The Business Vice President having reported in response to Board inquiry on possible hardship cases, voted to approve the following resolution authorizing condemnation procedure for the acquisition of additional areas in the Cedar Creek Natural History Area with the understanding that no steps of condemnation would be initiated prior to scheduled consultation with the Senator from Isanti and Anoka counties:
