1: Start with Confidence

University of Minnesota Overview

The University of Minnesota is divided into separate schools and colleges, each offering its own programs and each setting its own admission and graduation requirements. Each of these schools and colleges offers a variety of programs that may include bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and professional degrees, certificates, a range of professional endorsements, and several professional/continuing education and enrichment noncredit programs. For more information about the programs available at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities (UMTC), visit the website at **www.catalogs.umn.edu** or contact the appropriate prospective student office (see page 51).

Several undergraduate, as well as some graduate, degrees and programs of the UMTC can be completed entirely or almost entirely through a combination of evening and Online and Distance Learning (ODL) courses. In addition, a significant number of courses that fulfill requirements for many University programs are available evenings and through ODL. Visit **www.cce.umn.edu/odl** for more information.

Registration and Admission

The term **registration** refers to signing up for a class. Anyone who is not admitted to a school or college at the UMTC can register for a course through the College of Continuing Education (CCE) as a "non-admitted" (i.e., "non-degree-seeking") student.

The term **admission** refers to formally applying to, and being accepted to, a degree or certificate program at the UMTC. Admission involves submitting an application, application fee, and official transcripts, and meeting the program's admission criteria. **If you want a degree or credit certificate, you must be admitted.** Every program has its own admission criteria. Contact the prospective student services office for your program(s) of interest for additional information (see page 51). It is to your advantage to get admitted to the program as soon as possible. For degree admission information, visit **www.umn.edu/twincities** and click on "Admissions."

What to Ask Before You Apply

The advising staff of your school or college can help you find out how previous credits might transfer and decide which courses to take while you are waiting to be admitted.

They can also answer the following questions about admission:

- What are the admission criteria?
- What is the minimum GPA required?
- Is there a minimum number of credits that must be completed before I can be admitted?
- Are there any specific courses that must be completed before I can be admitted?
- How do I apply?
- What documentation is required (e.g., test scores, transcripts)?
- What are the deadlines?
- What is the application fee?

Undergraduate Degree Admission

Generally, credits from regionally accredited two- or fouryear colleges are accepted at the UMTC provided that the courses are similar in level and content to courses offered on the Twin Cities campus. Students who have had university or college work at institutions other than the UMTC and want to know how their previous credits would transfer to this campus should consult uSelect (www.transfer.org/uselect). Students interested in being admitted to an undergraduate degree program at the UMTC must follow certain procedures and meet specific requirements. When you are admitted, your credits are formally transferred and evaluated. You also will be assigned to an advising office.

Prospective CCE Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.Sc.) Degree Students

The Bachelor of Applied Science is an advanced standing degree, with a minimum pre-major admission requirement of 30 transferable semester credits. For each major, these credits must include a specific set of prerequisite and general education courses, either completed or in progress. If you have taken college level classes at the University or elsewhere, you should consult the transfer guide on the CCE website for your chosen major to see which classes will apply to the B.A.Sc. Where the University's lower division transfer guide does not specify a general education course in a given category, such as Arts/Humanities, you may select from courses in that category listed in the

University's Liberal Education Requirements. Click on the "Liberal education requirements" link in the Degree planning section of **www.onestop.umn.edu**. If you are currently enrolled in another college, your adviser can help you determine which courses to take. For more information, visit **www.cce.umn.edu/Programs-and-Courses/ Degrees**, send an e-mail to *cceinfo@umn.edu*, or call the CCE Information Center at 612-624-4000.

Prospective Students Interested in All Other Undergraduate Degrees

All freshmen (students who have completed fewer than 26 semester credits) and all transfer students (students who have completed more than 26 semester credits) interested in the College of Education and Human Development, the College of Food, Agricultural and Natural Resource Sciences, and the College of Liberal Arts should contact the Office of Admissions (see page 51). All others should contact their prospective school or college directly (see page 51).

All Students

If you want to take courses while waiting to be admitted, contact the appropriate prospective student office for information about what to take before you are admitted.

In addition, the following guidelines may help:

- If you have no previous college credits, start fulfilling the common Liberal Education (LE) and writing requirements, required by all undergraduate degrees, as well as the major prerequisites if you wish to apply for a B.A.Sc. degree. See the course list online at www.onestop.umn.edu in the Degree planning section (Click on the "Liberal education requirements" link.) and/or see page 44.
- If you already have earned some college credits, find out how previous credits transfer toward the common Liberal Education (LE) and writing requirements by using the transfer guides found at www.admissions .tc.umn.edu/cle.
- If you have taken courses from another college or university, you can find out how your credits will transfer using uSelect. This free, web-based system provides accurate, up-to-date information about how your courses will transfer and apply to a degree program at UMTC. You'll find access to course descriptions, academic program information, course equivalency guides, planning guides, and student services.

 If you have completed the LE requirements or the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum, contact the appropriate prospective student office for more information (see page 51).

Graduate and Professional Degree Admission

For more information on graduate level degrees, contact both the Graduate School (see **www.grad.umn.edu**) and the department(s) or program(s) in which you are interested.

If you want to take courses while waiting to be admitted, contact the specific department(s) to find out if that department allows non-admitted students to take courses that later can be transferred to the program, and ask for course recommendations. If they do allow non-admitted students to take graduate level coursework, ask a qualified department staff member to sign the Registration Request for Graduate Credit (available at www.onestop.umn.edu /forms) and see page 29.

CCE Credit Degree ProgramsApplied Science Degrees and Certificates

Developed in partnership with business and industry, taught by professionals with real-world experience, and convenient for working adults, the disciplines below focus on professional growth in specializations tied to key economic drivers. Classes are offered in the late afternoons, evenings, and online.

Construction Management, IT Infrastructure, and Manufacturing Operations Management credential options include a major (a Bachelor of Applied Science, the B.A.Sc.), a baccalaureate minor, or an academic certificate.

Two other disciplines, Applied Business and Health Systems Management (HSM), play a significant complementary role in the Applied Science curricula, providing essential business knowledge and competencies for each major. An Applied Business Certificate with four unique emphasis options targets the professional needs of specific audiences (see page 16, or visit www.cce.umn.edu /abus). Self-selected Applied Business and HSM courses also serve students in Individualized Degrees and majors from other colleges, as well as working adults interested in improving their business acumen. Applied Business and HSM courses are offered entirely online.

Prospective Applied Science certificate students are encouraged to meet with an academic adviser to select an appropriate course of study. Though a credential is often the best choice, even one or two credit-bearing

Applied Science classes can offer significant professional advancement.

Financial aid and WIA (Workforce Investment Act) funding are available for qualified students for all the majors.

Construction Management

This career area with its centerpiece B.A.Sc. major provides a knowledge base of structure design and engineering concepts combined with management and business principles to prepare students for professional management careers in four high-demand areas of the construction industry: commercial, residential, highway/heavy, and facility management.

An 18-credit minor in Construction Management or Facility Management is available to students in an undergraduate degree program at the University of Minnesota. For more information on the degree or minor, visit **www.cce.umn.edu/cm**.

Career professionals may acquire focused yet in-depth knowledge with an 18-credit Construction Management or Facility Management Certificate. For more information, go to www.cce.umn.edu/Construction-Management-Certificate, www.cce.umn.edu/Facility-Management-Certificate, or see page 16.

In addition, anyone seeking career enhancement in the construction field can pursue this goal with individual construction management courses.

Information Technology Infrastructure

This course of study prepares students for high-demand careers in corporate computer system technologies. Students build a foundation in information technology infrastructure theory and practice, complemented by real-world understanding of business needs, systems, and processes. In the B.A.Sc. major, concentrated study of network administration, system administration, or data administration enhances the program's core IT knowledge. Career professionals may acquire focused yet in-depth IT competencies with a 16 minimum credit IT Infrastructure Certificate. For more information, go to **www.cce.umn**.edu/IT-Infrastructure-Certificate, or see page 17.

In addition, anyone seeking career enhancement in the IT field can pursue this goal with individual ITI courses.

Manufacturing Operations Management

This major provides a B.A.Sc. in manufacturing processes and systems, as well as business and communications skills. Students acquire the knowledge, abilities, and global perspective needed to advance to higher-level technical, supervisory, and leadership positions in high-growth manufacturing industries.

A 16-credit minor is available to students pursuing an undergraduate degree at the University of Minnesota. For more information on the degree or minor, visit **www.cce.umn.edu/mm**.

Career professionals may acquire focused yet in-depth knowledge with a 16-credit Manufacturing Operations Management Certificate. Visit **www.cce.umn.edu/Manufacturing-Operations-Management** for more information.

In addition, anyone seeking career enhancement in the manufacturing field can pursue this goal with individual MM courses.

Undergraduate Self-Designed Degrees (BA and BS)

Combine related and/or unrelated areas of interest to create the major that fits your specific educational and career interests. These degrees include the University's Liberal Education Requirements (see page 44).

Inter-College Program (ICP)

This self-designed, cross-college program empowers you to design a major that will uniquely match your interests and goals. The highly flexible ICP degree allows you to design a two-area, three-area, or interdisciplinary thematic program.

Multidisciplinary Studies (MdS)

For returning adult learners who want to complete a baccalaureate degree, the Multidisciplinary Studies degree allows students to design their own program from among late-afternoon, evening, and Online and Distance Learning (ODL) coursework. Prospective students must have already completed 50 semester credits of university-level coursework and have had an interruption in their college career of at least two years.

Master's Degrees

Master of Biological Sciences (MBS)

Designed for working adults interested in expanding their base of knowledge in one or more areas of the biological sciences and to add to their professional credentials. You may focus on a single subspecialty suited to your professional needs, enabling you to learn new job skills, change professional emphasis, or provide added value to your present job. The program can be completed day or evenings, via courses and directed studies. GRE scores are **not** required.

Master of Liberal Studies (MLS)

The MLS program is interdisciplinary, enabling you to select and examine significant topics of your choosing from a variety of perspectives across academic areas. (See also the related credit certificate in Innovation Studies on page 17.) Coursework can be completed on evenings, Saturdays, and online. GRE scores are **not** required.

Master of Professional Studies in Arts and Cultural Leadership (MPS-ACL)

How Credits Transfer

Up to 40 percent of credits completed at other accredited institutions prior to admission may be transferred into a certificate program if they are relevant to the program. The remainder of the required credits must be completed at the U of M. Credit transfers are completed on a case-by-case basis at the time of admission. Credits transferred to a graduate program must be approved by a graduate faculty adviser.

How to Apply for Admission

Official application forms are available online in pdf format on the Admission and Registration pages of each certificate. Students are expected to complete an application form and officially apply to the program. Admission into a certificate program is not required to register for the first class.

Workforce Investment Act (WIA) funding is available for qualified students for many of the certificates.

Please note: Information in this section of the catalog applies specifically to Online and Distance Learning (ODL), a part of the College of Continuing Education (CCE), and supplements the information and policies given throughout this publication that apply to ODL and to all CCE offerings.

Overview

Online and Distance Learning (ODL) meets the needs of students who cannot or choose not to take campus classroom courses. The University's Class Schedules (on the One Stop website) indicate whether a course is printed (correspondence course) or online. Many courses are self-paced and give you an extended term of nine months to complete the coursework. These courses allow you the flexibility to work at your own pace, but you won't have class meetings or due dates to keep you on track. Term-based courses run on the regular semester calendar.

To see if ODL is a good fit for you, visit **www.cce.umn.edu /odl** and talk with your adviser. Generally, we recommend that you register in only one ODL course at a time.

Credits are recorded on your transcript and can be used toward fulfilling distribution requirements in most undergraduate programs. ODL courses can also satisfy residency requirements, with approval from your college. Check with your adviser about using ODL course credits toward your program.

There are no entrance or admission requirements to register for ODL courses, although specific courses or programs may require prerequisite study or experience. Prerequisites are noted in the online Class Schedule (under Quick Links) at www.onestop.umn.edu.

Term Lengths

Courses are either extended term (to be completed in up to nine months) or term based (to be completed within one semester term). If you are receiving financial aid administered by the Office of Student Finance (OSF), the difference is very important. Most kinds of OSF aid do not apply to extended-term courses.

Term-Based (Semester) Courses: These online courses (section A) are not self-paced; there are weekly due dates for assignments and activities. You will have one semester to complete coursework. There are no restrictions for financial aid with term-based courses.

Extended-Term (Nine Month) Courses: These online and printed courses (sections B, C, D, or E) are self-paced. You do the coursework individually, not as part of a student group. Year-round registration periods are timed so that one section is open per month. When a section closes at the end of the month, there is no late registration available—simply register for the next month's section. Extended-term courses and credits only count toward the term during which the course begins (e.g., spring 2014). Your course grade is posted to your transcript after you complete all coursework.

You pace the work yourself. Expect to spend three months (minimum) to complete an extended-term course, with a nine-month maximum time limit. Instructors are allowed two to three weeks to return your assignments with grades and feedback.

Financial Aid

Term-Based Courses (class section A): No restrictions for financial aid.

Extended-Term Courses (class sections B, C, D, E):

Financial aid programs administered by the U of M Office of Student Finance (OSF) **do not** apply to these courses, with two exceptions. If you are eligible for a Minnesota State Grant or the Minnesota GI Bill, OSF will count all ODL courses you are enrolled in by the end of the second week of the semester—both extended-term and termbased courses. If you have financial aid from another source, contact the sponsor to find out if your aid will cover courses that allow up to nine months to finish.

Canceled or Discontinued Courses

Sometimes ODL has to stop accepting registrations in a course because supplies, books, or an instructor may no longer be available. If you submit a Registration and Cancel/Add Form for a course that has been discontinued, your form will be returned or, if you specified a second choice, you will be registered in another course.

Registration Dates

Please follow the registration dates listed. Registration periods for extended-term courses (sections B, C, D, and E) are timed so that one section is open per month. When a section closes at the end of the month, there is no late registration available—simply register for the next month's section.

Note: January 20 is the last day to register in section A without incurring a late registration fee. Registrations occurring after January 24 require instructor permission. See page 3 for complete information on late registration fees.

Tuition and Fees

See page 31 for tuition and University-wide fee information. Credits for ODL courses qualify for any tuition caps that may be available in undergraduate, professional, or graduate tuition plans for resident students.

There is an ODL course fee based on the number of credits per semester, in addition to tuition and other fees.

ODL courses qualify as replacement courses when canceling/adding only if the course added is an ODL course offered during the same term and session (a fall section A is exchanged for a fall section A; a fall section B for a fall section B; and so on). See page 30 for complete change of registration information.

Changes in Registration

You cannot cancel an ODL course simply by not submitting assignments. Cancellations must be official (submitted on the Web, in person, or by mail/fax). Cancellations must be in writing if processed in person or by mail/fax. Mailed or faxed cancellations will be effective the date of the postmark.

Term-Based (Semester) Courses: These (section A) courses follow the cancel/add and refund schedules on page 30. Grading options (A—F or S/N) may not be changed after the second week of the semester.

Extended-Term (Nine Month) Courses: If you cancel your extended-term course (sections B, C, D, or E) within six weeks of the start date of the term, the course will not appear on your academic record. Six weeks is also the deadline to change your grading option (A–F or S/N). See the chart of cancellation/refund schedules on page 30. If you request a cancellation more than four months after the start of the term, you must obtain approval from the scholastic committee in your University of Minnesota college.

Course Materials

A day after you register, ODL emails information about your course, such as how to look up what textbooks are required, how to activate your U of M email/Internet account, and how to contact the instructor.

Printed (correspondence) courses: ODL mails a printed study guide that you will use to complete the course.

Online courses: Your email welcome message explains how to access and begin working on your course. (If you are a non-admitted student, this information will also be postal mailed to you.)

Textbooks: A list of books required for ODL courses is available online. Check your email welcome message for access details. See the University Bookstores website (**www.bookstores.umn.edu**) for ordering information. If you go to the bookstore in person, use the ODL area of the textbooks department, not the regular textbook shelves. If you order by phone or e-mail, specify ODL textbooks.

Library Services for Distance Learners: The University Libraries offer a number of services and resources that you can use without ever coming to campus. These include computer, phone, and mail-accessed reference services, help getting started on your research, and delivery of books and articles to your home or your computer.

To begin exploring the University Libraries' online resources, go to **www.lib.umn.edu**. Note that access to assigned readings at the libraries' course reserves sites requires logging in with your University of Minnesota X500 ID and password.

How ODL Works

Pacing Yourself in Extended-Term Courses: Expect to spend at least three months to finish a course. As you progress, you should consider any comments from your instructor—in order to recognize your strengths and weaknesses—before you submit more assignments for the course. Typically, you may submit a maximum of two assignments, exams, or papers per week. Your instructor will explain if there is a stricter limit for your course.

Allow about three weeks between the time you send an assignment to ODL and the time it is returned to you. Contact your instructor about any work that is not returned to you by three weeks from the date you turned it in.

Contacting Your Instructor: When you register for a course, ODL sends you a welcome e-mail message that includes the instructor's name and contact information.

Assignments: Be sure to save a copy of each assignment you submit. Assignments are rarely lost, but it can happen.

Sending Assignments Electronically: If your course is online you will find instructions at the course website. If you are taking a printed course, check with your instructor to find out if e-mail is an option. If you send assignments by e-mail, clearly identify your work in the subject line, such as *Phil 1001, submission #4*.

Sending Assignments as Hard Copy: If your course is by correspondence (printed), ODL will send you preprinted submission forms and address labels. Please fill in and staple a form to the front of each assignment and use a label to send it to the ODL office. ODL will use the form to route the work to your instructor, and then use the same form to return the assignment to you after your work is graded. Your assignment may be delayed if you forget the form, write a wrong address for yourself, or use insufficient postage.

Proctored Exams: Many ODL courses include supervised, in-person exams. Your course will include instructions about how to take exams. *You must submit all assignments that precede an exam before you may take that exam.* Be sure to bring a submission form and picture ID when you take the exam.

There is no charge for taking exams at the College of Continuing Education Office. You may be charged a fee at other institutions or campus locations. Any exam fees are the student's responsibility.

You may take proctored exams at the following offices or under the supervision of the following individuals:

- If you live in the Twin Cities area, you are encouraged to take your exams at the College of Continuing Education, 20 Ruttan Hall, 1994 Buford Avenue, St. Paul, MN. Seating is limited.
- Self-schedule appointments online for our St. Paul office by going to z.umn.edu/ccetesting. You may also call 612-624-4000 or 800-234-6564. For complete information, visit z.umn.edu/odlexams.

You must call 612-624-4000 or 1-800-234-6564 at least two days in advance and make an appointment to take an exam.

- Other campus offices can arrange for a proctored exam by appointment only. Crookston (218-281-8554 or 218-281-8557 in fall and spring, 218-281-8681 in summer); Duluth, for U of M students taking U of M course exams (218-726-6130); students taking exams from other institutions (218-726-8966); Morris (320-589-6060 or 1-800-842-0030); Rochester (507-258-8022 or 1-800-947-0117).
- The Independent Study/Distance Learning department of any member institution of the University Professional and Continuing Education Association (UPCEA).
- Any test center member of the National College Testing Association. Search for an NCTA test center at www.ncta-testing.org/cctc/find.php.
- A school superintendent, principal, or counselor; a faculty member (excluding teaching assistants) or administrator of an accredited university or college.
- For military students, a commissioned officer whose rank is higher than your own or a non-commissioned officer E-8 or above. Provide proctor's rank, title, and unit.
- A corporate education director or human resources officer.

ODL reserves the right to reject any proctor. Regardless of academic qualifications, no relative, work supervisor, or immediate employer may proctor an exam. You need to make arrangements with the office or individual who will proctor your exam before you send the Request for Exam form to the ODL office. ODL mails exams directly to the proctor's business location.

After Your Exams: Graded exams are not returned to the student; you will only receive the submission form with your exam score. The graded exam is kept on file for 9 months. To review a graded exam at the office, call the College of Continuing Education Information Center and make an appointment at least one day in advance (612-624-4000 or 612-234-6564). If you live outside the Minneapolis-St. Paul area, contact the same number to discuss arrangements to review your exam at a new appointment with your exam proctor. Please allow 1–2 weeks for this off-campus option.

Incompletes: If you do not finish your course on time you may ask your instructor for an extension and a temporary grade of Incomplete (I). Incompletes require establishing a new deadline that you and your instructor agree to in writing. Your instructor is **not** required to grant an incomplete. You can increase your chances of approval by finishing at least half of the coursework by your original deadline, and by thinking ahead and making your request in advance of your term end date. If you have done little or no work on the course by your deadline, your chances for approval are slim. If your instructor does not agree to an extension, you will receive an F or an N for the course; you will only be able to earn credit in the course by reregistering for a new section and completing the course.

Reregistration: If you did not complete an ODL course (because, for example, your term expired and you received a grade of F or N), and you would like to take the same course again, you must reregister in the current version of the course. To reregister, you must fill out a Registration and Cancel/Add Form, pay the newest tuition rates, buy the current required texts and supplies, and complete all the assignments and exams in the newest version of the course. Your original registration and grade will remain on your record. You are only allowed to repeat a course one time. High School Students

High school students are eligible to take ODL college courses, and Minnesota high school students may be eligible to take college courses using the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) program.

Under PSEO, eligible Minnesota high school juniors and seniors can take college courses and earn high school units and, concurrently, college credits for the courses they successfully complete. The Minnesota State Department of Education pays for tuition, fees, and textbooks for the courses.

High school students interested in taking ODL courses under the PSEO program must be formally admitted to the University's PSEO program and submit all registration materials to the Advanced High School Student Services office.

When to Register

Registration for admitted students begins November 12, 2013; registration for non-admitted students begins December 6, 2013. Registration is possible on and after the first day of the term, but you will be assessed a late fee, and you may need the instructor's permission to register (see this page).

Exceeding maximum credit limits: To exceed maximum credit limits (maximum 20 credits per term for undergraduates, 18 credits per term for graduate students), contact your college for scholastic committee approval.

Independent study (IND): To study a regular course or subject on your own, you will need instructor and department approval. A class number and a permission number will be provided by the department if approval is granted. (See also page 41.)

Late initial registration: If your initial registration is January 21, 2014, or later for semester and first seven-week courses, or March 24, 2014, or later for second seven-week courses, you must pay a late initial registration fee and may need permission to register (see page 3). Register early to avoid late fees.

Overlapping course times: Registration in courses that overlap in times or have less than one minute separation is not recommended, but if you choose to do so, you must obtain a Class Time Conflict Approval form from a One Stop Student Services Center (see page 53) or online at **www.onestop.umn.edu/forms**. Prerequisite or requisite missing: Permission may be needed from the department or instructor.

Attend the first class meeting:

You must attend the first class meeting of every course in which you are registered, or you may lose your place in class. If you cannot attend, you must obtain your instructor's approval before the first meeting. Instructors have the right to deny admission; you must officially cancel any course in which you are denied admission.

Special Registration Instructions

Carlson School of Management Courses

During the alphabetical registration process, access to many major courses are restricted to students admitted to the Carlson School.

If you are not admitted to Carlson or another major requiring specific business courses, you may be able to obtain permission to register for an open section after the alphabetical queue (beginning December 6). Call the Undergraduate Program Office at 612-624-3313 or go to room 2-190 Hanson Hall to obtain the required permission to register.

Note: Upper-division Carlson courses are taught with the assumption that students have completed the following courses or their equivalent: Acct 2050, Econ 1101, Econ 1102, Math 1142 or 1271, and OMS 2550 or equivalent statistics courses.

Non-admitted or visiting students are not permitted to register for MBA courses. Only students currently admitted to and currently registered in an approved U of M Graduate program may petition for MBA coursework. This includes some 5xxx–6xxx courses under the following subjects: ACCT, BLAW, ENTR, FINA, IDSC, MBA, MCOM, MGMT, MKTG, and SCO.

Senior Citizen Education Option

Eligibility: If you are 62 or older before the start of the term for which you are registering and a Minnesota resident you are eligible for the Senior Citizen Education

Program (SCEP). You are also eligible if you are 60 years old and receiving a railroad retirement annuity.

At your initial registration for classes, you will need to provide identification to verify your age, Minnesota residency, and (if applicable) railroad retirement annuity.

Program Fees: If you are eligible for SCEP, you may audit courses free of charge or take courses for credit at \$10 per credit. Most senior citizens attend as non-degree students. However, if you are admitted to a degree program, you are still eligible for SCEP. You are not eligible to pay the student services fee, but you must pay any required laboratory or materials fees.

Registration: For regular, term-based classes, please attend the first day of class to see if space is available and to receive information about class procedures.

You may register on or after the registration date for nondegree students for the term, and you can register through the first two weeks of the term without penalty. Distance Learning classes have separate registration dates that are different from regular term classes.

To sign up for a class, go to a One Stop Student Services Center with your registration and cancel/add request. You may also mail or fax your completed form to the address or fax number provided on the form. If the class is open, you will be able to sign up without any instructor or department permission during the first week of class.

If the class is closed (i.e., full) you will need a permission number from the instructor or department offering the class. Some classes have restrictions on who is allowed to take the class. In these cases, you will need a permission number from the instructor or department.

The online Section Status Reports can tell you if a course is open or closed. For more information, call One Stop Student Services at 612-624-1111.

Refunds: You can receive a 100% refund if you cancel a class during the first three weeks of the term. After the first three weeks of the term, no refunds are issued.

High School Students

University courses are demanding and quick-paced; students must be well prepared academically and possess the time and individual discipline to succeed.

The Post-Secondary Enrollment Option (PSEO) program, administered through the Advanced High School Student Service (AHS3) Office, allows qualified high school juniors and seniors from Minnesota to attend college tuition-free, and the College in the Schools program allows students to take college-level courses through their local high school.

Graduate Credit for Non-Admitted Students

You will receive a notice in the mail confirming your registration. Departmental authorized signature is required for each course you are requesting graduate-level credit for. You will be billed at a graduate level or professional school tuition rate for all courses (both graduate and undergraduate) you take for the term. How to Change Your Credit Registration and Obtain Refunds

Cancel/Add Policies: All changes must be done officially (online, in person at a One Stop Student Services center, or by mail or fax) and are effective on the date received, not the day you stopped attending class. You are responsible for applicable tuition and fees up to the date your cancellation is received. Do not stop payment of a check to cancel your registration. Stopping payment does not constitute cancellation. A check-handling fee of \$20 will be charged for any stop-payment order.

Full tuition is charged on a per-credit basis for changes that increase your credit load. No additional tuition is charged when a course addition is balanced by a course cancellation processed at the same time and equal to the number of credits being added. Refunds are issued on a per-credit basis depending on the date of cancellation (see table on next page).

Students receiving financial aid through the Office of Student Finance (OSF) should check with a One Stop Student Services counselor before canceling, as changes in credit load may affect eligibility. Changes Requiring Approval: Requests for registration changes requiring approval from your college's scholastic committee are granted only in cases of extenuating circumstances, usually beyond the student's control. Late registration requests for past terms are not allowed. Late grade-base changes are rarely approved. If you register for fewer than 13 credits you will still be charged the flat rate unless you have been approved for a reduced credit load. Student Classification

Pay the undergraduate rate and receive undergraduate credit if you are not registered as a graduate or professional degree student.

Pay a graduate or professional degree rate if:

- You are officially admitted to a graduate or professional degree program at any University of Minnesota campus; or
- You are a non-admitted, visiting student in a masters or Ph.D. program or a professional degree program or have permission to receive graduate credit (see this page); or
- You are admitted to a College of Continuing Education (CCE) post-baccalaureate certificate program.

Residency

Pay the resident rate if:

- You have maintained a permanent home in Minnesota for at least one calendar year for purposes other than obtaining an education and have been classified as a Minnesota resident by the University of Minnesota; or
- You are enrolling as a CCE student, non-degree status; or
- You are admitted solely to a CCE credit certificate program; or
- You hold a qualifying appointment as a graduate assistant.

Pay the nonresident rate if:

- None of the previous residency criteria applies; or
- You are not a resident of Minnesota; or
- You have been classified by the University as a nonresident, non-reciprocity student. If you previously applied to the University for a degree program and were classified as a nonresident, that classification continues in CCE non-degree programs.

Distance Learning Courses

All on-campus, admitted students will be charged the same tuition for all courses, whether traditional classroom courses or distance learning courses. Resident students or students with residency status because of reciprocity or a tuition waiver will pay resident tuition for all courses.

On-campus, admitted students who are classified as non-residents will be charged non-resident tuition for all courses, including online and distance learning courses. Resident tuition rates will continue to be assessed for distance education courses for students who are truly off campus (living in Texas or California, for example).

Tuition Reciprocity

The University has reciprocity agreements with Wisconsin, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Manitoba. Go to www.onestop.umn.edu/finances/costs_and_tuition/tuition_and_fees/reciprocity/index.html for the specific rates applicable to participating states.

Reciprocity Procedures

You must apply for reciprocity prior to the term in which you wish your reciprocity to begin. As soon as you receive an approval letter from your home state, take that letter to the Residency Office in the Office of Admissions, 240 Williamson Hall; they will adjust your records to reflect the reciprocity arrangement. After your first year, provided you have earned credits, your reciprocity will automatically be renewed.

Delays in your reciprocity eligibility do not exempt you from billing charges or late payment fees.

Fees

Senior Citizen Education Program Fees

If you are 62 or older and a Minnesota resident, or if you are 60 years old and receiving a railroad retirement annuity, you are eligible for the Senior Citizen Education Program (SCEP). Through SCEP, you may register on a space-available basis for credit courses for only \$10 per credit or audit courses free of charge. Course fees and special fees, if any, must be paid. These students do not pay the Student Services Fee.

General Fees

University-Sponsored Student Health Benefit Plan

All students who are 1) admitted to a degree program and 2) registered for six or more credits per semester that count toward the automatic assessment of the Student Services Fee are required by the University of Minnesota to have health plan coverage.

Non-degree seeking, certificate-seeking, distance learning, EMBA, PTMBA, Executive MBA (CEMBA), and most students are not eligible to enroll in the University-sponsored Student Health Benefit Plan and are not subject to this requirement.

Eligible students who do not appropriately waive the Student Health Benefit Plan per established guidelines before the deadline, will be automatically enrolled in and billed for the University-sponsored Student Health Benefit Plan.

Note: Academic Health Center (AHC) and international students and scholars have separate health plan requirements.

Billing and Payment

Student Accounts

Every University of Minnesota student has a student account reflecting charges and credits for tuition and fees for day, evening, and Online and Distance Learning (ODL) credit courses, housing, and other University charges, including any previously unpaid balances. Each time you register or cancel/add courses, your account is adjusted. To view your student account online, go to www.onestop.umn.edu and click on "Student account" under Quick Links. (You will need your University Internet ID and password to access your account.) Print out and save all registration and billing statements.

Note: If you intend to claim education tax credits on your federal income tax returns, your billing and account information is an important reference. More information about these tax credits is available online at **www.onestop.umn.edu**; click on "Education Tax Benefits."

Further information, including annual billing schedules and procedures, is available at **www.onestop.umn.edu**/finances/pay/where_when_how. If you have questions regarding your account, call or visit a One Stop Student Services Center (see page 53).

Online Billing Statements

Online billing is the official means of generating tuition bills to all University of Minnesota students. The online billing and payment system will automatically send an e-mail notification to each student's University e-mail address when a bill is ready to be viewed online. Students need their University Internet ID and password to log in and to view and make an online payment. For more information, go to www.onestop.umn.edu/finances/pay/where_when_how/pay_online.html or contact One Stop Student Services at 612-624-1111.

Online billing statements list the statement balance, current balance, and a minimum payment due.

Admitted students. If you are officially admitted to a U of M degree or certificate program, you may pay in three installments during the fall and spring terms by paying at least the minimum amount due by the due date. No installment plan is available in the summer. There is a \$35 installment fee per semester for paying by the installment plan. If you pay less than the full balance on the bill, you will be assessed the \$35 per semester installment fee on your next statement. Any time you pay less than the minimum amount by the due date listed on your billing statement, you will be charged a \$30 late payment fee in addition to the \$35 installment fee, if applicable, and a hold will be placed on your record. Payments must be received by the due date to be considered on time.

Installment payments may be made only for current charges. Balances from previous terms are due in full. All payments will be applied to the oldest charge on your account. You will continue to be billed late payment and installment fees if your balance due continues to remain unpaid.

Note: Paying more than the minimum payment due on your statements or paying before you receive your statements does not reduce the percentage required on your next billing statement—you will still be required to pay the standard percentage of the balance.

Non-admitted students. Non-degree students (including adult special/graduate or professional students filling out the Registration Request for Graduate Credit--Non-Degree

Students form) are required to pay all tuition and fees by the University's first payment date for the current term. If you are a non-degree student who does not pay, you will be canceled from your class(s) for the current term after the University's first payment due date. If you are canceled from a class(s) for nonpayment, you must contact a One Stop Student Services Center to re-register. Look here for registration information for non-degree students.

Tuition Holds

A hold may be placed on your record for financial indebtedness to the University. After your payment due date, you must pay the current amount due on your account to release a hold. If, in order to register, you pay a Student Finance hold for a previous term and that check or electronic payment does not clear the bank, you will be sent a notice by Student Account Assistance. The fee for returned payments is \$20 per item. Your current registration may be canceled if you fail to respond to this notice or pay your debt.

Note: If you pay a hold by personal check, it will be two weeks before you can obtain a transcript or diploma. For an immediate transcript or diploma release, pay with cash or cashier's check.

Collection Procedures and Costs: Past due accounts may be subject to late fees and collection procedures. Collection can include cancellation of classes, court action, or referral to outside collection agencies. You are responsible for any and all costs or fees incurred by the University to collect your balance.

Payment Schedule, Spring Semester 2014

Non-Admitted (Non-Degree-Seeking) Students

Payment in full for tuition and fees is required by the first billing due date of the term, February 19. Non-degree students are not eligible for the installment plan.

Credit card payment is available only as an online service. The University will not accept credit card payments through the mail or over the phone.

Billing Errors

If you suspect there is an error in your bill, contact the department that placed the charge and notify One Stop Student Services when a charge is in dispute. You must pay all undisputed charges by the due date.

Privacy Release

In compliance with the federal Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 and University of Minnesota Regents policy, information about your student financial account cannot be released to a third party (including your parents, spouse, or sponsors) without your permission. The most convenient way to grant other individuals access to one or more parts of your student educational records is online, through Parent/Guest Access (for more information, visit **www.onestop.umn.edu**). You may also complete a Student Information Release Authorization form, available at Forms Online (follow the Quick Link at **www.onestop.umn.edu**), or at any One Stop Student Services location.

When to Pay

Non-admitted Students

Non-admitted students are required to pay tuition and fees in full by the first billing due date of the term, February 19. Payments must be received, not postmarked, by that date. If payment is not received by February 19, your registration will be canceled. You can check your student account at **www.onestop.umn.edu** for your tuition and fees. If your only registration is in an ODL extended-term course (sections B, C, D, or E), later due dates may apply. (See page 21.)

Admitted Students

For registrations received through January 25, the first payment is due by February 19. Students whose registrations occur after the first billing date are billed in the next billing cycle (February 22) and have a March 19 due date. Initial registrations that occur after January 20 are subject to late registration fees.

How to Pay

Payments on your student account may be made online, by mail, or drop box.

Online Billing and Payment Services

The quickest way to make your payment is to pay online.

You or an authorized payer (e.g., parent, spouse) may choose to make direct payments from a bank checking or savings account or charge your payment to a credit card. Payments made online with an e-check from your

checking or savings account are easy and convenient and are posted to your account the same day. Students can also easily set up authorized payers to make payments on their behalf through Parent/Guest Access.

If you make a credit card payment, you will be required to pay a separate, non-refundable service charge—2.75 percent of the payment amount—at the time of each credit card payment. The service charge, assessed by our credit card vendor will appear as a separate line item on your (or the payer's) credit card statement. All costs for choosing to pay with a credit card must be assumed by the student/authorized payer. The University does not receive, nor will it underwrite, any portion of the service charge.

Credit card payment is available only as an online service. The University will not accept credit card payments through the mail or over the phone. For more information, go to www.onestop.umn.edu/finances /pay/where_when_how/pay_online.html or call One Stop Student Services at 612-624-1111.

Do not send scholarship checks, cash, or overnight deliveries to the P.O. Box address. Please make your check or money order payable to the University of Minnesota. Write your student ID number on your check and include it with the payment portion of your billing statement. If you do not have your billing statement, write your student ID number on your check and indicate that your payment applies to your student account billing. If you are unsure of your balance, you may check your balance online at **www.onestop.umn.edu** and click on "Student Account" under Quick Links or call One Stop Student Services at 612-624-1111.

Please do not mail any other University bills to the P.O. Box address. Mail those payments to the address listed on the bill itself. Please allow sufficient mailing time for your payments to be received by the due date. Payments must be received, not postmarked, by the due date to be considered on time and to avoid additional charges. Do not use campus mail for mailing of payments.

Pay by Drop Box

Before enclosing your billing statement and payment in an envelope, we recommend that you write your University student ID number on the check.

If you do not have your billing statement, be sure that your name appears on the check the same way it appears on your student records. Write your student ID number on the check.

Do not put cash payments in this box. The University of Minnesota is not responsible for cash payments made in this box.

The campus drop box location is in Science Teaching and Student Services—East Bank, third floor, Helping U desk.

If you need assistance with payment options, contact One Stop Student Services.

Tuition and Fees Paid by Various Agencies/ Sponsors

When an organization, not owned by you or a family member, makes a commitment to pay your educational expenses, they are considered a third-party sponsor by the University of Minnesota. When payment is due on your student account, the sponsor is billed by the University. This payment process is termed "third-party billing."

Sponsor's payments are subject to the same federal reporting requirements as other financial aid. Some sponsorships don't require a billing invoice and are administered by the University through One Stop Student Services.

Whether you are a student or a sponsor, you will find answers in the frequently asked questions (FAQ) sections about how the third-party billing processes these payments on the One Stop website.

Financial Aid Recipients

You must complete your registration by January 20 to avoid late registration fees, even if you have not received your financial aid.

Most financial aid payments are credited directly to your student account. A few students will, however, receive financial aid checks.

If the total of all your financial aid awards is less than the amount due on your account, or if your award is less than 100 percent of the amount due, you may make installment payments on the remaining balance. You are not eligible for installment payments if your financial aid awards or check are 100 percent or more of your tuition and fees.

You can view your student account and financial aid information online with the Quick Links "Student Account" and "Financial Aid Status," found at **www.onestop.umn. edu**. If you have questions regarding this account information, call or visit One Stop Student Services (see page 53).

Remember: Even if you do not receive your financial aid, you are still responsible for paying your tuition and fees by the due dates.

If the total of all your financial aid awards exceed the amount due on your account, the credit balance amount will be sent via mail or direct deposit. **Direct deposit** is the easiest way to get your excess financial aid funds. To sign up for direct deposit online, go to **www.onestop**.umn.edu and click on "Direct Deposit" under Quick Links, or go to Forms Online at www.onestop.umn.edu/forms, where you can download a Direct Deposit Authorization for Student Account Refunds form. Contact One Stop Student Services for more information.

Refunds

All refunds for tuition and fees are issued on a per-credit basis according to the refund rate that applies to the effective cancellation date. Cancellations are effective the day you officially cancel—not on the day you stop attending classes. Cancel immediately at a One Stop Student Services center (see page 53). To receive a refund, cancel within the time periods outlined in the refund schedule (see page 30).

Note: Undergraduates do not receive a refund when they drop below 13 credits unless they have been approved for a reduced credit load.

In a limited number of circumstances (e.g., active military duty), retroactive cancellation may be possible. If authorized, you also may be entitled to a tuition refund.

General Information-Tuition and Fees

Fee Refund Policies

Student Services Fee and University-Sponsored Hospitalization Insurance Fee: If you drop your credit load to below 6 credits, you must accept a refund of the University-sponsored hospitalization insurance. You may keep paying the Student Services Fee if you are taking at least 1 credit and wish to use those services/facilities covered by the fee. All fee refunds are based on the date that the cancellation is processed and are not affected by retroactive cancellation.

If you cancel all courses and qualify for a tuition refund, you must also accept a prorated refund of the Student Services Fee and the University-sponsored health plan coverage.

Special Fees: The orientation fee, the late registration fees, collegiate fees, and the Graduate and Professional Students Assembly (GAPSA), Minnesota Student Association (MSA), Council of College Boards, and Student Emergency Loan Fund (SELF) fees are generally not refunded (the GAPSA, Council of College Boards, and MSA fees are refunded if you qualify for a 100 percent tuition refund). All other special fees assessed at registration are refunded at the same rate as tuition and course fees. There is no refund of special fees after the refund period has ended, even if retroactive cancellation is authorized.

Graduate Assistant Tuition Benefit Program

Graduate and professional students who hold appointments as graduate teaching assistants, research assistants, administrative fellows, and certain other professional school student positions may receive tuition benefits for credit classes. Scholarships and Grants

The University of Minnesota Undergraduate Scholarship Search shows you a list of University scholarships for which you may be eligible to apply. If you have activated your University Internet ID and password, you can log in from the One Stop scholarships page at www.onestop.umn.edu/finances/financial aid/scholarships.

CCE Scholarships and grants are available for students with a CCE connection—part-time or full-time students admitted to a degree or certificate program, non-admitted (currently Non-Degree) students enrolled part-time in courses for undergraduate credit, and students enrolled in noncredit courses. More than 150 students receive CCE scholarships and grants each year. Awards typically range from \$500 to \$2,500 or up to the cost of three credits for admitted graduate students. Requirements vary by program. Awards are made on the basis of academic ability, financial need, and a statement of personal, educational, and career or life goals.

Degree and Certificate Students

Students admitted to a CCE degree program may have a wide range of financial aid options available to them, including federal, state, and institutional grants and scholarships, loans, and work-study. Aid is limited for certificate students.

CCE scholarships and grants are available for both degree and certificate admitted students.

Non-admitted (Non-Degree) and Noncredit Students

Non-degree students enrolled in credit courses and students enrolled in noncredit courses may have a number of financial aid options, including CCE scholarships and grants. Additional information is available online at www.cce.umn.edu/Information-Center/Financial-Aid or from the CCE Information Center

Registration with Financial Aid

Tuition and fees for credit courses are charged to your student account, provided that you do not have registration holds on your record. If your financial aid pays your charges in full, any credit balance remaining in your account will be deposited directly into your bank account, or a check will be mailed. (See page 36 for information on direct deposits). If you do not receive your aid or your aid is not sufficient to pay all of the charges, you are responsible for paying the balance due by the dates specified on your bill. Be sure your payment is received by the due date to avoid late payment and billing charges. See page 35 for information on online billing and payment.

Cancellations: If you receive aid through the Office of Student Finance (OSF), be sure to contact a One Stop counselor about the impact any course cancellations will have on your aid. If you drop below the number of credits on which your aid is based, you may not be able to obtain the aid or may be required to pay back all or part of your award. Cancellation may also affect satisfactory academic progress and could jeopardize future aid.

OSF will not release aid for any credits for which you register after the second week of the term (whether it is an initial registration or an added course or credits) unless you appeal in writing. If you reduce credits between the time you receive aid and the end of the second week, you may need to repay part or all of your aid.

Registration for ODL Courses Using OSF-Administered Financial Aid

Term-Based Courses (online class section A): These courses are automatically counted in your registration for financial aid if you are admitted to a UMTC degree program.

Extended-Term Courses (class sections B, C, D, E):

Financial aid programs administered by OSF do not apply to these courses, with two exceptions: the Minnesota State Grant and the Minnesota GI Bill allow all ODL courses you are enrolled in by the end of the second week of the semester to be counted—both extended-term and term-based. If you have financial aid from another source, contact the sponsor to find out if your aid will cover courses that allow up to nine months for completion.

Enrollment Verification for Full-Time or Half-Time Status

You may need to have your enrollment certified as full time or half time to defer your student loan payment or for other purposes. Each course for which you enroll is tied to a specific term, beginning with the first day of classes in the term and ending with the last day of final exams. The University of Minnesota Academic Calendar on page 2 defines the academic period for which enrollment is verified. Extended-term nine-month Online and Distance Learning courses count only for the term in which you begin your course. You need to enroll for additional credits each term to continue to be certified. Full-time status for undergraduates is defined as 12 or more credits per semester; half-time status is 6–11 credits per semester. Audit enrollments are not applicable for certification purposes.

More information about deferments and other exceptions to the definitions of full-time and half-time status is available at one of the following One Stop Student Services Center locations listed on page 53.

Financial Aid Consortium Agreements

If you receive financial aid from another school (your home institution) and you need to register at the University of Minnesota, contact the financial aid office at your home institution to inquire about a Financial Aid Consortium Agreement. If they are willing to count the University of Minnesota credits toward registration for financial aid, they will give you a consortium agreement form. Academic Level

Address, Current

It is your responsibility to report any address changes. You can verify and correct your address online at **www.onestop.umn.edu** (click on "Personal Information" under Quick Links) or by contacting One Stop Student Services (see page 53 for locations).

Attendance in Classes, Including First Class

Students are expected to attend all meetings of their course. Students may be excused from class for religious observances and approved University activities. Instructors must be notified at the beginning of the term about such planned absences.

You must attend the first class meeting of every course in which you are registered, unless you obtain approval for your absence before the first meeting, to keep your place in class. Instructors have the right to deny admission; students must officially cancel any course in which they are denied admission.

Certification for Full-Time or Half-Time Status

Class Cancellation or Schedule Changes

The University reserves the right to cancel, postpone, limit registration, split or combine classes, and change instructors and/or class locations. Classes with insufficient registration may be canceled; register early to minimize the chances of your course being canceled. If your class is canceled, immediately contact the department offering the class to see if other arrangements have been made. If a course is canceled by the University, your registration in that course is automatically canceled. Changes in course information are posted online at www.onestop.umn.edu/registration.

College or Status Change

If you want to be admitted (e.g., transfer) to a different University of Minnesota campus and/or college, complete the Undergraduate Change of College Form and submit it at one of the One Stop Student Services centers. See www.onestop.umn.edu/degree_planning/changing_college_or_major for deadlines. (See also Discontinued Status, page 41.)

Conduct Code

Students are responsible for complying with the University's Student Conduct Code, available in college student affairs offices and by calling the Office for Student Conduct and Academic Integrity at 612-624-6073. The code is also available online at **www.umn.edu**/oscai. Students who engage in behavior that disrupts the learning environment for others may be subject to disciplinary action. The College of Continuing Education (CCE) also reserves the right to cancel current or future registrations for such students.

Credit by Exam and Other Learning Options College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)

The College Entrance Examination Board's College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) enables individuals who have acquired their education in nontraditional ways to demonstrate their academic achievement. While the University of Minnesota — Twin Cities does not provide CLEP testing, it does accept college credit for three CLEP exams. For details, visit http://admissions.tc.umn.edu/academics/clep.html.

Directed Studies, Directed Research Registration

A wide range of opportunities is available to CCE students to earn college credit for individually designed study or research projects. Students who want credit in Directed Studies or Directed Research should contact a faculty member in their particular area of interest, determine if the department lists specific course numbers and titles for such registration, and obtain faculty and department approval. Registration is then completed in the usual manner with the correct Directed Studies or Directed Research department number.

Extra Credit and Independent Study

Most colleges permit independent study (IND) or extra credit (EXC). Through IND registration, you may complete a course by studying independently under the instructor's guidance without attending class. Through EXC registration, you may earn extra credits (limit of 3) in a course by arranging with the instructor to complete additional work or to explore a subject in more depth. Regular fees, deadlines, and grading policies apply, and you must register only for the number of credits approved by the instructor.

Both types of registration require departmental approval (i.e., a class permission number) and the instructor's signature. When you receive this permission number, you also must obtain a class number with which to register for the course. For further information, contact your college or department office.

Note: Independent study (IND) described above is different from courses available through the Online and Distance Learning (ODL) program. Many U of M courses are available through the ODL program. ODL courses are written for self-study with specific assignments and tests. ODL courses may be taken online or by correspondence and may have accompanying audio or video components. For more information about ODL, see page 20.

Special Examination

Students who (through independent study, experience, or study at a noncollegiate institution) have gained knowledge equivalent to that covered by a particular University course may earn credit for this by passing a special examination on the subject matter covered by the course. Only those students admitted to a University of Minnesota degree program are eligible to receive credit by special examination; those students should contact their college to discuss special exam arrangements. Not all courses are open to credit by examination, and departments may restrict its use in some cases. There is a \$50 per credit fee. For more information, contact CCE.

Credit Load (Full- and Part-Time Status)

Undergraduate students are considered full-time if the sum of the credits they take during the term equals or exceeds 12. Graduate students are considered full-time if the sum of the credits they take during the term equals or exceeds 6 credits. Maximum credit loads exist (maximum 18 masters and Ph.D. program credits, maximum 20 undergraduate credits). Exceptions require approval from your college scholastic committee. For questions related to loan deferment, contact your loan processor; for questions related to financial aid credit requirements, contact One Stop Student Services (see page 53).

Degree-seeking undergraduates pay a flat tuition rate based on a minimum 13-credit load. You are expected to register for at least 13 credits, unless you have been approved for a reduced credit load. For more information about the 13-credit policy, including how to request permission to take fewer than 13 credits, see **www.onestop.umn.edu/registration** and click on the 13-credit policy Quick Link.

While the credit value of most courses is set, a few courses are offered for a variable number of credits, as indicated by the notation "ar cr" (arranged credits) or by an optional notation (e.g., 3–4 cr). In such cases, you may register for the number of credits agreed upon with your instructor.

Discontinued Status

If you want to be discontinued from your campus or college degree program and continue your education as a non-degree-seeking (non-admitted) student in the college of your choice or in CCE, contact your current college office and request to be officially discontinued from your college. Once you have been placed on discontinued status by your current college, you must register with non-degree-seeking status (i.e., as a nonadmitted student). Transferring to non-degree-seeking status has implications for any degree you eventually seek at the University of Minnesota, for financial aid, and for later course registration. If you want to return to the college from which you were discontinued, you must meet with that college's advisers to discuss your educational plans. If you wish to change colleges upon your return. you must complete the Change of College form.

Final Exams

Final exams for evening classes are usually scheduled during the regular meeting time of the last day of class. All make-up policies are at the discretion of the instructor; talk to your instructor well in advance to discuss options if you need to miss an exam.

No extracurricular events requiring student participation may be scheduled from the beginning of study day to the end of finals week. Exceptions to this policy may be granted by the Senate Committee on Educational Policy. The Senate advises all faculty that students who are unable to complete course requirements because of approved events during finals week will be provided an alternative and timely opportunity to do so.

Grades, How to Obtain

The University no longer mails out grade reports, but grades are available online at **www.onestop.umn.edu** under Quick Links. Most instructors will also accept a self-addressed, stamped postcard to be used for returning your grade.

Grading Options

In some cases, students may select their grade base: A-F, S/N, or auditor. A—F means you are taking the course for a letter grade. S/N means you are taking the course on a pass/fail basis (satisfactory/not satisfactory). For undergraduate students on the Twin Cities campus, an "S" or passing grade is equivalent to a "C-" or better; in graduate and professional courses, the instructor determines what constitutes passing. S/N grades are not figured into your grade point average (GPA). Auditor status is for students who want to take the course but receive no credit or grade; consult the instructor before registering as an auditor. Auditors pay the same tuition and fees. Although you do not receive credit for attending the course, the credit value counts in determining your credit total for assessing the Student Services Fee for degreeseeking students. Grading options may be changed; see page 30 for deadlines.

Graduation Application Deadlines

Graduate students must submit their applications by the first working day of the month that they intend to graduate.

Complaints alleging discrimination in the University/ student relationship, including student complaints alleging sexual harassment by University staff or faculty, are handled by the Office of Equal Opportunity and Affirmative Action, 612-624-9547.

Holds

If you have a hold on your record, you may not register or, in many cases, obtain transcripts until that hold is cleared with the office imposing the hold. A hold may be imposed for financial indebtedness to the University or for disciplinary or scholastic reasons. Notice of any hold, including the name of the department or office where it may be cleared, is available online at **www.onestop.umn.edu/registration** under Quick Links.

Immunization Requirements

Minnesota law requires all students born after 1956 have the following immunizations: diphtheria/tetanus, measles, mumps, and rubella. Note: Students who graduated from a Minnesota high school in 1997 or later are considered automatically exempt.

Boynton Health Service provides immunizations. Call 612-625-3222 to schedule an appointment.

Once you have all of your immunizations, you need to complete a Student Immunization Form. You may complete and submit your immunization record online or by using a printable form.

Important: Students who do not submit the form will have a hold placed on their account that will prevent them from registering for classes until the form is submitted.

Students enrolled in Academic Health Center (AHC) programs have unique immunization requirements.

According to OSHA regulations, CDC guidelines, and Academic Health Center policy, all students enrolled in AHC colleges are required to have a health clearance as a condition of enrollment. The AHC form and requirements may be found at **www.bhs.umn.edu/immunization-requirements.htm.**

Incompletes

If you are unable to complete the assignments for your course, your instructor may assign a grade of Incomplete (I). An instructor is not obligated to give you an I. Receiving an Incomplete requires a written agreement between you and the instructor specifying the time and manner in which you will complete course requirements. If work is not completed within one year, the I automatically becomes an F or N for undergraduates. For graduate students, the I remains indefinitely on the transcript until changed by the instructor or department.

Leave of Absence, Undergraduate

Undergraduate students previously admitted to a degree or credit certificate program who do not plan to register for one or more semesters (excluding Summer Term) must complete a Leave of Absence (LOA) form, available online or at your college office, and submit it to their college office.

Canceling a Class: Completing the LOA form does not cancel your registration for a current or future term. Cancel your registration to avoid billing and assigned grades.

Probation or Suspension: Probation or suspension status will override an approved LOA.

Returning from an Approved Undergraduate Leave of Absence: Contact your college. If your leave of absence was for more than one semester, you may need to submit an Application for Readmission form. You will also need to submit transcripts of any coursework taken elsewhere to the Office of Admissions, 240 Williamson Hall. Your college office will determine your eligibility to return, your status in your major or degree program, and the program/degree requirements in effect upon your return.

Returning Without an Approved Undergraduate Leave of Absence: Undergraduates previously admitted to a degree or credit certificate program who have not been granted a formal LOA and who do not register for two semesters (excluding summer term) shall be placed on "inactive" status and may be required to follow new degree requirements.

To return, you must complete an Application for Readmission form and submit it to your college office. Also, submit transcripts of any coursework taken elsewhere to the Office of Admissions, 240 Williamson

Hall. If the LOA is for more than two academic years, (i.e., four semesters), you must follow new program requirements upon return.

Graduation under Quarter Sunset Policy: Under University Senate policy, students following quarter-based degree requirements needed to graduate by the end of spring semester 2007. Students graduating after that will be held to the semester-based degree requirements.

Current students who were following the quarter-based requirements should contact their college advisers to discuss their degree programs. Former students who are planning to return and who were under the quarter-based degree requirements should contact the college advising office for the college to which they are planning to return.

Liberal Education Requirements

The liberal education requirements changed for students admitted to degree programs as of fall 2010. Students admitted to degree programs on the Twin Cities campus before fall 2010 will remain under the Liberal Education requirements for students admitted before fall 2010.

As of fall 2010, the LE requirements consist of a **Diversified Core Curriculum** from which students draw approved courses in Arts and Humanities, Biological Sciences, Historical Perspectives, Literature, Mathematical Thinking, Physical Sciences, and Social Sciences.

Designated Themes of Liberal Education complement the core curriculum with the following themes: Civic Life and Ethics, Diversity and Social Justice, Environment, Global Perspectives, and Technology and Society. Students admitted in fall 2010 or later are required to satisfy four of these five themes. Students can choose which four of the themes to complete. For the Writing-Intensive Requirement, students take four writing-intensive courses and a freshman composition course. Two of the courses need to be at the upper division with one in the student's major.

Minnesota Transfer Curriculum

If you complete the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum at a participating college or university (including another University of Minnesota campus) and then transfer to the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities (UMTC), you have completed the core, theme, and first-year writing portion of the University's liberal education requirements (you may still need to complete the writing intensive portion of the writing skills requirement.) College advising offices have information about this.

Plagiarism

If you submit any other person's work as your own without proper acknowledgment, you are guilty of plagiarism. Plagiarism includes using any concepts, words, sentences, paragraphs, or entire articles or chapters from books, periodicals, or speeches. In these cases, quotation marks and citations must be used. If you have any questions about proper acknowledgment, look in any writing handbook.

Plagiarism also refers to copying another student's assignment or paper and submitting it for grading as if it were your own. If you allow another student to copy your assignment, you are equally guilty of scholastic dishonesty. Plagiarism is a violation of the University's Student Conduct Code and is dealt with by the faculty and/or the Office for Student Conduct and Academic Integrity (See Conduct Code, page 40, and Scholastic Dishonesty, page 45.)

Prerequisites

In order to register in some courses, you either must complete or concurrently register in another course or possess particular qualifications or class standing. These requirements, known as prerequisites, are listed in this catalog inside parentheses after the course titles. Students attempting to register for courses for which the prerequisites have not been met must obtain a class permission number from the instructor, department, and/or college, as indicated.

When courses in sequence are prerequisites, only the last course in the sequence is listed. When no departmental designation precedes the course number (e.g., prereq 3221), the prerequisite is in the same department as the course being offered. Prerequisites reading "6 cr" means 6 credits in courses offered by the same department. A comma means "and." Work equivalent to a prerequisite course (having either the same content or requiring the same component) is ordinarily accepted in place of that prerequisite, pending instructor approval.

Repeating a Course

You can only repeat a course once. If you have already repeated a course one time (excluding course withdraws), you won't be able to register for it again. Starting with fall 2013 registration, the registration system will not allow students to repeat a course a third time. *Current University Policy* (section F.6) states that students may repeat a course only one time (excluding course withdrawals). If you were considering taking a course for a third time, please consult with your academic adviser to explore other options.

Scholastic Committee, CCE

The CCE Scholastic Committee is charged with interpreting and enforcing College and University regulations relating to academic affairs for students admitted to CCE credit certificate and degree programs and non-admitted students assigned to CCE. The Committee handles registration exception request policies and procedures, certificate program admission standards, and certificate program credit transfer policies for these students.

The Committee seeks to maintain the spirit of the University's regulations and is empowered to make exceptions in extenuating circumstances. CCE non-admitted and admitted degree and credit certificate students should contact a CCE adviser at 612-624-4000.

Scholastic Dishonesty

The University Regents Policy on Student Conduct defines scholastic dishonesty as "Submission of false records of academic achievement; cheating on assignments or examinations; plagiarizing; altering, forging, or misusing a University academic record; taking, acquiring, or using test materials without faculty permission; acting alone or in cooperation with another to falsify records or to obtain dishonestly grades, honors, awards, or professional endorsement."

Suspected cases of scholastic dishonesty are taken seriously. Academic dishonesty in any portion of the academic work for a course shall be grounds for awarding a grade of F or N for the entire course. (See *Conduct Code*, page 40, and *Plagiarism*, page 44.)

Smoke-Free Campus Policy

Smoking is prohibited in all facilities of the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities campus, except for designated private residence hall rooms.

Student Educational Records, Access to

In accordance with regents policy, state, and federal law, information about a student generally may not be released to a third party without the student's permission. (Exceptions under the law include state and federal educational and financial aid institutions.) University policy and procedures are available for review at www.onestop.umn.edu/grades_and_transcripts/student-records-privacy.html.

Some student information is designated as public information, including name, address, e-mail address, telephone number, dates of enrollment and enrollment status (full time, part time, not enrolled, withdrawn and date of withdrawal), college and class, major, adviser, academic awards and honors received, and degrees earned. Currently enrolled students may prevent the release of public information; they can do so at the Personal Information Quick Link at **www.onestop**.umn.edu. Students can also choose to allow access to student record information to third parties (e.g., parent, spouse) through the Parent/Guest Access Quick Link at www.onestop.umn.edu.

Within the University, all employees with a demonstrated need to know will be granted access to student academic information. Employees with a need to know could include advisers, instructors, unit scholastic progress representatives, and department data managers.

Students have the right to review their educational records and to challenge the contents of those records. Students are responsible for updating their personal information, which can be done online through the Personal Information Quick Link at www.onestop.umn.edu.

Transcripts

Official Transcripts: Official transcripts are certified and signed by the University Registrar. You can order a transcript online, by mail, by fax, or in person. Telephone requests are not accepted.

Visit www.onestop.umn.edu/grades_and_transcripts /official_transcripts for complete instructions.

Unofficial transcripts: If you have an active Internet ID and password, you can print an unofficial copy of your transcript on the Web at **www.onestop.umn.edu**. Click on "Grades and Transcripts," then select "View or Print Your Unofficial Transcript."

If your Internet ID is no longer active, you may activate it by calling 1-HELP at 612-301-4357. You may also request an unofficial transcript in person at a One Stop Student Services Center; a picture ID is required.

Disciplinary action is taken if you forge or alter academic records.

Transferring Credit to Another Institution

Credits earned by non-admitted students at the University of Minnesota may be applicable toward a degree at another institution under the policies determined by that institution. If you are a non-admitted student taking graduate level coursework that you wish to apply to a University masters or Ph.D. program, be sure to check first with your future program about possibly transferring your credits.



How to Read a Course Listing

Sample Course Listing

Use this handy diagram to navigate your way through the course listings starting on page 65. Each shaded box indicates what the item is, while a corresponding paragraph offers detailed explanations.



Course Number: Courses have four-digit numbers. The first number designates the course level:

Oxxx Courses that do not carry credit toward any University degree

1xxx Courses primarily for undergraduate students in their first year of study

2xxx Courses primarily for undergraduate students in their second year of study

3xxx Courses primarily for undergraduate students in their third year of study

4xxx Courses primarily for undergraduate students in their fourth year of study; graduate students may register in such courses for degree credit. 4xxx courses may be applied toward a Graduate School degree with approval by the student's major field department, and only for courses taught by a member of the graduate faculty or an individual authorized by the program to teach at the graduate level.

5xxx Courses primarily for graduate students; undergraduate students in their third or fourth year may register in such courses.

6xxx Courses for post-baccalaureate students in professional degree programs

7xxx Courses for post-baccalaureate students in professional degree programs. 6xxx and 7xxx courses are used primarily for post-baccalaureate professional programs that are not offered through the Graduate School.

8xxx Courses for graduate students

9xxx Courses for graduate students

In addition, courses may carry a letter after the course number to indicate special status as follows:

- V Indicates the course fulfills both Honors and Liberal Education Writing Intensive requirements
- W Indicates the course fulfills the Liberal Education Writing Intensive requirement

Class Number/Call Number: This five-digit number appears to the left of each course or each section of a course. Course numbers and these specific class numbers (call numbers) must be used when you fill out your Registration and Cancel/Add Form.

Section Number: This three-digit number indicates different sections of a course. When class numbers (call numbers) and section numbers precede the hours and days listed, you may choose the section in which you wish to register (see **Example 1** below).

Many courses have a choice of laboratory or recitation sections, but only a single lecture section. This lecture section will not have a class number (call number) before it, signifying an automatic registration in the lecture; therefore, you need only list the laboratory class number (call number) on your Registration and Cancel/Add Form (see **Example 2** below).

If laboratory or recitation sections are distributed under different lecture hour headings (see **Example 3** below), then your choice of laboratory or recitation hours determines in which lecture you are automatically registered. In this case, list on your Registration and Cancel/Add Form the laboratory or recitation section you wish to attend; you will automatically be registered in the lecture section listed immediately above.

Section Type (course component abbreviation):

Course sections have abbreviations that indicate, generally, the course or section format. More information on course content and teaching style can be found in the Course Guide which is available online at **www.onestop.umn.edu**.
