

:: The Wharf at Rivertown

The Chester Station generating plant; “one of the best-preserved and most monumental early power plants in the United States” — according to the Historic American Buildings Survey — has been transformed into The Wharf at Rivertown. Turbine Hall is the centerpiece of this magnificent building, home to Synogy Enterprise Incentive Management and the Delaware Valley’s most unique venue for special events.

The new facility, a dramatic 40,000 square foot Beaux Arts-era space with 100-foot vaulted ceiling, was painstakingly restored to integrate historic elegance with high-tech flair. Where there once stood 3 massive generating turbines, a new meeting/event space now features a café, large meeting rooms, mezzanine meeting space and the server banks that are Synogy’s core. A large, dramatic convention area looks out onto the Commodore Barry Bridge. This football-field-sized space also houses the Turbine Hall Data Center, with a capacity for 3000 servers. An additional off site backup data center provides this area with a level of security and scalability that meet or exceed the toughest industry standards.

Both historic and contemporary, Turbine Hall can be configured to host a variety of events — from lavish seated dinners for 450 to extravagantly produced parties and corporate meetings for 1000. Exceptional catering, advanced audio/video capabilities including four large projection screens, a built-in stage, dance floor, lounge area, bar, free parking, and many other amenities are available on site. The flexible layout and sophisticated audio/visual capabilities offer unlimited creative possibilities.

This historic building’s design also incorporates a public food court, abundant parking, a riverfront terrace and panoramic views. Additional office space is available.
