# **Competency-Based Residency Training**

(Preceding the Second Annual Northern Ontario Pediatric Conference on October 4, 2013)

Both the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) are implementing a competency-based approach to residency training. The overall goal of a competency-based residency is to ensure that family and specialty physicians are competent in all the necessary knowledge, skills, and professional behaviours to practice independently upon completion of their training. A competency-based framework provides challenges for both programs and preceptors. Residency educational activities must be based on the required competencies of each discipline within the CanMeds framework. Clarifying milestones for each resident to master in order to achieve the required competencies, utilizing feedback and assessment tools to assist and measure a resident's progress, and engaging residents as essential partners in the educational process is also required. This workshop will better prepare faculty to implement competency-based training with their residents.

### **WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES**

By the end of the workshop, participants will be able to:

- 1. Explain the principles of competency-based residency training;
- 2. Implement competency-based medical education strategies within NOSM residency programs; and,
- 3. Employ approaches and tools for competency-based assessments of residents in training.
