Patriotic Summons—Gov. Dwight H. Green has proclaimed Sunday, August 23, as "Illinois National Day" which will be commemorated by a huge pageant to be held in the afternoon at Soldier Field under the auspices of the Foreign Language Division of the illinois State Council of Defense.



Close of a Notable Career—Mrs. Seraphine E. Pisko, widely known honorary secretary of the National Jewish Hospital at Denver and active in philanthropy and women's affairs for over 50 years, died July 27 after a long illness. She was 81 years old.



New Child-Care Work—Miss Florence Goldman, newly-appointed Bellefaire (Cleveland Jewish Orphan Home) Regional Supervisor, will make her initial trip into the State of Indiana, August 7, with a view to giving impetus to the enlarged child-care service of the seventy-four-year-old institution.



Key Figures in Jewish Education Drive—The Board of Jewish Education, in conformity with its agreement with the Jewish Charities of Chicago, will conduct a campaign during the months of September, October and November for the necessary funds to carry on its work. Believing that education is linked with the struggle for the perpetuation of democracy, Judge Julius H. Miner of the Circuit Court of Cook County and long prominent in civic and patriotic activities, has accepted the chairmanship of the drive, it was announced this week at a special meeting of the directors of the Board of Jewish Education by Prof. Louis Gottschalk, president of the Board, and chairman of the Department of History at the University of Chicago. "We are blessed," says Judge Miner, "with constitutionally guaranteed rights to live, learn and worship as free men and women. We shall teach our children how to do so nobly." 

There is a popular saying that the writing of songs for a country is as necessary as the writing of its laws. They provide the national spirit and loyalty to strengthen its morale. Following this principle. Zionist leaders have just issued a fine collection of some two hundred songs which deal with the spirit of Palestine and Zionism. The range of subjects includes the land and the people, Jewish festivals and holidays.

These songs have been compiled in a most artistic book by Harry Coopersmith. An English rendition of each song has been prepared by Deborah Pessin and the clever illustrations are from the pen of Margot Tomes, Music lovers and Zionist advocates will enthusiastically welcome this new book.

co-religionists will uncon-Many sciously think of the so-called "Protocols of Zion" when they read the "Tanaka Memorial." Both treat of world conquest and universal domination. The former is a deliberate falsehood, kept alive by anti-Semitic propaganda; the latter is historically true but was suppressed for years by Japanese cleverness. The "Protocols of Zion" relate the fictional secret meeting of international Jewish bankers for world control through financial manipulation. The "Tanaka Memorial" is the statement of an actual meeting in Mukden from June 27 to July 7, 1927, of Japanese military and civil officers.

"Japan's Dream of World Empire" is a book that every American who wishes to grasp Japanese psychology should read. Directly after the historic gathering in Mukden, Baron Tanaka carried a report of the deliberations to his Emperor in Japan and this report has since been called the "Tanaka Memorial." "There has not been any official act of Japan in China in the past ten years which has not followed the lines laid out in this memorial" (P 22). Today, a military clique dominates Japan and its aim is to rule the entire world. In that ambitious drive for power, Formosa and Korea were first conquered. Five years ago, the invasion of China began. Pearl Harbor was another planned step in that gigantic dream. Our Western mind can scarcely believe these facts but our experiences since December 7 leaves no room for doubt.

For too many years, Americans have measured the Japanese viewpoint by the gentle Nipponese folks we pass on the street. This book furnishes the facts and the history of Japanese ambition and thus becomes an excellent guide to those who wish to know the actual background on one front of this world war.

#### News Brevities

Kuibyshev (JPS)—The settlers of the autonomous Jewish district of Biro-Bidjan, farthest outpost of the Soviet Union, have pledged themselves to increase their shipments of food and special supplies to the Red Army fighting on the western front, it was announced in the Soviet press. Assigned a quota to furnish produce, the Biro-Bidjan group decided to impose an additional responsibility on themselves.

London (JPS)-Nine Jewish refugee children, whose long journey from Poland included a stay in Soviet Russia and more recently in India, have been given permission by the British Government to continue to their goal, Palestine.

Geneva (JPS) — All shares and stocks belonging to Jews, estimated to total 30,000,000 Leva (approximately \$5,790,000) have been confiscated by the Bulgarian Government.

Washington (JTA)-Earl G. Harof Immigration and Naturalization, has pledged that he will "do everything possible" to facilitate the naturalization of aliens serving in the armed ghetto, it is learned here. forces of the United States. The pledge was given in a letter replying to a query by a loval alien concerning a recent modification by the War Department of the naturalization regulations for alien soldiers, it was disclosed here this week.

Stockholm (JTA) - One hundred Belgian Jews who had been confined in the St. Giles prison in Brussels on charges of "sabotage," have been deported from Belgium to Poland or occupied Russia, according to information reaching here this week.

New York (JTA)—EMICA, the organization set up by the Jewish Colonization Association and the Trust Fund of New York, in connection with settling refugees in Palestine, will place twenty families at Kfar Warburg, a new settlement which has been established in Palestine since the outbreak of the war, it was announced here this week. They will join 47 families who have already been settled at the colony which is named after the late Felix Warburg. Ninety-nine families are now living on the other EMICA colony, Beer Tuviah, which is located nearby.



Reports reaching here state that 700 German women and 1,000 children arrived in the one city of Wloclavek, Poland, to be placed in the homes of Jews, who were ordered out of the city and their household belongings confiscated.

# The Ingredients of Victory

The second front in Europe or wherever else it could do the most good would be opened at once if the prevalent attitude, officially as well as privately, with regard to so vital a move for all the United Nations, were that of Governor Edison of New Jersey, son of the immortal American inventor, Thomas A. Edison, and former Secretary of the Navy, who expressed himself on this point last week as follows: "I'd like to see a few more John Paul Joneses and a daring take-achance attitude to bring aid to China and Russia." The minute such a spirit is brought to bear upon the war situation, and not before, the Axis threat to civilized mankind will be checked and thrown back in Russia and everywhere else and disposed of in short order. There is only one way to win this war, as every other, and to do so quickly and that is to wage it constantly with the audacity demanded by Danton in his impassioned exhortation at the outbreak of the French Revolution. The very risk involved in embarking upon a second front at this time is the best reason in the world for going about it in earnest, preparing it with the greatest speed as well as thoroughness and making an actual start in that direction.

The prime need of this country and the rest of the United Nations now is leadership, military and otherwise, of the most daring character. Difficulties cannot be permitted to stand in the way of proceeding at this critical juncture as Farragut did when he issued the order that has made his name live forever, "Damn The Torpedoes! Go Ahead!" The counterpart today, industrially, of the valiant and victorious American Admiral of our own Civil War is Henry J. Kaiser, hailed far and wide as "America's master shipbuilder," whose breathtaking war effort should serve as an inspiration for all others, particularly those whose job it is to get the second front going. Telling of the feasibility of turning out the 70-ton Glenn L. Martin flying boat Mars at the rate of 5,000 a year, a United Press dispatch from Portland, Oregon, brought to the attention of all on the front page of the "Chicago Sun," July 20, reveals: "Such planes, Kaiser said, could each carry a hundred men, completely equipped.

"'Five thousand of them could land 500,000 equipped men in England in a single day. And the next day they could fly over again with 70,000 tons of fresh milk, beefsteaks, sugar—and bombs. No submarine could shoot them down', he said.

"'With the aid of Martin and the aviation industry in general', he added, 'and with the equipment already in place in the shipyards, we can have the assembly line functioning in six months or less. We can be at maximum production in 10 months or less.

"'And when that maximum production comes, the position of our enemies will be hopeless. We will be able to put down a vast army, anywhere in the world, within a single week. We will be free once and for all of the fear of having our armies cut off in some place distant from our own shores. There will be no distant places. The whole world will be our front yard. And our enemies will be beaten to their knees."

In a radio address last Sunday over the Columbia network and also at the "Win the War" rally in Grant Park, sponsored by the Chicago Industrial Union Council, and with 8,000 in attendance, R. J. Thomas, president of the United Automobile, Aircraft and Agricultural Implement Workers of America, claimed to be the biggest labor union in the United

States, likewise pointed the way to certain victory by opening a second front now and removing obstacles in the way of maximum American war production, saying: "We do not need to approve of Communism to realize that if Russia is knocked out of the war it will mean the loss of hundreds of thousands of additional American lives before Hitler and Japan are defeated.

"In sections of the armed forces and of industry, there is still a short-sighted 'can't-be-done' attitude. Labor demands that these hands so enmeshed in red tape and outmoded tradiions be removed from our defense setup.

"The proposals of Henry Kaiser for development of air transports, the emphasis of Maj. de Seversky on development of a separate air force should not be kicked around merely because they will mean unemployment for some admirals or generals, or because they will disturb the vested interests of some industries."

Together with the foregoing considerations, there must be proper realization, as George S. Messersmith, United States Ambassador to Mexico, told the International Women's Club in Mexico City a few weeks ago, of the implications of an Axis victory for "every single one of us" and, in consequence, "such a fervor and such a spirit among all the peoples of the world as that which is now being shown by those heroic men who are struggling at the fronts," notably in Russia and China, and the women, too, it must not be forgotten, whether as civilians or in the armed forces of those and other countries whose spirit of resistance to subjugation and enslavement by the Axis cannot be broken.

"It is only when we have that full realization," the American envoy to Mexico earnestly pleaded on the basis of his experiences in Germany where he was formerly stationed, "that we shall have all the power which is necessary to destroy the monsters aiming to devour us. Our faith alone will not save us. If we depend only on our faith and upon the rightness of right as our weapon and as our defense, the monster will laugh in our face and slay us.

"It is time for us to awake, not only as nations and as governments but as individuals. While the sinking of ships in our waters has brought the war and its real significance to some of us more closely, our attitude is still one of too great complacency.

"From the casual spectator whose interest is so largely confined to reading about the war in our daily paper or listening in over the radio as if these were events which concern others and not ourselves, we must come to have the feeling that every battle that is fought for freedom these days, whether it is in the air, on the land or on the seas, is our battle and that we shall not be doing our part, which is essential to the victory, until every sacrifice of blood and toil and treasure is made by us as it is by those valiantly combating the enemy today.

"We are stronger than the enemy, but shall only defeat the enemy if every one of us puts forth the maximum effort

and is prepared for the maximum sacrifice:"

The course of action that must be insisted upon in every phase of the war effort — political, military, industrial and civilian — is that which provides assurance that victory will not be deferred and thereby possibly imperiled.

# He Teaches Toughness to Soldiers

HE LIFE of a guerrilla fighter is exhausting — physically, mentally and nervously — lonely, perilous, hard in every way. The guerrilla must sometimes work in isolation, must lurk in the shadows and take terrifying risks in broad daylight."

That is how Bert "Yank" Levy, world's foremost expert on guerrilla fighting, defines his craft, a skill which has saved Yugoslavia for the United Nations — only because of the 250,000 trained, savage guerrilla warriors; a trade in war which has made the Russian guerrillas the most feared battalions in the heroic Red Army; a type of warfare which has made possible resistance to the Nazis in such small lands as Greece and Norway, in such outposts as Crete and Java.

Now that the United States is in this war to the end, with all its resources and all its imagination, guerrilla fighting is being looked upon as a definite means of fighting the strong enemy. And the man who is teaching Americans how to battle the Axis with as few weapons as possible, with as many ingenious devices as the human brain can create, is a 120-pound, black-haired, mustached Jew, born in Hamilton, Ontario, in 1897.

Bert Levy is an outspoken man with clear ideas as to how this war must be fought. He believes that guerrilla bands are needed in America because the Axis is capable of invading South America from Africa and thus could endanger the United States. As a matter of fact, Bert Levy thinks that guerrilla fighters can do more harm than most army units. During the past few weeks he has been lecturing on his specialty at the State Guard School of the 1st Corps Area in Concord, Mass. He has been putting the American boys through a schedule which, in effect, can be described in this fashion: "If you survive, you'll be a guerrilla fighter."

But Yank Levy need not take a back seat for any of the adventurous men throughout the world who are labeled "soldiers of fortune." He has quite a record himself. Here is part of it:

His active life really began in 1916, when he got a job as a stoker in the merchant service. Before that date he just grew up in Cleveland and attended public school and a couple of years' worth of night high school. "My real education," he declares after the fashion of many self-made men, "was in the school of hard knocks." After his sailoring-to which he later returned-Yank fought in Palestine and Transjordan during the First World War. Not satisfied with that bit of soldiering, Yank took part in a few revolutions down Mexico way, and then did some gun-running in Nicaragua. In 1937 he decided to join up with the Loyalists in Spain-the first men who fought Hitler in Europe-and quickly became an officer in the machine-gun company of the British Battalion. He was captured by Franco's troops and spent six months in Fascist prisons.

The secret of victory over Hitler is "toughness." That is the slogan now ringing through the declarations of military experts. One man who is being shuttled from one of the United Nations to the other to teach their soldiers "toughness" as guerrilla fighters is Bert "Yank" Levy, an adventurous Jew who has learned in "the school of hard knocks" what he is now teaching trained squads of American troops.

Through with "foreign" wars, Levy returned to Great Britain and became an instructor of the British Home Guards. For more than fifteen months he talked and talked about guerrilla fighting. He is proud of the two million Home Guards in Great Britain. He says they will help turn the tide if the Germans should ever decide to invade England.

"England can't be invaded," he said. But the British are cautious. Yank has orders: he has to return to Great Britain after school in the United States ends. He is to give a new series of lectures in guerrilla fighting.

For those to whom guerrilla warfare is new, unknown and mysterious, a perusal of "Guerrilla Warfare," Levy's opus on what some bright adjective-smitten phrase-maker has termed "the art of unmodified murder," is in order. In this slim volume Levy pours out his guts. In it he includes all the knowledge he has picked up of guerrilla warfare. He tells about guerrilla heroes from the days of William The Conqueror to the moment when the Russian guerrillas began to torture and halt the Nazis. It is with considerable military skill that he explains the fighting theories of Lawrence of Arabia, one of the topnotch guerrilla experts. of Liddell Hart and of many more guerrilla men. That Levy is extremely well-read is indicated by his liberal references to books dealing with his particular phase of war. He turns to Ernest Hemingway's "For Whom The Bell Tolls" to point out guerrilla methods in fighting north of Madrid; he refers to Edgar Snow's "Scorched Earth" to stress Chinese

guerrilla methods; E. O'Malley's "Army Without Banners" and Denis Rietz' "Commando" are other volumes to which Levy alludes.

Yank Levy lays down the law for guerrilla warriors: "Know your own territory, and know it both by day and by night." He then goes on to tell of the value of knowing each ridge, every factory, every landmark, all the strong buildings, the blind sides of edifices.

"We must get to know people," is another axiom. "People who can be of use to us, who have an intimate knowledge of some aspect or other of our territory. Men and women who can give us useful information now, and who will give us invaluable information if ever the enemy is all around." One more bit of pungent advice is this: all guerrillas should be "sons of guns"—their rifles should always be handy. He repeats an old line: "My rifle is my mother; it feeds me, it houses me, clothes me and protects me."

The fundamentals of guerrilla fighting are caution, invisibility and surprise. They need as their handmaids both initiative and obedience. With a startling comeback, Yank brushed aside courage. "Courage is the commonest of qualities," he says. "Most men are naturally brave, just as most men also get scared."

At this point, Yank Levy gets in a few more words about guerrilla fighters. They deserve full quotation because they will give the uninitiated a glimpse into the task facing these partisans: "The good guerrilla fighter must out-smart, out-think the other fellow. He needs plenty of audacity, but audacity should only be used after he has studied every possibility of a get-away as carefully as he has studied the attack. We cannot afford to throw away guerrilla fighters. There are not too many of them. It is their job to badger the enemy, to wreak as much destruction as possible, and then to withdraw for the next attack."

Yank has coined some other phrases which tellingly describe the job and difficulties of guerrillas. "Invisibility is the guerrilla's fortress. The only one he can hope for . . . A guerrilla . . . must be a dim but sinister shadow, a mosquito in a darkened tent that stings first here, then there, his victims unable to trap him." These turns of phrase reveal that Levy can write as well as lecture, as well as fight.

He offers, in his book, prosaic, invaluable advice. You must not forget to use the leaves of trees; remember not to carry anything that reflects light. Learn how to walk so that you always lift your feet clear off the ground. Don't tip-toe; don't slide your feet along the ground. The side-crawl is useful; so is the belly-crawl. Move with the wind. Watch the animals in the field, so that you may get hints as to the environment. Carry silent equipment. Watch landscapes carefully. Rest whenever possible. Eat whenever you can. Even if you have eaten an hour ago, eat—for you may not get another chance to eat for days.

That's what Yank Levy teaches willing men of the United Nations.

# The Case of the Jew

'F THE "Case of the Jew" is to be discussed, it is not a subject for either attack or defense. "The Case of the Jew" is merely the case of humanity, with all its glories and all its frailties. The human individual -Jew or Gentile-is born amoral, neither good nor evil. He becomes one or the other, or partly both, because of example, environment, precept or vicissitude. These may perhaps all be grouped as environment. He is influenced by these from the moment of birth, and, later, though decreasingly, all through life.

Because a child's earliest environment is his home, and his earliest examples are his parents, the age-old notion persists that character is inherited: Like Father, Like Son. Modern thinkers are inclined to discard this notion. Whether or not they do, a lifetime of observation and thought on the subject has convinced me that character is not inherited, but acquired. Nations, peoples, groups-or, what not-are vast multiplications of individuals; and the same law holds true with them. Mass psychology, mass character, are not inherited—they are acquired. It follows that there are not inherently good, nor inherently evil peoples, any more than there are inherently good or evil individuals. They become one or the other, from force of circumstances: And, among those circumstances are democratic freedom and justice on the one hand, and the intellectual and moral oppression and goose-step on the other.

Proponents of the doctrine of heredity (or "inbornness") of character point to the instance of the celebrated Jukes family, which is said to have produced seven hundred criminals, descended from one criminal pair. But the logic of this was punctured by one writer, who asked: "If you could trace seven hundred German-speaking offspring to one Germanspeaking pair, would you argue that the German language was inherited?" We know that here in the United States descendants one or two generations removed from German immigrants, speak practically not a word of German. And, too, those who point to the Jukes tradition, overlook the fact that that family has also produced many outstandingly useful and honorable citizens.

How much bloodshed and oppression the world might have been spared, if its leaders had an honest understanding of this rule of the origin of both good and evil! Also, if they had not been infected with the absurdity of "Master Races" and "Inferior Races"! The Medes and the Persians, the Greeks and the Romans and others, all took turns at conceiving themselves to be "Master Races," only to sink into oblivion, or into secondary importance.

In this law of individual, as well as of group, evolution, the Jew reacts exactly like any other human being. Except as affected by ghettos and by persecution, a German Jew is just a German, a Russian Jew is just a Russian, and an American Jew is just an American. BeJacob G. German that he carried with him an air of cockiness toward others, including fellow-Jews. And since the overthrow of the Czar and the extirpation of the Russian ghetto, the Jew in the U.S.S.R. is more and more indistinguishable from his Slav brethern. A foreign visitor to Moscow inquired of a member of the central governing Soviet, what proportion of that Soviet were Jews? He was told, after some hesitation, that really there was no way of knowing, because no one in Moscow concerned himself with any such question. Soviet Russia may have much to answer for, but it has made Anti-Semitism a crime, as essentially it is.

There is no "Case Against the Jew" either physically, mentally, or morally. It is true that

the Jews are not a race, nor a nation, but a religion—as far as that religion goes. There is no Jewish entity unless it is the religious entity. And that entity is becoming more and more attenuated. The extreme Orthodox Jew differs as greatly from the extreme "Reformed" Jew, as Judaism, as a whole, differs from Christianity, as a whole. There is, perhaps, a more literal monotheism in the Jewish belief than in others. But both good and evil are as compatible with one form of faith as with another. Philanthropists and convicts are drawn from all religions. It is the individual who staunchly follows high principles on the one hand, or who weakly or corruptly follows criminal practices on the other. Neither wickedness nor heartlessness is any more general among Jews than among others. The Indiana Dillingers and the Missouri James Boys were not Jewish; and their exploits cannot be charged to the honest folk either of Indiana or of Missouri.

There are some heartless Jewish employers. There always were, and are, some heartless non-Jewish employers. Thomas Hood's "Song fore Hitler, a German Jew was so much a of The Shirt' was not written with Jews in

mind. The Arkansas "Share-croppers" were not said to be victimized by Jewish land proprietors, although some of them may have been Jewish. And Lord Macaulay, in "Horatius At The Bridge," speaks of an Etruscan "Saius. whose eight hundred slaves sickened in Ilva's mines.'

To generalize from individual instances of dereliction marks the irresponsible mind. If I should indulge in individual instances, I have in mind one former Jewish client who was a veritable Nathan the Wise, in point of nobility of character. He was, oddly enough, a dealer in wholesale liquor. He was probity itself. He had absolutely no hardness of soul. He would not take harsh legal measures to collect a debt. One customer, a "Gentile" saloon-keeper, had become indebted to him for an unusually large sum. My client said: "If I close him up he will be deprived of his only means of livelihood." This customer, incidentally, in the end paid his indebtedness in full, showing that my client was wise as well as warm-hearted. We all know instances of such Nathans among Jews and non-Jews. But, alas, we could wish that they were more numerous. And then there is the instance of the Jewish manufacturer who, some years ago, turned his entire business over to his employees.

It is said that Jews are more inclined than others to change their names. To the extent that this may be true, it is the intolerant or thoughtless non-Jew who is responsible. A Jew, by changing his name, has some escape from vicious or supercilious taunts, and some young people of my acquaintance were able to obtain desirable positions after making the changesomething they could not do before. Employment agencies discourage young people with Jewish names, even though of superior attain-

But the notion that change of names among Jews is general is much exaggerated. When one indulges in wise-cracking, he is likely to strain the truth. Perhaps the most frequent change is that from "Moses" to "Milton." But the scanning of a City directory will disclose columns and pages of "Levis," "Levys," "Levins," "Cohns," "Cohens," "Abrams," "Abrahams," "Isaacs," "Isaacsons," and of innumerable Jewish names which end in "Berg," "Stein," "B a u m, " "Heim," "Heimer," etc.

That Jews are not a race is easily demonstrated. Contrary to popular conception, they have no distinctive facial characteristics. The American-born Jew cannot be told from the mass, either physically or culturally. When one bears a tell-tale name like mine, the observer will imagine "Jewish traits," which would not have occurred to him otherwise. The dark Jews are not distinguishable from Southern Europeans, nor blond Jews from Northern Europeans. The "Jewish nose" is the invention of the comedian and of the Anti-Semite; in reality, it is the Greek, the German.

The story develops, after various mysterious incidents, into an international spy plot and comes to a forceful action climax with a gun siege in a cross-continental train in a lonely mid-European forest.

#### NYASSA DOCKS 557 REFUGEES AIDED INTO U. S. BY J. D. C.

The Portuguese vessel Nyassa, 20 days out of Portugal, steamed into Baltimore harbor last Friday with 557 refugees on board whose passage had been arranged by the Joint Distribu-tion Committee. The Nyassa is the 14th refugee boat to arrive in the Western Hemisphere since Pearl Harbor on which the J. D. C. bought up the passenger space to evacuate emigrants stranded in Europe.

Her arrival brought to 6,000 the number of persons the J. D. C. has aided to escape from the Old World since America went to war. The ages of the Nvassa passengers ranged from a pair of two-month-old twins to a 99vear-old woman.

Some of the passengers gave evidence of the harrowing hardships they had lived through in Europe when a bomber, evidently making a test flight, flew overhead as the boat was being moored. Some scurried to what they thought would be safety, others looked up at the bomber in transfixed fear. But they calmed down when they realized that they were on friendly shores.

The Nyassa left Lisbon, Portugal, on July 10, picking up at Casablance, French Morocco, the bulk of her passengers, who had been transferred from Marseille in order to board the ship. The J. D. C., through its American representatives in Lisbon, had bought up all the passenger space on her. Transportation funds were advanced under the United States Treasury Department licenses.

By keeping transportation facilities available, the J. D. C. insures sailings from Europe at specific dates and thus prevents refugees from becoming stranded should their visas expire.

the Russian, and the American nose. At the corner of State and Madison Streets in Chicago one could not possibly single out the Jews from among the passers-by.

I was once invited to address a Congregational church, and I spoke on the foregoing lines. I said to my hearers, "I was told that a number of Jewcome to hear me, but I cannot pick is with Fascism. them out in the audience," — and I Anti-Semitism could not.

I once sat on a platform in a public hall, waiting to be introduced as a speaker. Before me was a gathering of several hundred—understood to be all, or nearly all, Jewish. They were Americanized in their dress - young and beardless. I turned to another prospective speaker beside me-not a Jew-and asked him, "If you did not know that this is an exclusively Jewish audience, would it have occurred to you that it is?" My friend, after a moment's reflection, said, "No, it would not." I have verified that phenomenon on numerous occasions since then.

So much for the nonsense of Jews being "A race." Nor are there any traits of character distinctively "Jewish." Occasionally, among themselves, Jewish people will deprecate the actions of one or another of their number, and say "It takes a Jew to do that." The unsophisticated or immature, on hearing such a remark, may take it literally. But the real feeling among Jews is that, as a matter of policy, a Jew should be better than his neighbor, to be considered as good. Also, they are fond of referring to a kind heart as a "Jewish heart," and to an exemplary mother as a "Jewish mother" or "mother in Israel."

I have said that it is not safe to generalize from one's individual experience. Making due allowances I will give my own for what it is worth. I hear, of course, of much discrimination against Jews, and even of out-right hostility. An occasional chance acquaintance may stiffen on being told my name; and then I drop that acquaintance. Sometimes I run into "tolerance"—(i.e. prejudice become highminded). But in the case of old acquaintances, my relations with non-Jews have been, and are, completely normal. "Some of my best friends" are non-Jews. Before Hitler's rise I had even forgotten to be "Jew-conscious." Whatever Jewish activities I had then espoused were rather in the interest of Jews mistreated abroad, than of Jews in general. I was formerly satisfied that in America, at least, Anti-Semitism was a negligible, if contemptible, quantity; that Anti-Semitism here did not amount to enough to put on the Jews the brand of "inferiority"—the brand was rather on their detractors. But when the Nazi plague came, some of its germs were carried over into the U. S. A. And then came the professional "Christian" who began to wave the banner of "Christianity." But, scratch an Anti-Semite and you find a Fascist; scratch a Fascist and you find a traitor to America.

Anti-Semitism is not only a crime but a fraud. There is no logical con-Fascists, yet, he removed at a stroke, come." the medieval disabilities from which

the Jews had suffered. He destroyed the infamous Spanish Inquisition. Mussolini, godfather of modern Fascism, was free from Anti-Semitic taint, until he became a vassal of Hitler's. But the wily Adolf and his followers found that for the spread of their Nazi cult it was helpful to first deprive men of their reason: so, they proceeded to arouse their passions and hatreds. Shakespeare, in "Julius Caesar," has Mark Antony say: "Oh judgment! Thou art fled to brutish beasts, and ish people from the neighborhood have men have lost their reason." Thus it

Anti-Semitism is an instrument of would-be American Fuehrers. I had at one time an extended talk, also correspondence, with one of these worthies of local notoriety. He had previously made repeated bids for publicity by presenting himself (without an organization) as an "independent" or "liberal" candidate for mayor, for senator, and what not. After Hitler's advent he shed his "liberalism" overnight and now sought recognition on a Nazi anti-Semitic platform. In my talks with him he labored to show what a friend he had been of the Jews, that for instance, he had supported Governor Horner (a Jew) for election. A contributing factor to his change appeared to be that he had failed to receive an appointment from that Governor. There was not a word of justification, in my interviews with him, for his new pose; I thought he acted rather ashamed of his apostasy and was hopeful that he might recant. Later, however, I heard that he was attacking Jews in speeches at German Bund meetings. In disgust, I terminated my discussions.

I believe it was Bebel, the great German socialist who said, "Anti-Semitism is the socialism of fools." This should be corrected to say that "Anti-Semitism is the socialism of fools and scoundrels." And it has in all ages taken a bloody toll of the Jewish people and never more so than at the present time.

It is, in my judgment, a disservice to Jews, to urge them to retire upon themselves in their places of worship, etc. In the shadow of the wall of separatism grows the fungus of distrust and hatred.

The great Jewish community occupies merely its due and proportionate place in the American scheme of things; and all hostility directed to that is unholy, un-American, and, may I add, un-Christian!

#### The Tyrant Must Be Destroyed

"Americans who love justice and hate oppression will hail the solemn commemoration in Madison Square Garden as an expression of the determination of the Jewish people to make every sacrifice for victory over the Axis powers. Citizens, regardless of religious allegiance, will share in the sorrow of our Jewish fellow-citizens over the savagery of the Nazis against their helpless victims. 

#### J. N. F. PALESTINIAN EXHIBIT **DEPICTS LAND REDEMPTION**

The epic of homecoming and of the reunion of a people with the land are the central themes of the Jewish National Fund exhibition now touring the cities, villages and army service clubs in Palestine, according to a description of the exhibit received by the United Palestine Appeal.

The exhibit is a graphic presentation of the principle milestones of 40 years of land redemption by the J. N. F., which has made of the Jewish return to Palestine one of the greatest back-to-the-land movements of modern times.

The transformation of the valley of Jezreel, illustrated at the exhibition, is the most striking example of land reclamation for which the J. N. F. provided the land and the Palestine Foundation Fund provided the funds for settlement. Both funds are combined in America in the United Palestine Appeal.

The land area under Jewish ownership, the exhibit points out, is still only 5.5% of the total area of the country, but 40 per cent of the Jewish land is held as a national trust by the J. N. F., which, the exhibit says, "thus provides one of the most valuable social and national safeguards for the nation's future."

Funds of the United Palestine Appeal are raised through the United Jewish Appeal for Refugees. Overseas Needs and Palestine.

#### YIVO HOLDS WRITING CONTEST FOR FOREIGN-BORN JEWS

The Yiddish Scientific Institute-Yivo, of New York City, which has been studying Jewish life for more than 16 years, now announces a contest for the best autobiography on the subject: "Why I left Europe and what I have accomplished in America."

All Jewish men and women not born in the United States or Canada may participate. Education, background, employment or party affiliation of the contestant are irrelevant. Twenty-five prizes are offered for the best autobiographies: First prize, \$100; second prize, \$70; third prize, \$40; fourth prize, \$30; and fifth and sixth prizes, \$20 each; seventh to twenty-fifth prizes, each one volume of a Yivo publication. Manuscripts should be sent to the Yivo not later than September 1, 1942. It is of the first importance that the autobiographies be written with detail, accuracy and sincerity.

## THE WEEK IN EDITORIAL PARAGRAPHS

#### Speak Up for the Refugees

There is great sadness in the plight of the 450 men, women and children who, for more than three months, have been interned at Tiscornia, Cuba's Ellis Island, Having succeeded at last in escaping from the Nazi prisons that held them abroad, they continue to be confined, crowded, forgotten. How different their fate from the excitement aroused a few years ago when the steamer St. Louis, with some 900 passengers, tried vainly to land in some western hemisphere port with its refugee cargo and finally was turned away from Cuba too. Large sums of money were raised to ease their plight. Governmental intervention was sought. International excitement ran high.

It is true that the circumstances are entirely different; that the turmoil of war makes the discomforts and humiliations of a few hundred Jews a negligible item of news. But incapacity to feel moral resentment at their incarceration on our very borders is an indictment of our sympathies and of our appreciation of the purposes of this war.

Freedom on a distant horizon always beckons more attractively. Perhaps ten stranded refugees in Tibet might provoke us to surge up in righteous wrath to demand the solution of their problem. But right on the doorsteps of some 5,000,000 American Jews are 450 Jewish refugees. True, they are free from the hell of Europe. But would it not ease our own conscience as well as ease their plight if the appropriate Jewish organizations would speak up loudly, quickly at our State Department?

#### The Sacred Funnies

Don't be surprised if there is a faint resemblance to Dick Tracy in the features of Joseph as he is sold by his brothers in the Biblical story—as retold in " Picture Stories From the Bible." The story and the language of the sacred Scriptures are now "streamlined" to meet the mood of youngsters whose horizon is supposed to be set by the daily and Sunday "comic pages." A group of Jewish pedagogues, along with Protestant and Catholic representatives, is supposed to have approved of the idea of breaking down the resistance to absorption of Bible tales by sugarcoating them in the lively colors and techniques of the "funnies."

The first issue of the 64-page magazine for one dime tells all about Joseph, Moses, Saul, Ruth, Noah. Jonah and Esther. One of the "balloons" has a contemporary of Noah saying to his next-door neighbors: "Hear the latest, men? Crazy old Noah's got his relatives shut in the ark with him. What's wrong with him?" Whether this "folksy" way of telling the sacred folk tales of a people and of a civilization will achieve results is any man's opinion. In the meantime, the youngsters seem to be as afraid of these stories as they were of spinach before "Popeye" began selling it to them in the colored comics. The first edition is only 10,000 copies and the lad who has a week's spending money to lay on the newspaper counter for his reading matter still seems to prefer the genuine blood-and-thunder of Dick Tracy and Terry And The Pirates.

"Vote Christian!"

Johannes Steel, one of the first Christian newspapermen to escape his native Germany after Hitler came to power and now recognized as a leading American news analyst, revealed last week that the anti-Semites have banded together in New York to defeat Jewish candidates and pro-Administration nominees and to elect "Vote Christian" is the slogan which they have coined. "Don't vote for a Jew on any ticket. Remember the motto of Verdun: "They Shall Not Pass!"

It may seem incredible that these tactics should be pursued at a time when Los Angeles jails Robert Noble, Indianapolis tries William Dudley Pelley for criminal sedition and Washington indicts 28 for conspiracy. Because a rude, unexpected awakening will be far more bitter than a realistic facing of the facts, it is essential for Jews everywhere - in New York and in the rest of the country -- to realize that the subversive forces have not been destroyed. They may have taken convenient cover under rocks but their verminous activity still continues. It is, therefore, important for Jews to bestir themselves in a positive way on behalf of the candidates for office who detest all for which these Bundists and Christian fronters stand.

New York is not alone in being subject to the persistent perniciousness of these enemy forces in our midst. In the heart of Washington, where all the power of the F. B. I. and the Justice Department is concentrated, passengers on streetcars find anonymous throwaways with such inscriptions: "Who betrayed America to the empire of the British-Jewish yellow race? Rosenfeldt. We are victims of his Infantilism; he cannot stand alone."

From one end of the land to the other there are local and national candidates for office who have it in their power, by their own precept and by their conduct of public affairs, to crush these un-American forces or to perpetuate them. Jews, like all Americans, should remember that, as Secretary of State Hull says, a people is worthy of its freedom only as long as it is prepared to fight for it.

#### Discrimination in Hartford

Hartford, Conn., is experiencing a wartime boom. Airplane manufacture is not the least of the industries which have expanded enormously in the last few years. The Hartford Jewish Ledger noting the need for increased manpower in the city, charges that plants are rejecting Jewish workers. This would appear to apply to artisans as well as to clerical help.

Issues of this kind should not be lost on the editorial page of a local English - Jewish newspaper. Unfortunately, all too many Jewish leaders feel that the way to solve these problems is by not "offending" industrialists through calling attention publicly to their offenses. If, in these days of constricting resources of manpower, in these days which see hundreds of thousands of Jews arming in our country's defense, in these days when the President of the United States calls selection of workers on basis of creed or race sabotage of the national war effort—it is both un-American and un-

Jewish to permit a single Jew to be discriminated against for employment in Hartford, Los Angeles or any other center of war production.

But polite, private letters and secret conferences will not achieve the desired end. Dr. Malcolm MacLean, head of the President's Committee on Fair Employment Practices, has shown that publicity is an antitoxin for the noxious weed of discrimination in employment.



#### Watch the Rabble-Rousers

Don't let anything lead you into believing that rabble-rousing has come to an end-simply because a few spies have been arrested and some will get the death penalty. There is still a dangerous kind at large and its rabble-rousing has not abated.

For some of them, Michigan is still like The New Republic and others. © a camping ground. It may not last long, and if the party leaders have Geneva (JPS)—That Italians residtheir way some of the hot-mouthed fellows will soon be out of the way. In the meantime, however, they are still going strong.

Two excellent examples are Gerald L. K. Smith and Representative Clare Hoffman.

#### Smith and Rubber

Gerald L. K. Smith has a following, and his party, the Republicans, know it. That is why the leading figures in the party are so elated over the candidacy for U.S. Senator, in opposition to Smith, of Judge Homer Ferguson.

It is assumed that Judge Ferguson. a good campaigner and a popular judge, will make an easy target of Smith. But it would be well for Michigan voters not to be overconfident. Smith has a following. He has inherited quite a few boosters from Coughlin. That is not saying too much in a state that hatched anti-Semites but never elected them to office. But it is something to watch carefully.

Smith's stock-in-trade now is rubber. He promises enough tires for everybody. Also, he capitalizes on "mothers"—in every speech he speaks of his own mother as a martyr and as a symbol of something about to be abused, by an "unseen power." Of course, he constantly refers to his former mentor, Huey Long, at whose grave he shouted: "God make me a rabble-rouser."

He sums it up neatly: "I am not ashamed of the Bible, of Christ, or of my mother's patriotism"-and the impression he desires to make is that anyone opposing him is ashamed of all three or seeks to dynamite all three.

## JEWS IN SPORTS

#### Oddities in Sports

Carl Hubbell, "old long pants," has pitched some 200 games for New York Giants since 1935 when he really was the Maestro of the Screwball . . . Old Man Hubbell is not the same hurler he used to be but in one thing he is still consistent . . . He insists on using Hank Danning as his receiver . Handsome Harry has caught 195 of these games the screwball wizard has pitched and would have had a perfect record but for the fact that he was on the hospital list on those five occasions . . . No other catcher in either the American or the National League has caught nearly half as many games of one pitcher.

Two Jewish track and field men who were played a queer trick by fate ten years ago at the try-outs for the 1932 Olympic Games are both head-coachers of a championship scholastic track team in New York. The two men, George Winston and Babe Scheuer, were products of N. Y. U.'s famous track mentor, Emil Von Elling. Winston specialized in the sprints while Scheuer, an all-America tackle in the days when the Violet was a national gridiron threat, went in for the shotput and weight events. Winston cracked the national collegiate 70 yard record and Scheuer was one of the top-three men in the sixteen pound shot event. On the strength of their records both were sent out to the Coast for the national I-C-4-A outdoor track and field carnival. Both men scored brilliantly and were rated surefire bets for Olympic berths. On the eve of the Olympic try-outs Winston pulled a leg muscle and Scheuer sprained an ankle thereby eliminating themselves from further competition. They went their separate ways until today both are coaches in track and field at the same scholastic institution.

Mauri Rose, winner of the 1941 Indianapolis 500 Mile Memorial Day Race—the blue-ribbon event of the automobile speed racing world—and one of the nation's top-notch racing drivers, was rejected by the Army for a commission in the Motor Transport Division on the grounds that he "lacked sufficient experience."...

Harry Mendl, impressario of the six day bike races has been invited by the Canadian Government to stage one of his very successful six day races in Montreal . . . Harry is not at all phased by the problem of securing eligible riders who are not in either the American or Canadian armed services . . . some of his best riders are over military age . . . #### ILLINOIS SCRAP IRON DRIVE YIELDS 125,000 TONS IN FIRST WEEK

In the first week of the drive to salvage 125,000 tons of scrap iron and steel by September 1, homes and farms of Illinois have sent 25,000 tons to our hard pressed steel mills, Robert Tieken and George M. Eisenberg, co-chairmen of the salvage committee, Illinois State Council of Defense, reported to Governor Green.

The urgency of the need for scrap if our war production schedule is not to be endangered, has lead to the most comprehensive salvage setup yet worked out in the state, Tieken said. Active participation of all automobile, rubber, oil and farm implement dealers was assured at a recent meeting of representatives of those industries with Tieken, Eisenberg and officials of the W. P. B. As a result local dealers are now assisting county and community salvage.

The cooperation of the Illinois Civil Air Patrol was also enlisted to insure success of the test salvage harvest to be held in Delavan, Ill., on August 8. Flights are being made by more than 50 planes of groups of pilots from the Springfield and Peoria areas and over Tazewell, Mason and Logan counties. When they spot scrap piles, the location is noted and reported to the group commander, who in turn forwards it to salvage headquarters. Owners are then urged to start it on the way to mills.

# INTERNATIONAL WORKERS PLAN TANK DRIVE FOR RED ARMY

The Jewish-American Section of the International Workers Order announced through Rubin Saltzman, national secretary, that it will immediately begin an intensive drive among its membership for funds to send ten tanks to the Soviet Union.

This decision is the answer to an appeal sent to world Jewry by the Second Jewish Anti-Fascist Congress of the Soviet Union for 1,000 tanks and 500 bombers as a special contribution by the Jewish people of all countries to the Red army's struggle against Hitlerism.

The action of the International Workers Order is the first response of a large American Jewish organization. Mr. Saltzman, in announcing the drive declared, however, that while the Order is proud of the fact that it was the first to start campaigns in answer to the appeal, it does not wish to be the only organization carrying out this duty to our Soviet allies. Every tank and bomber will be another guarantee that the Soviet people together with the American and British Allies will crush Hitlerism between a powerful Red army and an American and British Expeditionary force on the mainland of Europe.

#### FAST PROCAIMED BY RABBIS

New York, Aug. 4 (JPS) — Jews throughout the free world are being asked to join in a fast of sympathy with the victims of Hitler on Friday, August 14, it was announced here by the Union of Orthodox Rabbis, which reported that it had sent cables to all capitals urging the action.

The occasion will also be marked by the unusual step of blowing the shofar. The Union announced that it has already received a reply from the Chief Rabbinate of Palestine stating that Palestine Jewry would share in the fast.

Geneva (JPS)—The former huge Jewish community of Brest-Litovsk, which once numbered 40,000 Jews, has now been reduced to 18,000, all of whom are engaged in slave labor, according to the Boersen Zeitung of Berlin.

#### PUNISHMENT FOR THE NAZIS

Though there are no words for the cruelty of the Nazis against unarmed men and helpless women and children, many leaders of the United Nations have vowed to punish them for their wickedness, their special wickedness toward the Jews.

Here is what a few of these champions have said.

Cardinal Hinsley, who is head of the Catholic Church in England, publicly condemned the Nazi massacres of the Jews in a broadcast to the people of Europe. He appealed to his "fellow-Christians" on the continent to fight against the "black deeds of shame" which the Germans are committing. "Innocent blood cries out to Heaven for vengeance!" he said.

Dr. Schwartzbart of the Polish National Council made a broadcast to the Jews of Poland. He declared that "revenge will grow from the graves of those who have been forced to dig their own graves. The whole world sees the funeral processions passing through the ghettos. The day of victory and the day of reckoning approaches!"

A great meeting took place at Madison Square Garden in New York City. Twenty thousand people met there to express their horror at the Nazi massmurder of Jews. The message sent to the meeting by Winston Churchill, Prime Minister of Great Britain, said that he and Mr. Roosevelt had resolved to place punishment for these crimes among the chief purposes of the war. While our own President Roosevelt sent a message saying:

"Citizens, regardless of their religious faith, will share in the sorrow of our Jewish fellow citizens over the savagery of the Nazis against their helpless victims.

"The Nazis will not succeed in exterminating their victims, any more than they will succeed in enslaving mankind. The American people not only sympathize with all victims of Nazi crimes, but will hold the criminals to strict account and punish them in the day of reckoning which will surely come."

It is the duty of all people to see that such things shall never happen again.

Spending most of his time in Egypt, he left his excavations there, protesting against difficulties put in his way.

New York (JPS)-Dr. George Moses Price, founder and director of the Union Health Center — the medical clinic of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union-and author of several books on industrial hygiene and public health, died here at the age of 78.

Chosen to head the Joint Board of Sanitary Control-which was set up to remedy the conditions largely responsible for the historic nationwide strike of the garment workers in 1910 -Dr. Price three years later conceived the idea of a Union Health Center. Under his direction, many improvements in working conditions were made and a sickness insurance system for union members was established.

London (JTA) — Polish Jewish circles here received word from Kuibyshev that Dr. Henryk Schrieber, Jewish Socialist leader and for many years a member of the Cracow municipal council, died in Siberia on June 27.

#### PIONEER CHICAGOAN DIES OF HEART ATTACK AT 72

Moses L. Purvin, formerly treasurer of the F. C. Austin Co., died Sunday evening of a heart attack. Mr. Purvin was born in Chicago on the site of the old Post Office 72 years ago. He has always lived in Chicago to which his grandfather came in 1843. He was associated with the F. C. Austin Co. from his fourteenth year until the

time of Mr. Austin's death in 1931.

Jennie F. Purvin, his widow. is a trustee of the Chicago Public Library and well known in civic and educational circles. Mr. Purvin leaves two daughters; Janet Purvin Mange of St. Louis and Nata Purvin Felstiner of New Rochelle, N. Y., and five grandchildren.

London (JPS)-If alien Jews in the one-time Republic of France fail to give themselves up for deportation to Poland's ghettos, they will be liable to the death sentence. The Soviet organ also denounced the Polish anti-Semites for hindering the close relationship which now exists between the Russians and the Poles.

Chelsea, Mass. (JTA)—Believed to be one of the first of its kind in the in Yiddish will be given in Chelsea under the auspices of the local Committee on Public Safety, it was announced this week. #### JEWISH LABOR LEADERS REPLY TO PLEA OF MOSCOW JEWISH **ANTI-FASCISTS**

Two hundred and seven Jewish trade unionists, officials of the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations trade union bodies, issued a joint statement calling upon the Jews of America to help raise funds for tanks and bombers for the Russian army, in response to a recent appeal from the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee in the Soviet Union which called upon the Jews of the world to help provide 1,000 tanks and 500 bombers for the Russian army.

The statement declared in part, "We are heart and soul behind our President and the agreement of our government to open a Second Front in Europe and we are eager to participate ourselves in a Second Front NOW and at the same time to give the stalwart Red Army the tanks and bombers that it needs for our common defense and our common free future.'

# Rubber Problem-Time

New York, Aug. 3 (JPS) - The candidate of influential Time Magazine for "the man to whom the U. S. could look for a way out of the Rubber Scandal" is Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, according to its August 3 issue.

Saying that Dr. Weizmann had met in Washington with "Presidential Adviser Judge Samuel I. Rosenman," Time states: "Reports were that Dr. Weizmann, who did not claim to know all the facts about synthetic rubber, nevertheless knew more of them than any other one man, perhaps could set the record straight." The magazine suggests, in view of Dr. Weizmann's chemical achievements in the last war that "able, inventive Chaim Weizmann" would be able, through his current synthetic rubber experiments, to solve one of America's prime war problems.

#### Report on Jewish Youth Life in Vichy France

Geneva, Aug. 3 (JPS)—The life of Jewish youth in unoccupied France is more difficult than ever before, but at the same time is becoming more unified, reports indicate.

A special "youth action," created within the framework of the "Union Generale des Israelites de France," co-ordinating all the Jewish youth movements, including the Jewish boy scouts and the various Zionist groups. There are, according to the latest figures, some 8,000 Jewish boys and girls in the youth section. M. Gamzon, a former captain in the French Army, holder of the Croix de Guerre and chief of the "Eclaireurs Israelites de France," heads the youth section.

The aim of the youth unit is to aid the boys and girls in a spiritual and professional orientation in a France suddenly turned anti-Semitic. Many Jewish intellectuals, former government officials, teachers and writers, who lost their jobs as anti-Jewish legislation grew more severe, have been placed at the head of these youth edu-cational activities. The "Consistoire Israelite," which has kept its special functions as spiritual and religious central body for the Jews in spite of the creation of the "Union," is also giving its entire support to the work of the youth section.

The difficulties in the way of an effective educational program are great and are accentuated by the fact that the youths can be classified into three groups: (1) those belonging to or formed by the young Alsatians and Lorraines (French-assimilated but attached to religious Judaism); (2) those belonging to the "French Israelites" (entirely assimilated and having a vague connection with Judaism) and (3) young Jews of foreign stock.

Another great hardship is the paucity of Jewish educational handbooks. It is impossible to publish books at this time. There are no Jewish printing establishments in France any more and the stocks of Jewish books which existed in Paris and in libraries of other cities as well as in the libraries belonging to the Alliance Israelites and the Seminaries have disappeared. The Zionists have been authorized to publish handbooks in Hebrew.

# Weizmann May Solve Listed "Missing in Action", is Safe After Two Months of Sea Adventures

New York, Aug. 4 (JPS) happy adventure of Lieutenant William Lipsett of the U.S. Navy, first reported as missing in action "somewhere in the Philippines," and then picked up with four other American naval officers after two months of sailing in a flimsy boat, is the feature of the latest Jewish Welfare Board Honor Roll, which pays tribute to Jewish heroes in the present conflict.

Lieutenant Lipsett of New Bedford, Mass., had been reunited with his comnanions on the Island of Cebu after having been separated at Bataan and Corregidor. Leaving for Cebu on a secret mission, they accomplished their job and left the island a few moments before the Japs arrived. They fled in a native sailing boat, 70 feet long and "flimsy as a canoe." It took them 20 days to reach open sea. Then they sailed about for 11 days without sighting land. Running out of food and water, using ingenious implements, including an alarm clock, a portable radio and a page from a schoolbook atlas, the five men sighted land on May 10. New Guinea natives chased them away. Finally they were picked up and given a "hitch" to Australia.

Mr. and Mrs. Meyer Lipsett, William's parents, had been notified on July 3 that their son was missing in action. "I almost collapsed with joy when I heard the welcome news," his mother said.

## Dr. Wise Repudiates Greenspan as "Burden"

New York, Aug. 3 (JPS)—Words of hot scorn were poured upon Ben-jamin Greenspan, former magistrate, by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the American Jewish Congress, who charged Mr. Greenspan with misuse of the name of the American Jewish Congress in coming to the defense of William Griffin, publisher of the New York Enquirer, one of 28 indicted by a Federal Grand Jury for alleged con-spiracy to undermine the morale of the armed forces.

In his statement, which was widely disseminated in the Hearst press, Mr. Greenspan had said he was speaking in the name of the Jews in championing Griffin as a friend of the Jews and an enemy of Hitlerism.

"It is true," said Dr. Wise, "I regret to admit, that Mr. Greenspan is the temporary chairman of a district of the American Jewish Congress in Washington Heights, but I have no doubt that at the earliest moment that district will force itself from the burden of Mr. Greenspan's chairmanship.

"The case of Mr. Griffin will be judged by a court of law and not by Mr. Greenspan, but I cannot forbear for one moment to express my unmeasured abhorrence of Mr. Greenspan for dragging in the name of the American Jewish Congress into a case associated not only with those who are charged with being enemies of the Republic, but who are indubitably anti-Semites of the basest order."

#### U. S. Lend-Lease Head Promises Aid to Russia

London, Aug. 4 (JTA)-A promise that Polish refugees in Russiawhom are many Jews-will continue to receive food, clothing and medicine on a lend-lease basis from the United States has been given to Jan Stancyzk, Polish Minister of Social Welfare by Edward Stettinius, American Lend-Lease administrator, it was announced here this week in Dziennik Polski, official organ of the Polish Governmentin-Exile.

In the course of the conference between Minister Stanczyk and Mr. Stettinius the Polish official informed the Lend-Lease administrator concerning the situation of the Polish refugees in Russia and the Middle East and discussed the possibilities of aiding these refugees, the Polish newspaper stated.

## Say Palestine Jews No Chance to Fight

New York, Aug. 4 (JPS)—The serious accusation that three Jewish companies in United Nations armies are armed but get no chance to fight has been leveled by Arthur Hale over the "Confidentially Yours" radio program.

"There are," he said, "some 16.000 Jews who have enlisted to fight (in Palestine) and are on active duty in the various services. Several thousand are in the infantry, but they haven't been formed into battalions or brig-ades. They are isolated units. "More-over," he stated, "instead of being permitted to come face to face with the Axis enemy, these infantry companies have been assigned to guard duty, and to the present day they are not receiving full military training."

The commentator concluded that "the situation is having a discouraging effect on the efforts of Jewish authorities in their recruiting campaign. The young men want to fight, and not simply to parade in uniform.'

Washington, Aug. 4 (JPS)-The Soviet Embassy has announced the receipt of \$2,000 from the Jewish Committee for Aid to Russia and other Democratic Countries of Montevideo, Uruguay. The amount is being turned over to the Soviet Red Cross.

In a letter from Jaime Galperin, President of the Uruguyan Committee, he wrote: "The Jewish people of Uruguay, regardless of class, with understanding and a high spirit of sacrifice have responded to the call of the Jewish people of the Soviet Union who are defending the most sublime ideals of liberty and of human civilization.

### Nye Bill Aids Anti-Jewish Publications

Washington, Aug. 3 (JTA)—An attempt by Social Justice, X-Ray and other Jew-baiting publications to make a comeback after the war was seen this week in a bill introduced by Senator Gerald P. Nye, Democrat of North Dakota. Nye was one of the Senate's leading isolationists before Pearl Harbor.

The bill, which was referred to the Senate Committee on Post Offices and Post Roads, would "relieve newspapers and periodical publications which have voluntarily suspended publication for the duration of the war from payment of second-class mailing fees upon resumption of publication." Legally, it might be argued that Social Justice and X-Ray "voluntarily" suspended publication, although both were facing hearings which would probably have resulted in permanent revocation of their mailing privileges. A spokesman for the post office department indicated that it would probably fight any such contention.

At Senator Nye's office, it was said that the bill was suggested by an unspecified North Dakota publication, but that it would probably have a "wider application." The post office department pointed out that many legitimate publications, such as trade organs for industries abolished by the war effort, have also suspended.

#### Polish-Jewish Leader Asks Aid for Russians

Kuibyshev, Aug. 3 (WNS)-Urgently appealing to world Jewry for funds to purchase military supplies and ammunition for the Red Army, a well-known Polish Jewish leader now residing in the Soviet Union stressed the need for aiding the Soviet while withholding his name for fear of reprisals directed at his family still in Nazi-occupied Poland.

"I have seen our pogrom-racked Jewish brothers and sisters and our tortured and murdered children," he declared in his appeal. "Rivers of bloods are being shed by our brother Jews in the Red Army and by other Russians. More tanks, more bombers, more ammunition is needed. I appeal to you: Collect the necessary funds. Let your work be on a par with the great struggle for life against the forces of death—for freedom against the forces of slavery."

Addressing his message to "friends of the World Jewish Congress, and the American Jewish Congress, dear colleagues and friends of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Jews of Rio de Janeiro and Buenos Aires, my friends in Jerusalem and Tel Aviv and my friends in Capetown, the unnamed Polish-Jewish leader observed: "You know me well, I am neither a Soviet citizen nor a Communist. I am a Polish Jew who believes in and hopes for a free Poland.'

Meanwhile, the Soviet government awarded the Order of the Red Star to several Jewish engineers for work in increasing production of fighter planes and bombers. Among those who received the award were Arson, Miller, Lewitin, Lewin, Schweitzer Gundelan.

# Pelley's Anti-Semitism

Indianapolis, Aug. 4 (JPS) - An anti-Semite's holiday is being celebrated at Indianapolis as counsels for and against William Dudley Pelley, Silver Shirt founder and hate-mongering publisher, on trial for criminal sedition, recite from the voluminous anti-Jewish literature that has appeared from Pelley since he first saw himself as America's Hitler.

In the early days of testimony, extensive excerpts were read from the anti-Semite's autobiography, in which, among other things, he had suggested the segregation of Jews in America in a single town in each state and urged the ousting from office of "the Sephardic Jew, Franklin D. Roosevelt."

It is typical of the atmosphere which surrounds the Pelley trial that his chief counsel should be Floyd Christian, remembered here as attorney for Ku Klux Klan leader D. C. Stephenson, now serving a life sentence for murder. It was ironic that in impanelling the jury, Christian kept asking whether the prospective jurors harbored any "religious prejudice."

Whether a man listened to Walter Winchell, radio commentator and columnist, became one of the tests of a juror's ability to serve, as Christian inquired whether the men followed Winchell or other radio commentators. Judge Robert C. Baltzell, who has injected humorous notes at various stages of the trial, asked whether the question also applied to "Lum and Abner," another folksy radio feature.

The aim of Pelley's counsel is to show that their client's views do not constitute criminal sedition, as they were held by a large body of Americans, including Congressmen. Oscar R. Ewing, special Federal prosecutor in the case, has turned tables on the Pelley attorneys by calling a series of "typical Americans" to show that Pelley's vicious libels against the Jews, against Government officials and others were not shared by the majority of Americans. Two Indiana salesmen were called to the stand and denied that only Jews and refugees condemned Hitler, saying that all normal Americans detested what he had done in Germany and the horror he had brought on the whole world.

New York (JPS) -Anti-Semites of various stripes, from the German American Bund to the Christian Front. are engaged in a vigorous campaign to defeat pro-Administration candidates coming up for election this fall and are using such slogans as "Vote Christian," it was asserted here by Johannes Steel, news analyst and radio commentator.

months after landing in Cuba on the S. S. San Thome, 450 Jewish refugees are still interned at Tiscornia, the Cuban Ellis Island, "without comfort, in overcrowded quarters, inadequately nourished, exploited by individuals who sense an opportunity to enrich themselves," it is revealed by Aufbau, German Jewish weekly.

New York, Aug. 3 (JPS) - Three ternees on the 4th of July, following a parade held in Havana to mark America's anniversary of independence. It read in part:

"The call for liberty and independence was heard in our place of detention. Freedom being the prize for which we abandoned everything, we feel it our duty to join in this day's festivities. Or are we not worthy of that participation? . . . We, deported and imprisoned by Hitler and his Gauleiters in the notorious concentration camps of Dachau, Vernet, Gurs, Ferramonti, Tarsia for our love of liberty and our religion? . . . We, the persecuted and hunted names figure on the Gestapo's black lists? We, the exiles, who volunteered in the French foreign regiments, running the risk of being executed, if captured by our former countrymen? . . . Are these 450 victims of tyranny really unworthy of participating in the Day of Liberty as free men?'

## Raise Iewish Children As Own-Get Jail Term

London, Aug. 3 (JPS)—The remarkable tale of how five German peasant women from villages in the Koenigsberg district brought up eight small Jewish children as their own and were rewarded by the Nazis with long prison terms has been published by Koenigsberg Zeitung.

The women are Johanna Kleger, Ernestina Schmidl, Sofia Metzger, Frieda Krantz and Frieda Seifert. They received sentences ranging from 42 months to six years for their acts of

The children belonged to their Jewish neighbors who had been deported to Poland for forced labor. To save the children from the same fate, the women took in the youngsters and said they were their own. The subterfuge lasted 18 months until the Gestapo discovered the "crime" and arrested the women.

The first clue came to the Gestapo when they intercepted a letter written by the women to the real parents, advising them of the well-being of their children. The women also sent to their Jewish friends food packages, which in a devious manner led to the discovery of what the Nazi court and the Koenigsberg Zeitung denounced as a "betrayal of Nazi Socialism."

## J.W.B. Aids U.S. Jap WarPrisoners

New York, Aug. 2 (JTA)—A shipment of Bibles, prayer books, religious articles and books for American prisoners of war of the Jewish faith held by the Japanese has been made by the National Jewish WelfareBoard. through arrangements with the War Prisoners Aid of the World Committee of YMCA's, of Geneva, Switzerland, it was announced this week by Louis Kraft, executive director of the Board.

The materials provided by the Board, Mr. Kraft said, form part of a larger shipment of materials for American war prisoners of the three major religious faiths who are now being held in five Japanese prison camps.

The Jewish religious and ritual materials provided by the Board include Sefer Torahs, abridged prayer books and bibles, phylacteries, prayer shawls, full text bibles in both English and Hebrew, and other synagogue appurtenances, and Jewish histories and literary works. In all, 30 items are included. A Sefer Torah is included for each of the five prison camps. Aside from the religious articles, the materials in the five shipments which have been contributed by groups from all faiths include a library, phonographs, musical instruments, athletic goods, indoor games, theatrical outfits, and school supplies.

#### Doubtful If Food Can Reach Ghettos

Montreal, Aug. 3 (JPS)—Saying that "it is a cruel thing to encourage hundreds of thousands of relatives in the United States and England" with news reports that food shipments are to go to the ghettos of Axis-occupied countries through the International Red Cross, Saul Hayes, Executive Director of the United Jewish Refugee and War Relief Agencies of Canada, declared here that on the basis of conferences he held with representatives of "two internationally known organizations" he did not believe the project possible.

Mr. Hayes' views were contained in a letter to the Canadian Jewish Chronicle in which he said that "the difficulties in the main can be translated in the phrase, 'You Can't Do Business With Hitler.'" The success of the undertaking does not depend on the Red Cross or on the British government, he said, but 'upon the German authorities keeping inviolate a promise to allow the food to reach its destination. The history of the past number of years has painfully disclosed to the democracies that the promises which emanate from Naziland are about the equivalent of the old adage that a verbal promise isn't worth the paper it's written on . . . the real and insuperable difficulty will be in the acceptance of assurances from Germany."

According to Mr. Hayes, his organization had been considering a "test shipment." He added that "until there are assurances from authentic and neutral sources that food and other supplies are actually going to the beneficiaries and not to be diverted to the Nazi economy, such a scheme will be inoperative."

#### Lists of Jews in Gov't Found on Seized Aliens

Philadelphia, Aug. 3 (JPS)-Lists of Jews serving in government positions were found on aliens, stated to be members of the German-American Bund or sympathizers, arrested here by F.B.I. agents, it was reported by the local director of F.B.I. More than fifty homes of aliens were entered in the raid, part of a nation-wide series of roundups to seize subversive agents.

It was also disclosed that among a series of charts and maps picked up in the raids was one showing the number of Jews and Germans in every country of the world.
