MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All requests for working press, photo, and broadcast credentials for Stanford's 2013-14 home games should be made in writing on company letterhead via fax, e-mail, or mail to Aaron Juarez, Assistant Communications Director, Stanford University, Arrillaga Family Sports Center, 641 East Campus Drive, Stanford, CA 94305-6150. All credentials will be left at the Press Will Call at the southeast entrance of Maples Pavilion, adjacent to the loading dock. Only media who cover Stanford on a regular basis will be considered for season credentials. Credentials will be issued on a priority basis to daily newspapers, originating radio and television stations, national weekly or monthly publications, electronic media outlets and local and regional television crews. Credentials may be picked up in the Stanford Athletic Communications Office prior to the day of the game.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

Photo credentials will be issued to photographers on assignment from legitimate newsgathering organizations. Freelance photographers not on assignment will not be considered for photo credentials. All requests must be made at least 24 hours prior to each game. Photographers are not allowed to shoot from in front of or behind team benches or the scorer's table. Flash photography is not permitted.

ON-LINE CREDENTIALING POLICY

Credentials for on-line media services will only be issued to those outlets that are a part of national newsgathering organizations, reach a broad audience, produce original content and employ full-time journalists. Any exceptions must be approved by the Stanford Athletic Communications Department.

STROBE PHOTOGRAPHY

Photographers wishing to strobe Stanford women's basketball games must obtain approval to do so by contacting Aaron Juarez, Assistant Communications Director, at least 24 hours prior to the game. No more than three sets of strobes are allowed for any game. Strobes must be installed at least two hours prior to the game (no exceptions) and installation should be arranged through the Stanford Athletic Facilities Office after obtaining approval from the Athletic Communications Office.

WILL CALL

The press will call window is located at the southeast entrance of Maples Pavilion, adjacent to the loading dock. It will be open 90 minutes prior to tipoff and will remain open until the end of the first half. All members of the media must show proper photo identification when picking up their credentials. Parking passes can be left at will call upon request.

PARKING

The main parking lot is located at the south end of Maples Pavilion on Campus Drive. Additional parking is available at the Varsity Lot adjacent to Stanford Stadium and Klein Field At Sunken Diamond on Galvez Street. A limited number of parking passes are available for members of the media. Outlets covering Stanford Basketball will have first priority. University permits are not required on weekends or after 4 p.m. on weekdays.

SCOUTS

Professional teams wishing to scout games at Maples Pavilion may purchase tickets by contacting the Stanford Ticket Office at (650) 721-1021 or (800) STANFORD.

PRESS ROW

Press seating is assigned on the floor and in the upper east press area at Maples Pavilion. Seats in the upper press area may be assigned as needed or requested. The courtside and upper press seating areas will be equipped with phone lines and Internet access, conventional and wireless.

PRESS AREA SERVICES

Programs, media guides, cumulative statistics and game notes will be available prior to the start of each game. Complete box scores and play-by-play sheets will be distributed to the media at halftime and at the end of the game. An athletic communications representative will accommodate any fax requests at the conclusion of the game. Refreshments will be served approximately one hour before tipoff.

INTERNET ACCESS

Maples Pavilion is a wireless facility. A user name and password will be provided to credentialed members of the media on game day.

POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCES

Stanford head coach Tara VanDerveer and selected players, along with the visiting head coach and selected players, will be made available to the media following a 10-minute "cooling off" period. Press conferences will be held in the Maples Pavilion media room, located on the south side of the court level. Prior to the conclusion of each game media members should inform the Stanford Athletic Communications staff which Stanford players they would like to interview after the game. Additional interviews with visiting team players will be coordinated by the visiting team's SID staff.

IN-SEASON INTERVIEW POLICY

All requests for player or coach interviews must be made through Assistant Communications Director Aaron Juarez at (650) 725-7277 or (408) 250-1598. Please allow at least 24 hours' notice. Interviews may be done over the telephone or in person prior to or following practice, depending on the practice schedule. Since practice times vary, please call the Athletic Communications Office for an updated schedule.

DIRECTIONS TO MAPLES PAVILION

Stanford home games are played at Maples Pavilion on the Stanford University campus

- From U.S. 101: Use the Embarcadero exit West. After crossing El Camino Real, the road becomes Galvez Street. Stay to the left when the road divides. At the first stop sign, turn left onto Campus Drive. Maples Pavilion is on the left side of the road after the first stop sign.
- From Interstate 280: Use the Page Mill Road exit East. Turn left onto El Camino Real. Turn left onto Serra Street. At the second stop sign, turn right onto Campus Drive. Maples Pavilion is on the right.




- Overall, Stanford players have earned 46 All-America selections from the WBCA and the Associated Press





STANFORD IN FIBA

- Head coach Tara VanDerveer, Jennifer Azzi, and Katy Steding were all part of the Olympic Gold Medal-winning USA Basketball Team at the 1996 Atlanta Games.
- Tara VanDerveer boasts a career international record of 88-8 at the helm of various USA Basketball teams, including a perfect 60-0 run in 1995-96 as head coach of the USA Basketball Olympic Team.
- Jayne Appel won a gold medal with the USA Basketball Senior National Team at the 2010 FIBA World Championship.
- Former Cardinal players Jillian Harmon and Clare Bodensteiner became the first Stanford players to represent a country other than the United States when they played for New Zealand at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing.

Head Coach • 35th Season (28th at Stanford) • Indiana, 1975

n a storied 34-year coaching career, Setsuko Ishiyama Director of Women's Basketball and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2011 member Tara VanDerveer has established herself as one of the top coaches in the history of both collegiate and international women's basketball.

Regarded in the profession as one of the

most well-respected and dynamic coaches in the country, VanDerveer was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass. in August 2011. In 2002, she was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in Knoxville, Tenn.

An ambassador for both Stanford University and the sport of college basketball, VanDerveer has enjoyed an unprecedented level of success through an energetic and positive approach to the game. A 15-time conference coach of the year (13 Pac-12/Pac-10, 2 Big Ten), VanDerveer has accumulated an impressive 894-203 (.815) record over her career.

Entering 2013-14 VanDerveer needs just six wins to become only the fifth women's basketball head coach to reach the 900-win mark.

VanDerveer possesses the third-highest career winning percentage among Division I women's basketball coaches, and has won two NCAA Championships, led her teams to 10 Final Fours and captured 24 conference titles (21 Pac-12/Pac-10, three Big Ten). Last year's trip to the NCAA Tournament was the 27th postseason appearance of her career.

In 27 seasons at Stanford, she owns a 742-152 (.830) record. She has led the Cardinal to two NCAA Championships (1990, 1992), 10 NCAA Final Four appearances (1990-92, 1995, 1997, 2008-12), 21 Pac-12/Pac-10 Conference titles, 10 Pac-12/Pac-10 Tournament crowns and 25 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Over the past six seasons, VanDerveer has overseen one of the most successful programs in the nation as the Cardinal has accumulated a record of 205-19 (.915) and been one of just two programs to reach the Final Four five times over that span. Stanford is also one of just four teams to reach the national title game twice since 2008. Her Cardinal teams have won at least 30 games in each of the past six seasons as well, topping out with a program-record 36 wins in 2009-10.

In 2011 VanDerveer earned her fourth National Coach of the Year honor, sharing the Associated Press' top coaching award and earning the Naismith Trophy from the Atlanta Tip-Off Club after leading the Cardinal to a 33-3 record and its fourth straight Final Four trip.

Under VanDerveer's watch the Cardinal enters the 2013-14 season as 13-time defending Pac-12 champion and has captured seven straight Pac-12 Tournament titles. Over the past six seasons VanDerveer has also seen six players earn All-America recognition a total of 20 times from both the WBCA and Associated Press.

Candice Wiggins became Stanford's first four-time WBCA All-American and its second winner of the Wade Trophy in 2008. Nnemkadi Ogwumike became Stanford's third three-time WBCA All-American (2010-12) while Jayne Appel (2009-10) and Chiney Ogwumike (2012-13) have each earned the honor twice, and Jeanette Pohlen was voted to the Associated Press All-America First Team in 2011. Kayla Pedersen was twice voted an All-America honorable mention (2010-11).

During that same span Stanford players have taken home five Pac-12/ Pac-10 Player of the Year awards, two Pac-12/Pac-10 Freshman of the Year awards, three Pac-12/Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year awards and earned a total of 21 All-Pac-12 and All-Pac-10 Team nods, the most of any school in the conference.

VanDerveer's contributions to the sport of women's basketball reach far outside the collegiate world. She became internationally known in 1996 when she guided the United States Olympic Women's Basketball Team to the gold medal in Atlanta. VanDerveer led the National/Olympic team, which included Stanford products Jennifer Azzi and Katy Steding, to an

incredible 60-0 record from 1995-1996. Overall, VanDerveer has compiled an 88-8 (.917) record, including four gold medals, in eight head coaching stints with USA Basketball.

VanDerveer at Stanford

Since arriving at Stanford in 1985, VanDerveer's philosophy and teaching methods have helped Stanford women's basketball maintain a level of success that has paved the way for both program milestones and individual achievement.

VanDerveer, who was named the third women's basketball coach in Stanford University history on May 7, 1985, has guided the Cardinal to a 742-152 record in 27 seasons, including a 407-59 (.873) record in regular season Pac-12 play.

Under her leadership, Stanford has captured two NCAA Titles and made 10 Final Four appearances. Additionally, her teams have reached the Elite Eight 15 times and the Sweet 16 on 19 occasions. VanDerveer's teams are 67-23 (.744) in NCAA Tournament play. With a 33-3 record in 2012-13, the Cardinal has won 30 or more games 11 times, including in each of the past six seasons, and 20 or more games 22 times on VanDerveer's watch.

VanDerveer took a sabbatical from Stanford during the 1995-96 season to serve as head coach of the USA Basketball Women's National Team ahead of the 1996 Olympic Games. As a result, the 1995-96 Stanford team's 29-3 record, Pac-10 title and Final Four appearance is not credited to VanDerveer but to associate head coach Amy Tucker and Marianne Stanley, who served as interim head coach and co-head coach, respectively, for the season.

VanDerveer's teams have compiled a 375-34 (.917) home record and 12 perfect seasons at Maples Pavilion during her tenure. Stanford boasted a school-record 82-game home winning streak from Nov. 28, 2007 to Dec. 29, 2012, going five whole seasons plus part of a sixth unbeaten at Maples Pavilion.

Stanford teams have been dominant in both the Pac-12 and nationally, evident by VanDerveer's numerous awards. She is a four-time National Coach of the Year (1988-90, 2011), a seven-time District/Region Coach of the Year (1988-90, 2007, 2009-11), and has been named Pac-12/Pac-10 Coach of the Year 13 times (1989-90, 1995, 1997, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2008-09, 2011-13). Additionally, VanDerveer earned Northern California Women's Intercollegiate Coach of the Year honors five times in a six-year span in the late 80's and early 90's (1988-90, 1992-93).

Perhaps one of VanDerveer's most notable attributes is her ability to connect with student-athletes and adapt to the ever-changing landscape of college athletics. Considered one of the nation's premier recruiters, VanDerveer and her staff routinely bring top classes to The Farm. The Stanford staff brought in the likes of Jennifer Azzi and Kate Starbird, both of whom won women's basketball's highest individual honor - the James Naismith National Player of the Year Award (Azzi 1990; Starbird 1997) - as well as Candice Wiggins, who in 2008 joined Azzi (1990) as Stanford's second recipient of the State Farm/WBCA Wade Trophy Player of the Year Award. First-team State Farm (formerly Kodak) All-Americans that have flourished under VanDerveer's guidance include Wiggins (2005-08), the program's only four-time All-American to date, Nnemkadi Ogwumike (2010-12), Nicole Powell (2002-04), Azzi (1989-90), Val Whiting (1992-93), Kate Starbird (1996-97), Jayne Appel (2009-10), Chiney Ogwumike (2012-13), Sonja Henning (1991), Kristin Folkl (1998) and Jeanette Pohlen (2011). Overall, VanDerveer has guided her players to two Wade Trophy Player of the Year honors, two Naismith Player of the Year honors, 22 WBCA First-Team All-America honors, 17 Pac-10/Pac-12 Player of the Year awards, 61 first-team All-Pac-10/All-Pac-12 selections and 37 appointments to USA Basketball teams.

VanDerveer's alumnae have also made their mark on the professional level in both the WNBA and the ABL. In 2001, Stanford had a league-high 10 players on WNBA rosters. That dominating trend stretches back to 1996, when Stanford had nine players on opening day rosters in the ABL's inaugural season, the most of any institution.

In 2007, Brooke Smith and Kristen Newlin became Stanford's first WNBA selections since Nicole Powell in 2004, and in 2008, Wiggins was taken third overall by the Minnesota Lynx. Wiggins would end up capping off an impressive rookie campaign by being named the WNBA's Sixth Woman of the Year in September, 2008. In 2010, Jayne Appel would be selected fifth overall by the San Antonio Silver Stars and be named to the WNBA All-Star Team. A year later, Kayla Pedersen (No. 7 - Tulsa Shock) and Jeanette Pohlen (No. 9 - Indiana Fever) would both be selected in the first round of the 2011 WNBA Draft.

Most recently, Nnemkadi Ogwumike became the first Stanford player to go No. 1 in the WNBA Draft when the Los Angeles Sparks made her the top choice of the 2012 Draft.

At the conclusion of the 2013 WNBA season, Stanford boasted seven alumnae on the league's active roster, with six being former first-round picks.

NCAA Champions

VanDerveer earned her first NCAA Championship in 1989-90, after the Cardinal won its first 20 games en route to a 32-1 overall mark. Stanford set more than 100 school, Pac-10 and NCAA postseason records during that campaign. After defeating Mississippi and Arkansas in the NCAA West Regional at Maples Pavilion, the Cardinal continued to roll with a 75-66 win over Virginia in the semifinals and an 88-81 victory over Auburn in the final to capture its first-ever NCAA title.

The Cardinal earned its second championship in 1991-92, despite the loss of three first-team All-Pac-10 players (Sonja Henning, Trisha Stevens and Julie Zeilstra) the previous season. The Cardinal won its first 10 games, finished 15-3 in conference play to win its fourth straight Pac-10 title, and went into the NCAA Tournament on an upswing behind the play of Kodak first-team All-American Val Whiting. Stanford defeated Western Kentucky, 78-62, in the championship game to end the season with its second national title in three years and a 30-3 record.

Prior to Stanford

Prior to her arrival at Stanford, VanDerveer led Ohio State to national prominence from 1980-85, as the Buckeyes went 110-37 (.748) overall and 55-5 (.917) in the Big Ten during her tenure.

During that time, the Buckeyes won three Big Ten Championships (1983, 1984, 1985), compiled four consecutive 20-win seasons and made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1982, 1984, 1985). In 1984-85, Ohio State

finished seventh in the national rankings and fell to eventual national champion Old Dominion by four points in the East Regional Final. She was twice named Big Ten Coach of the Year (1984, 1985) during her tenure in Columbus.

Before Ohio State, VanDerveer served as head coach at the University of Idaho. In two seasons in Moscow (1978-79, 1979-80), she brought unprecedented success to Vandal women's basketball. The Vandals went 42-14 in her two seasons and advanced to the AIAW Tournament (predecessor to the NCAA Tournament) in 1980.

VanDerveer and USA Basketball

A veteran international coach, VanDerveer had served as head coach of seven previous USA Basketball teams before earning the prestigious job as the 1995-96 U.S. National Team and 1996 U.S. Olympic Team head coach on April 13, 1995.

The 1995-96 USA Basketball Senior National Team posted a record of 52-0 before Olympic competition. At the XXVI Olympiad in Atlanta, VanDerveer's team went 8-0, including a 111-87 defeat of Brazil in the final to capture the gold medal. The gold medal by VanDerveer's team was the third in five Olympic competitions for U.S. women.

Prior to Atlanta, VanDerveer led the team to a perfect 52-0 record during a tour of the globe in 1995 and 1996, including a 20-0 mark against U.S. collegiate opposition. Coupled with the performance in Atlanta, VanDerveer finished her one-year appointment with an amazing 60-0 record.

For those efforts, VanDerveer was honored as the 1996 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year. She was also selected as the 1996 USOC Elite Basketball Coach of the Year.

Prior to coaching the National Team, VanDerveer directed the 1994 USA Goodwill Games Team to a 4-0 record and the gold medal in St. Petersburg, Russia. Also in 1994, she led the USA World Championship Team to the bronze medal and a tournament-best record of 7-1 in Australia. One year earlier, VanDerveer helped the United States earn its FIBA World Championship berth by coaching the team to a gold medal at the 1993 World Championship Qualifying Tournament in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

In 1991, VanDerveer's USA World University Games team posted an 8-0 record and won the gold medal in Sheffield, England. VanDerveer also coached the 1990 USA Select Team and the 1986 U.S. Olympic Festival East Team.

Personal

VanDerveer is a 1975 graduate of Indiana University, where she was a Dean's List scholar for three years and a sociology major. While at Indiana, VanDerveer was a starting guard for three years on the women's basketball team. For her efforts at Indiana and her accomplishments after leaving the Hoosiers, VanDerveer was inducted into the Indiana University Hall of Fame in 1995 and in 2012 received a Distinguished Alumni Award from the Indiana University College of Arts and Sciences.

In addition to the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and Indiana University Hall of Fame, VanDerveer has also been inducted into the Women's Sports Foundation Hall of Fame and the Greater Buffalo Hall of Fame.

An avid piano player in her spare time, VanDerveer was born June 26, 1953. A Boston native who grew up in upstate New York, she is also a published author. Her book Shooting From The Outside, which chronicled her 1996 Olympic and National Team experience, was released in September 1997.

VanDerveer is not the only basketball coach in the family, as her sister, Heidi, is the head coach of the women's basketball team at UC San Diego and spent over two decades as an assistant and head coach on both the collegiate and professional levels.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH AMY TUCKER

Associate Head Coach • 29th Season • Ohio State, 1982

Amy Tucker, who led the Cardinal to the NCAA Final Four as interim head coach in 1995-96, enters her 29th season at Stanford and currently serves as the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator.

One of the nation's top recruiters and an excellent evaluator of talent, Tucker has been responsible for assembling several top-five recruiting classes during her tenure at Stanford. Among the notable recruits

Tucker has helped bring to The Farm are Wade Trophy Players of the Year Jennifer Azzi (1990) and Candice Wiggins (2008), two Naismith National Players of the Year in Azzi (1990) and Kate Starbird (1997), as well as three-time All-Americans Nicole Powell (2002-04) and Nnemkadi Ogwumike (2010-12). Eleven of Tucker's recruits have also gone on to earn Associated Press and WBCA All-America first-team selections.

Overall, Tucker's prowess on the recruiting trail has resulted in Stanford women's basketball players earning not only the aforementioned two Wade Trophies and two Naismith National Player of the Year Awards, but also a combined 28 WBCA and Associated Press first-team All-America selections.

Working with Stanford's post players, Tucker has overseen the year-toyear improvements in production from All-Americans such as Jayne Appel, Chiney Ogwumike, Nnemkadi Ogwumike and Kayla Pedersen in recent years, as well as to Stanford's entire frontcourt being named to the All-Pac-10 Team in 2010 and 2011. Under Tucker's tutelage, five Stanford front-line players (Appel, Chiney Ogwumike, Nnemkadi Ogwumike, Val Whiting, Nicole Powell) have earned multiple State Farm/Kodak All-America Team selections and all have been named Pac-12/Pac-10 Player of the Year.

Six of Tucker's frontcourt recruits have gone on to be selected in the first round of the WNBA Draft, highlighted by Nnemkadi Ogwumike becoming the first Stanford player to go number one overall when the Los Angeles Sparks made her the top pick in 2012. Twelve of Stanford's post players in the Tucker era have gone on to play in the WNBA, and in the 2013 WNBA season five former Cardinal posts (Nnemkadi Ogwumike, Powell, Appel, Pedersen, Joslyn Tinkle) were on active rosters.

Since the inaugural season of Pac-10 (now Pac-12) women's basketball play in 1986-87, Tucker has helped guide Stanford players to 17 Pac-12/Pac-10 Player of the Year awards (won by a total of 10 players), eight Pac-10 Freshman of the Year awards, 61 All-Pac-12/All-Pac-10 first-team selections, 29 Pac-10 All-Freshman Team picks and 64 Pac-10 All-Academic selections. Through 2012-13, each of those figures stands as the conference record in its respective category.

An excellent strategist, Tucker has helped guide the Cardinal to a 205-19 (.915) record and five straight trips to the Final Four since 2007-08. Stanford is one of just two programs to pull off that feat and reached the national championship game twice over that span.

An original member of VanDerveer's coaching staff in her inaugural year in 1985-86, Tucker has held the post of associate head coach since the 1996-97 season.

As an assistant coach from 1985-90, Tucker was instrumental in Stanford's rise from a record of 13-15 in 1985-86 to a 27-5 record and Pac-10 title just two years later and finally to the historic 1989-90 season in which the Cardinal went 32-1 and claimed the program's first national championship. Following that championship season, Tucker was promoted to associate coach, a title she held from 1990 through the 1994-95 season.

During that span, Tucker helped guide Stanford to four of the next five Pac-10 titles and an overall mark of 78-12 in conference play. Stanford would go on to reach three more Final Fours (1991, 1992 and 1995) and win its second national title in 1992. That 1992 team would end the campaign with a 30-3 overall mark and a 78-62 victory over Western Kentucky in the NCAA

Championship Game.

When current head coach Tara VanDerveer was tabbed to lead the U.S. National/Olympic Team during the 1995-96 campaign and for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Tucker was named interim head coach along with co-head coach Marianne Stanley. Together, the duo guided Stanford to a 29-3 overall record and the program's fifth NCAA Final Four appearance of the 1990s. The Cardinal set a school and conference record with 23 consecutive victories, posted a perfect 18-0 record in Pac-10 play for the second time in conference history and captured the school's seventh Pac-10 title in eight seasons. For their efforts, Tucker and Stanley shared UPI (United Press International) National Coach of the Year and Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors.

Upon VanDerveer's return to the Cardinal program in 1996-97, Tucker assumed her current title of Associate Head Coach. Over that span Tucker has helped oversee five more trips to the Final Four, including berths in the NCAA Championship Game in 2008 and 2010. The Cardinal has also posted seven more seasons of 30 or more victories during that time, highlighted by five straight 30-win seasons from 2007-12 and a program-record 36 wins in 2009-10.

During Tucker's tenure, Stanford has won two NCAA titles and reached 10 Final Fours. The Cardinal has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 19 of the last 25 seasons and made 16 Elite Eight appearances over that time, as well.

Tucker began her coaching career soon after completing a successful four-year playing career (1978-82) at Ohio State University. She joined VanDerveer's Ohio State staff as a graduate assistant coach in 1983-84, and a year later, was promoted to assistant coach. In the two years that Tucker served on the Buckeye staff, she helped guide OSU to a 50-10 (.833) mark and a pair of appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including a run to the Elite Eight in 1985.

As a player, Tucker led the Buckeyes to a 72-51 record and twice paced the team in scoring, finishing her career second on Ohio State's all-time scoring list with 1,629 points. Through the end of the 2011-12 campaign, Tucker's career scoring output continues to hold a place in the Ohio State top 10, ranking eighth in Buckeye women's basketball history. She also finished her career atop the school's all-time list for games played with 123, a mark that stood for 14 years.

As a senior in 1981-82, Tucker was named Ohio State's captain and led the squad to the Big Ten Tournament title and an appearance in the inaugural edition of the NCAA Tournament.

In May 2012 Tucker was inducted into the Ohio Basketball Hall of Fame's Class of 2012. Tucker was previously recognized for her achievements by being inducted into the Ohio State Sports Hall of Fame in 1994.

Tucker graduated with her bachelor's degree in social work from Ohio State in 1982. In 1984, she earned a master's degree from Ohio State in sports management and administration.

ASSISTANT COACH KATE PAYE



KATE PAYE

Assistant Coach • Seventh Season • Stanford, 1995

Kate Paye begins her seventh season as a member of the Stanford women's basketball coaching staff in 2013-14.

Since Paye's return to Stanford in 2007-08, the Cardinal has been one of the top teams in the nation, going 205-19 (.915), reaching two national title games and being one of just two programs to reach the Final Four in five of the past six seasons. Paye's responsi-

bilities with the program include working with the perimeter players, overseeing the defense, opponent scouting and recruiting.

Under Paye's tutelage, the Cardinal perimeter players have garnered national and conference awards and recognition and established program and personal bests. Since 2007-08 the perimeter players under Paye's tutelage have thrice been selected in the first round of the WNBA Draft, captured two All-America nods, two Pac-10 Player of the Year awards, a Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year award and 10 All-Pac-12/Pac-10 Team selections.

Kayla Pedersen and Jeanette Pohlen, each earned national and conference recognition and were selected in the first round of the 2011 WNBA Draft.

Paye's work with Pedersen contributed to the forward's successful transition from an inside player to a dominant perimeter threat. In 2011, Pedersen was named to the All-Pac-10 Team and was an Associated Press All-America honorable mention. Pohlen enjoyed a career year in 2010-11, scoring 14.5 points per game and setting a new Stanford single-season record with 96 3-pointers made. She was named to the Associated Press All-America First Team and captured the Pac-10 Player of the Year award. That April, each player was selected in the first round of the WNBA Draft as Pedersen went seventh to the Tulsa Shock and Pohlen ninth to the Indiana Fever.

In 2007-08, Paye coached Stanford standout Candice Wiggins to a record-breaking senior season in which the Cardinal guard earned her fourth straight All-America honor, third Pac-10 Player of the Year award, the Wade Trophy Player of the Year Award, and was the No. 3 pick by the Minnesota Lynx in the WNBA Draft.

Most recently Paye guided sophomore point guard Amber Orrange to her first All-Pac-12 Team selection after being named to the All-Freshman Team in 2012. Orrange established herself as one of the conference's top point guards in 2012-13, upping her scoring average by six points (4.8 to 10.8) and increasing her assist total by 35.

Another guard to earn her first All-Pac-12 Team honor, this one in 2012, under Paye's guidance was Toni Kokenis. In 2011-12 Kokenis scored 9.5 points per game, an increase of over four points a contest, and her 2.28 assist-to-turnover ratio paced the Pac-12 and ranked eighth in the nation.

Paye also played a key role in the development of senior guard Rosalyn Gold-Onwude, who became Stanford's first Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year in 2010 and was regarded as one of the country's top defensive guards.

Paye, who earned the Cardinal's "Best Defensive Player" award in 1994, has played a vital role in shaping a dominant and aggressive Stanford defense in the past five seasons. Stanford has held its opponents to its five lowest-scoring seasons over the last five years and its four lowest shooting percentages over the past four years, highlighted by all-time lows of 51.9 points per game and a 31.6 field-goal percentage in 2012-13.

Paye has also been instrumental in the Cardinal recruiting efforts which have landed the program numerous Top-10 ranked classes including two top-ranked prospects and Gatorade National Players of the Year in Nnemkadi Ogwumike (2008) and Chiney Ogwumike (2010).

Prior to joining the Cardinal staff in 2007-08, Paye spent the previous two seasons at San Diego State, leaving the program as associate head coach after helping guide the Aztecs to the 11th-greatest team improvement in NCAA

Division I and the biggest turnaround in Mountain West Conference history in 2006-07.

During her tenure at San Diego State, Paye served as the offensive coordinator and perimeter coach and conducted all opponent scouting. Paye also played an integral role in the Aztec recruiting efforts that rebuilt the San Diego State program into MWC champions and an NCAA Tournament participant. Paye was instrumental in the recruitment of All-MWC performers Quenese Davis, Paris Johnson and Jene Morris.

A native of Woodside, Calif., Paye was a four-year member of the Stanford women's basketball team that claimed the national championship in 1992 and advanced to the NCAA Final Four in 1995. A three-time Pac-10 All-Academic selection and two-time team captain, Paye scored 743 points and averaged 3.22 assists and a steal per game in her Stanford career.

Paye earned her bachelor's degree in political science from Stanford in 1995. She also graduated with distinction with both her Juris Doctorate and Master's of Business Administration degrees from Stanford in 2003. Paye worked as a corporate attorney for Palo Alto-based, Cooley Godward LLP, before returning to basketball as a coach.

Prior to her second appointment at San Diego State, Paye spent the 2004-05 campaign as an assistant coach at Pepperdine, serving as the program's recruiting coordinator and guard coach. She helped guide the Waves to a fourth-place finish in the West Coast Conference and a semifinal appearance in the WCC Tournament.

Out of college, Paye served as assistant coach at San Diego State during the 1995-96 season before going on to play basketball professionally, competing with the Seattle Reign of the ABL for three seasons (1996-98) and later with the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx and Seattle Storm from 2000-02. In her six-year professional career, Paye played with and competed against the top players in the world, including Katie Smith, Sue Bird, Lauren Jackson, Lisa Leslie, and Sheryl Swoopes. She also worked with some of the most accomplished coaches in the college and pro ranks including Anne Donovan, Brian Agler and Lin Dunn.

In addition to being born at Stanford hospital, Paye's entire immediate family have all attended Stanford University.

Both Paye's father and brother, each named John, lettered as members of the Stanford football team. Her father lettered in 1962, while her brother, Stanford's starting quarterback from 1983-86, currently ranks third all-time in the school record book with 7,669 career passing yards and fourth overall with a career mark of 7,539 yards of total offense. The younger John also earned three letters as a point guard with the Stanford men's basketball team from 1984-86.



TEMPIE BROWN

Assistant Coach • First Season • Michigan, 1990

L empie Brown begins her first season on The Farm after joining the Stanford women's basketball coaching staff in July 2013. Brown will work primarily with the Cardinal guards and assist in opponent scouting and recruiting efforts

Brown spent the past four seasons at Michigan State, rising to the position of Associate Head Coach as she helped guide

the Spartans to NCAA Tournament appearances in each of her seasons in East Lansing. Over this span the Spartans went 95-37 overall, including a 46-20 mark in conference play as the team never finished lower than third in the Big Ten standings.

Her duties on the Spartan staff included serving as the staff's academic liaison, strength and conditioning coordinator, and perimeter position coach, while also playing a key role in the scouting of upcoming opponents.

Under Brown's tutelage a total of five Spartan guards garnered All-Big Ten recognition over the past four seasons, with Jasmine Thomas, Kiana Johnson and Klarissa Bell each being honored in 2013 while Porsche Poole (2012) and Brittney Thomas (2010-11) were also singled out by the conference for their stellar play.

Brown's work with the quintet of guards led to significant improvements in production. Bell, who averaged just 2.5 points and 2.1 rebounds as a freshman in 2010-11, increased her output to team bests of 10.5 points and 6.1 rebounds as a junior last season. Both Thomas and Poole more than doubled their scoring averages in each of their senior seasons, en route to team MVP and all-conference recognition. Meanwhile, Johnson has led MSU in assists over each of her first two campaigns in East Lansing, already ranking second in the Spartan career annals in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.78), sixth in assist average (4.1) and eighth in steals average (1.8).

Off the court, Brown oversaw the team's academic success over the past couple years as the staff's liaison to Student-Athlete Support Services (SASS). The Spartans owned a program-best cumulative team GPA of 3.1731 after the fall 2012 semester and over Brown's four seasons had 21 student-athletes earn Academic All-Big Ten honors, with three being named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.

Last summer, Brown attended the Nike Villa 7, which brings together university athletic directors and the country's elite assistant basketball coaches in an effort to prepare the next generation of college basketball leaders. In the summer of 2009, she completed the NCAA Black Coaches & Administrators Achieving Coaching Excellence (ACE) Program, which provides professional development opportunities for current NCAA collegiate men's and women's basketball coaches.

Including her stint at Michigan State, Brown has spent the past 14 years in the collegiate coaching ranks. Prior to arriving in East Lansing she served as an assistant coach at Memphis (2008-09), Northwestern (2004-08), Lehigh (2002-04), Eastern Michigan (2000-02) and Saginaw Valley State (1999-2000).

Brown graduated from the University of Michigan in 1990 with a degree in kinesiology, and later finished her master's degree in exercise physiology in 1992. A four-year letterwinner and two-year captain from 1986-90 with the Wolverines, Brown still ranks among the program's top-15 scorers with 1,142 points, in addition to sitting in the top-20 in career assists and steals. As a sophomore, she was recognized as an All-Big Ten honorable mention in addition to being named the team's most improved player.

Maples Pavilion Home of Stanford Basketball

Maples Pavilion offers one of the best environments for college basketball is Maples Pavilion at Stanford University. Built in 1969, Maples Pavilion has hosted several of the top collegiate games in the nation.

Maples Pavilion, which underwent a \$26-million renovation that was completed prior to the 2005-06 campaign, is ushering in a new era of great basketball that benefits both student-athletes and fans alike. Maples Pavilion serves as home for the nationally-ranked men's and women's basketball teams, along with the women's volleyball program. The men's volleyball, men's and women's gymnastics squads also occasionally host home events at the facility.

The renovation, financed entirely through private donations, has enhanced the college athletic experience for both the student-athletes and the fans. The facelift included a newly-covered 29,000 square foot concourse around the exterior of the seating area, state-of-the-art concession and restroom facilities with speaker systems, in addition to a new four-sided, state-of-theart center-hung scoreboard with video and replay capability.

The concourse is physically separated from the original building. The gap between the original building and the new concourse was designed for two reasons: to preserve the integrity of the architectural design and to create an open garden feel that is present throughout buildings on the Stanford campus. The renovation also included a new playing surface, upgraded locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, a state-of-the-art sports performance room and training room, a media workroom and photography office, and new meeting rooms.

The seating configuration features a lower-bowl seating area that replaced the old floor and loge sections. The new lower seating level includes padded stadium seats that replaced the wood bleachers in the old floor setup. With the upgraded facilities and the improved seating area at floor level, the home team and fans experience the best playing atmosphere in the Pac-12.

On July 18, 2008, construction got underway on the newest addition to Maples Pavilion: The Arrillaga Gymnasium and Weight Room. The new facility, completed in the spring of 2009, is located adjacent to the southwest entrance of Maples Pavilion and includes two practice courts for basketball and three for volleyball. The courts are connected to Maples Pavilion via an underground tunnel, and the facility also includes a varsity weight room on the east end.

Since the beginning of Stanford women's basketball's rise into the national elite in 1987-88, Maples Pavilion has become one of the hottest environments for college basketball. On March 18, 1989, Maples Pavilion hosted its first NCAA Tournament contest, a 105-77 second-round Stanford victory over Illinois State, and since then has played host to a total of 30 Cardinal postseason games.

Maples Pavilion was originally dedicated on March 1, 1969 at a cost of \$3.3 million. The building was named after its principal donor, the late Roscoe Maples, a member of the 1904 Stanford graduating class.

The pavilion is utilized throughout the year by university staff and students for recreational and intramural purposes. During the winter academic quarter, Maples is used continually used for noontime recreational basketball, men's and women's varsity basketball practice, and intramurals during the evening hours. In addition to intercollegiate competition, the pavilion is also used for banquets and lectures.

STANFORD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Jayne Appel (2009-10)

A two-time State Farm Coaches' All-America selection (2009-10), Appel captained the Cardinal to three straight Final Four appearances and a pair of national title games. She was a three-time All-Pac-10 Team selection (2008-10) and one-time Pac-10 Player of the Year (2009), finishing her Stanford career atop both the school's and Pac-10's career rebounding list with 1,263 rebounds. In 2009 Appel had one of her best moments when she scored a Stanford-record 46 points in the 2009 Regional Final against Iowa State. In the Cardinal record books, Appel



ended her career first in blocked shots (273), second in games played (147), third in points scored (2,125), shooting percentage (.565) and rebounds per game (8.6), and seventh in points per game (14.5). She also became just the third Cardinal player to reach 2,000 career points and 1,000 career rebounds, joining Nicole Powell and Val Whiting.

Jennifer Azzi (1989-90)

Stanford's first national superstar, Jennifer Azzi was the 1990 Wade Trophy winner as well as the Naismith National Player of the Year and Honda-Broderick Award recipient. Azzi was a two-time Kodak All-American and Pac-10 Player of the Year (1989-90), becoming the first Stanford player to earn each honor. Azzi averaged 13.4 points, 3.8 rebounds and 6.1 assists per game for the Cardinal during her career, as the Cardinal accumulated a 101-23 record, two Pac-10 championships and its first NCAA Championship in 1990. Azzi ended her career on The Farm as the school's career leader in three-pointers made (19) and attempted (423), assists (751) and steals (271).



Kristin Folkl (1998)

In her senior season, Kristin Folkl was named a Kodak First-Team All-American, a Naismith Player of the Year Finalist, and a GTE/CO-SIDA Academic All-American Second-Team. Folkl was chosen as an All-Pac-10 Freshman in 1995 and was all-conference in 1998. She wrapped up her collegiate basketball career leading the team in scoring and rebounds with 18.9 points and 9.2 rebounds per game her senior year. Folkl helped the Cardinal to two Final Four appearances and three Pac-10 Championships. Folkl also competed on the Stanford volleyball team helping the Cardinal to three NCAA Championships in 1994, 1996 and 1997.



Sonja Henning's Stanford career began on the right note as she was named the Women's Basketball News Service Collegiate Freshman Player of the year in 1988. She went on to be a key part of Stanford's first national championship-winning team in 1990, starting all 33 games and leading the team with 221. As a senior in 1990-91, Henning was named to the Kodak All-America Team and the NCAA Women's All-Final Four Team as the Cardinal made its second straight appearance at the marquee event. Over her four-year Stanford career, Henning was named to the All-Pac-10 Team three consecutive years (1989-91), led



Stanford to a four-year record of 113-15 and helped the Cardinal to its first NCAA Championship in 1990. Henning, following her junior year on The Farm, was a member of the USA Basketball Goodwill Games and FIBA World Championship Teams in 1990, winning gold with each team, and was part of the USA Basketball Pan-American Games Team bronze medal-winning team following her graduation in 1991.

Chiney Ogwumike (2012-13)

Chiney Ogwumike earned WBCA All-America honors in 2012 and 2013. Her first selection came following a campaign in which she became one of just four Stanford players to average a double-double (15.0 ppg, 10.1 rpg). In 2012-13 she bettered those numbers, winning the Pac-12 Triple Crown (22.4 ppg, 12.9 rpg, 58.6 FG pct.) and being named Pac-12 Player of the Year. Following each season she was named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year and to the All-Pac-12 Team, and in 2012-13 was a consensus All-American and national player of the year finalist.



Nnemkadi Ogwumike (2010-12)

Nnemkadi Ogwumike became Stanford's third three-time All-American when she was named to the WBCA Coaches' All-America Team in 2012. Ogwumike's selection capped an all-time great career which included four Final Four appearances, an undefeated record at Maples Pavilion and numerous Cardinal records including becoming the fourth member of the 2,000-Point/1,000 Rebound Club. In her senior campaign, Ogwumike set Stanford single-season benchmarks for points scored (809), scoring average (22.5) and free throws made (191) and attempted (230). She was named Pac-12 Player of the Year for the



second time, and earned her second straight Pac-12 Tournament MVP as well as a third NCAA Regional MVP in a row. Ogwumike in 2009-10 became the first sophomore since Candice Wiggins to be named Pac-10 Player of the Year, leading the conference with 18.5 points per game and a 59.8 shooting percentage, and just missing out on the conference's triple crown by finishing second with 9.9 rebounds per game.

Jeanette Pohlen (2011)

Jeanette Pohlen was named to the Associated Press All-America First Team after a breakout season in 2010-11. Pohlen's fearless play and leadership helped carry the Cardinal to a second straight 18-0 conference record and her to the Pac-10 Player of the Year award. On the year, she averaged 14.5 points per game, made a Stanford singleseason record 96 3-pointers, and ended her Cardinal career with 1,453 points (16th overall), 268 3-pointers made (second), 560 assists (sixth) and tied for the Stanford career lead in games played with 150. On Dec. 30, 2010, she played the key role in Stanford ending Connecticut's



NCAA-record 90-game winning streak, scoring 31 points with nine rebounds and six assists in the 71-59 Cardinal win.

Nicole Powell (2002-04)

Nicole Powell was a Kodak first-team All-American and a finalist for the James Naismith Player of the Year for three-consecutive years (2002-04). She began her career with the Cardinal as Pac-10 Freshman of the Year in 2000 and was named Conference Player of the Year in 2002 and 2004. Powell helped Stanford accumulate a 105-26 record over her four years, as she averaged 17.3 points, 9.6 rebounds and 4.8 assists for the Cardinal. She ended her collegiate career as Stanford's all-time leader in career rebounds (1,143) and third all-time leading



scorer (2,062 points). Powell is the only player in Pac-10 history to have recorded more than one career triple-double, tallying six in her career.

Kate Starbird (1996-97)

Kate Starbird won the James Naismith National Player of the Year in 1997 and was a Kodak First-Team All-American in 1996 and 1997. Starbird was tabbed All-Pac-10 in both 1995 and 1996, and helped the Cardinal to three-consecutive Pac-10 Championships (1995-97). She helped Stanford to a 118-14 record with three Final Four appearances. She averaged 16.9 points per game, 3.9 rebounds, and 3.3 assists, as Starbird finished her career at Stanford as the all-time high scorer with 2,215 points.

Val Whiting (1992-93)

Val Whiting was a two-time Kodak First-Team All-American, and a two-time James Naismith Player of the Year Finalist in 1992 and 1993. She began her career for the Cardinal by being named Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and National Freshman of the Year by Women's Basketball News Service in 1990. She was an NCAA All-Final Four selection in 1992, and All-Pac-10 in 1992 and 1993. During her career, Stanford accumulated a 114-16 record and won four-consecutive Pac-10 Championships and two NCAA Championships in 1990 and 1992. At the time that she finished her career, she was Stanford's all-time



leading scorer with 2,077 points and the top-rebounder with 1,134 rebounds.

Candice Wiggins (2005-08)

Candice Wiggins, a senior guard, ended her collegiate career in 2008 as the only four-time WBCA/State Farm and WBCA/Kodak All-American in Stanford history, also earning All-America honors from the Associated Press four times (Second Team – 2005-07, First Team – 2008). The San Diego native led Stanford in scoring in 2007-08 and became the program's second player to be named the State Farm Wade Trophy Player of the Year, helping the Cardinal to its eighth straight Pac-10 tile and the program's seventh Final Four. Wiggins' 787 points in 2007-08 broke not only the school and Pac-10 single-season records, but also contributed to her becoming Stanford's and the Pac-10's



all-time leading scorer with 2,629 points. The Pac-10's first three-time Player of the Year (2005-06, 2008), Wiggins left The Farm as the owner of 10 career records. In addition to her All-America honors, in her rookie season, Wiggins was also named the U.S. Basketball Writers Association Co-Freshman of the Year and the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year in 2005. She helped the Cardinal to a 122-20 record in her four seasons and its first national championship game in 16 years in 2008.

Stanford at a Glance

On October 1, 1891, the 465 new students who were on hand for opening day ceremonies at Leland Stanford Junior University greeted Leland and Jane Stanford enthusiastically, with a chant they had made up and rehearsed only that morning. Wah-hoo! Wah-hoo! L-S-J-U! Stanford! Its wild and spirited tone symbolized the excitement of this bold adventure. As a pioneer faculty member recalled, "Hope was in every heart, and the presiding spirit of freedom prompted us to dare greatly." For the Stanfords' on that day, the university was the realization of a dream and a fitting tribute to the memory of their only son, who had died of typhoid fever weeks before his sixteenth birthday. Far from the nation's center of culture and unencumbered by tradition or ivy, the new university drew students from all over the country: many from California; some who followed professors hired from other colleges and universities; and some simply seeking adventure in the West. Though there were many difficulties during the first months – housing was inadequate, microscopes and books were late in arriving from the East – the first year foretold greatness. As Jane Stanford wrote in the summer of 1892, "Even our fondest hopes have been realized."

Ideas of "Practical Education"


Governor and Mrs. Stanford had come from families of modest means and had built their way up through a life of hard work. So it was natural that their first thoughts were to establish an institution where young men and women could "grapple successfully with the practicalities of life." As their thoughts matured, these ideas of "practical education" enlarged to the concept of producing cultured and useful citizens who were well-prepared for professional success.

More than 120 years later, the university still enjoys the original 8,180 acres (almost 13 square miles) of grassy fields, eucalyptus groves, and rolling hills that were the Stanfords' generous legacy, as well as the Quadrangle of "long corridors with their stately pillars" at the center of campus. It is still true, as the philosopher William James said during his stint as a visiting professor, that the climate is "so friendly ... that every morning wakes one fresh for new amounts of work."

Current Perspectives

In other ways, the university has changed tremendously on its way to recognition as one of the world's great universities. At the hub of a vital and diverse Bay Area, Stanford is less than an hour's drive south of San Francisco and just a few minutes north of Silicon Valley, an area dotted with computer and high technology firms largely spawned by the university's faculty and graduates. On campus, students and faculty enjoy new libraries, modern laboratories, tremendous sports and recreation facilities, and comfortable residences. Contemporary sculpture, as well as pieces from The Cantor Arts Center's extensive collection of sculpture by Auguste Rodin, is placed throughout the campus, providing unexpected pleasures at many turns. At the Stanford Medical Center, worldrenowned for its research, teaching, and patient care, scientists and physicians are searching for answers to fundamental questions about health and disease. Ninety miles down the coast, at Stanford's Hopkins Marine Station on Monterey Bay, scientists are working to better understand the mechanisms of evolution, human development, and ecological systems.

The university is organized into seven schools: Earth Sciences, Education, Engineering, the Graduate School of Business, Humanities and Sciences, Law, and Medicine. In addition, there are more than 30 interdisciplinary centers, programs, and research laboratories - including the Hoover Institution on War, Revolution and Peace; the The Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies; the SLAC national accelerator laboratory; and the Stanford Center for the Study of Families, Children and Youth - where faculty from a wide range of fields bring different perspectives to bear on issues and problems. Stanford's Overseas Studies Program offers students in all fields remarkable opportunities for study abroad, with campuses in Australia, Beijing, Berlin, Cape Town, Florence, Kyoto, Madrid, Moscow, Oxford, Paris, and Santiago.





Stanford People

By any measure, Stanford's faculty - which numbers just over 1,995 - is one of the most distinguished in the nation. As of fall 2013, the faculty included 22 Nobel Laureates, five Pulitzer Prize winners, 27 MacArthur Fellows, 20 recipients of the National Medal of Science, two National Medley of Technology recipients, 277 members of the National Academy of Arts and Sciences, 158 members of the National Academy of Sciences, 104 National Academy of Engineering members, 32 members of the National Academy of Education, seven Wolf Foundation Prize winners and three Presidential Medal of Freedom winners. Yet beyond their array of honors, what truly distinguishes Stanford faculty is their commitment to sharing knowledge with their students. The great majority of professors teach undergraduates both in introductory lecture classes and in small advanced seminars.

Currently 15,877 students, of which 6,980 are undergraduates, live and study on campus. Above 40 percent come from California, but all 50 states and approximately 83 countries are represented

as well. Among undergraduates, approximately 53 percent are African American, Asian American, International, Mexican American, Native American, Native Hawaiian or Other Hispanic in ethnicity. Like the faculty, the Stanford student body is distinguished. Stanford accepts 7 percent of the students who apply,

with 89 percent of those admitted finishing in the top 10 percent of their high school class. The number of Rhodes Scholars at Stanford currently stands at 109, 86 have been selected Marshall Award winners, and 62 have been chosen Truman Scholars. Nearly 90 percent of graduating seniors plan to attend graduate or professional schools. Stanford students also shine in a tremendous array of activities outside the classroom – from student government



Looking Ahead

In her address to the Board of Trustees, in 1904, Jane Stanford said, ". . . Let us not be afraid to outgrow old thoughts and ways, and dare to think on new lines as to the future of the work under our care."

Her thoughts echo in the words of former Stanford President Gerhard Casper, who has said, "The true university must reinvent itself every day . . . At Stanford, these are days of such reconsideration and fresh support for our fundamental tasks – teaching, learning, and research."

Bernard Muir was named Stanford's Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics on July 27, 2012. He was appointed to his position by Provost John Etchemendy.

"Bernard Muir has a national reputation as a superb athletic administrator," said Etchemendy. "He also has a deep personal understanding of what it means to be a scholar-athlete, performing at the very highest levels both academically and athletically. In Bernard Muir, we are confident we have a leader with the integrity, experience and commitment to ensure that Stanford's athletic legacy continues."

Under Muir's guidance in 2012-13, Stanford kept alive two of the most unfathomable streaks in college athletics. Stanford won its 19th consecutive Directors' Cup trophy as the top overall athletic program in the country and extended its streak of having won at least one NCAA team championship annually for the past 37 years, the longest such streak in the nation.

Stanford teams have won 104 NCAA Championships, with 123 total team championships, the most of any school. With seven individual national championships in 2012-13, Stanford extended another lofty number; no other school has won more than the Cardinal's 430 individual national titles.

Stanford added to its impressive sport lineup as well with the addition of sand volleyball. The school now sponsors 36 varsity programs, all of which exceed the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate.

In addition to its 36 varsity sports, the Stanford Department of Athletics, Physical Education and Recreation supports campuswide recreation, fitness and wellness programs. The university employs over 100 coaches and assistants. Eleven current coaches have led their teams to one or more NCAA titles.

Muir has earned the respect of collegiate athletic administrators nationwide, including Kevin White, director of athletics at Duke University, who is widely regarded as the dean of athletic directors.

"Simply put, Stanford University made a brilliant hire," White said after the hire. "Bernard Muir has already distinguished himself as a truly great leader. Bernard is terribly humble, incomparably intelligent and just drips with integrity. Moreover, Bernard is empathetic to a fault, inordinately task oriented, both clearly adaptable and situational, and ridiculously passionate about the plight of the student-athlete."

Muir was selected after a nationwide search headed by Robert Simoni, the Donald Kennedy Chair in the Stanford School of Humanities and Sciences and professor of biology, and Jeff Wachtel, senior assistant to the president.

"I could not be more delighted that Bernard will join the Stanford family," said Simoni at the time. "He shares every value we have as an institution and that we expect for our athletic program. He also shares our absolute commitment to integrity and a passion to provide our remarkable students with every opportunity for academic and athletic success. It's a great day for the future of Stanford athletics."

Muir brought nearly 25 years of athletic administrative experience to The Farm from stops at Delaware, Georgetown, Notre Dame, Butler, Auburn and the National Collegiate Athletics Association (NCAA). He directed Delaware's athletic program from 2009 to 2012 and, before that, was director of athletics at Georgetown from 2005 to 2009. As an undergraduate at Brown University, Muir was a four-year letterwinner in basketball.

In February 2012, Muir was named to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee. The committee oversees all aspects of NCAA collegiate men's basketball at the Division I level and serves as the selection committee for the NCAA Tournament. He also serves as a member of the board of directors of USA Basketball.

At Delaware, Muir is credited with increasing the competitiveness of Blue Hen varsity sports, helping secure NCAA Division I tournament games on campus and enhancing athletic facilities.

Before joining the athletics administration at Georgetown, Muir served as deputy director



of athletics/administration and facilities at the University of Notre Dame from 2004 to 2005. He also served at Notre Dame as senior associate athletic director for student welfare and development from 2003 to 2004 and as associate athletic director for student welfare and development from 2000 to 2003.

Muir worked for the NCAA from 1998 to 2000 as director of operations for the Division I men's national basketball championship and from 1992 to 1998 as assistant director of the Division I men's national basketball championship. He began his career in athletics administration as an athletic administrative assistant at Butler University in 1990, and subsequently held positions with Auburn University and Streetball Partners International of Dallas.

In 2007, Muir was named to Street & Smith's SportsBusiness Journal's "Top 40 Under 40."

Muir earned a bachelor's degree in organizational behavior and management from Brown University in 1990 and a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University in 1992.

Muir and his wife, Liz, have two daughters, Libby and Millie.

Stanford's National Titles

NCAA championships are commonplace at Stanford University, as Cardinal teams have won national titles at an unprecedented rate, including a national-best 89 since 1980 and 66 since 1990. Stanford has won at least one NCAA championship for 37 consecutive years and has won four national titles in a single season nine times.

Nine different Stanford teams have won at least five national titles, including men's tennis (18), women's tennis (18), men's water polo (11), women's swimming and diving (9), men's swimming and diving (8), men's golf (8), women's volleyball (6), synchronized swimming (7) and women's cross country (5). A total of 22 Stanford teams have won at least one national championship.

Stanford teams have won a total of 123 national championships. In NCAA competition, Cardinal teams have won 104 team titles, including 61 men's championships and an NCAA-best 43 women's titles.
