WHAT TO LOOK FOR - A LOOK BACK

<u>CLOSE GAMES</u>: The Seattle Seahawks defeated the San Francisco 49ers 23-17 in the NFC Championship Game on Sunday.

It marked the seventh consecutive NFC Championship Game to be decided by seven points or fewer, <u>extending the longest streak in conference championship game history</u>.

<u>LUCKY SEVEN</u>: The **DENVER BRONCOS** defeated New England 26-16 in the AFC Championship Game to advance to Super Bowl XLVIII. This is the Broncos seventh Super Bowl appearance, tying New England for the third-most in NFL history.

TEAM LEADER: Denver head coach **JOHN FOX** guided the Broncos to a 26-16 win over New England in Sunday's AFC Championship Game.

With the win, Fox became the sixth coach in NFL history to lead two different franchises to the Super Bowl.

<u>PASSING LEGENDS</u>: Denver quarterback **PEYTON MANNING** passed for 400 yards and two touchdowns in Denver's 26-16 win over New England in the AFC Championship Game.

Manning became the fourth quarterback in the Super Bowl era to lead the league in passing yards and TD passes and also advance to the Super Bowl that season, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (1984), **KURT WARNER** (2001) and **TOM BRADY** (2007) as the only QBs to accomplish the feat.
