February 5, 1986 - "BROWN SUGAR" - In honor of Black History month, Rhonda Roberson, D.C. attorney, former WPFW programmer, and collector of videos of black women performers, will present some of her collection and a review of black singers and performers from the early 1900's to the 1980's. Video performances will be shown of such entertainers as Lena Horne, Mary Lou Williams, Carmen McCrae and Chaka Kahn.

February 12, 1986 - "VALENTINE'S DANCE" Bring your sweetheart (or meet one at GWA) and join SHARONE, who will be playing music that is sure to win her heart. Red optional. PLEASE NOTE: The cost will be \$5.00 for the evening to help defray expenses.)

February 19, 1986 - "LESBIAN COUPLES: HOW DIFFERENT ARE WE?" - Dr. Mary Jane Wood, a local psychotherapist, asks: "Are lesbian couples more likely to have unhealthy relationship patterns than straight couples?" Do we differ from straights in terms of psychosocial development or social support for the relationship? Dr. Wood is currently the coordinator of the Lesbian Resourse and Counseling Center, and Vice President for Women's Issues of the Whitman-Walker Clinic.

February 26, 1986 - Jewel Spencer-Bay, Director of the Color Me Human Players, will present an originally composed artistic work focusing on one of todays social issues. \*

March 5, 1986 - "WOMEN AND AIDS" - The current AIDS crisis is further exposing the tensions and mistrust that have existed for a long time between the lesbian community and the gay male community. However, in 1985, quarantine is now a reality in San Antonio, Texas and Mario Cuomo (a liberal) is closing gay bathhouses. What is the lesbian community's responsibility to women with AIDS and to men with AIDS. Tammy Weinstein, a Jewish lesbian activist and Assistant Director of the Rainbow Alliance Lobby will address the issue of Women and AIDS.

March 12, 1986 - "WOMEN AND WELLNESS: A FEMINIST APPROACH TO HEALTH CARE" - Liz Calderon, R.N. Women are strong and healthy, but society teaches us to be weak and dependent. Knowledge is power. Learn how to take control of your health and your body. A hands on workshop to learn how to increase your energy level and feel good!
