TOP 8 TIPS FOR SPECTATORS

- Please visit the official website, sochi2014.com, for the most upto-date information about the Games. Be aware that event times are subject to change. You can check for changes to the Games schedule here.
- To enter the Olympic park, the competition venues and the Ceremony venues, you must have a valid ticket and Spectator Pass. You can apply for a Spectator Pass at pass.sochi2014.com.
- Check the transportation routes and plan your route ahead of time.
- 4. If you are purchasing tickets for events which take place at different venues in the Mountain and Coastal Clusters on the same day, please make sure you allow enough time between events in order to travel from one venue to another.
- 5. We recommend you arrive early and allow time to pass through security checks. Please check which items are permitted / not permitted to bring with you.
- Please note Visa cards and cash are the only accepted way of payment for all services at the Games.
- 7. Please make sure that you have adequate protective winter weather clothing with you for attending Paralympic events. The weather may change quickly and the conditions vary greatly from those that you experienced when leaving your accommodation, particularly in the mountains, where you should make sure you have warm water-resistant clothing that offers protection from snowfall. You will be able to find the weather forecast during the Games at the sochi2014.com website at the venue pages.

HOW TO PURCHASE A TICKET

In order to gain access to the Games, you will need a valid ticket and a Spectator Pass.

HOW TO PURCHASE A TICKET

The official ticketing website of Sochi 2014 tickets.sochi2014.com

BUYING TICKETS

If you live in the Russian Federation, you will be able to purchase tickets on the official ticket website, tickets.sochi2014.com.

To buy tickets, you will need your ID and a Visa payment card.

- Select an event on the website tickets.sochi2014.com, choose the tickets and complete payment.
- 2. Receive confirmation of your ticket purchase by email.
- 3. Get your ticket:
 - by postal delivery
 - or pick it up in person at the Main ticket centers in Sochi by presenting your printed order confirmation.



It is recommended picking up your tickets in advance at the Main ticket centers in Sochi in order to avoid long queues at venues.

Spectators who do not reside in the Russian Federation may buy tickets through Authorized Ticket Reseller or through the National Paralympic Committee of their country. Under consent of National Paralympic Committees, the Sochi Website can also be used for ticket sales for citizens of certain territories as marked on the Sochi Website.

To buy tickets you will need ID and a valid payment method (Visa card or cash). Children born after February 1, 2012 do not need a ticket or Spectator Pass to attend events if accompanied by an adult who has both.

TICKET BOX OFFICES AND THE MAIN TICKET CENTER

In the Ticket Box Offices you can purchase tickets or print out pre-booked tickets. In the Main ticket centers you can also purchase and print out pre-booked tickets, fill-in the ticket refund / claim form or find Sochi 2014 staff to answer any questions you may have regarding your ticket.

Payment for ticket purchases at the Main Ticket Centers and Ticket Box Offices will be possible in cash or by Visa card.

If you purchase tickets for events taking place at different venues in the Mountain and Coastal Clusters on the same day, please make sure you allow **enough time** between the events in order to travel from one venue to another.



APPLYING FOR A SPECTATOR PASS

After buying your tickets, we recommend that every spectator begins the Spectator Pass registration process as soon as possible via pass.sochi2014.com or at one of the Spectator Registration Centers.

Only ticket holders may obtain a Spectator Pass. You only need to apply once for a Spectator Pass, even if you have tickets for multiple sporting events, as it will be valid for the entire period of the Sochi 2014 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. If you hold already a spectator pass from the Olympic, this will also apply for the Paralympic period.

Procedure for applying for a Spectator Pass

Step 1. Submitting an Application

In order to submit your application to receive a Spectator Pass ahead of the Games, you need to go to pass.sochi2014.com or at to one of the Spectator Registration Centers.

Step 2. Pick-up

Spectators may pick up their Spectator Pass in person at one of the official Spectator Registration Centers in Sochi or Moscow by showing the ID indicated when they submitted their Spectator Pass application.

Step 3. Activation

Spectator Passes will be activated when the spectator visits a Spectator Registration Center in person and shows the ID indicated when submitting the Spectator Pass application.



Important! The passport should be the one you use to enter the Russian Federation.

TAKE CARE OF THE TICKET AS IF IT WAS CASH

Pay attention to your ticket. Damaged tickets may not be accepted and lost tickets unfortunately cannot be replaced.

BUY YOUR TICKETS IN ADVANCE

It will guarantee attendance of your favorite competitions.

REMEMBER, A TICKET DOES NOT GIVE PERMISSION TO RE-ENTER A COMPETITION

If you exit a venue after a competition has begun, you cannot reenter with a used ticket. When you are on route to an event make sure that you have everything that you need with you.

USING A TICKET ON THE SPECTATOR TRANSPORT SYSTEM

If you have a ticket to the Paralympic Winter Games, then your journey, on the day of the event you are attending, will be free of charge on the Spectator transport system.

PERSONS WITH AN IMPAIRMENT

Sochi 2014 is accessible for spectators with an impairment. To buy a ticket with an assigned seat equipped for individuals with an impairment, go to tickets.sochi2014.com, and submit the electronic form in the 'Help' section.

You can also issue a ticket for individuals with a disability by telephone, by calling the Sochi2014 ticketing help line on

ADDITIONAL TICKET

GOING TO THE GAMES WITH CHILDREN

Ticket Holders under 18 years can only attend a Session accompanied by an adult who possesses a Ticket and a Spectator Pass.



Please note:

Children under the age of 2 years (born after 1st of February 2012) do not need a Ticket and a Spectator Pass.

Children older than 2 years (born before 1st of February 2012) years must have a Ticket and a Spectator Pass.

DELAY, POSTPONEMENT OR CANCELLATION OF AN EVENT

Please note that tickets to delayed or postponed events are valid and are not exchangeable. If an event is cancelled, you can apply for a refund.

REFUNDS

The ticket refund process is outlined by the Organizing Committee. In case of a refund, you have to send your unused ticket and a refund claim to the Organizing Committee. The form for a refund claim is on the website tickets.sochi2014.com, in the "Help" section, and will also be available at the Main ticket centers and offices.



Note! At the Main ticket centers and Tickets Box Offices you can't get money back for your ticket.

If you bought a ticket from Authorized Ticket Reseller, the refund will be managed by the Authorized Ticket Reseller from whom you have bought the ticket.





BARRIER-FREE ENVIRONMENT



THE GAMES IN SOCHI WILL BE FULLY ACCESSIBLE FOR PEOPLE WITH IMPAIRMENTS

All the competition venues and transport infrastructure facilities have been designed in accordance with accessibility requirements.

Public transport is equipped with information tables, ramps and areas for wheelchairs.

In the stands special areas are provided for wheelchair users, with places for the people accompanying them.

In Sochi parking places have been set aside for people with impairments, and hotels are providing accessible accommodation.

Toilets at the venues are equipped with special hand rails and have enough space in which to maneuver a wheelchair.

Special services for people with impairments will be provided at the venues during the Paralympic Winter Games (sign language and audio description services (during Opening and Closing Ceremony days only), hearing aid repairs, the provision of accessible transport and wheelchairs and other such services).

ACCESSIBILITY MAP

The innovative Accessibility Map project is one of the key elements of the legacy that will be left by the Sochi Games. The map publishes information about the city's infrastructure, featuring elements of the barrier-free environment and the accessible routes. When planning your visit to the 2014 Games in Sochi, make sure you use the "Accessibility Map" as your guide around the city, and, if necessary, as a "navigator around the barrier-free environment".

SPECTATOR TRANSPORT SYSTEM



The spectator transport system will run between the competition venues and the main districts of the city of Sochi. Transportation for spectators includes a network of rail and bus routes, as well as a system of cableways.

The transport infrastructure facilities have been designed in accordance with accessibility requirements: information tables, ramps and areas for wheelchairs, Games mobility accessible shuttles at venues are available.

Spectator transport system is free of charge for spectators with an Paralympic ticket.



Please note! You can't use the bus or cable way routes without a ticket on the day of competition. Buy your ticket in advance!

Transportation hubs are located in the major districts of the Coastal and Mountain Clusters: Sochi, Matsesta, Khosta, Adler, Airport and Olympic park, as well as in Krasnava Polyana, Laura and Rosa Khutor.

- Buses are available for spectators with a valid ticket for a competition

Cableways

- Starts to operate 3 hours before the event and ends 3 hours after the event
- It is not possible to buy a ticket just for a cableway.

Cableways are available for spectators with a valid ticket for a competition at this venue on that day



Important! During the Games, road access to Sochi will be limited for private vehicles, and unauthorized access to the Paralympic venues is prohibited. Please choose public transport for spectators to travel to competition venues, to Sochi and around the city during the Games.



Important!

Luggage restrictions are applicable when using railway routs R1, R2, R4. Requirements and restrictions are identical to the ones applicable to the venues. Plan your trip accordingly:

- Upon your arrival on the first day to the Sochi Airport if you need to get to the center of the city or Adler, take the R3 railway route, as it is more convenient.
- If you are accommodated in Mountain Cluster or closer to the Olympic park, take the bus routes and B5 or a feeder bus. You can get yourself familiar with the list of restricted items at sochi2014.com/en/paralympic/spectators.



SPECTATOR TRANSPORT SYSTEM



CABLEWAYS TRAVEL TIME (min.)

Cableways connect the transportation hubs (Krasnaya Polyana, Laura Hub and Rosa Khutor 3S) to the sports venues in the Mountain Cluster: Laura Cross-country Ski & Biathlon Center and Rosa Khutor Alpine Center. The cableways are accessible (ramps and areas for wheelchairs, accessible elevators at the exit from the cableways station, Games mobility accessible shuttles (from the cableways station to the venues). Please find Sochi 2014 volunteers to get more information about access the venue.

^{*} The door width of the gondolas I, X is fixed at 80 centimeters. The gondola seats can be lifted easily to create more space, so 1-2 wheelchairs may enter a cabin. This support will be provided by technical workers.

As for the 3S gondolas (III, VII), their door width is 1 meter and each cabin can carry 1 wheelchair user.





A total of 5 venues in two clusters have been built in Sochi for the Games — the Mountain Cluster (Krasnaya Polyana and Rosa Khutor) and the Coastal Cluster (the Olympic park). The two Clusters are 48 km apart and linked by a high speed modern transport connection.

KEY TIPS FOR VISITING SPORTS VENUES:


- 1 Before leaving your hotel always check transport timetables.
- 2 To enter sports events you must present your valid ticket and Spectator Pass. If you don't yet have a Spectator Pass, find out how to get one.
- 3 A separate ticket is needed for each event. If you did not manage to get tickets in advance, you may buy them at the Main Ticket Centers or Ticket Box Offices at the Games depending on availability. Buy your tickets in advance!
- 4 Visa cards and cash are the only accepted form of payment for all services at the venues.
- 5 Please allow time to go through security. Be aware of what you can and can't bring with you — refreshments will be available at cafés and fast-food outlets at the venues.
- **6** Spectators with small children may bring the child's food.
- 7 If you have any questions please ask the Sochi 2014 volunteers they will be easily recognizable by their uniforms.

SPECTATOR SCREENING PROCEDURE AT THE VENUES

All spectators will be required to go through security checks upon entering the venues. The personal security checks and the procedure for checking personal belongings will be the same as those found at the airport. Spectators with an impairment will be asked to go through security checks in accessible areas.

Every spectator must:

- have a valid ticket to the Games on their person for the accurate date and session, plus a Spectator Pass;
- · present their personal belongings for checking;
- follow the instructions of the Games staff.


LIST OF PROHIBITED ITEMS AT THE VENUES:

- Firearms and sharp implements, ammunition, explosives;
- Flammable liquids and materials, gases and gas canisters, toxic, poisonous, and caustic substances. Narcotic and psychotropic substances;
- Medicines, no more than 1 packet, no more than 3 types, with a total capacity of no more than 100 ml;

- Food and drink products, including alcoholic beverages (with the exception of children's food and milk, no more than 1 liter per child), thermos flasks and jars, glass containers and bottles, liquids with a total volume greater than 100 ml;
- Flags and banners larger than 2×1 m, or the flags of countries which are not participating in the Games. Printed literature, banners, banners with religious, political or offensive content or content which is contrary to civil order and / or morals;
- Any advertising materials;
- Radio frequency equipment (with the exception of USB modems, smart phones and telephones, security keys, medical implants, hearing aids), laser devices, tripods;
- Devices creating excessive noise which may impede the staging and watching of events (vuvuzelas, etc.);
- Sporting goods and bicycles;
- Any items which look like the aforementioned prohibited items or are copies of banned items.


RULES OF CONDUCT AT VENUES

- Be careful when crossing the driveways, try to avoid slippery surfaces (wet floor, ice);
- It is prohibited to attempt to scale the fence, railings, lighting devices, masts, supporting structures;
- It is prohibited to smoke outside of designated and marked areas;
- In the event of fire, or other emergency situations, keep calm and immediately report them to any Games workforce representative or law enforcement officer, and follow their instructions;
- Unauthorized attachment of the permitted flags and banners on the surfaces of buildings and/or structures in the Venues is prohibited;
- Unauthorized presence on the competition in the aisles and on the stairs of sports facilities, as well as, obstructing the movement of participants and spectators is prohibited;
- In order to avoid conflicts pay attention to the on-site warning and restrictive signs.

ACTIVITIES IN THE DIYMPIC PARK

HOSPITALITY HOUSES

The program of Houses may include the organization of activities for members of the team, and winners of the Games, events for the general public, concerts, sales of the Houses' own souvenirs, food and beverages and the organization of cultural and educational activities. Houses can be either free for the Olympic Park spectators and visitors to access or they can have limited access by invitation only. Currently the Olympic Park includes the Krasnodar Region Hospitality House and the PyeongChang 2018 Organizing Committee activities.

THEME PARK

The Olympic Park also contains the Sochi Park Theme Park. Olympic Park visitors can access the Sochi Park Theme Park area for free. In the Sochi Park Theme Park visitors can stroll through the Enchanted Labyrinth, which is based on Pushkin's fairy tales; a wellappointed landscaped park with a man-made lake; ride carousels; and watch a variety of shows in the Theme Park's theme areas. The Theme Park's entertainment program includes performances by 150 artists from different regions of Russia.

THE RESIDENCE OF DED MOROZ

Ded Moroz is one of the brightest and most popular symbols of winter in Russia. In view of the great popularity of the character among children, his residence in the Olympic Park will be a major attraction for the youngest guests of the Games.

EXHIBITION OF THE RUSSIAN REGIONS

The Exhibition will allow the participants and guests of the Games to get acquainted with the cultural and ethnical diversity of Russia, the traditions of its indigenous ethnic groups, and the touristic highlights attractiveness of Russia and its innovative potential.

SOCHI 2014 MARKETING PARTNERS SHOWCASING

CITY OF SOCHI

Sochi is one of the biggest and most beautiful resorts in Russia. Officially, Sochi is the central part of the resort, which also includes the districts of Lazarevskoe, Khosta, and Adler. The city of Sochi is spread out among the foothills of the Caucasus and along the shores of the Black Sea. The city is situated at the same latitude as Nice and Toronto.

The territory of Sochi comprises 200,000 hectares, including 30,000 hectares of arboretums, botanical gardens and protected nature reserves with unique flora and fauna. Sochi is known for the unique combination of Mediterranean and Alpine climates.

The region has a Mediterranean-style climate, gentle and moderate, with an average winter temperature in the range of $8-10\,^{\circ}\text{C}$ along the coast. In the summer, the temperature can reach up to $38-40\,^{\circ}\text{C}$. In the mountains, the air temperature in summer may never get above $8\,^{\circ}\text{C}$, and in the winter, the temperature in the mountains is often below zero.

WHERE TO EAT. Sochi boasts a well-developed tourist infrastructure. Restaurants in Sochi demonstrate Russian hospitality and flavors. In many cafés vegetarian and faith-based diets are available. In addition the majority of restaurants and cafés have Internet access. Information about the infrastructure in Sochi (food, entertainment, walking tours) is available at the hotel where you are staying in Sochi and from tour operators.

The relay of the Paralympic Flame is a large sports related celebration, which always precedes the Summer and Winter Paralympic Games. More than 1,500 torchbearers over the course of 10 days will carry the Paralympic Flame across the territory of the host country of the future Games, symbolizing the approaching Paralympics.

These relays have their own unshakable traditions. In 2014, new traditions will be formed. The birthplace of the Paralympic Movement, Stoke Mandeville, England, will become the first place in history to be involved in the Paralympic Torch Relay outside of the Games hosting country. Stoke Mandeville will continue to be involved in all future Paralympic Torch Relays. The symbol of the future Paralympics will also visit 46 cities in eight Russian federal districts, where the main part of the relay is held. MEDICAL INSURANCE

Russian and foreign spectators must have a medical insurance policy on their person in order to receive medical assistance. For foreign spectators having insurance, medical services have to be paid in Russia with further reimbursement by their insurance company.

SMOKE-FREE ENVIRONMENT



The city of Sochi and the Paralympic venues have been declared a smoke-free environment. Smoking is prohibited at all the competition venues and in all public places. Smoking areas are only located outside the venues and are marked with special signs.

Medical assistance at the sports venues is free of charge. If further professional care is needed, it is subject to the terms of your medical insurance arrangements.
