# ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN

## Where great minds meet

The Act establishing the University of Saskatchewan was passed by the Legislative Assembly on April 3, 1907. The U of S celebrated its 100th birthday in 2007. The first classes in Arts & Science began in 1909 with a registration of 70 students. The classes were in the Drinkle Building downtown. On Oct. 12, 1912 the first building on campus, the College Building, opened for student admissions. It was declared a provincial (1982) and federal (2000) heritage building.

## Colleges and schools

The university offers 58 degrees, diplomas and certificates in more than 100 areas and disciplines. Enrolment in 2011-12 was 20,495.

## Faculty and staff

The U of S prides itself on its faculty and staff that number about 7,000. The university, with associated organizations such as Innovation Place and the Royal University Hospital, is the City of Saskatoon's second largest employer, making up about eight per cent of the city's work force.

## Historical highlights

The U of S student newspaper The Sheaf has been in publication since 1912. In the 1940s and 1950s, the U of S pioneered the use of radiation for cancer treatment. Canada's first department of drama was established at the U of S in 1945. Since 1971, the university's Crop Development Centre has bred and released more than 200 new field crop varieties. Canada's first Native Law Centre was established at the University of Saskatchewan.

## WHY HUSKIES? WHY GREEN & WHITE?

The name Huskies was included in an article in the Sept. 20, 1932 Star-Phoenix: "The Varsity Stadium yesterday morning saw the advance guard of over twenty gridiron Huskies swing into action." One of the earliest pictures of players wearing sweaters with 'Huskies' on them was the 1932-33 Greystone yearbook, which showed the men's hockey team in uniforms with the new name.

The colours green and white were chosen in 1910 by Reginald Bateman, a native of Ireland and the first English professor at the University of Saskatchewan. Bateman was at a college meeting which displayed pennants and colour suggestions made

by professor Alexander Greig. "There was a moment's silence, and then professor Bateman stepped forward and touched the green and white," wrote historian Arthur Morton. Said U of S president Walter Murray: "The Irishman has spoken. So be it."

- Grieve was coach of Saskatchewan's team at the 2001 Canada Games in London, Ont., finishing fifth, and at the 2011 Western Canada Summer Games in Kamloops, B.C., winning bronze.

- He has a Masters of Administration in leadership from the University of Regina.



### Assistant coach Natalie Lukiw

- Natalie Lukiw is in her second year as an assistant. She holds the team record for kills and blocks in a season. She was named an All-Canadian.



### Assistant coach Tiffany Dodds

- This is Dodds's first year as an assistant with the Huskies. Dodds, who is from Lucky Lake, played on the Canadian national team.

### Assistant coach Lindsay Mehler

- Mehler in her first season with the Huskies. She played senior volleyball for four years at Bishop Mahoney High School and is a high school coach.

### Honours for coach Tennant

Mark Tennant was named to Volleyball Canada's Hall of Fame in 2012 for his influence on the sport as a builder.

In Tennant's 24 years as coach at the U of S, the Huskies won the Canadian title three times and were conference champions seven times. The trophy for female rookie of the year in CIS volleyball is the Mark Tennant Award.

Besides coaching, he has served on the technical committee at the Universiade and with FIVB, the international federation for volleyball.

He started an ongoing exchange program between teams at the U of S and Japan.

In 1999, the world junior women's championship was held in North America for the first time. Tennant helped land the event in Edmonton and Saskatoon.

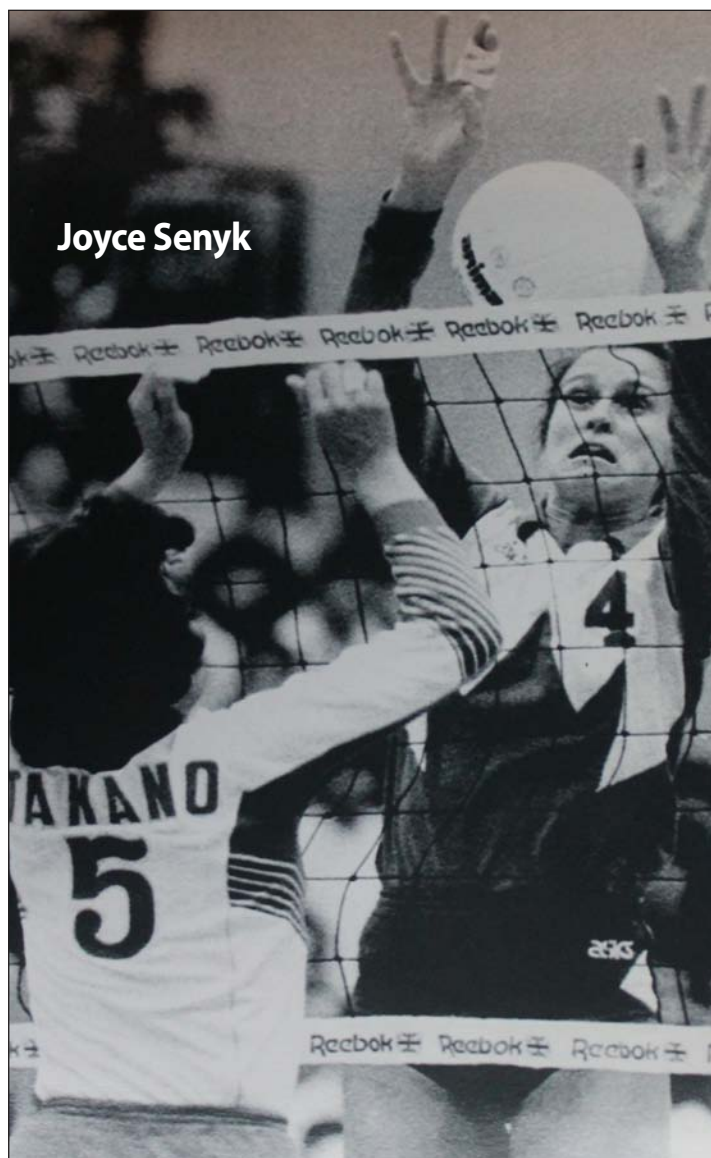

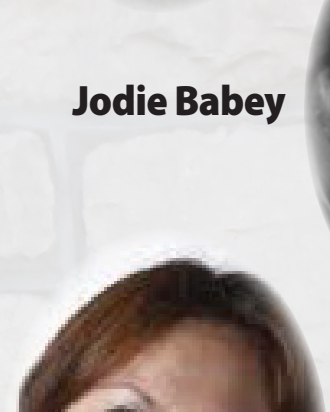
