(Ways to "Bullet Proof" Your Son)

For some reason, the education industry speaks in a future tense - when your exams occur? When you go to university, when you leave Yr. 10/11/12/13 - Home! etc

The process of education, however is in a present tense - it happens today - this class period! Now! Hence the emphasis on the word "building" (Now)!

Some ways born of experience/observations, to ensure your son can be "bullet proofed" into being an outstanding man:

- Surround your son with a controlled freedom environment. The younger the boy - the more control and as he becomes older the more boundaries move out. Even then, there are still some constant boundaries and structure. This is not to deny aspiration or creativity - but to remind him of societal limitations.
- Fill the personal ledger with some very good relationships of other boys, friends and family. This doesn't happen by chance - and for boys generally a by product of doing some activity with others - sport, music, dance, study etc
- Teach him to delay gratification and to control impulsivity. "I'm hungry!" Answer "Dinner is ready at 6.30pm!" "I need an iPod (5/6?)" Answer "Wait until you save up to it!"
- 4. Remind him there is no room for any sense of entitlement in life. He was born from the earth. He is destined to return to the earth. The expectation on a daily basis is to ensure that his life, his time and talents are used in the service of others.

- 5. The time is now! Kicking the can down the road in terms of an essay to be done, study to be done, dishes to be washed etc is now! Procrastination is a problem with young men!
- There is an elephant in every room of his life!
   The task is to help him name the elephant and then ensure something gets done about it. Naming gives control and security.
- Increase the words about need to practise (now), the need to study (now) etc. Boys can overestimate their potential and underestimate the effort required to reach that potential.
- 8. The greatest asset your son has is in his head. Remind him to keep it on at all times! To limit what can goes to the head through the mouth! And what comes out of the mouth in talk, is authentic!
- Teach your son to weep not for himself, but for the plight of others their poverty and their lives.
- 10. Teach your son to pray (now). Not always in formulas, but with a heart that recognises a dependency on a loving God.

'Building an Outstanding Man' is unfortunately not what you see from the volumes of paper in education circles.

Yet it is so important for the longhaul of life - as a student, an employee and potential father.


