Work consumes our time and our thinking. We are compelled to do it, and are burdened by it. Yet without it we can lack identity and self-esteem. Should it be so? Is our work valued by God, and how should it intersect with our faith?

SLAVERY IN THE OLD AND NEW TESTAMENTS

KIT BARKER

Kevin Rudd's pre-election riposte about slavery revealed confusion about the biblical teaching on this topic. Slavery remains a problem throughout many parts of the world. Kit, Old Testament lecturer at SMBC, will carefully consider the biblical implications of slavery.

GUIDING AND PARENTING TEENAGERS IN A SEX-SATURATED SOCIETY

DR PATRICIA WEERAKOON

Dr Weerakoon, a medical doctor, sexologist and Christian writer and speaker will present biblical foundations and helpful practical suggestions and strategies for Christians who guide teens and young adults in the midst of a culture obsessed with sex.

ABORTION AND INFANTICIDE REV PETER BARNES

Cigarette packets warn that smoking harms unborn babies; yet abortion is legal. Australian philosopher Peter Singer argues in favour of both abortion and infanticide, suggesting a child in utero is no different legally from a child already born. Peter Barnes will explore biblical and cultural foundations behind these much debated questions.

MUSIC, EMOTIONS AND CHRISTIAN CORPORATE WORSHIP REV ROB SMITH

Rob teaches theology at SMBC, with extensive experience in theological education, pastoring and music ministry. Christians are often unsure how to think: what is the relationship between music and worship? How appropriate is it to show emotions? What kinds of emotions should we feel? Is there room for self-expression in corporate worship?

DEALING WITH DEMENTIA

REV ANDREW HERON

As a society, and even as Christians we tend to misunderstand and undervalue elderly people-especially those with dementia. Andrew, the chief chaplain at Anglican Retirement Villages, Castle Hill will give us insight into understanding, pastoring and valuing the growing number of people afflicted with dementia.

SAVED BY SACRIFICE, OR SAVED FROM SACRIFICE? WHAT EXACTLY DID THE CROSS OF CHRIST ACHIEVE? REV DR IAN MADDOCK

Did Jesus die as an atoning sacrifice in our place? Alternative explanations of the cross currently gaining favour see it as a purely human event, having nothing to do with redemption from sin. Ian, Senior Lecturer in Theology at SMBC, will help us to understand and critique other non-violent theories of the cross.

SPIRITS, POWER STRUGGLES AND THE **REALITY OF THE UNSEEN WORLD, IN CROSS-CULTURAL MINISTRY** DR L. TAN

Lawrence lectures in medicine at UWS, and spent 14 years as a medical missionary in Bolivia. Integrating biblical, medical and practical perspectives, he will guide our understanding of the unseen spiritual battle taking place. As Christians proclaim the gospel, what is the nature of the forces opposing Christ and his people?

JUDE: AN URGENT CALL TO 21ST CENTURY CHRISTIANS DR ROD THOMPSON

Jude, a little-known book of the Bible, is only 25 verses long. Yet despite its strangeness and unfamiliarity, it contains much that faithful Christians should not overlook. Rod Thompson, Principal of Laidlaw College in Auckland, will unpack Jude's teaching and explain his confronting call to action for modern Christians.
