Chancellor's Report to the 49th Diocesan Assembly Archpriest John Kowalczyk

"And we know that all things work together, for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose" (Rom.8:28)

One of the most opportune times for a Church to grow is when it goes through change. There are many things that may bring change. When handled properly, the challenges that are brought about by changes can turn into opportunities for growth. One of the most difficult and at the same time joyful events for our diocese occurred on November 12th, in Parma, Ohio, with the election of Archbishop Tikhon to the high office of Metropolitan and Primate of the Orthodox Church in America. Our loss is gain for the entire Church.

For over half a decade, Metropolitan Tikhon has had the awesome responsibility and weight in shepherding and guiding the priests and the parishes in the ecclesial work of our diocese. As the chancellor of our diocese, I would like to thank his Beatitude, during the tenure of tremendous leadership provided during a transition and difficult time for our diocese. It was his prayerful spirit, steady hand, softness, embracing smile and humility that was able to turn the diocesan ship and allow it to begin to sail and face uncharted waters with unwavering faith. It is by divine providence that our Lord Jesus Christ has now placed our Archpastor Metropolitan Tikhon with the heavy cross of the primatial office also during difficult and insolent times for the Orthodox Church in America.

At an immediate meeting following the election, the Holy Synod of Bishops of the O.C.A. appointed Bishop Melchisedek of Western Pennsylvania as *locum tenens* of our diocese and Bishop Mark as the Administrator. St. Paul reminds us "And we know that all things work together, for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." (Rom. 8:28) On Tuesday, November 20th the transition meeting with Metropolitan Tikhon, Bishop Melchisedek and Bishop Mark and Diocesan Staff took place. Both Bishops Melchisedek and Mark were present at our first Diocesan Council Meeting in Berwick to reassure us and help us during this time of transition, adjustment in leadership and governance. I would like thank, His Grace, Bishop Melchisedek, and his Grace, Bishop Mark, for their prayerful guidance, wisdom, sagacity, and for providing a renewed compass of leadership as we begin the search process, leading to the election of a new diocesan bishop.

His Grace, Bishop Mark as the Administrator, has not missed a beat in his liturgical visitations to local parishes, having weekly meetings with our administration, providing counseling to our clergy family and revamping our diocesan web-page. We thank him for his speedy reply to the letters received and for his tireless efforts and coordination in informing and asking for blessings provided by the *locum tenens* of our diocese.

It is truly reassuring to know that growth can occur during times of change. At this Assembly let us take advantage of the opportunity to grow amid change. The recent events of our Church taught us a lesson, i.e. change will occur whether we want it or not so it is better to develop a plan for it. God has blessed us with the leadership of two bishops who have a combined goal of wanting to growing our churches. We have to be

visionary people who want to be led and are looking to the future. In this diocesan assembly, let us spiritually observe study and listen to the inner voice of God speaking to our hearts, calling us to be responsible stewards of our faith.

Let us persevere and not be quick to judge. Remember that every good work of the church that sows the seed will not return empty (Isa. 55:11). Persevering in the work of the Lord may not instantly yield results (1 Cor. 3:6-7). Let us not lose sight of the goal before us and be patient.

Dealing with change is not easy. Sometimes we choose change, and sometimes, (particular with us) change chooses us. Either way, it is rarely without its challenges. At this Assembly let us pray for clarity to understand the things we need to do and the serenity to know that some things have to be left up to God. When a church goes through change, it can be a great time to prioritize. A Diocesan Assembly is an opportunity to assess our strengths and weaknesses. Most importantly change can be a challenge to embrace a new opportunity. To sit back and do the same thing over and over and expect different results is a recipe for disaster. Let's rise to the task of building up the church and our diocese. Let's roll up our spiritual sleeves and do the work of the Church. In this Assembly we pray that we all will have the courage to make decisions which will aid in the development of our parishes and the spiritual and physical growth of our diocese.

The Diocesan Council

The Diocesan Council members are Bishop Melchisedek, Bishop Mark, Chancellor Fr. John Kowalczyk, Treasurer Fr. Martin Browne, Deans, Rev. Nicholas Solak of Wilkes-Barre Deanery, V. Rev. Michael Hatrak of Frackville Deanery, Rev. James Weremedic of Philadelphia Deanery, Metropolitan Council Clergy Representative V. Rev. S. David Mahaffey, Rev. John Soucek (Wilkes-Barre), Rev. Timothy Hojnicki (Frackville), Rev. Victor Gorodenchuk (Philadelphia), Lay representatives John Buckeye (Wilkes-Barre), Elsie Herman (Frackville), Mark Linnehan, (at Large), Doug Yates (Philadelphia), Metropolitan Council Lay Representative David Yeosock.

Since the last Diocesan Assembly, the Council has met three times, February 9th, August 30th, and November 29th. Each meeting heard reports from the Bishop, Chancellor, and Treasurer. Issues of Diocesan interest and policy were discussed as relates to local and National issues. Recommendations and resolutions were made and acted upon by the appropriate diocesan authorities and communicated to clergy and lay leadership in the parishes as necessary. The substance of the Council's work is reflected in the reports of its members to the Assembly.

We are grateful to the elected diocesan council members and for the hard work provided for the past three years. We are blessed to have diocesan council members who bring to the table, their unique gifts and talents in building up the "Body of Christ." In our election today, let us use wisdom and prudence in the selection process to provide new council members who will continue to work especially in this special time of transition in our diocese.

Policies, Standards and Procedures of the Orthodox Church in America on Sexual Misconduct (PSP) This subject was discussed at length and communicated to the Deans of our Diocese for implementation. This document was approved by the Holy Synod of Bishop of the Orthodox Church in America in 2003 and became effective immediately within each diocese and institution of the OCA. Each diocese is required to forward a yearly report of compliance with the PSP, and this report is to include the confirmation of each parish's compliance.

Diocesan Vocations Department

With the continuing shortage of clergy for assignment in our diocese the need to develop the office of vocations in our Church is crucial to maintain the future stability of our diocese. We need to encourage and develop vocations. With the blessing and guidance of Archbishop Tikhon, I was appointed in my expanding role as Chancellor to develop and explore this office and utilize all the media available to us and help coordinate the annual vocations encounter held in our Seminaries and with interested candidates from our diocese. The Rev. Nicholas Solak has volunteered to be a part of this department. Plans have already been made to interview seminarians in both our seminaries who have an interest in exploring the vast missionary field of the Diocese of Eastern Pennsylvania.

The Diocesan Census

Enclosed as an appendix to my report is the Diocesan Census results for this year for the (37) parishes in our diocese. We have a combined paying membership of 2,805 adults showing a drop of 117 adults from last year. We thank everyone for their participation in completing this task.
