#### **About Laura**

With over 20 years of pediatric nursing experience, Laura Moore has dedicated her life to improve the lives of medically fragile children. She and her family have two biological children, Hayden, 21, and Anna 19. As a family, they have fostered



six medically fragile children over the last three years and provided respite care for another six. One of these beautiful children stole their heart and is now a permanent part of their family. Her name is Katie. She is 10 years old and is only the second child in medical history to survive two, back-to-back five organ transplants (stomach, small intestine, colon, spleen and pancreas- twice, two weeks apart!).

As a nurse, unit administrator, and clinical nurse educator, Laura noticed that although today's advancing technology allows doctors to save children who would have died in the past, the life and future of these children is bleak at best. The very technology that saved them is now required to sustain their life, making their care much more complicated and costly.

Unfortunately, these medically fragile children are often abandoned or taken away from their families when appropriate care cannot be provided. Many of these fragile children live shuffled between hospitals, untrained foster homes, and adult nursing facilities with no family to call their own.

In addition, tearful families who love their children but can not provide for their care, watch helplessly as their children are taken into State custody and placed in foster care far away from home. Dozens of children with high level needs live in the hospital for years with no family, no home, and soon become depressed and lose hope. These children then lose motivation to participate in their care and as a result, their already fragile condition deteriorates rapidly. Staff become frustrated and turnover is high.

Families are being torn apart. Children are spending years isolated in hospital rooms or being institutionalized in adult nursing facilities and acute care institutions. Each situation wastes tremendous resources. Although millions of dollars and tremendous resources may miraculously save the lives of these precious children, Laura questioned the kind of life they were being saved for. She knew something had to be done.

Laura is the Founder and CEO of the Dream House for Medically Fragile Children, Inc. with a mission to increase the opportunities for medically fragile children to live in a stable, permanent home environment through the development of support resources and programs which increase the number of families and communities prepared to care for them.

Her goal is to make it possible for medically fragile children to leave the hospital in a more timely manner, keep them out of institutional care, and give them the home, family and future the so desperately needed to survive.

The Dream House organization, now in their seventh year, has a corporate office with 18 staff members and has raised more than \$3 million serving over 900 medically fragile children in 42 Georgia counties. Their goal in 2009 is to expand their programs state wide and begin construction on the Dream House Resource Center LLC in Conyers, GA.
