The 34ème Rallye International de Madagascar 2013 Organizing Committee invites you to come and experience the Rallye International de Madagascar 2013 (RIM 2013). Competitors will enjoy the hospitality of Madagascar and treat themselves to a land of diverse cultures and sights.

This year the event will be the 8th Round of the FIA African Rally Championship.

The 34ème RALLYE INTERNATIONAL DE MADAGASCAR 2013 is organised by Federation du Sport Automobile-Moto de Madagascar (FSAM). The event runs under the FIA African Rally Championship regulations which allow longer "special stages" will be approximately 210.00 Kms. The total length of the rally will be approximately 450.00 Kms. It is run on gravel roads in the outlying rural areas south and east of Antananarivo.

1.2 Event History

RALLYE INTERNATIONAL DE MADAGASCAR

The first edition of the «Rallye International de Madagascar » was organized by the **Automobile Club de Madagascar (ACM)** dated August 18, 1951. CHANTREL – VILLENEUVE on a PEUGEOT 203 won this

first edition named « Rallye du Sud »





From the third to the seventeenth edition (1953 – 1969), the rally was sponsored by SHELL and the name has changed to « Rallye SHELL de Madagascar ». RAMAROSON – RAMANANTSOA on AUSTIN Cooper S were the first Malagasy to win the International Rally (14th edition).







When SHELL left the island in 1970, the name of the Rally has changed into GRIM (Grand rallye International de Madagascar). The political events in 1972 suspended the competition until 1986.

The upcoming competitions were on a national basis, therefore, the name has again changed into «Grand Rallye de Madagascar » (GRM) for five years from 1986 to 1990. The 1991 political crisis has stopped the competition for another five years until 1996.

In 1997, the « Fédération du Sport Automobile de Madagascar » (FSAM) was created, the International competition restarted the same year, and Madagascar was part of the FIA again.

In 2000, the 28th edition was handled by the club FMMSAM. The CACMS Chairman, Surinder Thatthi visited the island during this competition. He suggested Madagascar to apply for the African Rally Championship. Accordingly, the 29th edition was candidate for the ARC.

Unfortunately, another political issue arose and any attempt to organize a competition on an international level was impossible. All planned events were cancelled until the situation became more or less stable.

The 30th edition was organized in 2003 to keep the feeling of an International Rallye.

The newly elected member of the Federation (FSAM) decided to upgrade the level of the Rally competition in Madagascar by complying with the General Prescriptions applicable to all FIA Rally Championships.

During 4 years, the Federation (FSAM) and all its affiliated clubs trained all competitors and stewards to comply with the International Regulation. Finally, in 2010, the 31st edition, co-organized by the club FMMSAM and the Federation was candidate for the African Rally Championship.

This event first organized ever, was sponsored by TOTAL and was called RITM « RALLYE INTERNATIONAL TOTAL MADAGASIKARA » and was observed by FIA officials.

Madagascar and Rally competition in particular, is part of the African Rally Championship - ARC. The big island will host the 8th leg of the 2013 ARC on November 08-09-10, 2013.

1.4 Event Overview

The 2013 edition of the Rallye International de Madagascar will be competed over three days. The rally will cover the picturesque scenery of Antananarivo and will take competitors and fans to the South and East parts. The total distance of the rally will be 450.00 Kms, of which 210.00 Kms will be special stage.

The rally is composed of 11 Special Stages (7 differents); the longest will be 37.700 Kms and the shortest 1.270 Kms.

The Special Stages will be on gravel roads completely closed to the traffic.

Day 1A Friday November 08th, 2013

The event, after a ceremonial start, will start with a Spectator Stage at Hippodrome Bevalala, which will be approximately 1.270 Km in length. This circuit will be competed over two round of two laps.

Day 1B Saturday November 09th, 2013

The cars, after an overnight at the HQ "Hôtel de Ville" - Analakely, will head to the city center. Competitors will battle over 5 Special Stages totaling 110.00 Kilometers, with 240.00 Kilometers of road sections. The cars will return to the Hôtel de Ville for an overnight halt.

Day 2 Sunday November 10th, 2013

The cars, after an overnight rest at the Hôtel de Ville, will head east of the capital Antananarivo, where competitors will battle over 4 Special Stages totaling 97.00 Kilometers, with 175.00 Kilometers of road sections. The cars will return to the Hôtel de Ville for the finish and for the prize giving.

The organizers wish to point out that the format given above is a precise draft of the Itinerary and is subject to change based on the conditions on the ground. Any significant changes will however be communicated to all aspiring competitors, as they occur.



If the entry is sent by Fax, the original must reach the organiser at the latest one week after close of entries.

Entry fees can be paid either in Malagasy Ariary or the equivalent rate in any convertible currency (1 US \$ = approx. MGA. 2,200). Payment may be made in cash.

Without the organiser's optional advertising an additional amount to US \$ 500.00 must be paid.

3.2 Competitor Assistance

For international entrants, organizers are negotiating for the following concessions:

- Free Entry (Confirmed)
- Accommodation The organizers have up to 10 Twin Rooms at the Rally Hotel, Hotel du Louvre, for the first 10 foreign entrants for 4 Nights (Bed & Breakfast). Special rates will also be offered to all participants during the event. Single rooms are offered at € 65 per Single Room and € 72 per Twin Room (B & B).

Bookings can be made either through the Rally Secretariat or directly to the Hotel Le Louvre. However, payment will be made directly to Hotel Le Louvre at the time checking in.

3.3 Vehicle Eligibility

2013 RRC Sporting Regulations

3.4 Vehicle And Parts Importation

All vehicles and spare parts, temporarily imported into Madagascar must be guaranteed against import duty and taxes. There are three ways in which this can be done:

i) AIT/FIA Carnet de Passage

This document allows the temporary importation of a vehicle and any spare parts declared on related documents. Guarantees the payment of import duties and taxes on the vehicle or spare parts, should you not re-export them. It is the most convenient way of temporarily importing a vehicle and spare parts.

The original carnet and related documents must be presented to Customs at the port of entry and again at the port of exit.

The Carnet de Passage is obtainable from your local ASN.

ii) Insurance Bond

This involves the execution of a customs bond with an insurance company. The Commissioner of Custom calculates the duty and taxes payable on the vehicle and spares parts. The importer pays a percentage of the duty and taxes payable, as a premium, to an insurance company, which thus becomes the guarantor.

The original bond must be presented to Customs at the point of exit, where it will be cancelled on re-exportation of the vehicle and spare parts.

iii) Cash Deposit

This involves the deposit of an amount of money, equivalent to the import duty and taxes payable on the vehicle and spare parts, which is refundable on re-exportation of the vehicle and spare parts.

This method is not only very expensive, but also very time consuming.

3.5 Radio Licencing (VHF, 2 Way)

It is illegal to operate any radio communication in Madagascar without radio licence. The process of obtaining a license from the Madagascar Communications Commission is very tedious, and it is advised that crews requiring a team channel utilise one of the mobile phone companies' services

3.6 Medical Cards

It is a FIA requirement that all competitors (drivers and co-drivers must be in possession of a valid medical card. This can be obtained from your local ASN. A Medical Certificate of Aptitude is incorporated in the medical card.

A card is valid for five years but needs to be stamped annually after a medical examination, by a certified medical practitioner in your country.

This card must be surrendered to the Chief Medical Officer at the start of the RIM 2013 and will be returned to you at the finish, on retirement or exclusion from the event.

Should you have met with an accident during a previous event, the Chief Medical Officer of that event should have filled in the relevant part of the medical card. Should you have sustained an incapacitating injury during this previous event, you will need another medical examination before you are allowed to participate in the RIM 2013. Your local ASN approved Medical Practitioner or any licensed Medical Practitioner in Madagascar should conduct this examination

3.7 Personal Accident Insurance

Personal Accident Insurance is not mandatory for this event, but can be obtained from the following place:

Details of insurance of Antananarivo will be available on this page at a later date.

3.8 Servicing Arrangements

There is two Service Park per leg, which will be indicated in the Road Book and the Service Notes. Access will be by tarmac (asphalt) roads.

All service and auxiliary vehicles need plates to gain entry into the Service Park. **The entry fees include two stickers for service cars.** Additional Auxiliary Plates may be applied for from the Rally office.

For non-manufacturers, only two vehicles, either service or auxiliary, for each competing car, may be allowed to remain in the Service Park at any given time.

Any additional vehicles, either service or auxiliary are allowed entry into to Service Park either to drop spares or Service Personnel at the service site and must exit promptly after that.

There are several competent outfits that will help with servicing arrangements, who the organiser will help contact on behalf of the competitor.

3.9 **Fuel**

Competitors who would like to obtain AVGAS should place their booking with the Rally Secretariat as soon as possible. However, Payments will be made directly to Total Madagascar at the time of collection. At the time of this document, One 200 litre drum of Avgas cost approximately US \$ 720 at Total Madagascar.

3.10 Alcohol and Tobacco Advertising

No advertising permited.

3.11 Prize Giving

The Prize Giving ceremony will be held on Sunday November 10th, 2013 on the finish podium – Hôtel de Ville, Avenue de l'independence - Analakely.

3.12 Corporate Hospitality

Corporate hospitality, for both organisers' and competitor: sponsors, is available at the Service Parks for all the legs.

4.2 Practice (Testing and Shakedown)

There will be no official shakedown for the RIM 2013. However, as part of the rally, Leg 1A will comprise of a Super Special Stage.

4.3 Reconnaissance Arrangements

Competitors wishing to carry out Reconnaissance must register with the Rally Secretariat. Reconnaissance is limited to two passages per crew.

Reconnaissance, for all crews will be as follows:

■ Foreign Crews - Wednesday November 06th - Thursday November 07th, 2013.

Road books and unofficial pace notes will be available as from Tuesday November 05th (Foreign Crews) 2013 at 16:00 Hrs onwards at the Rally HQ.

4.4 Reconnaissance Accommodation

Accommodation during Reconnaissance: The entire route is accessible within a day from Antananarivo.

4.5 Media Publicity

The RIM is usually well covered by the media. The event will feature in the media regularly for the three months prior to its running. There are many leading French daily newspapers, in addition to numerous periodicals that cover the event. Antananarivo has a number of FM stations with vibrant sports programmes that usually give motor sport a lot of airtime. Similarly, the national TV channel, RTA, as well as other local channel screen news and breaking stories around the event.

There will be an official result service at service parks, which will be updated regularly.

4.6 Turbo And Spares Sealing

The sealing of the turbo (compressor) and the transmission gear mounted in the car will be carried out prior to scrutineering. In addition, spare turbos equaling the number of legs (two), a spare set of differentials and a spare Gearbox, will also be sealed, at the same time. Tracking Units will also be installed at the same time. Details will be announced later.

4.7 Competitors Briefing

Competitors (drivers) briefing will be held at the Rally HQ on Thursday November 07th, 2013. Time to be announced later.

This is an important briefing because any changes noted in the road books or unofficial pace notes, as far as changing road conditions are concerned, will be communicated to the drivers.

- A valid FIA Medical card, with a certificate of Aptitude.
- Valid third party insurance for duration of the event.
- A correctly filled in Service registration form.

After verification of the above, the following will be handed out:

- Competition numbers and plates and any sponsor stickers.
- 2 Service Stickers per Crew.

The Road books, Service books and the unofficial pace notes can be collected from Rally HQ from Tuesday November 22nd, 2011, provided correctly filled in entry form along with the correct entry fee have been submitted.

Airport Madagascar has one International airport Ivato International Airport,

which is thirty minute drive from the city centre.

Capital Madagascar's capital is Antananarivo, around which the rally is based,

with a day time population of up to 20 million.

Car Hire There are good local car hire firms that have offices in Antananarivo.

Rates depend on the distance travelled and the type of car.

Climate Madagascar has a nice climate. Daytime temperatures rarely go above 30

degrees (Centigrade) and the nights are pleasantly cool. November is

normally rainy

Communication There are both networks of a telephone system, landline and cellular,

covering the whole country. In addition over five digital cellular networks cover most parts of Madagascar. International fax, telephone, Internet

and Email services can be found in most towns around the country

Credit Cards Most international credit cards are accepted in the major hotels and

restaurants, as are traveler's cheques.

Currency Madagascar's currency is the Ariary (MGA) (Denominations of MGA are

10/=, 20/=, 50/= (coins); 500/=, 1,000/=, 2,000/=, 5,000/= and 10,000/= (notes). Banks operate form 08:30 Hrs to 16:00 Hrs on weekdays. Money and exchange services are also available through the

foreign exchange bureau, which are prevalent in the city.

Health Due to the large prevalence of malaria in Madagascar, visitors are

advised to begin anti-malaria prophylaxis a week before arriving in the country and continue for four weeks after they've left. Very efficient private hospital care, clinics, chemists, air rescue services etc. are

available in Antananarivo.

Immigration All visitors are required to have a valid passport. Information as to

whether Visas are required should be sought from the Antananarivo

Ivato International Airport for free.

Language Malagasy is the official language, but the working language is French.

Restaurants Antananarivo has a wide selection of eating places, catering for almost all

know cuisine in the world.

There are several restaurants, which, in addition to an excellent meal

Security Keep valuables in the hotel safe and avoid explicit shows of affluence and

wearing items that can be easily snatched. Avoid isolated places and

walking anywhere alone after 18:00 Hrs.

Time Zone Madagascar is 3 hours ahead of Greenwich Meridian Time (GMT + 3).

Transport Taxis are easily available and should be used where possible.

Voltage Madagascar's electricity grid is 220 – 240 volts AC, with a European plug

system.

Water Always make sure you drink either filtered tap water or bottled mineral

water, which is available in all hotel and supermarkets.

5.2 Driving In Madagascar

Please Read This Section Carefully

Driving in Madagascar is on the right side of the road. Consequently most cars are left hand drive. Overtaking is only on the left side

Please give way to pedestrians on the zebra crossings. Drive safely by observing **traffic signs**, **speed limits** and by wearing **safety belts**. Talking on a mobile phone (without a hands free gadget) while driving is a serious offence.

All residential, business and industrial areas and areas having streetlights (built up areas), have a speed limit of **40kph**. In some areas, road signs indicate varying speed limits. Elsewhere, the speed limit is **80kph**.

It is an offence to drink and drive in Madagascar, and if caught, a stiff fine or imprisonment can result.

Beware of potholes and broken roadsides. Vehicles may come onto your side of the road while over-taking or avoiding a pothole: Most accidents involve buses, lorries and mini buses (taxi-be).

There are emergency breakdown services available in most places in Antananarivo. **Beware of roadside mechanics if your car does break down**.
