## RATING

**PG** Mild peril.

Contains lace and beading techniques.

## YOU WILL NEED

400m/437 yards Posh Yarn Cecilia (cobweb laceweight, 50% silk/50% cashmere)

Approximately 800 silver-lined rocaille beads, size 8/0  
3mm needles

0.6mm crochet hook

## NOTE ON BEADING

To place bead, thread a bead onto a fine crochet hook, Use hook to remove one stitch from right needle. Slide bead onto stitch and replace on needle.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 50 stitches. Knit four rows in garter stitch.

Lace pattern:

Row 1: k1, \*yo, sl1 k2tog pssso, yo, k3\* 8 times, k1

Row 2: \*k6, place bead\* 8 times, k2

Row 3: \*k2tog, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k1\* 8 times, k2

Row 4: knit to end

Row 5: k1, \*k3, yo, sl1 k2tog pssso, yo\* 8 times, k1

Row 6: k3, place bead, \*k6, place bead\* 7 times, k5

Knit in pattern until scarf is desired length.

Knit four rows in garter stitch.

Cast off and block.
