The York County Board of Commissioners met according to law on September 22, 2009 at 9:36 a.m. as per notice in the York News Times on September 17, 2009, with Chairman, Augustus M. Brown Jr., with Steve Neujahr, Kurt Bulgrin and Patricia Bredenkamp. Also present were Melanie Wilkinson, correspondent for the York News Times and Bo Blackman, correspondent for KAWL Radio Station. Commissioner Eugene Bergen was absent.

The agenda of the meeting was posted on the bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and a copy of the agenda was made available to each Commissioner.

Brown announced that the Open Meetings Law was posted outside the door and copies were available in the back of the board room. Proof of publication was also available.

The Board met with Elected Officials and Department heads prior to the regular meeting. No action was taken.

Under discussion, Neujahr stated that it was his understanding that an employee did not work the day before the holiday (Labor Day) and therefore, he should not get holiday pay as stated in the handbook, *an employee must work the last scheduled day prior to the holiday and the first scheduled day following the holiday unless otherwise on paid vacation*. The Chairman confirmed that information.

Moved by Bredenkamp, seconded by Bulgrin to approve General Assistance case #09-23 payable to Walgreen Pharmacy in the amount of \$276.51; roll call: yeas, Bredenkamp, Bulgrin, Neujahr and Brown; nays, none; Bergen absent; motion carried.

There were no interfund transfers to be brought before the Board.

An Agreement between the Owner and Contractor and the Notice to Proceed for a bridge replacement on Road C (093BR10) was reviewed by the County Attorney and the Board.

Moved by Bulgrin, seconded by Neujahr to authorize the Chairman to sign the Agreement and Notice to Proceed for the contract between York County and the Contractor, WAW Construction Inc., for the road project - bridge replacement on Road C; roll call: yeas, Bulgrin, Neujahr, Bredenkamp and Brown; nays, none; Bergen absent; motion carried.

The salary for the Juvenile Diversion Coordinator was reviewed as it was not addressed when the other pay increases were. It was found that her salary is set by the Juvenile Diversion Grant, therefore, no action need be taken at this time.

Representatives of the York Adopt-A-Pet came before the board regarding the amount of support the county would provide. Those representing the association were: Bob Hose, Gail Nordlund, Judi Nordlund and Katie North.

Adopt-A-Pet is requesting funding in the amount of \$5,000.00. The county budget as adopted on September 8, 2009 provided \$4,000.00 to the institution. At this time, Adopt-A-Pet is serving as the county animal shelter.

In the last legislative session, an amendment was made to LB241 which became operative on August 30, 2009. Under this law, the County has the following options for their animal control facility.

- 1. To maintain an Animal Control Facility which is licensed.
- 2. To use an Animal shelter which is licensed
- 3. Use an Animal control Facility in another political subdivision
- 4. Contract with a Veterinary Clinic or Veterinarian to perform holding services and the county will apply for an Animal Control Facility license
- 5. Contract with a Veterinary Clinic or Veterinarian to perform holding services and the Veterinarian or Veterinary Clinic will apply for an Animal Control Facility license

The Board thanked those present. The matter was tabled to allow time to further research the options.

Bids were received for a used packer at the September 8, 2009 board meeting. All bids were rejected as the one recommended by the Highway Superintendent was not consistent with the bid specs. At that time, the Board questioned if they could accept a bid for a machine which was other than that which was in the bid specs. It was also questioned if they could negotiate with the representatives who submitted the bids.

The County Attorney researched the matter and advised them to re-advertise specifications for the packer. The Board will follow the direction given.

Commissioner Neujahr presented information on wireless headsets for phones within the county offices. He had several vendors which supplied him with information and pricing. He is hoping to receive a grant from NIRMA to help pay for the equipment.

Moved by Neujahr, seconded by Bulgrin to purchase from HELLO DIRECT twenty-three (23) GN 9125SE Micro wireless headsets; roll call: yeas, Neujahr, Bulgrin, Bredenkamp and Brown; nays, none; Bergen absent; motion carried.

Moved by Bulgrin, seconded by Neujahr to go into executive session to discuss the Road Department union contract at 10:40 a.m. and the County Attorney be included in the session; roll call: yeas, Bulgrin, Neujahr, Bredenkamp and Brown; nays, none; Bergen absent; motion carried.

The Board went into executive session to discuss the road department contract at 10:41 a.m.

Moved by Neujahr, seconded by Bredenkamp to go back into open session at 11:32 a.m. Nothing was acted upon in the session and only the road department union contract was discussed; roll call: yeas, Neujahr, Bredenkamp, Bulgrin and Brown; nays, none; Bergen absent; motion carried.

Committee reports were given.

The Chairman declared the meeting adjourned at 12:00 p.m. The next regular meeting will be October 6, 2009 at 8:30 a.m. with Elected Officials/Department Heads; 9:20 a.m. with the General Assistance Administrator and 9:35 a.m. in the County Commissioners Room, lower level of the Courthouse for the regularly scheduled meeting.
