Group tickets - \$8 for groups of 50-or more – are only available by calling the Group Sales Office at 1-800-GOBUCKS (select Option 2).

TICKET(S) PRICES

General admission prices are \$12 for adults if bought in advance; \$20 if purchased day of game. A ticket will also get fans into the "Showdown in the Shoe," the Ohio State vs. Michigan lacrosse match that will precede the spring game and start at 11 a.m. Children ages 6-and-under are free in the general admission sections only. A limited number of reserved club seats are available for \$20. Current OSU students get in free with a valid OSU ID. Students should enter the stadium through Gate 26.

SPRING PREVIEW

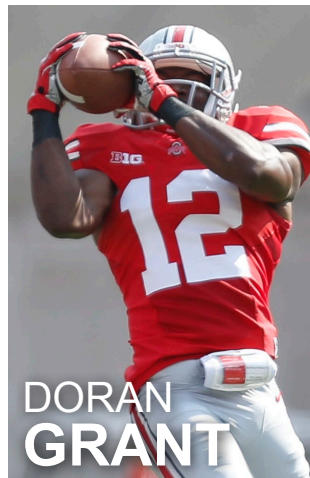
COLUMBUS, Ohio – The 15 practice days that make up the 2014 Ohio State University football spring drills commence Tuesday, March 4 and extend through the LiFE Sports Spring Game, presented by Nationwide, on April 12.

A total of 92 individuals are on Ohio State's spring roster, which includes 39 returning lettermen from last season's 12-2 team that played in the Big Ten championship game and the Discover Orange Bowl. A total of 12 starters off the 2013 team's offense (five) and defense (seven) return.

Returning starters from an offense that set a Big Ten record for most rushing yards (4,321), ranked fifth nationally in rushing (308.6 yards per game) and shattered school records for points scored (637), touchdowns (87) and touchdown passes (38) are senior quarterback Braxton Miller, senior tight end Jeff Heurman, senior receivers Devin Smith and Evan Spencer, and junior tackle Taylor Decker.

The seven returnees on defense include everyone who started along the front line – senior Michael Bennett, juniors Noah Spence and Adolphus Washington and sophomore Joey Bosa – plus linebackers Curtis Grant, a senior, and junior Joshua Perry (who shared starts with nickel back/safety Tyvis Powell), and senior cornerback Doran Grant.

Sophomore punter Cameron Johnston, who led the Big Ten in punting with a 44.0 average, also returns.



A NEW FOUNDATION

The Buckeyes have powered for 7,228 rushing yards – a 278.0 yards per game average – and 82 rushing touchdowns in two seasons under Urban Meyer, a rush total that only seven schools can top. The foundation of this success has been an offensive line that is now void of four upperclassmen – all of whom have the potential to make an NFL roster – and their 135 combined starts. It’s time to restock up front.

Junior Taylor Decker started all 14 games at right tackle last year and is the new leader of the pack. He’ll move to left tackle this spring. Sophomore Pat Elflein, who played well in three quarters vs. Michigan and in a start against Michigan State in the Big Ten championship game, is tested and proven at one guard position. Jacoby Boren and Darryl Baldwin have some game experience the last two seasons at center and tackle, respectively. Nine additional scholarship linemen will be vying for playing time, including Antonio Underwood, who is returning after missing the 2013 season, Kyle Dodson, Billy Price and Joel Hale, who has moved from the defensive line.

EXPECT SPIRITED COMPETITION EVERYWHERE

Position battles will be spirited and fervent at running back, receiver and at quarterback. Braxton Miller isn’t likely to take a snap this spring which means untested young quarterbacks Cardale Jones, a third-year sophomore who was on the field for all of 39 plays in three games last year, and red-shirt freshman J.T. Barrett will have plenty of opportunities to perform in the competition for the No. 2 position. Early enrollee and true freshman Stephen Collier is the third scholarship quarterback on the roster.

Sophomore Ezekiel Elliott’s 30 carries (for 262 yards and an 8.7 per carry average) were the most last year of any returning running back, a testament to his skill, savvy and practice habits, but he’ll be

challenged hard by a slew of veterans for this open position. Rod Smith is a fifth-year senior who has gained 448 yards with a 5.4 per carry average and is a solid 6-3 and 232 pounds. A couple of third-year sophomores will also be mixing it up at the position: Bri’onte Dunn and Warren Ball.

And speedster Dontre Wilson, a running back who also played H-back last year and averaged 13.2 yards with every touch of the football, is bound to be bigger, better and stronger in his second season. He averaged 8.1 yards off 31 carries, 15.0 yards off 22 receptions and 24.9 yards on kickoff returns plus scored three times as a freshman.

JUICE

Seniors Devin Smith and Evan Spencer return as starting wide receivers with 22 and 15 starts, respectively, but the juice will be loose with this position group that is loaded with talented players eager to play and who either red-shirted (Michael Thomas, Corey Smith and Jalin Marshall), sat out (Jeff Greene) or were in high school (WR Johnny Dixon and H-B Curtis Samuel) last season.

Smith has speed and experience – 88 receptions for 1,572 yards and 18 touchdowns – on his resume and Spencer, although he won’t play this spring, has consistently been lauded for his downfield blocking and football awareness. He has 37 career catches and four touchdowns.

Ohio State boasts two outstanding, veteran tight ends in senior Jeff Heuerman (22 starts; 35 receptions for 585 yards and five touchdowns) and fourth-year junior Nick Vannett. Both are in the 6-6, 250-pound range.

A FOUNDATION TO BUILD UPON

Defensive coordinator Luke Fickell has a couple new assistants on his side of the ball to work with and a line that will anchor the defense. Every lineman returns from a 2013 unit that registered a combined 53 tackles for loss, including 31 quarterback sacks.

Tackle Michael Bennett (11.5 TFLs and 7.0 sacks) is the only senior among this group and he is a force on and off the field. First-team all-Big Ten junior end Noah Spence (14.5 and 8.0, respectively) is a 12-game starter and junior Adolphus Washington (4.0 and 2.0, respectively) is a formidable performer at 6-4 and 295 pounds. Physical sophomore Joey Bosa (13.5 and 7.5, respectively) was a freshman All-American during a 2013 season in which he started 10 games.

Senior Steve Miller and juniors Tommy Schutt, Jamal Marcus and Chris Carter have all played well and had their moments in back-up rolls. Schutt and Marcus have each started games in the past.

JUST THREE LB/DB STARTERS RETURN

Linebacker and the defensive backfield areas each lost an All-American performer to early application into the NFL Draft: Ryan Shazier and Bradley Roby. Both standouts and their incredible playmaking abilities will be missed.

Senior Curtis Grant is the man in the middle at linebacker and is coming off his most productive season with 12 starts, 52 tackles, including four tackles-for-loss, and a pair of pass break-ups. Joshua Perry, fourth on the team with 64 tackles last year, has significant experience – 10 starts – at outside linebacker and the junior continued to improve as the season progressed. Junior Camren Williams and sophomore Tre Johnson also had game action, with Williams in on 10 tackles in a start at Illinois.

Linebacker is a position where true freshmen will have to contribute this fall, according to Meyer. Four linebackers are in this year's recruiting class, including the nation's No. 1 middle linebacker and an early enrollee, Raekwon McMillan.

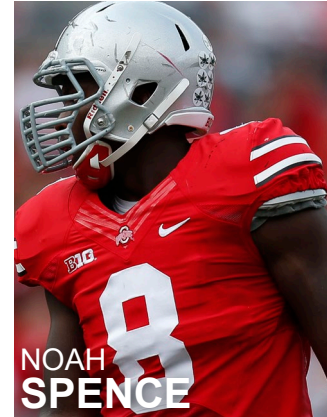
The secondary will feature a talented senior and 15-game starter in cornerback Doran Grant, and a quartet of young players eager for more time. Grant was second on the team last season with three interceptions and 10 pass break-ups, and he was a top five tackler on the team with 58 stops, including 43 solos.

Junior Armani Reeves, who started the first two games of the season and the Discover Orange Bowl in place of Roby, played plenty in between and is the only other cornerback with game experience, now that Cam Burrows, who played in 12 games last season but mostly on special teams, has moved to safety. Reeves had seven pass break-ups and an interception last season, in addition to 26 tackles.

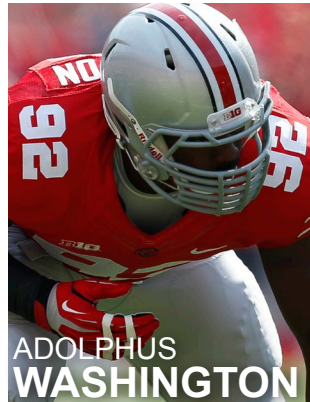
Sophomores Tyvis Powell and Vonn Bell are poised to make noise at safety this year. Powell played 732 snaps from scrimmage last season and started five times while playing as the team's nickel back. He made 48 tackles plus the game-deciding play against Michigan: intercepting a two-point conversion attempt with seconds left to play. Bell was an outstanding special teamer last season who

managed a modest 70 snaps on defense through the first 13 games. And then he started against Clemson in the Discover Orange Bowl and performed well: registering seven solo tackles and an end zone interception while playing 78 plays from scrimmage.

Burrows, who played 124 snaps on defense as a freshman cornerback last season, will vie for playing time at safety along with fourth-year junior Ron Tanner, considered among the best tacklers on the team. Tanner had his first significant action on defense last season – 56 snaps – and had an interception against Buffalo.

SPECIAL TEAMERS

Cameron Johnston had an outstanding freshman season punting, leading the Big Ten in average but also leading the nation in percentage of punts downed inside the 20 (31 of 49; 63 pct.). He returns, as does Bryce Haynes, who has shared long-snapping duties the past two seasons. A battle for Drew Basil's kicking responsibilities will take place among third-year walk-on senior Kyle Clinton and freshman Sean Nuernberger.



NEWS & NOTES

NEW ON THE SIDELINES

Coach Urban Meyer's staff will feature two new assistant coaches: Chris Ash is the team's co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach and Larry Johnson is assistant head coach and defensive line coach. Ash spent the past year at Arkansas and the previous three years at Wisconsin. Johnson has coached collegiately for the past 18 years at Penn State.

And some additional additions to the program:

- Phil Matusz is a new assistant strength and conditioning coach for Mickey Marotti. Matusz, head strength coach at Villanova the past two years, replaces Rick Court, who took his juice to the Deep South to be head strength coach at Mississippi State University.
- Graduate assistants for this season are second-year defensive GA Vince Oghobaase and new GAs Jon Carpenter (defense), Cody Hawkins (offense) and Adrian Mayes (offense).

LIMITED AND/OR OUT THIS SPRING

Braxton Miller's shoulder surgery Feb. 21 will limit what he will do on the field this spring. Evan Spencer, injured in the Orange Bowl game against Clemson, will not compete in spring drills as he continues to rehabilitate from his lower leg surgery in January. Two others – junior OL Chase Farris and junior LB Devan Bogard – will also be held out of spring drills while continuing to recover from surgery last fall. Red-shirt freshman WR James Clark will practice, but he will have some limitations. Second-year sophomore linebacker Mike Mitchell is no longer practicing with the team. Ben St. John, a walk-on OL who has been with the program four years, has elected not to compete as a fifth-year senior because of a shoulder issue.

SENIORS AND JUNIORS AND SOPHOMORES AND ...

Ohio State's spring roster includes 92 student-athletes. The breakdown by class includes 20 seniors (seven fifth-year seniors and 13 true seniors), 28 juniors, 24 sophomores and 20 freshmen (13 red-shirt freshmen and seven true freshmen).

CHANGES

Some notable position changes have been made for the start of spring drills. Joel Hale, a veteran of 29 games along the defensive line and a true senior, will practice with the offensive linemen. Sophomore Cam Burrows, who lettered with 306 plays last season including 124 snaps as a cornerback, has been moved to safety. And Chase Farris has moved back to offensive line, where he played in 2012 but converted to defensive line last season when Tommy Schutt was injured in the preseason.

The program has had only 24 head coaches and it has become one of the top programs in the nation with a No. 5 ranking in victories (849) and with seven national championships, 34 Big Ten Conference championships, 43 bowl game appearances, 78 consensus All-Americans, 36 Academic All-Americans, 20 National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame Scholar-Athletes, 24 National Football Foundation & College Hall of Famers, 71 first-round NFL Draft picks and 10 Pro Football Hall of Famers.

THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

Maryland and Rutgers are now members of the Big Ten Conference and a new East/West divisional format replaces the Legends and Leaders divisions. New division alignments will feature Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State and Rutgers in the East Division and Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Purdue and Wisconsin in the West Division. Each school will play the other six schools in its division plus two teams from the other division in 2014 and 2015 before moving to nine-game conference slates in 2016.

SOME NEXT GAMES "WEST" NOTES

Ohio State plays Iowa and Purdue only once in the next six years with each game on the road, so Iowa and Purdue won't play in Columbus until at least 2020. MORE SEATS AND LIGHTS IN OHIO STADIUM

An \$8.9 million project ongoing at Ohio Stadium will add approximately 2,600 seats with the construction of two seating areas that extend above the south stands' stadium tunnels. The project, which will be completed in August 2014, will include a new players' tunnel and it will also add rows of permanent MUSCO sports lighting atop the stadium's east wall and above the press box. Upon completion, the south stands will hold just over 17,300 students (an additional 9,000 students will continue to have seats in the north end of the stadium).

HEAD COACH URBAN MEYER



Urban Meyer is 24-2 and 16-0 in Big Ten Conference games in two seasons as head coach of the Ohio State University Buckeyes. Along the way his Buckeyes set a school record with a 24-game winning streak (fourth-longest in Big Ten history) and, by virtue, Meyer became the first coach in major college history to win 20-or-more games consecutively on three different occasions. His Buckeyes have finished atop their division in the Big Ten in each of the past two seasons.

Meyer came home to Ohio to win games and win championships and to develop outstanding young men as coach of the Buckeyes. Born in Toledo, raised in Ashtabula and with degrees from Cincinnati and Ohio State, Meyer made it clear from the day he took the Ohio State position - Nov. 28, 2011 - what his intentions are: "We're going to make the great state of Ohio proud with everything we do."

Ohio is proud and Meyer, named the 2012 Ohio College Coach of the Year by his coaching peers in the state, has the proven deeds to keep the state beaming. Consider:

- Meyer has the highest winning percentage among all active FBS coaches with at least 10 years of experience (128-25;.837);
- He has the fourth-highest winning percentage all-time among FBS college coaches and he has the 10th best winning percentage among all coaches in college football history;
- He has won two national championships, one of only two active coaches with multiple national titles;
- He has won 13 games three times, the first to accomplish the feat, in addition to three 12-win seasons;
- Ohio State's 12-0 record in 2012 was the second undefeated season for Meyer, who also went 12-0 at Utah in 2004;
- While nine coaches have had two winning streaks of at least 20 games, Meyer is the only coach to have three such winning streaks (22 at Florida; 20 with Utah/Florida; 25 with Florida and Ohio State), and he has five winning streaks of 10-or-more games;

- He won more games his first 10 years - 104 - than all but two coaches in college football history; and
- He reached 100 wins faster than all but one coach – Bud Wilkinson – in the last 55 years and faster than all but five coaches all-time.

Meyer made history in his first season as Ohio State coach in 2012, guiding the Scarlet and Gray to only the sixth undefeated and untied season in school history with a 12-0 record and also to a Big Ten Conference Leaders Division championship. He was awarded the Woody Hayes Trophy as national Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. He was also a finalist for four additional national Coach of the Year Awards: the FWAA's Eddie Robinson Award, the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year, the Paul "Bear" Bryant and the Bobby Bowden Coach of the Year awards.

The winning and the making history continued for Meyer and the Buckeyes in Year 2, with Ohio State extending its winning streak to school-record status and ultimately finishing a 12-2 season with a second consecutive Big Ten Leaders Division title, a berth into the Big Ten championship game and an invite to the Discover Orange Bowl.

Meyer, who is in his 28th season as a collegiate coach, is married to the former Shelley Mather. The couple are proud parents to daughters Nicki and GiGi and a son, Nate.

- Meyer has won 13 games three times during his career, including back-to-back in 2008 and 2009 to become the first BCS coach to ever accomplish that feat.
- His teams are 22-3 in "rivalry games." Bowling Green was 1-1 vs. Toledo; Utah was 4-0 vs. Utah State and BYU; Florida was 16-2 vs. Florida State, Tennessee and Georgia; and Ohio State is 2-0 vs. Michigan.
- His teams are also 76-18 in conference play with four championships (two apiece at Utah and Florida). They are also 2-2 in conference title games and 7-2 in bowl games, including a 4-1 record in BCS bowl games.
- Meyer has coached his teams to winning streaks of 11 games (Bowling Green), 20 games (16 at Utah and four at Florida), 11 games (Florida), 22 games (Florida) and 24 games (Florida and Ohio State).
- His teams have 18 wins by 40-or-more points and another 22 wins by at least 30 points for a total of 50 wins by rather considerable margins.
- Meyer's teams are 2-2 vs. the No. 1 team in the nation, 7-3 vs. Top 5 teams, 11-5 vs. Top 10 teams and 23-9 vs. Top 25 teams.
- Both *The Sporting News* and *Sports Illustrated* named Meyer "Coach of the Decade" in December 2009.
- Thirty of his former Florida Gator players have been chosen in the NFL Draft, including more first-round selections – eight – than any other school produced between 2006-10.
- Meyer has watched a total of 39 players that he coached for at least two years get selected in the NFL Draft, including nine first-round draft picks.
- Of those 36 NFL Draft picks, three were quarterbacks: Bowling Green's Josh Harris was a sixth-round selection by Baltimore in the 2004 NFL Draft and Utah's Alex Smith (San Francisco, 2005) and Florida's Tim Tebow (Denver, 2010) were each No. 1 draft picks with Smith the overall No. 1 pick.
- In addition to Smith and Tebow, Meyer's first-round draft picks include offensive linemen Maurkice Pouncey (Pittsburgh, 2010) and Mike Pouncey (Miami, 2011); defensive linemen Jarvis Moss (Denver, 2007) and Derrick Harvey (Jacksonville, 2008); defensive backs Reggie Nelson (Jacksonville, 2007) and Joe Haden (Cleveland, 2010); and wide receiver/running back Percy Harvin (Minnesota, 2009).
- With the exception of kickers, Meyer has had multiple players at every position drafted into the NFL, including 12 defensive linemen, seven wide receivers, six defensive backs and six offensive linemen.
- Nine of Meyer's former assistant coaches are head coaches: Steve Addazio (Boston College); Gary Anderson (Wisconsin), Tim Beckman (Illinois); John "Doc Holliday (Marshall); Dan McCarney (North Texas); Dan Mullen (Mississippi State), Charlie Strong (Texas), Kyle Whittingham (Utah) and Everett Withers (James Madison).
- Seven of his former assistant coaches are offensive (OC) defensive (DC), passing game (PG) or run game (RG) coordinators: Vance Bedford (DC at Texas); Gregg Brandon (OC at New Mexico State); Chuck Heater (DC at Marshall); John Hevesy (co-OC/RG at Mississippi State); and Greg Mattison (DC at Michigan).

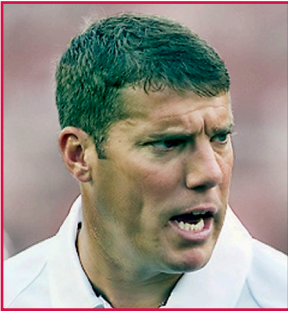

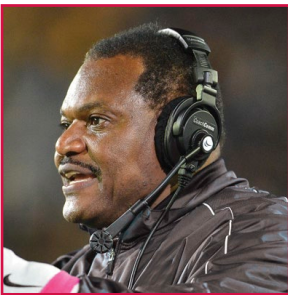

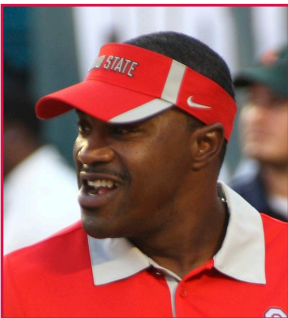
