- · Finishing lacquer.

- · Made of African walnut
- Finishing with pickling and lacquer.

- The idea was born during a rainy and thunder-storm full summer.
- The relief is made of pine and has been treated with varnish and bee-wax.

- · Made of "jelutong"
- Finishing with varnish and lacquer.



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"Spring"

- Made of lime
- Finishing with stain and lacquer.

- Relief woodcarving made of American lime.
- The woodcarving captures a moment in the life of Teha'amana - Paul Gauguins' (1948 - 1903) wife from his stay in the island of Noa Noa (Tahiti). She has just received a letter from her husband - now in Europe, telling her that he will always love her and will soon be back. She remembers his descriptions of Paris and thinks of him with true love

Doris, love & Society

- Relief woodcarving made from birch (background) and pine(Doris, the lady).
- This carving captures the struggle of Doris with morality. She loves dearly her husband but at the same time loves in a different but equally strong way her lover, whom she is embracing. Can it be that true love is only meant for one person?

The parrot in the background represents society, ready to chatter and criticize whatever is different. A Unicorn represents the right choice that Doris will make about her future if she is strong enough to follow her hearts desire. Her lover is dressed as a joker because he feels like a fool with the situation.

- Relief woodcarving of birch
- The artist in the process of creation is inspired by Idàlia (she who saw the sun) who poses for him beautifully under the shining Cleomênia (glorious moon).

- Relief woodcarving on a aspen log. Finishing with bee-wax and linseed oil.
- With this lamp my intention was to capture the wonderful feelings of the morning sun rays as they enter Aniaras tropical bedroom. She stretches and feels the joy of a new day coming.

- Lamp Relief woodcarving of Finnish birch.
- Atargatis shines with the wonderful light of understanding while she talks to her son Ichthys- the holy fish

"Celeste by the sea" Mood lamp

- Relief woodcarving on Finnish birch. Finishing with bee-wax
- Celeste (from heaven) by the sea is a romantic expression of two of my favourite subjects: Feminine beauty and the force of the sea. She is sitting on a rock letting the breeze and the salty smell of the sea fill her with joy as she rejoices with the warm feeling of the sun and lets her gaze wander off into eternal distance.

- Lamp relief woodcarving of birch.
- As Eni (spirit) is born a wonderful butterfly emerges and through purity and calm brings light to the world.



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Iris & the whispering breeze

- · Mirror frame of birch.
- Typical lake scenery from Finland.
 After a harsh winter the Fins truly
 enjoy the warmth of spring and
 summer. Iris represents the rainbow,
 beautifully shining after a short
 summer rain. She is lying by a lake
 listening to the breeze that whispers
 to her the secrets of summer love.
 The myth tells that where the
 rainbow meets the earth there is a
 wonderful treasure hidden.

- Pier table made of birch and linden.
- The yearly cycle starts with freshness and beauty, a time of innocence and romance

Meretrish

- African walnut table with mermaid sculpture and background relief made of Finnish birch.
- Poseidon, lord of the Sea, is furious with the approaching Vikings because he is jealous and believes that his beloved Meretrish might fall in love with anyone of them. In his fury he creates a wild storm and rises above the sea to invoke havoe with the aid of thunder and lightning. The magnificence of his power is shown in the way his fury and anger are controlled so that they simply affect the Vikings but leave Meretrish safe and secure in her peaceful and oblivious waiting

"Dreams"

•Mantlepiece made of finnish birch

•I set myself the task of creating a story about the sea and love basing myself on a painting by Gustav Klimt, "Danae". On the left hand side the mermaid Auricélia watches the ship with her platonic love in the horizon, while under the water a sea horse plays around symbolising the power of will when it is set in freedom. On the right hand side Auricélia sleeps and the shower of gold above her is used as a

symbol for the fertility of her dreams. Below her, again under the water, a big fish

swims downwards symbolising the soul imprisoned by matter.

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"Edith"

- Relief woodcarving on grey alder
- The warm sun caresses Edith as she prepares for a swim in the lake. Someone arrives and she blushes seductively.

- Relief woodcarving on finnish birch. Wood finishing with acrylic and oil colours, linseed oil and bee-wax.
- Midsummer afternoon in Finland. The warm and beautiful light caresses the girl by the lake.

"Playful Avani"

- Lamp-Relief woodcarving on finnish birch. Wood finishing with acrylic and oil colours, linseed oil and bee-wax.
- Enjoying freedom and vitality by the Sea, Avani dances happily thus producing warm, tender golden light.
