To the ancient roots of Shibukawa ichi ryû

Grandmaster Osano invited Carsten Schroeder to join him on a journey to Saka (Hiroshima prefecture), which is the birthplace of Shibukawa ichi ryû jûjutsu.



Saka is placed on the slope of the range of mountains near the sea. Shihan Osano and Carsten Schroeder went from Fujiyoshida City to Mishima via Gotenba by bus and from Mishima to Hiroshima via Nagoya using the famous Shinkansen. This journey was a nine hours trip with a final trip on a local train from Hiroshima to Kure, where they had a nice overnight stay at a nice business hotel.





The typical food for a journey like this is called bento, here you can take a look at the one of Carsten Schroeder. Delicious!






Next day they first visited the house of sensei Tanita Asao Tokinobu, who was the teacher of Shihan Osano. Here they looked at his old weapons like bokken (wooden sword) or bo (long stick).





They also had the great opportunity to take a look at the old makimono of the late Tanita sensei.







Also, Carsten Schroeder was able to try the nice feeling of holding one of those old weapons in his own hands.

Here he is holding the wooden sword (bokken) of Tanita sensei, which was stunning. It feels very light in the hand but on the other side it seems also as hard as iron. After this, they visited some important monuments of Shibukawa ichi ryû. Here you can see a brief history of this ryû made in stone:







This jûjutsu school is one of the last traditional (koryû) styles.

There are many kinds of defensive techniques in orthodox form and versatility.

Also in this ryû there are many weapons, for example, bo, hanbo, tanbo, jitte and kusarigama.


