Flight Information

Entry/Exit Requirements

- File an eAPIS manifest outbound (recommend inbound at this time, too)
- File and activate international flight plan
- Land at a designated airport of entry (AOE) customs and immigration

The following entry documents are required:

Passengers -

- Valid passport
- Visa (U.S. citizens required for stays greater than 4 months)

Pilots -

• Part 91 operators - Same as passengers

Part 135 operators - Visa not required if not leaving airport (no more than 24 hrs)

Note: Other requirements may be placed in lieu of those stated. Contact appropriate AIS for further clarification

Aircraft -

- Registration Certificate
- · Airworthiness Certificate
- Aircraft radio License
- Journey Logbook
- Third Party Liability Certificate
- Passenger Manifest
- Cargo manifest

Exit Requirements (Departing Tunisia)

- Depart from an AOE
- File <u>eAPIS</u> manifest if inbound to the U.S.
- File an international flight plan
- Call U.S. Customs at filed U.S. airport of entry

Additional Flight Information

Aircraft Instruments and Equipment

In addition to U.S. aircraft airworthiness and 14 CFR Part 119 certification requirements, most countries adhere to ICAO Annex 6 which defines aircraft instruments, equipment and documents. Exceptions or additions to those rules are listed below for reference only.

In addition to the above mentioned, all aircraft operating within Tunis FIR whereby Tunisia territory is overflown, must adhere to the provisions detailed below:

VOR and radio equipment:

- VFR within controlled airspace
- Special VFR
- VFR overflying the sea.

Appropriate radio navigation equipment and radio communication:

• VFR overflying the inhospitable regions.

Signaling, rescue and survival equipment:

• VFR overflying the sea.

VFR overflying the inhospitable regions.

Commercial air transport aircraft operating in Tunisia must adhere to the provisions of ICAO Annex 6 — Operation of Aircraft, Part 1 — International Commercial Air Transport-Aeroplanes, Chapter 6 (Aeroplane instruments, equipment and flight documents) and

Chapter 7 (Aeroplane communication and navigation equipment).

RVSM

<u>Domestic and International RVSM</u> guidance is provided on the IFIM Home Page. Click on the **Air Traffic** tab and select **Separation Standards** from the drop down list.

Technical Stop / Overflight

Aircraft belonging to countries that have signed bilateral agreements with Tunisia are allowed to overfly the Tunisian territory or make technical stopovers under the conditions laid down in the referred to agreements. Otherwise, an application for permission must be forwarded to the "Ministère du Transport. at least three working days before the expected date of departure (see address under Non-scheduled Flights)

Every air carrier overflying the Tunisian territory with or without stopover must take out a third party insurance policy.

Non-scheduled Flights (Charters)

Application for permission must be forwarded to the "Ministère du Transport — Direction Générale de l'Aviation Civile — Direction du Transport Aérien BP 179 - 2035 Tunis CEDEX, E-mail: air.transport@mt.gov.tn, at least three working days before the expected date of departure.

The following documents are required:

- The noise certificate
- A copy of air operation certificate,
- · A copy of operation manual,
- · Operational flight plan
- · Aircraft equipment report
- Copy of detail of filed ATS flight plan,
- Appropriate NOTAM/AIS briefing document
- Appropriate meteorological information,
- Weight and balance documentation of aircraft
- Forms to comply with special reporting.

Private Flights

Private Flights are not addressed, as such, in the Tunisia AIP; however, see the Entry/Exit Requirements section above.

Float Planes

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Float Plane requirements or restrictions.

Light Sport Aircraft

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Light Sport Aircraft requirements or restrictions.

Fees

Users should anticipate varying fees for landing, parking, passenger boarding, security, ground transportation, lighting, meteorological services, jetway usage and enroute navigation.

Fuel

Jet a1 is available at all AOEs.except DTTG -Gabes International Airport which does not have fuel any fuel available. Avgas is available at DTMB - Monastir and DTNZ - Enfidha- Hammamet International Airport.

Night VFR

Night is defined as the hours included between the end of the evening civil twilight and the beginning of the morning civil twilight. For application into practice and on mid-latitudes, criterions adopted will be 30min before sunrise and 30min after sunset.

"Only the pilots-in-command of an aircraft holding the night VFR flight qualification or the instruments flight qualification can undertake night VFR flights.

To make a night VFR flight, the aircraft must be fitted with radio equipment enabling reliable and continuous two-way radio contact, a serviceable very high frequency omnidirectional radio range receiver VOR and / or an equipment approved by location by serviceable satellite.

The aircraft must be provided with special equipment consisting of signalling rescue and survival kits, according to the provisions of the regulation in force. Besides, the aircraft must be provided with a pyrotechnic signal system.

The night VFR flight can be made only at departure and destination of useful night aerodromes by aircraft." [sic]

Island Hopping

The IFIM Staff is not aware of any Island hopping requirements or restrictions.

Aeronautical Charts

Charts are only available through the purchase of the AIP from the Tunsia AIS (see Designated Authorities).
