

Roku Announces BrightSign High-Definition Solid State Media Player

Low cost, reliable media player targets POP displays, museums, kiosk, and digital sign markets

ANAHEIM, CA, June 19, 2007. Today at the InfoComm 2007 trade show Roku introduced the BrightSign HD2000 solid state media player. The HD2000 adds high-definition video and playlist support to the BrightSign line of media players. BrightSign also supports photos, audio and interactivity. Its simple, reliable and flexible design makes it the perfect solution for high-impact digital signs, interactive kiosks, POP displays and museum exhibits.

Roku is launching and demonstrating BrightSign at the InfoComm 2007 trade show. Demonstrations are available in Booth 14000. The BrightSign HD2000 is easy to operate and customize. Simply insert a removable flash card to display looping playback of video, image and audio content using playlists. To add interactivity with button controls or touch screens, there are several options from the very simple all the way up to complete scripting. Playlists are supported, state-based tables, or BrightScript, an easy scripting language designed specifically to enable new interactive features to solid state media playback.

Unlike DVD players or PCs, BrightSign with BrightScript is designed specifically to control digital signage, in-store point-of-purchase displays, museum exhibits, and kiosks. BrightSign has no moving parts, making it much more reliable than other display options. In addition, it easily mounts to walls, shelves or cabinets.

BrightSign HD2000 connects to both standard VGA and XVGA LCD monitors and high-definition displays via component video or HDMI. Connectivity options include HDMI, component video, two USB ports (for touch screens, keyboard, mice, trackball, speakers and more), three stereo analog audio outs, SPDIF audio out, GPIO port for button or switch inputs and LED or other outputs, IR remote control, Ethernet and two serial ports.

Roku BrightSign HD2000 sells in single unit quantities \$699.99, and prices as low as \$420 for 1,000 units. The HD2000 begins shipping in July 2007.
