## CURRICULUM AND ACADEMIC PROGRAM

CCA students follow a four x four block schedule. Students take up to four ninety-minute classes per day, five days per week, in each eighteen-week Fall and Spring term. On this accelerated system, every term-long class is the equivalent of a traditional two semester, year-long class and students earn two final grades per class each term. Students who take eight classes can earn up to 80 credits in a year.

## Envision/CONSERVATORY

For students who desire to expand their exposure to the arts, CCA offers Envision, a program designed to inspire and train future artists. It is an extensive curriculum with a structured sequence of progressively challenging courses in the following disciplines: Dance, Visual Arts, Humanities, Instrumental Music, Theater, Cinema and Vocal Music. For students who demonstrate exceptional potential and talent, CCA offers Envision Conservatory. Conservatory is a rigorous, audition-only extracurricular program that provides advanced instruction and training supplemented by professional teaching artists.
