

Senator Dale E. Brandland

Elected to the state Senate in 2002 and 2006, Senator Dale Brandland represented Washington's 42nd District, a community he has served as both a Bellingham police officer as well as Whatcom County Sheriff.

Growing up in Port Angeles, Brandland entered the armed services and became interested in law enforcement while serving as a base police officer. After spending two years at Port Orchard Community College Brandland entered Washington State University knowing that the Police Science major would eventually lead him to land a position in his desired field; law enforcement.

After graduating college with a wife, two kids and a police science major he landed a position in Bellingham as a police officer for the city. While serving there he was a K-9 officer, a crime scene investigator, and road sergeant.

After being asked to run for Whatcom County Sheriff and initially saying no, he was elected in 1992. During his election campaigns he maintained that a good Sheriff should step down after 12 years, and in 2002 he ran and was elected in his first campaign for Washington state Senator for the 42nd District. Initially approached to run as a Representative, he instead decided to campaign for the Senate seat and has represented the 42nd District ever since.

Senator Brandland served on the Ways and Means committee as the Ranking Republican Member on the Capital Budget committee, and on the Human Services and Corrections and Early Learning and K-12 Education committees.

In his community Brandland has served as past president of the Washington State Sheriff and Police Chiefs Association and the past chair of the United Way of Whatcom County.
