

#### **Scotland Independence Poll**



Fieldwork dates: GB Interview Method: Online

Population sampled: All Scottish adults aged 16+ years

Fieldwork dates: 21-24th January 2014

**Sampling Method:** A demographically representative sample of Scots were invited to participate on the survey, with sample selected invited to participate in proportion to population distribution across Scotland and to specific demographics including gender and age.

Sample size: 1,004 adults aged 18+

**Data weighting:** Data were weighted to the profile of all Scottish adults aged 16+. Data were weighted by sex, age, social grade and region. Targets for the weighted data were derived from Census 2011.

**Past Vote Weighting:** However, after demographic weighting the declared past votes of the sample may not exactly match the results of the last election (Scottish Parliament 2011 election - first Constituency vote), which implies some kind of *political imbalance* may still be present in the contacted sample, even if demographic balance is deemed to be good.

As a result, we take the declared past votes on any new poll and add it to recent similar polls we have conducted which contain the same question (recall of past vote to the 2011 Scottish Parliament election).

ICM compares the declared past votes derived in each poll to the actual result of the last Scottish Parliamentary election and gives a weight of 80% to the results of that election and 20% to the average of the most recent polls. This makes some allowance for people who genuinely misremember how they previously voted.

**Questions:** The computer tables attached in PDF format show each question, in full, in the order they were put to respondents, all response codes and the weighted and un-weighted bases for all demographics and other data including but not limited that published.
