yards on the drive, which was capped with a one-yard

touchdown run by Toussaint, making the score 21-3 in the early moments of the second quarter.

Central Michigan converted Gardner's second interception into three points to make the score 21-6. He responded on the team's next possession, however, engineering an 11-play, 76-yard drive that ended in a 16-yard touchdown pass to Gallon to make the score 28-6 with 2:04 to play in the first half.

The Wolverines tacked on another TD before halftime, as junior defensive back Raymon Taylor intercepted Central Michigan quarterback Alex Niznak and returned it 51 yards to set up the score. With 28 seconds left, Gardner scampered four yards for a touchdown, and the Wolverines led 35-6 heading into the locker room at halftime.

Michigan continued to score in the second half, as Toussaint ran it in from one yard out for his second score of the game to increase the lead to 42-6. The drive was set up off a 45-yard pass from Gardner to Reynolds that went down to the one-yard line. On the next offensive possession, Green and fellow true freshman De'Veon Smith combined for 55 yards on 10 carries, including a one-yard touchdown run by Green, making the score 49-6 with 4:55 left to play in the third quarter.

Freshman quarterback Shane Morris made his collegiate debut near the end of the third quarter, taking Michigan down the field for another touchdown. Rawls finished the drive with a five-yard touchdown run to increase the lead to 56-6 with one second left in the third quarter.

The teams traded field goals to start the fourth quarter. The Chippewas converted on a 33-yard attempt to make the score 56-9. On the next drive, Morris threw an interception, but the Michigan defense got it right back on a fumble recovery. Freshman defensive back Channing Stribling forced it, and junior defensive back Delonte Hollowell recovered, leading to a 30-yard field goal by fifth-year senior Brendan Gibbons, putting the score at 59-9 with 6:59 to play in the game.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner accounted for 376 yards of total offense and five touchdowns, while fifth-year senior wide receiver Jeremy Gallon set career highs in both receiving yards (184) and touchdowns (three) to guide the No. 17-ranked University of Michigan football team to a 41-30 victory over No. 14 Notre Dame on Saturday (Sept. 7) in the second-ever night game at Michigan Stadium. The win is the program's 400th at the Big House.

Right before kickoff, Gardner was awarded the No. 98 jersey, the number designated to newly minted Michigan Football Legend Tom Harmon. The U-M quarterback is the first player to wear that number since Harmon in 1940, a span of 73 years. Officially, Gardner went 21-of-33 for 294 yards and four touchdowns through the air, adding 13 rushes for 82 yards and one touchdown. Michigan fifth-year senior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint carried the ball 22 times for 71 yards.

Shining under the lights defensively, junior cornerback Raymon Taylor led the team with 11 tackles, while junior/sophomore cornerback Blake Countess had six tackles and two interceptions.

With Michigan clinging to a four-point lead late in the fourth quarter, Gardner orchestrated a 10-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a four-yard touchdown pass to senior wide receiver Drew Dileo, putting the Wolverines back ahead by two scores at 41-30 with 4:18 to play. The drive was kept alive by two defensive pass interference calls against the Notre Dame secondary, both of which came on third downs.

After a penalty on the ensuing kickoff allowed Notre Dame to start at the 35-yard line, the Fighting Irish marched all the way to the Michigan six-yard line with less than two minutes to play. Notre Dame quarterback Tommy Rees fired a pass into the end zone that was initially deflected by Taylor. The ball hung in the air until Countess pulled it down for the interception.

The Michigan defense was stout on the opening drive of the game, forcing Notre Dame into a three-and-out. The Wolverines took over on their own 32-yard line and marched 41 yards in 10 plays, getting points on a successful 44-yard field goal attempt by fifth-year senior Brendan Gibbons -- his 15th consecutive made field goal, a new school record.

Michigan took possession after the defense forced another three-and-out. Back-to-back runs from Toussaint netted 16 total yards on the drive's first two plays. On the third, Gardner found Gallon wide open, and as Fighting Irish defenders converged to make the tackle, the Wolverines wideout slipped

away and ran straight to the end zone to complete a 61-yard touchdown reception with 5:35 left in the first quarter. Gibbons tacked on the extra point to make it 10-0 early.

However, Notre Dame tied up the score. First, on a third-and-goal from four-yard line, Rees found TJ Jones in the back of the end zone after it went through the hands of George Atkinson III, the intended receiver. On the second possession, kicker Kyle Brindza tacked on a 44-yard field goal with 14:05 left in the first half.

Gardner then engineered a 12-play, 75-yard drive to put the Maize and Blue back up a touchdown. On a third-and-goal from the 14-yard line, Gardner threw into the end zone, but pass interference was called on Notre Dame, giving Michigan an automatic first down at the two-yard line. On the next play, Gardner kept it on the option, running it in to put the score at 17-10 after the extra point.

The two teams traded field goals on each of their next possessions. Brindza initially cut the lead to 17-13 after a successful 24-yard field goal attempt, but Gibbons matched it, connecting from 38 yards out.

On the ensuing Notre Dame drive, Rees was flushed out of the pocket left on second down and threw an interception to Countess, who returned it 30 yards all the way to the Notre Dame 23-yard line, setting the Michigan offense up with its best starting field position of the day. Four plays later, Gardner found Gallon in the front of the end zone on a comeback route for the 12-yard touchdown, increasing the advantage to 24-10 heading into halftime.

Michigan punted on its first possession to start the third quarter, before Rees took the Fighting Irish down the field in a 12-play, 90-yard drive, finishing with a 20-yard touchdown pass to Troy Niklas, bringing the score to 27-20.

The Wolverines got it back on the next drive, however, with the Gardner-to-Gallon combo playing a big part once again. After Gardner scrambled for a first down on a third-and-eight, he hooked up with Gallon for a 41-yard gain over the middle to set Michigan up at the Notre Dame 25-yard line. Three plays later, the duo connected again, this time for a 13-yard touchdown to put the score back at two touchdowns (34-20) with 1:54 left in the third quarter.

The Fighting Irish drove down the field on the next possession, but the Michigan defense turned them away, stopping a fourth-and-four from the Michigan 17-yard line. Soon after, Gardner was chased into his own end zone and threw up a pass attempt that was intercepted by Fighting Irish defensive end Stephon Tuitt for a touchdown. After Michigan challenged the ruling, the call was confirmed, putting the score at 34-27 with 12:06 to play in the game.

With 9:15 to play, Brindza added another field goal, this time from 40 yards, cutting the lead to four at 34-30.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- The No. 11-ranked University of Michigan football team used a goal-line stand as time expired to hang on for a 28-24 win over Akron on Saturday, Sept. 14, in front of 107,120 at Michigan Stadium.

Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner went 16-for-30 with 248 yards and two touchdowns passing and accounted for 103 yards rushing with one touchdown. Fifth-year senior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint rushed for 71 yards and one touchdown, with fifth-year senior wide receiver Jeremy Gallon catching six passes for 66 yards and sophomore tight end Devin Funchess grabbing two passes for 65 yards and a touchdown.

On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore linebacker James Ross III led the way with 10 tackles, including one for a loss. Meanwhile, sophomore safety Jarrod Wilson and sophomore defensive back Blake Countess each recorded an interception.

Michigan wasted no time getting on the board, scoring on its sixth play of the day when Gardner found Funchess for a 48-yard touchdown with 10:29 remaining in the first quarter for a 7-0 lead.

Akron came up empty on its next offensive series but forced the Maize and Blue into a short punt of 21 yards on its next possession to start at U-M's 31-yard line. With the short field, the Zips cut the Wolverine lead to four, 7-3, on a 45-yard field goal from Robert Stein with 2:59 showing on the clock in the first quarter.

Following the exchange of scores, neither team put another point on the board for the rest of the half. Michigan turned the ball over three times and missed on a 45-yard field goal, with Akron turning the ball over once and missing on 45- and 55-yard field goals to give U-M a 7-3 lead at the break.

Starting at its own 27-yard line to start the second half, Michigan went three-and-out. After the 54-yard punt, Akron began its first possession of the second half at its own 25-yard line. The Zips orchestrated a 10-play drive, culminating in a Kyle Pohl 28-yard touchdown pass to Zach D'Orazio. Following the successful PAT from Robert Stein, Akron took a 10-7 lead with 9:56 to go in the third.

After having his first run of the drive called back for a holding penalty, Toussaint ripped off a 24-yard run from U-M's 36-yard line to jumpstart Michigan's second offensive series of the half. Following Toussaint's four-yard rush on the next play, Gardner scampered 36 yards for Michigan's second touchdown of the afternoon. With the good PAT from fifth-year senior Brendan Gibbons (West Palm Beach, Fla./Cardinal Newman), Michigan regained the lead, 14-10, with 8:13 remaining in the third.

The Wolverines forced an Akron punt on the ensuing possession, taking over at its own 15-yard line with 7:14 to go in the quarter. After Gardner fumbled and recovered on the first play of the drive for a loss of six yards, he took off for a 35-yard gain on the next play to advance to the 46-yard line. Five plays later, Gardner found sophomore/freshman wide receiver Jehu Chesson (St. Louis, Mo./Ladue Horton Watkins) for a 33-yard touchdown to increase Michigan's lead to 21-10 with 3:23 left in the third. Chesson's first career catch and TD.

Akron responded with its third interception of Gardner on the day to start the fourth quarter, with Justin March picking off Gardner and returning it 27 yards to the end zone just 14 seconds into the quarter. After converting the point after, Akron trimmed the Michigan lead to four points, 21-17.

With the Zips threatening to score on Michigan's two-yard line, Wilson picked off Pohl's pass in the end zone. U-M came up empty on its next possession, with Akron taking over at its 33-yard line. The Zips strung together an 11-play, 67-yard scoring drive to take a 24-21 lead with 4:10 remaining. After having a 40-yard pass originally ruled a touchdown overturned, Akron cashed in on third down from the one-yard line for the three-point advantage.

After his first pass of the drive was batted down on the next Michigan possession, Gardner took off on a 35-yard run to enter Akron territory. The Wolverines then took advantage of pass interference by Akron in the end zone, moving to the two-yard line. Toussaint then punched it in on first down, putting Michigan on top, 28-24, with 2:49 remaining.

Akron marched down the field on its final possession of the game, using three big plays to reach the Michigan one-yard line with 15 seconds left. Passes of 24 and 21 yards coupled with a rush of 19 yards set the Zips up a yard away from the end zone. A pitch to the right was unsuccessful on first down, leaving Akron with three yards and five seconds to score. Junior linebacker Brennen Beyer broke through the line untouched to rush Pohl, whose pass fell incomplete in the end zone as time expired.

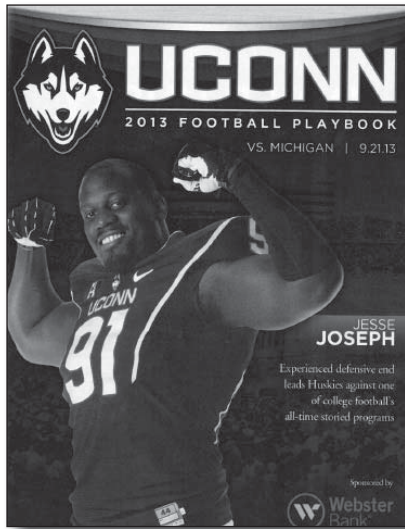

East Hartford, Conn. -- The University of Michigan football team (No. 15 AP, No. 14 USA Today) came away with a 24-21 victory at Connecticut on Saturday, Sept. 21, overcoming a two-touchdown deficit with 17 unanswered points -- punctuated with a 21-yard field goal from senior kicker Brendan Gibbons with 4:36 to play -- in front of a record-breaking crowd at Rentschler Field.

Fifth-year senior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint scored two second-half touchdowns and rushed for 120 yards, marking the sixth time in his career he eclipsed 100 yards on the ground. U-M's rushing attack combined to compile nearly 200 yards and three scores, with senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner contributing 64 yards and one touchdown.

On defense, junior linebacker Desmond Morgan came up with a leaping, one-handed interception and long return in the fourth that set up the second of Toussaint's two touchdowns. The Michigan front seven frequently found its way into the Connecticut backfield, led by junior defensive end Frank Clark, who recorded two of Michigan's season-best four sacks.

The Wolverines opened the scoring towards the end of the first quarter when a defensive pass interference call set up a third-down 17-yard touchdown run by Gardner. The U-M offense faced four third downs during the drive.

Connecticut followed up with a three-and-out and amassed just one first down in the first quarter.

After another UConn three-and-out and three straight U-M drives that ended with punts, the Huskies broke through when tight end Spencer Parker reeled in an 11-yard throw over the middle from quarterback Chandler Whitmer to draw the game even at seven apiece.

On Michigan's next possession, Gardner threw his second interception of the evening, but the Wolverine defense held strong. However, the resulting punt bounced off a U-M player and was recovered by Connecticut just nine yards from the Michigan end zone. Two plays later, Whitmer connected with running back Lyle McCombs for a seven-yard score, and the Huskies entered halftime up, 14-7.

Michigan received the ball to begin the second half, but on a quarterback sneak attempt on third-and-short, Gardner fumbled and Connecticut safety Ty-Meer Brown picked it up and ran 35 yards into the end zone to give the Huskies a two-touchdown lead.

The two sides traded short drives, before the U-M offense found its rhythm when Toussaint took a pitch from Gardner for a 35-yard touchdown, turning it into a one-score contest.

The home side responded by driving deep into Michigan territory, but a key sack by junior cornerback Raymon Taylor forced a long field goal attempt. The Huskies' kicker Chad Christen followed by hooking his 46-yard try wide left.

Following the miss, Michigan marched from its own 29-yard line deep into Connecticut territory, but a Gardner dash on fourth down came up just short.

On Connecticut's first possession in the fourth quarter, Morgan jumped and snared a throw across the middle from Whitner and returned it to the 12-yard line. On the following play, Toussaint got to the outside and into the end zone to tie the game at 21-all with 10 minutes remaining.

After another three-and-out by the Connecticut offense, senior wide receiver Drew Dileo's 24-yard punt return helped set up a 21-yard chip shot from Gibbons, who has converted 17 of his last 18 attempts, with 4:36 to go.

The Huskies had one last drive but were stymied, highlighted by Clark's second sack on the night.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner threw for 235 yards and two touchdowns, while sophomore tight end Devin Funchess set career highs in receptions (seven) and yards (151) to lead the University of Michigan football team to a 42-13 victory over Minnesota on Saturday (Oct. 5) inside Michigan Stadium to retain the Little Brown Jug. With the win, the Wolverines have won 31 of their last 32 Big Ten openers dating back to 1982.

Fifth-year senior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint rushed 17 times for 78 yards and two scores. Junior linebacker Desmond Morgan produced 10 tackles, while sophomore linebacker James Ross III contributed nine.

Michigan won the toss, deferred to the second half and caused a turnover on the first Minnesota possession, as senior Jibreel Black forced a fumble that was recovered by Ross III at Minnesota's 35-yard line. The offense ran the ball six consecutive times, culminating with an eight-yard touchdown scamper by Toussaint. The Golden Gophers answered quickly, however, engineering a 16-play, 75-yard drive to knot up the score at 7-7 with 52 seconds left in the first quarter. Minnesota converted on all five third-down opportunities during the drive, which ended with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Mitch Leidner to Maxx Williams.

The second quarter was dominated by special teams. After Minnesota downed a punt at Michigan's own two-yard line, the Wolverines moved the ball down the field slightly before answering with a field-position play of their own, as junior Matt Wile booted a punt that was touched dead at the Golden Gophers' one-yard line. The Michigan defense forced a stop and took over the next drive at the Minnesota 38-yard line, setting the offense up with short field. Facing a third-and-14 from the 24-yard line and only 1:31 left on the clock before halftime, Gardner fired a touchdown pass to Funchess to put Michigan up 14-7 heading into the break.

The Wolverines opened up a two-touchdown lead to start the second half, moving 75 yards in nine plays. The key play of the drive once again came on a third-and-long situation, as Gardner hooked up with Funchess for a 21-yard gain to the Minnesota two-yard line. After the call on the field was confirmed via replay, freshman Derrick Green punched it in on the next play,

putting Michigan up 21-7 with 10:08 left in the third quarter.

Minnesota then got three points back on a 44-yard field goal by Chris Hawthorne with 4:26 left in the third quarter, cutting the lead to 21-10.

Michigan answered that field goal, however, with a 12-yard TD run by Toussaint, his second of the afternoon. Gardner made three plays to keep the drive alive, including back-to-back completions -- to senior Drew Dileo and fifth-year senior Jeremy Gallon -- that totaled 42 yards. Three plays after Gallon's reception, on a third-and-five, Gardner scrambled for 13 yards to the 12-yard line, setting up Toussaint's touchdown run on the next play to make the score 28-10 as the third quarter drew to a close.

With 10:07 to play in the game, Minnesota once again cut into the lead, as Hawthorne booted another field goal, this time from 27 yards, making the score 28-13.

Michigan put the game out of reach with two fourth-quarter touchdowns, the first of which was a two-yard touchdown run by Gardner with 2:36 to play. The Wolverines were faced with two third-and-longs on the drive, but Gardner connected with Funchess on both of them, the last being a 46-yard bomb to the Minnesota four-yard line. Three plays later, Gardner faked a handoff and rolled out to the right for the two-yard touchdown, giving Michigan a 35-13 lead. Just 1:17 later, junior/sophomore Blake Countess sealed the win with a pick-six, intercepting Leidner and returning it 72 yards for the touchdown, capping the scoring at 42-13.

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. -- The University of Michigan football team (No. 18 AP, No. 16 USA Today) was unable to hold on to a lead with less than a minute left in regulation and was outlasted by Penn State, 43-40, in four overtimes on Saturday night (Oct. 12) at Beaver Stadium.

A two-yard rushing touchdown by PSU running back Bill Belton gave the Nittany Lions the win after Michigan kicked a field goal on the first possession of the fourth overtime period.

Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner (Detroit, Mich./Inkster) totaled 361 yards and three total touchdowns, while sophomore tight end Frank Clark (Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville) recorded two sacks and recovered two fumbles, including one he returned for a touchdown.

The teams traded interceptions in the first quarter, with U-M's coming from sophomore safety Jarrod Wilson (Akron, Ohio/Akron Buchtel). Penn State's INT resulted in the game's first touchdown.

However, U-M responded in a hurry, as Gardner found sophomore tight end Devin Funchess (Farmington Hills, Mich./Harrison) for a 59-yard catch-and-run touchdown at 8:19 of the opening quarter.

Michigan then took the lead following fifth-year senior Brendan Gibbons' (West Palm Beach, Fla./Cardinal Newman) 47-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions outscored U-M, 14-0, in the second quarter, thanks in part to two U-M turnovers, and carried a 21-10 lead into half.

On the first play from scrimmage of the second half, sophomore linebacker James Ross III (Orchard Lake, Mich./Saint Mary's Prep) forced a fumble that Clark returned 24 yards for a TD.

A few minutes later, junior cornerback Raymon Taylor (Highland Park, Ill./Highland Park) notched his second pick of the year in Penn State territory, setting up a 23-yard Gibbons FG.

Penn State then stretched the lead to four (24-20) with a 45-yard field goal.

A 16-yard TD catch from fifth-year senior wide-out Jeremy Gallon (Apopka, Fla./Apopka) -- his first since he recorded three earlier this season against Notre Dame (Sept. 7) -- returned the

lead to U-M.

That lead became 34-24 after Gardner found Funchess from 34 yards out with 10:28 to play in regulation.

A Penn State field goal brought the score back within seven at 34-27, and despite the Wolverines running the clock down to the one-minute mark, a delay-of-game penalty forced U-M to punt with a short field.

The Nittany Lions used three long passes and a sneak to tie the game with just 27 ticks left.

U-M had a chance to win it on a 52-yard try by Gibbons with a few ticks left, but it fell short.

Michigan won the toss and chose to begin the first overtime on defense, which forced PSU to a miss a field goal, but Gibbons' 40-yarder was blocked.

In OT two, the teams traded field goals, forcing a third overtime -- only the third in program history.

Clark recovered a fumble on the first Penn State play, but Gibbons' sixth attempt of the night, from 33 yards, sailed wide left.

The Wolverine offense opened with the ball, but a false start forced U-M into a long and unsuccessful third down, forcing U-M to settle for a 40-yard field goal.

Penn State's winning score followed a successful rush on fourth-and-one and a third-down pass interference call on Michigan, putting the ball on the Wolverines' two-yard line.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Behind record-setting performances from fifth-year senior wide receiver Jeremy Gallon and senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner, the University of Michigan football team (NR AP, No. 24 ESPN/USA Today) outlasted Indiana, 63-47, in an offensive shootout on Saturday (Oct. 19) at Michigan Stadium. The Wolverines amassed a school-record 751 yards of total offense in the bowl-eligible-clinching win.

Gardner went 21-for-29 for a program-record 503 passing yards (averaging nearly 24 yards per completion) and tacked on an additional 81 rushing yards, totaling five touchdowns (3 rush, 2 pass). His 584 yards of total offense -- a new school record -- fell one yard short of the Big Ten total-offense record. Meanwhile, Gallon finished with 14 receptions for 369 yards and two touchdowns, establishing new Big Ten and school records for most receiving yards in a single game. His 369 yards are also the second-highest ever by an FBS receiver.

Fifth-year senior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint added 32 carries for 151 yards and four touchdowns, the sixth Michigan running back to accumulate at least four rushing TDs in a game. Defensively, sophomore Raymon Taylor led the team with nine tackles, while sophomore linebacker James Ross III had eight.

Leading 49-47 with 12:05 to play, Michigan drove the length of the field to the Indiana two-yard line, looking to add some insurance. But Gardner fumbled snap, and Indiana recovered. However, the Wolverines got it back three plays later on fifth-year senior safety Thomas Gordon's first interception, which he returned 30 yards to the Hoosiers' five-yard line. On the ensuing possession, Gardner dropped back to pass, was forced to scramble and scampered six yards to make the score 56-47 with six minutes to play.

Down nine, the Hoosiers marched down the field, but another Gordon interception -- off a tip by freshman defensive back Jourdan Lewis -- ended the drive. The Wolverines kept the ball on the ground and ate up clock, finally icing the game on a Toussaint 27-yard touchdown run with 1:12 to play.

In the first half, the two teams traded touchdowns on multiple occasions. After Indiana opened up the scoring with a 59-yard pass

from Sudfeld to Cody Latimer, Michigan answered on a 13-yard option keeper by Gardner.

On the first play of U-M's next drive -- following an Indiana punt -- Gardner, from his own 19-yard line, connected with Gallon in the right flat on a screen pass that turned into a 70-yard gain. The next two running plays went for negative yards, setting up Michigan with a 3rd-and-17. On that play, Gardner hit Gallon again, this time for a 16-yard gain. At the two-yard line, the Wolverines elected to go for it, and Toussaint ran off left tackle for the score, putting the home team ahead, 14-7, with 4:33 left in the first.

The defense stopped Indiana again on the ensuing drive, and on a 2nd-and-15 from their own 36-yard line, the Wolverines' got a Gardner screen pass to Toussaint for 27 yards. Later in the drive, Gardner found Gallon twice -- for a total of 23 yards -- setting up a seven-yard Toussaint touchdown run to make the score 21-7 with 7:02 left in the half.

The Hoosiers cut the lead on the next drive, as quarterback Tre Roberson found Shane Wynn for a 33-yard touchdown. But the Wolverines responded by going 91 yards in 12 plays to go back up two scores. The Wolverines picked up six first downs on the drive, ending with a 21-yard touchdown pass from Gardner to Gallon.

The Hoosiers got the ball back with little time on the clock before halftime, but Mitch Ewald successfully made a 50-yard field goal, cutting the Michigan lead to 28-17 as the teams headed into the locker room.

Michigan got the ball to start the second half but turned it over on a fumble on the second play of the drive. Indiana took over on the Michigan five-yard line and scored on a two-yard Tevin Coleman touchdown run. Following that score, the two teams each traded quick-strike touchdowns on their respective possessions. After Michigan got the touchdown back courtesy of a Gardner-to-Gallon 50-yard connection, Indiana responded, as Roberson found a wide-open Wynn for five-yard touchdown pass. Following a Michigan punt, the U-M defense held the Hoosiers to a 23-yard field goal from Ewald to cut the lead to one at 35-34 with 6:17 to play in the third quarter.

Gallon then continued his big day, notching another 70-yard reception (his second of the day) to set up Michigan's next score, a two-yard Toussaint run (his third of the day). But Indiana answered again, as Kofi Hughes out-jumped Taylor for a Roberson pass, broke two tackles and streaked down the far sideline for a 67-yard touchdown. The two-point conversion was no good, however, keeping Michigan with a two-point lead at 42-40 as the fourth quarter began.

On the third play of the fourth quarter, Gardner added his second rushing touchdown of the game, before Roberson made the score 49-47 with 12:15 to go on a TD run, and Michigan pulled away.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- The University of Michigan football team (No. 23 AP, No. 21 ESPN/USA Today) surrendered 23 unanswered points in a 29-6 loss at Michigan State (No. 24 AP, No. 24 ESPN/USA Today) on Saturday (Nov. 2) in the battle for the Paul Bunyan Trophy at Spartan Stadium.

A 97-yard Michigan State drive late in the fourth quarter -- punctuated by a Jeremy Langford 40-yard rushing touchdown -- sealed the MSU victory.

Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner passed for 210 yards, with sophomore/freshman wide receiver Jehu Chesson hauling in three passes for 82 yards, a new career high. Junior Raymon Taylor tallied 12 tackles and one interception on the defensive side of the ball.

Michigan opened the scoring on its first drive of the game, as junior kicker Matt Wile booted through a 49-yard field goal with 10:38 remaining in the first quarter. U-M drove 54 yards on its opening possession, with Gallon posting three receptions, including a 38-yard catch on the first play of the game.

Michigan State evened up the score at 3-3 with a field goal by Michael Geiger on its first offensive possession with 9:10 remaining in the quarter. Fullback Trevon Pendleton's 49-yard catch and run on MSU's first play took the Spartans deep into Wolverines territory to the 26-yard line.

The two teams traded punts and field position over the next four possessions while battling a steady rain that created slick field conditions. Michigan State then took its first lead of the game with 11:19 remaining in the second quarter on a 44-yard field goal by Geiger.

With 6:02 on the clock in the second, Michigan started a drive that went 57 yards on six plays, including a Chesson leaping 48-yard grab. That set up fifth-year senior kicker Brendan Gibbons' 39-yard field goal. The kick bounced off the right upright and caromed through for three points and a 6-6 tie.

The Spartans responded to close the second quarter, going 75 yards in 2:54 -- as Connor Cook found Bennie Fowler from 14 yards out for a TD with 23 seconds left in the half, which ended with MSU up, 13-6.

Poor field position plagued U-M throughout the game and especially in the second half. The Wolverines began their first three possessions in the third quarter from their own 19-, seven- and 10-yard lines. Taylor turned around the field position when he picked off Cook with 2:08 remaining in the third quarter and returned it 18 yards to the Spartans' 41-yard line. U-M was unable to capitalize, however, when Gardner was sacked on three consecutive plays.

On the ensuing MSU drive, Cook passed for 44 yards and plunged into the end zone from one yard out to put the Spartans up 22-6. Redshirt freshman Willie Henry blocked the extra-point try to keep the deficit at 16 points.

Michigan took the ball with 10:25 left in the game and moved it 53 yards to the MSU 20-yard line. The drive included a Gardner fourth-and-one rushing conversion, Chesson's two receptions for 24 yards and two catches for 13 yards by sophomore Devin Funchess, but with 6:23 left on the game clock, Darqueze Dennard snuffed the threat with an interception at the MSU three-yard line.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- U-M could not hold on to its fourth-quarter lead, falling to Nebraska, 17-13, on Saturday (Nov. 9) at Michigan Stadium.

The Wolverines led 13-10 with a little more than eight minutes to play, but Nebraska engineered a 14-play, 75-yard drive that spanned more than six minutes to take the lead, as Ameer Abdullah scored on a five-yard touchdown run with 2:03 to play. It is Michigan's first home loss since 2010.

Senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner went 18-of-27 for 196 yards and one touchdown. Sophomore tight end Devin Funchess was the team's leading receiver, hauling in six receptions for 66 yards and the team's lone touchdown, a five-yard strike in the third quarter. Fifth-year senior linebacker Cameron Gordon (Detroit, Mich./Inkster) had eight tackles, a forced fumble and a sack, while sophomore linebacker James Ross III added eight tackles.

After the teams traded punts on their opening possessions, Nebraska jumped out to a quick 10-0 lead through the end of the first quarter on a 21-yard field goal by Pat Smith and an eight-yard touchdown run by tailback Abdullah. The Cornhuskers stifled Michigan during the first half, allowing only 47 yards of total offense on three drives.

The Wolverines responded to get on the board with a field goal of their own, using a 13-play, 66-yard drive to bring the score to 10-3 with 11:47 left in the second quarter. Fifth-year senior Brendan Gibbons connected on a 27-yard field goal, finishing off a drive that lasted more than six minutes.

Michigan reversed the field off a great special teams play, as junior punter Matt Wile booted a 69-yard punt all the way down to the Nebraska three-yard line. The Michigan defense stood tall, not yielding a single yard on the ensuing Nebraska possession, getting the ball back on the Cornhusker side of the field after a punt. The Wolverines opted to go for it on a fourth-and-four, but Gardner was sacked, turning the ball over on downs, sending U-M into halftime down, 10-3.

The Wolverines had new life on the opening drive of the second half, knotting the score at 10-10 on a five-yard touchdown pass from

Gardner to Funchess. U-M went 75 yards in 10 plays, with 44 of those yards coming on two of the first four plays of the drive: a 25-yard pass from Gardner to fifth-year senior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint and a 19-yard pass from Gardner to freshman tight end Jake Butt (Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington North). The Wolverines faced only one third down on that drive.

The Michigan defense forced the game's first turnover in the middle of the third, a fumble that was forced by Gordon and recovered by sophomore/freshman Chris Wormley. However, the Wolverines did not take advantage, as Wile missed a 52-yard field goal with the wind at his back.

Special teams then played a factor again, as Nebraska's Jordan Westerkamp muffed a punt that was recovered on one bounce by sophomore Dennis Norfleet at the Nebraska 25-yard line with 10:03 to play in the game. U-M stalled and settled for a 40-yard field goal make by Gibbons with 8:08 to play to go up, 13-10.

The Cornhuskers responded with a long drive and took the lead for good with 2:03 to play. Facing a fourth-and-two from the Michigan 31-yard line, Nebraska elected not to try a field goal attempt into the wind, instead converting for a 26-yard gain all the way to the Michigan five-yard line. Three players later on a third-and-goal, Nebraska quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. ran an option left, pitching the ball to Abdullah, who dove into the end zone for the touchdown.

The Wolverines had one final chance . On a fourth-and-five from the their own 41-yard line, Gardner's pass slipped through the arms of senior Drew Dileo.

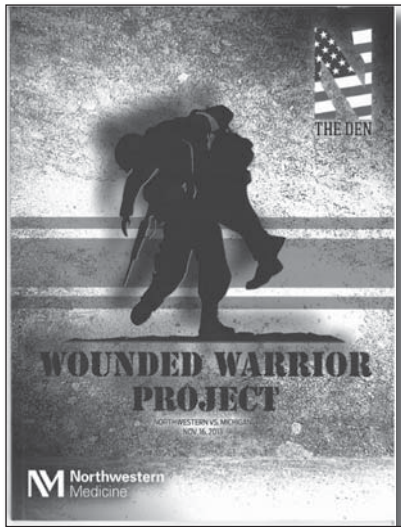

EVANSTON, Ill. -- The University of Michigan football team kicked a tying field goal as time expired in regulation before prevailing in three overtimes at Northwestern, 27-19, on Saturday (Nov. 16) at Ryan Field.

With Michigan down 9-6 with less than a minute to play, senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner found fifth-year senior wideout Jeremy Gallon at the Northwestern 27 with 12 seconds left. Michigan hustled on its kicking unit and got the snap off with a tick left. Fifth-year senior kicker Brendan Gibbons split the uprights from 44 yards out to send the game into overtime.

The teams traded touchdowns in the first OT, and each kicked field goals in OT2, before Gardner scored on a third-down option and ran it in for two to set up a chance for a Wolverine win. The Michigan defense used a second-down sack and two consecutive pass defenses to preserve U-M's seventh win of the season.

In addition to his game-winning scamper, Gardner completed 24 of a career-high 43 throws for 226 yards and a score. On the defensive side, sophomore linebacker James Ross III registered a career-best 11 tackles and a sack.

On their first drive, the Wolverines marched down the field mainly via freshman tailbacks Derrick Green (Richmond, Va./Hermitage) and De'Veon Smith before stalling at the eight and settling for a 25-yard Gibbons field goal, despite the 20-plus mile-per-hour winds blowing in his face.

The Wildcats offense responded with a 40-yard field goal of their own.

Four consecutive punts and a missed 51-yard field goal attempt by Matt Wile followed. Northwestern then reached the Michigan five, but the U-M defense stood tall and forced a 22-yard field goal for a 6-3 halftime score.

As the rain continued to fall, the first four drives of the second half ended in punts. On the fifth possession, Michigan once again held in the red zone, resulting in Northwestern padding its lead to 9-3 thanks to Jeff Budzien's third field goal of the contest, this time from 29 out.

Michigan's next drive reached just past mid-field, before a Wile punt that was downed on the Northwestern 1. After a short two-yard

drive, the Wildcats Brandon Williams' shank gave Michigan the ball just 10 yards away from the end zone.

Despite the great field position, Gardner and the offense were once again unable to convert on third down, marking the ninth consecutive failed attempt. Gibbons' 43rd career field goal brought U-M back within three, 9-6, with 11:45 remaining.

After Northwestern was stopped inches short of a first down, U-M reached the Northwestern five-yard line and elected to go for it on fourth-and-two with four minutes to go; but a Gardner bootleg was stopped, and the ball went back to Northwestern.

Following a punt, U-M had the ball on its own 22 with less than two-and-a-half minutes on the clock. Michigan converted on two fourth downs -- a Gardner six-yard scramble and nine-yard catch from sophomore tight end Devin Funchess -- and moved to the NU 30 following a pass interference call. A sack then pushed Michigan back to the 43, but Gardner found Gallon for the 10th time in the game to set up the tying kick.

Michigan got the ball first in the first overtime and converted when, from 11 yards out, Gardner found freshman tight end Jake Butt (Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington North), who reeled in a one-handed catch for his first career touchdown.

The Wildcats' offense responded with a touchdown of their own, as quarterback Kain Colter punched it in from one yard out after just six plays.

In the second overtime, Michigan forced Northwestern to kick another field goal, but after a ball bounced off the fingertips of Gallon in the end zone on third down, Gibbons was true from 29 yards to enter OT3.

U-M started with the ball and an incomplete pass, before four Gardner rushes ended in a touchdown. Gardner got the call on the two-point attempt and converted.

With another chance to end the game, senior defensive tackle Jibreel Black sacked QB Trevor Sieman for a 14-yard loss on second down. Senior safety Thomas Gordon nearly intercepted a long pass on the Wildcats' third-and-23 attempt and picked off NU's last heave to the end zone on fourth down to end the game.

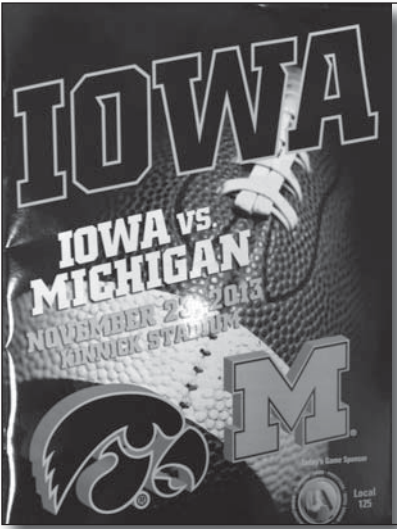

IOWA CITY, Iowa -- U-M carried a 21-7 lead into halftime before being outscored, 17-0, in the second half in a three-point (24-21) defeat at Iowa on Saturday, Nov. 23, at Kinnick Stadium. Despite a trio of interceptions on defense, 158 total yards of offense doomed the Wolverines.

After being forced to punt on its opening drive, U-M blitzed on Iowa's first play from scrimmage and forced an errant pass from quarterback Jake Rudock, whose floater went right into the hands of junior linebacker Brennen Beyer, resulting in a seven-yard interception return and 7-0 Michigan lead with just 1:41 off the clock.

Iowa, which missed a 36-yard field goal earlier in the first quarter, overcame an early 15-yard penalty to tie the contest, as Rudock connected with CJ Fiedorowicz on a third down from the five with 3:39 remaining.

Michigan's defense came up big on the next two possessions, first stopping Iowa on fourth down, before junior/sophomore defensive back Blake Countess recorded his fifth interception of the year -- the first U-M DB to reach that mark since 2000 -- and returned it to the Hawkeye 28.

The Wolverines took advantage of the short field, and on a second and goal to go from the two, senior/junior quarterback Devin Gardner scrambled and found sophomore tight end A.J. Williams, whose first career catch put U-M up a touchdown.

Late in the quarter, U-M again took advantage of the short field (47 yards), as Gardner completed one to fifth-year senior wide receiver Jeremy Gallon from nine yards out to extend the Wolverines' lead to 21-7 with 41 ticks left in the half.

A long Iowa kick return following the touchdown gave the Hawkeyes a chance to kick a field goal with less than 10 seconds remaining. A bobbled snap, however, prevented the kick from being attempted.

The Hawkeyes received the kick to start the second half and needed just three plays to halve the Michigan lead, with the dagger being a 55-yard scoring pass-and-catch from Rudock to Tevaun Smith.

After five consecutive punts, junior corner back Raymon Taylor halted an Iowa possession in Michigan territory with an interception; but the Hawkeyes marched down the field to start the fourth and took less than three minutes to tie the game at 21. Mark Weisman finished the drive with a nine-yard run, as he helped the Iowa rushing attack top 100 yards for the game.

Following junior punter Matt Wile's 10th punt of the day, the Hawkeyes utilized a nine-play drive to take a 24-21 lead with 6:02 showing in the clock, as Mike Meyer booted a 34-yard field goal.

Michigan moved the ball into Iowa territory, but on a second-down scramble, Gardner had the ball ripped from his arms and Iowa recovered with just 2:40 remaining. Two Iowa first downs later, the game came to a close.

Gardner failed to get over 100 yards passing (98) despite his two TD throws, while Taylor notched a team-high nine tackles and junior defensive end Frank Clark had 2.5 tackles-for-loss.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- The University of Michigan football team scored six offensive touchdowns and had a chance to take the lead with 32 seconds remaining in the game, but the Maize and Blue's two-point conversion failed, and Ohio State (No. 3 AP, No. 3 USA Today) escaped with a 42-41 win on Saturday afternoon (Nov. 30) in front of 113,511 fans in Michigan Stadium.

After 14 straight points from the Wolverines, Ohio State went ahead, 42-35, with 2:20 left on a one-yard touchdown run from Carlos Hyde.

Michigan followed with an 11-play, 84-yard drive to cut the Buckeye lead to one. Completions to sophomore Devin Funchess (Farmington Hills, Mich./Harrison) (14 yards) and senior Drew Dileo (Greenwell Springs, La./Parkview Baptist) (13 yards) put Michigan at its own 43. An 11-yard completion to Dileo followed by a 13-yard catch from fifth-year senior Joe Reynolds (Rochester, Mich./Rochester Adams) gave Michigan the ball on Ohio State's 33. The Wolverines called timeout with 50 seconds left after a Gardner sack. On 3rd-and-8, senior/junior Devin Gardner (Detroit, Mich./Inkster) completed a pass to fifth-year senior Fitzgerald Toussaint (Youngstown, Ohio/Liberty) for 29 yards to the OSU two. Gardner connected again with Funchess for a two-yard touchdown on the very next play as the Maize and Blue trailed 42-41 with 32 seconds left. On the two-point conversion attempt, Gardner's pass to Dileo was intercepted. Michigan tried an inside kick, which was recovered by the Buckeyes, who kneeled down to ice it.

Gardner went 32-of-45 for 451 yards, the second-highest mark in program history, and four touchdowns. He also ran for a touchdown and helped the Maize and Blue rack up 603 total yards of offense. Fifth-year senior Jeremy Gallon (Apopka, Fla./Apopka) tallied 175 receiving yards on nine catches, while freshman Jake Butt (Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington) caught five passes for 85 yards and a touchdown. On the ground, freshman De'Veon Smith (Warren, Ohio/Howland) ran for 57 yards on seven carries, while Toussaint joined Gardner with a rushing touchdown.

Both teams scored a pair of touchdowns in a 28-point first quarter. After the Wolverines forced the Buckeyes to punt on their first drive, the Maize and Blue executed a five-play, 99-yard drive to take a 7-0 lead. Gardner hit Gallon on a bubble screen for an 84-yard reception down to the OSU two-yard line. Two plays later, Gardner sneaked into the end zone with 9:24 left in the first quarter to give the Wolverines the early advantage. Ohio State answered on its next drive as Braxton Miller hit Devin Smith on a 53-yard touchdown pass with 5:08 left in the first.

Michigan retook the lead with 2:11 left in the first on a seven-play, 70-yard touchdown drive that took 2:57. Gardner first hit Butt for a 37-yard pass to the Buckeye 22. Three plays later, Toussaint scored on a four-yard run, giving the Maize and Blue the 14-7 lead. However, Ohio State knotted the score at 14 on a 53-yard Miller quarterback rush for a touchdown.

The Wolverines scored for the third straight drive when a 17-yard touchdown pass to Gallon capped a four-play, 78-yard march to start the second quarter. Funchess hurdled an OSU defender on a 22-yard pass on the play before the score.

The next two Ohio State drives ended in an interception by sophomore Blake Countess (Owings Mills, Md./Our Lady of Good Counsel) and a punt, but the Buckeyes knotted the game at 21-all just before half-time. Miller ended a seven-play, 91-yard drive with a 21-yard touchdown run with 1:03 left.

Michigan and Ohio State each went three and out on its first drive of the second half. The Wolverines had a 20-yard strike from Gardner to Dileo on their next drive, but a Gardner fumble at the OSU 45-yard line turned the ball over to the Buckeyes. Ohio State went 55 yards on five plays, capped by a three-yard scamper from Miller, his third rushing touchdown of the game, to give the Buckeyes a 28-21 advantage with 6:59 left in the third quarter. Michigan drove down the field on its next possession with the help of a 38-yard run by Smith, but the drive stalled at the Ohio State 14 as Gardner's pass to Dileo on 4th-and-two fell incomplete.

Ohio State extended its lead to 35-21 with 1:05 left in the third on a six-play, 86-yard drive after the U-M turnover on downs. The score came when Miller connected with Jeff Heurman from 22 yards out.

The Maize and Blue struck on the next drive, as Gardner's 11-yard pass to Dileo in the end zone capped an 11-play, 83-yard drive that took 4:50. Michigan then forced a fumble on the Buckeyes' next drive, and junior Desmond Morgan (Holland, Mich./West Ottawa) covered it, giving the Wolverines possession on the Ohio State 41 with 10:30 remaining in the game.

The Wolverines capitalized on the Ohio State miscue. After Gardner scampered for 14 yards to the Buckeye 26, the Wolverines got it to the OSU 12 after a 16-yard pass from Gardner to Gallon. Michigan then converted on a 4th-and-2 from the Ohio State four on a three-yard Gardner sneak. Three plays later, Gardner connected with Butt for a two-yard touchdown pass, tying the game at 35 with 5:01 left.

The Wolverines amassed 31 first downs in the game, forced a pair of Buckeye turnovers and were led on defense by a trio of players with six tackles.

Miller accounted for five of Ohio State's six touchdowns (three rushing, two passing) and was 6-of-15 in the air for 133 yards and had 153 rushing yards. Hyde ran for 226 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries.

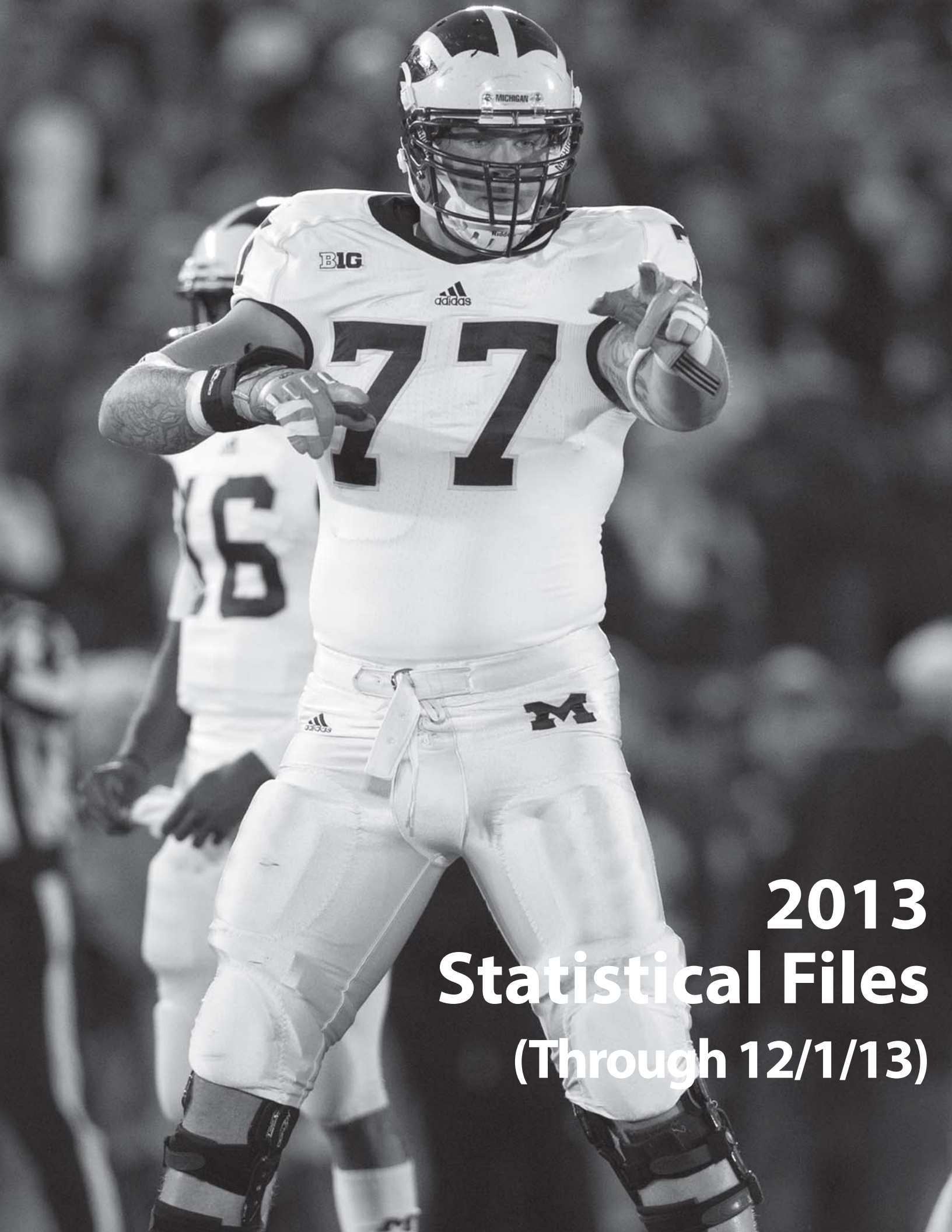

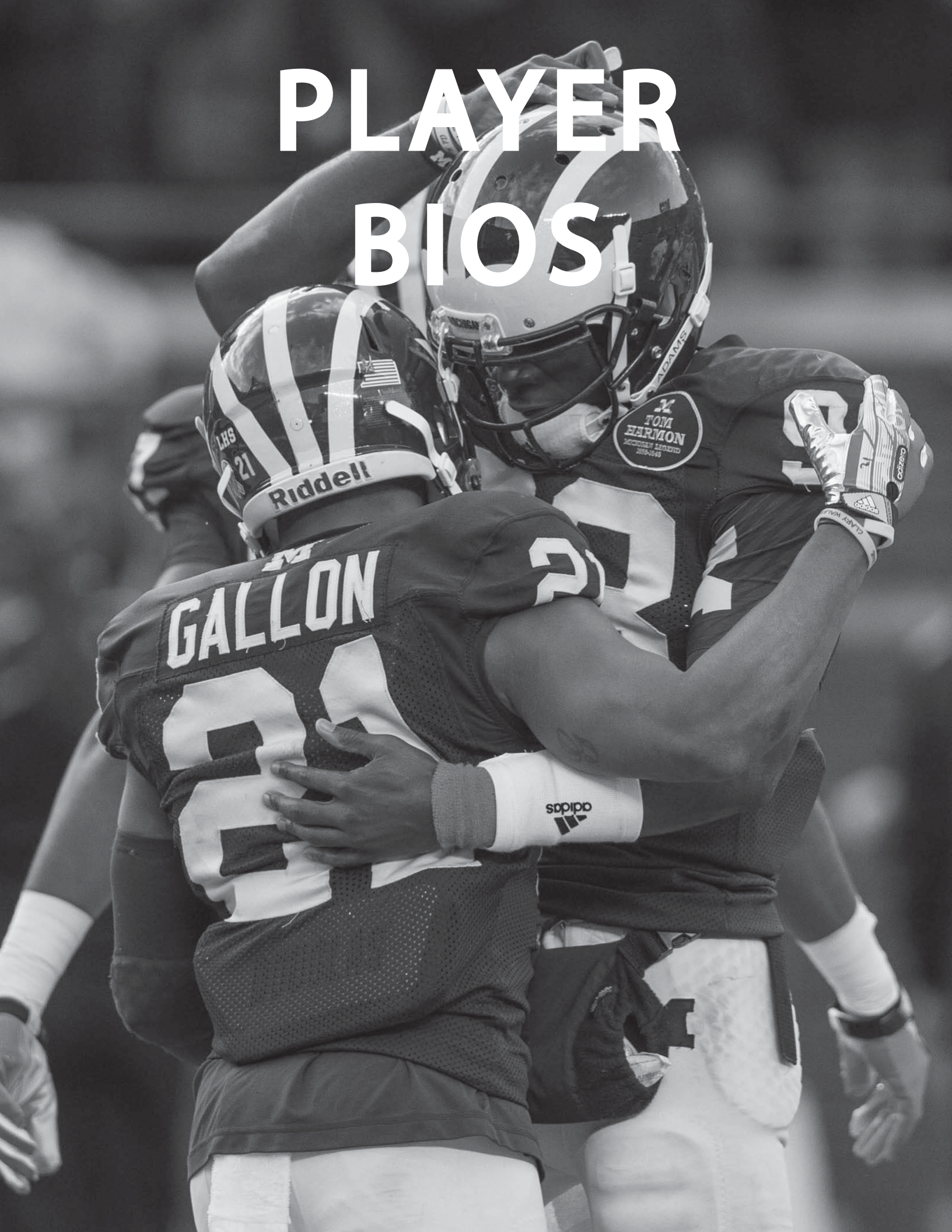
