The 2013/2014 prize money ranking list is for indicative purposes only and will not be used as a basis for seeding until the 2014/2015 season.

The prize money ranking list will be calculated using a 2 year rolling points system. Please refer to the calendar for seeding cut off dates.

Players losing their first match will receive full prize money however will only contribute the amounts detailed in the rows marked 'seeded loser' towards their prize money ranking.

Players competing in the Pre Qualifier will be awarded the respective Round 1 (Last 128) losers prize money for losing in either the Last 128 round or the Pre-Qualifying round. No prize money will be awarded for winning the Pre-qualifying round.

Players who have joined The Tour commencing the 2013/2014 season will not receive starter prize money as they will receive a two year exemption from falling off the tour. Players who finished outside of the top 64 in the 2012/2013 season but regain a tour place by any means will start on zero prize money. Players starting on zero prize money will be ranked in alphabetical order to determine a ranking.

At the end of the season players on equal prize money will be ranked according to the most prize money earned in the last season. Should this not determine positions, prize money in events working backwards from the World Championship 2014 will be considered. Finally, if still equal, frames won in losing final match would be used from events working backwards from the World Championship 2014.
