

This list, of events in the lives of The Moores' family of artists from Nottingham, is collected from newspaper articles, which can be accessed from The 19th Century British Library Newspapers archive, available from some public libraries, The British Newspaper Archive, The Nottingham Archive (real building), the offices of the Nottingham Post, formerly The Nottingham Evening Post and various sources provided by Ancestry.co.uk. The events are listed in chronological order, with exceptions where the exact date is unknown or incorrectly recorded. There will be the author's mistakes as well as the ones already existing in the source material; please check any significant facts before quoting from this document. For further research, there is a much greater coverage of historic articles from local newspapers, available from Nottingham Libraries, in the relevant areas. There is also an excellent Nottinghamshire Bibliography by Michael Brook, which is also currently available on-line (Feb. 2012) at <http://www.thorotonsociety.org.uk/publications/recordseries/nottsbibliography2002.pdf>.
