Settlement Profile of

AIRMYN



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Airmyn is a village situated at the mouth of the River Aire (Airmyn meaning 'mouth of the Aire') and the Ouse, approximately 2 miles north west of Goole and to the north of the M62. The most dominant features in the village include the parish church of St David's, which is a Grade II listed building, and the Airmyn Clock Tower which sits on the bend of High Street (also Grade II). Airmyn also has a fairly large memorial hall, located next to the village field and 'Woodland Park' as named by an Airmyn Park Primary School pupil.

A high earthen embankment protects the village from the fast flowing waters of the Aire and runs paralell with HIgh Street.

	Comments.	 Core Strategy Issues & Options (April 2008) – Selected comments: The Council would like to see more emphasis put on the renovation of existing properties where possible to make much better use of housing stock. The Parish Council has concerns about development on high risk flood areas and would encourage the strategy not to include proposals for development where land has been identified as highly susceptible to flooding. Settlements on the periphery of the county have more affinity with travel sub-area out of the East Riding – the policies of neighbours could potentially have more impact on these communities. The Parish Council supports the regeneration of parts of Goole but does not wish to see remedies for the housing problems in this area being extended to the hinterland villages. Such settlements should not be seen as possible overflow development area to ease problems in the larger service centre towns. Boundaries of villages should be protected. [Development in rural areas] Every village should be considered on its own merits taking into account any local development plans such as a Parish Plan.
