- The team is 21-11-1-3 in its last 36 games and four points behind division-leading Binghamton.
- **Chris Wagner** recorded his first career hat trick (3-1=4) on March 22 vs. Binghamton. He has now scored goals in each of his last two games (4-1=5) with a +3 rating.
- **Emerson Etem** has 2-2=4 points on his current two-game point streak.
- **John Gibson** currently leads the league in shutouts (5), tied for ninth (tied for second among rookies) in wins (19), tied for eighth (second among rookies) in SV% (.920), 10th (second among rookies) in GAA (2.35) and sixth (second among rookies) in saves (1,057).
- **Andre Petersson** had 1-1=2 points on March 22 vs. Binghamton. Since joining Norfolk, he has 3-3=6 points in seven games.
- **Devante Smith-Pelly** is currently on a four-game point streak (4-1=5) and a three-game goal streak (4-0=4). He scored his third SHG (tied for the team lead) of the season on March 21 vs. Binghamton.

Kerdiles posted 0-3=3 points in the BIG Ten championship game against Ohio State, including assisting on the OT GWG. He has 7-13=20 points in his last 11 games and 11-18=29 points in his last 18 games.
- **Keaton Thompson** assisted on the GWG in the third-place game of the NCHC Frozen Faceoff. North Dakota will play against Wisconsin in the first round of the NCAA tournament.
- **Andy Welinski** ends his sophomore season with career highs in goals (5) and points (19), and a career-tying 14 assists.
